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

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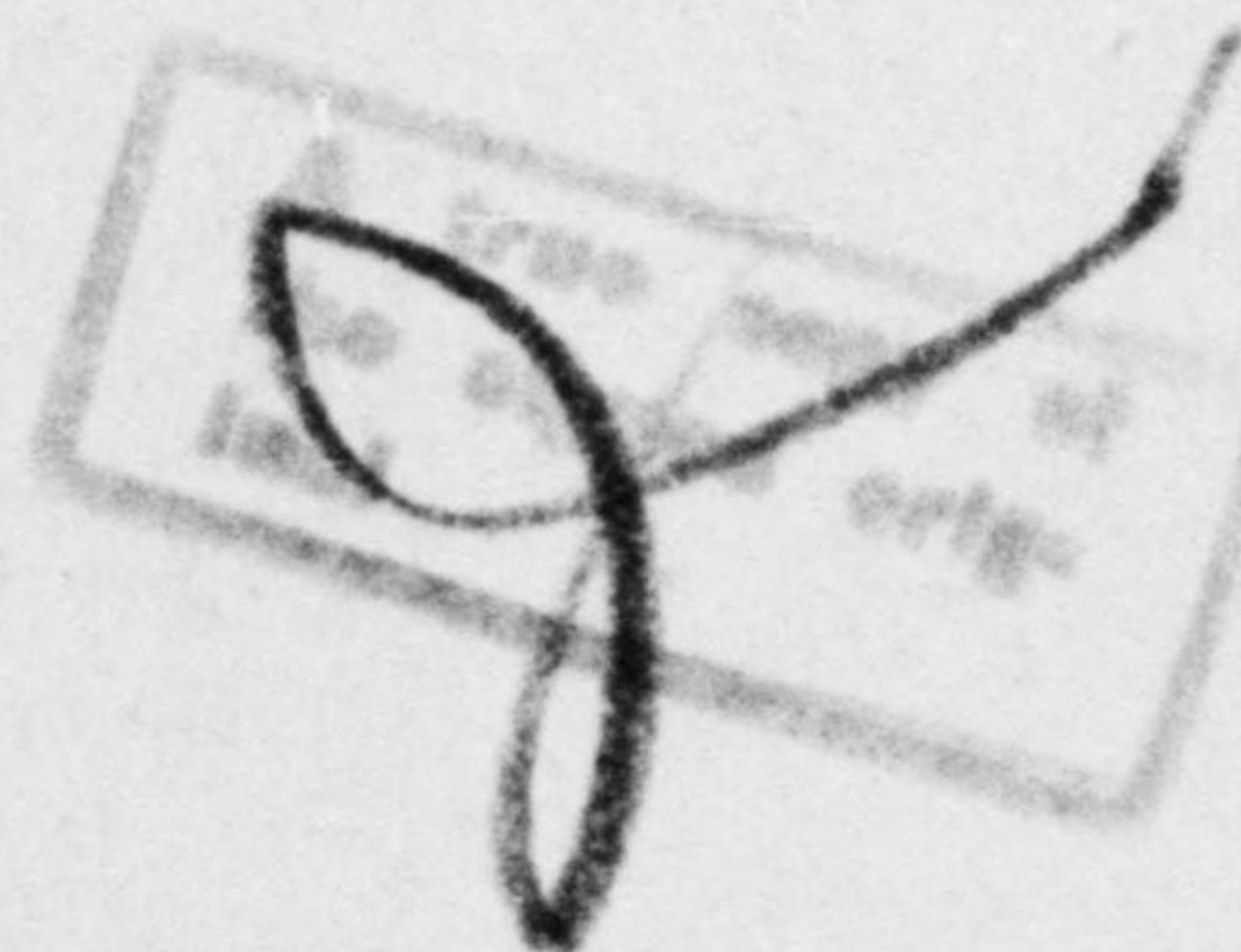

Mr. Yanowe stated there is a possibility Mr. Yanowitch might come to the United States and Mrs. Mellor told Mr. Yanowe in that event an extension of the validity dates could be requested and Mr. Yanowitch could be issued a military permit document.

Mr. Yanowe expressed his thanks for the information and authorized the cost of the cable to be charged to his firm.

The Acting Political Adviser has the honor to refer to this Mission's despatch no. 35 of January 19, 1949, on the subject, "Proposed Liberalization of Japan Tourist Program", and to forward for the information of the Department, SCAP memorandum for the Japanese Government No. AG 095 (22 May 48) GA of February 11, 1949 (SCAPIN 1971), entitled "Entry of Personnel into Japan to Visit Relatives". This SCAPIN constitutes actual authorization for individuals to enter Japan for the purpose of visiting immediate relatives who are Japanese nationals or foreign-nationals permanently resident in Japan.

