SUBJECT: Update Recommendation to a Retain under DoD Control (DoD) for Guantanamo Detainee, ISN: US9PK-000524DP (S)

**1. (FOUO) Personal Information:**

First name Middle names Last name: Mohammed Anwar

Aliases: None

Place of Birth: Gorr Bassi, Pakistan (PK)

Date of Birth: 1 January 1980

Citizenship: Pakistan (PK)

**2. (FOUO) Health:** He has been diagnosed with Hepatitis B and a left Orchiectomy for Testicular Cancer but is otherwise in good health.

**3. (S) Detainee Summary:**

A. (S) Detention Information: Same as previously stated in JTF CG memo, dated 14 December 2002.

B. (S) Prior Assessment: MG Geoffrey D. Miller, Commander JTF Guantanamo, recommended that detainee be considered for release or transfer to the control of another government. This recommendation was based on the assessment that detainee was not affiliated with Al-Qaida or a Taliban leader.

C. (S) New Information:

- In 1998, detainee was recruited by the Lashkar-e-Tayyiba (LT) and moved to Muzaffarabad, PK where he attended the Lashkar-e- Tayyiba training camp, aka "Abdulla Bin Masood" for 21 days.
- In July 2001, detainee traveled to Afghanistan (AF) and spent three months at Tarnak Farms, near Kandahar, AF, preparing food for Taliban forces. Tarnak Farms is an Al-Qaida training camp that specialized in explosives training and urban mountain tactics.
- Following the fall of the Taliban 2001, LT publicly announced its commitment to fight Jihad against the US. LT routinely sent fighters to Afghanistan for follow-on training to several Al-Qaida terrorist training camps to include: Tarnak Farms, Derunta and Al-Farouq.

SUBJECT: Update Recommendation to a Retain under DoD Control (DoD) for Guantanamo Detainee, ISN: US9PK-000524DP (S)

- Detainee has been identified through sensitive reporting as a Pakistani Inter-Service Intelligence Directorate agent.

D. (S) Intelligence Value: Detainee is of medium intelligence value to the United States due to:

- his ability to provide information on the LT, its training, and operations in Pakistan.
- his ability to provide intelligence on the Camp Abdulla Bin Masood and its operations in supporting and training terrorism.
- his ability to give further information on the explosive training conducted at Tarnak Farms.

4. (S) **Detainee's Conduct:** Detainee has on a number of occasions yelled across at detainees in other cellblocks, performed physical training in his cell, and does not always comply with the guards' orders/requirements. Detainee is non-compliant and belligerent.


5. (S) **EC Status:** Detainee's enemy combatant status was reassessed on 23 May 2003, and he remains an enemy combatant.

6. (S) **JTF-GTMO New Assessment:**

A. (S) Summary. Detainee has not been forthcoming or cooperative during his detention at GTMO. Based on information collected and available to Joint Task Force Guantanamo as of 19 November 2003, detainee ISN: US9PK-000524DP is assessed as being a member of LT, which has been identified as a terrorist organization according to Executive Order 13224 and has been classified as Tier 1 terrorist organization (defined as terrorist groups, especially those with state support, that have demonstrated the intention and the capability to attack US persons or interests). In addition, the detainee is suspected of having attended advanced training at Tarnak Farms. Based on the above, detainee poses a high risk, as he is likely to pose a threat to the U.S., its interests or its allies.

B. (S) Recommendation. GTMO recommends this detainee be Retained in DoD control.

7. (S) **Coordination:** Criminal Investigative Task Force (CITF): JTF Guantanamo notified the Criminal Investigative Task Force of this recommendation on 6 December 2003. In the interest of national security and pursuant to an agreement between the CITF and JTF GTMO Commanders, CITF will defer to JTF GTMO's assessment that the detainee poses a high risk