The approved program is substantially that described in this Mission's despatch under reference. Application is to be made through a commercial carrier or travel agency, using the application form enclosed with SCAPIN 1971. The Japanese Government is made primarily responsible for the supervision of the implementation of the program after the visitors' arrival in Japan.

It is pointed out that only United States citizens are required to apply for military permits to enter Japan after being notified of SCAP approval of proposed visits. However, it is believed that delay in clearance will not materially inconvenience American citizens applying from the United States, as travel performed under this program will presumably not often be of such urgency as that of commercial representatives.

With regard to the case of Juan Naoe SHIMOYAMADA Sukekawa referred to in the correspondence under reference, who desires to visit Japan, it is noted that the latest reason given by Mr. Shimoyamada for permission to enter Japan is at variance with the original reason given to the Embassy.

The Department observes that Mr. Shimoyamada has obtained his certificate of Bolivian citizenship and has been issued a Bolivian passport. In the circumstances the Embassy may inform Mr. Shimoyamada that in as much as the interests of Bolivia in Japan are under the protection of the Swedish Government he should submit his application for permission to enter Japan for business travel through Swedish diplomatic channels.

There also appears to be an alternative for Mr. Shimoyamada. On February 10, 1949 the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo authorized sixty-day visits with relatives in Japan. In this connection there is enclosed for the Embassy's information a copy of the pertinent press release. The Embassy may acquaint Mr. Shimoyamada with the conditions under which such travel to Japan is permitted. It will be observed that upon the applicant's notification by the commercial carrier of his approval for entry by SCAP, the applicant applies directly to the Pacific Military Permit Branch at Washington for his Military Permit to enter Japan.

ARMY APPROVES 60-DAY VISITS  
WITH RELATIVES IN JAPAN

A program authorizing individuals to enter Japan for a maximum period of 60 days for the purpose of visiting immediate relatives who are Japanese nationals or who are foreign nationals having permanent residence in Japan prior to December 1941, was announced today simultaneously by the Department of the Army and by General of the Army Douglas MacArthur, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers (SCAP). This program includes Japanese nationals, United States nationals, and all foreign nationals.

The salient provisions of this program are as follows:

1. Individuals entering Japan will be required either to bring with them sufficient food to fulfill their needs for the duration of their entire stay or to purchase such food from overseas supply stores in Japan.
2. The Japanese Government must certify that the host has adequate housing (other than that required for use by occupation forces) and that the visitors' entry will not increase the critical housing shortage in Japan.
3. Subject individuals will travel by commercial transportation to Japan and will not be authorized use of any occupation force facilities while in Japan.
4. Subject individuals must have legal access to dollar or pound sterling credits since yen will be acquired only for dollar or pound sterling credits and purchases from overseas supply stores must be made with foreign trade payment certificates acquired with such credits. Visitors will be allowed to possess only Japanese yen while in Japan. All other currencies must be deposited upon arrival in an appropriate bank, and upon departure yen may not be converted into any other currencies.
5. While in Japan, visitors will be subject to all regulations promulgated by SCAP and CINCFE and to Japanese law, and, in the event of any violation, the individual will be subject to trial by Japanese courts or by the Occupation Forces Provost Court at the option of SCAP. SCAP reserves the right to terminate the stay of visitors for cause at any time.
6. In order to implement this program, an application form has been devised which may be secured by prospective visitors in the country of their residence from those commercial carriers authorized to operate in Japan. This form is to be filled out by the prospective visitor and returned to the commercial carrier, who will then forward it to the Japanese Government for investigation.

Final approval for entry will be given by SCAP to the commercial carrier, who will then notify the applicant of this approval. This notification to the applicant by the commercial carrier will constitute authorization for application to the Pacific Military Permit Branch, MDW, Room 2A-320, Pentagon Building, Washington 25, D. C., for issuance of a Military Permit for Entry into Japan. This procedure applies to United States citizens, Japanese nationals, and those foreign nationals who do not have their own representation or protecting power in Japan.

MEMORANDUM

The Department of State acknowledges the receipt of the memorandum from the Embassy of Mexico dated February 18, 1949 regarding the desire of Señor Ernesto Ibarra to enter Japan for trade purposes.

With reference to the aforementioned application, the Department has been informed by the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers at Tokyo that a request for the clearance of an individual for travel to Japan may be submitted by the country of which the applicant is a national through the diplomatic mission in Japan of another country, in accordance with the formal "protective Power" agreement between the two countries, provided, however, that the Supreme Commander has already been informed of the protection agreement. It is believed that this procedure will hasten the obtaining of entry permits to Japan for nationals of countries whose interests in Japan are under the protection of third Powers. In as much as the interests of Mexico are protected in Japan by Sweden, it is suggested that Mr. Ibarra's
