(3) Russian-born stateless interviewee states she has known subject family for approximately eight (8) years and considers them sincere and serious-minded, honest in their business dealing and to have a reputation for being anti-Soviet in their political views. She further states that their daughter married an American soldier, who, with his wife, is presently residing in America. Interviewee knew nothing derogatory about the KRIVUSHINS.

(C-3)

(4) Stateless, Russian-born, interviewee stated that he had known the KRIVUSHINS for a period of twenty-five (25) years and considers them sincere, honest people who are in rather poor financial condition. He stated that they had two (2) sons, MICHAEL and ANATOLIE, who left Kobe for China shortly before the war and are now Soviet citizens. The KRIVUSHINS, however, are very democratic in their political views. At the end of the war, when the Soviet government offered Soviet citizenship to stateless, Russian-born, persons in Japan, they urged others not to apply. (C-3)

(5) Several confidential sources stated that the KRIVUSHIN has dealt in the blackmarket with American currency which is sent from the States to NICOLSKY-KOSSIREFF Alexander and then transferred to the KRIVUSHINS. (B-2)

(6) Confidential informant stated that he had not seen, nor heard of, the KRIVUSHINS attending any Soviet-sponsored functions in Tokyo. (B-2)

d. Derogatory Information: No evidence of the KRIVUSHINS being engaged in subversive activity.

1. Reference your letter GPCIC 201, dated 22 June 1948, subject as above and letter Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Far East Command, dated 16 September 1948 and indorsements thereto, subject as above, addressed to Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, U.S. Army, Pacific.

2. A continuous check from 14 August 1948 to 13 December 1948 revealed that Subject was reportedly participating in the West Coast Strike and would arrive Yokohama, Japan on 28 December 1948, aboard an American President Lines vessel.

3. Subject arrived Yokohama, Japan, 28 December 1948 aboard the S.S. General Meigs, American President Lines vessel, and surveillance resulted in negative report, however, Subject obviously was surveillance conscious and appeared very suspicious. S.S. General Meigs departed Yokohama bound for Shanghai, 29 December 1948, with Subject aboard.

4. The S.S. General Meigs arrived Yokohama on 11 February 1949 and Subject was no longer a member of the crew. Information that Subject quit his job with the S.S. General Meigs around 25 January 1949 at San Francisco, California was received from Guerrieri Arthur, Chief Steward of the vessel. Guerrieri stated he did not know Subject's whereabouts at the present time.

5. Request that any information as to present whereabouts or employment of Subject be forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Far East Command, to facilitate future control of Subject's movements when reentering Far East Command areas.

1. Reference your letter GPOIC 201, dated 22 June 1948, subject as above and letter Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Far East Command, dated 18 September 1948 and instruments thereto, subject as above, addressed to Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, U.S. Army, Pacific.

2. A continuous check from 11 August 1948 to 13 December 1948 revealed that subject was reportedly participating in the West Coast Cruise and would arrive Yokohama, Japan on 26 December 1948, aboard an American merchant liner vessel.

3. Subject arrived Yokohama, Japan, 28 December 1948 aboard the S.S. General Sledge, American merchant liner vessel, and surveillance resulted in negative report, however, subject obviously was surreptitious connections and appeared very evasive. S.S. General Sledge departed Yokohama bound for Shanghai, 29 December 1948, with subject aboard.

4. The S.S. General Sledge arrived Yokohama on 11 January 1949 and subject was no longer a member of the crew. Information that subject quit his job with the S.S. General Sledge around 22 January 1949 at San Francisco, California was received from Captain Arthur, Chief Steward of the vessel. Captain stated he did not know subject's whereabouts at the present time.

5. Request that any information as to present whereabouts or employment of subject be forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, Far East Command, to facilitate future control of subject's movements when returning to East Command area.

- d. Present employment: Asia Industrial and Mercantile Co., 113 Kiu-kiang Road, Shanghai. Company engaged in North China trade.
- e. Subject was a "temporary visitor" from Tientsin from 24 May 1942 to 9 June 1942 and from 6 April 1943 to 17 July 1943. During these periods resided at Park and Cathay Hotels, Shanghai.
- f. Subject has business connections with the Manchukuo Economic Mission, Cathay Hotel, Shanghai. Also reported to be engaged in "private commercial activities and smuggling" of goods between Manchukuo, North China and Shanghai. Has business connections with numerous wealthy Jewish businessmen in Shanghai, Tientsin and Harbin--some of whom are alleged to be "closely connected with Soviet circles." Has reputation as a successful businessman. Reported to have several "influential Chinese and Japanese friends who are backing him, as he assists them in business transactions--some of them illegal in character."
- g. Subject reported to be on close terms with one LEOPOLD (fnu), Swiss citizen of Russian origin, owner of a large house in Tientsin in which local blackmarket headquarters is allegedly located. 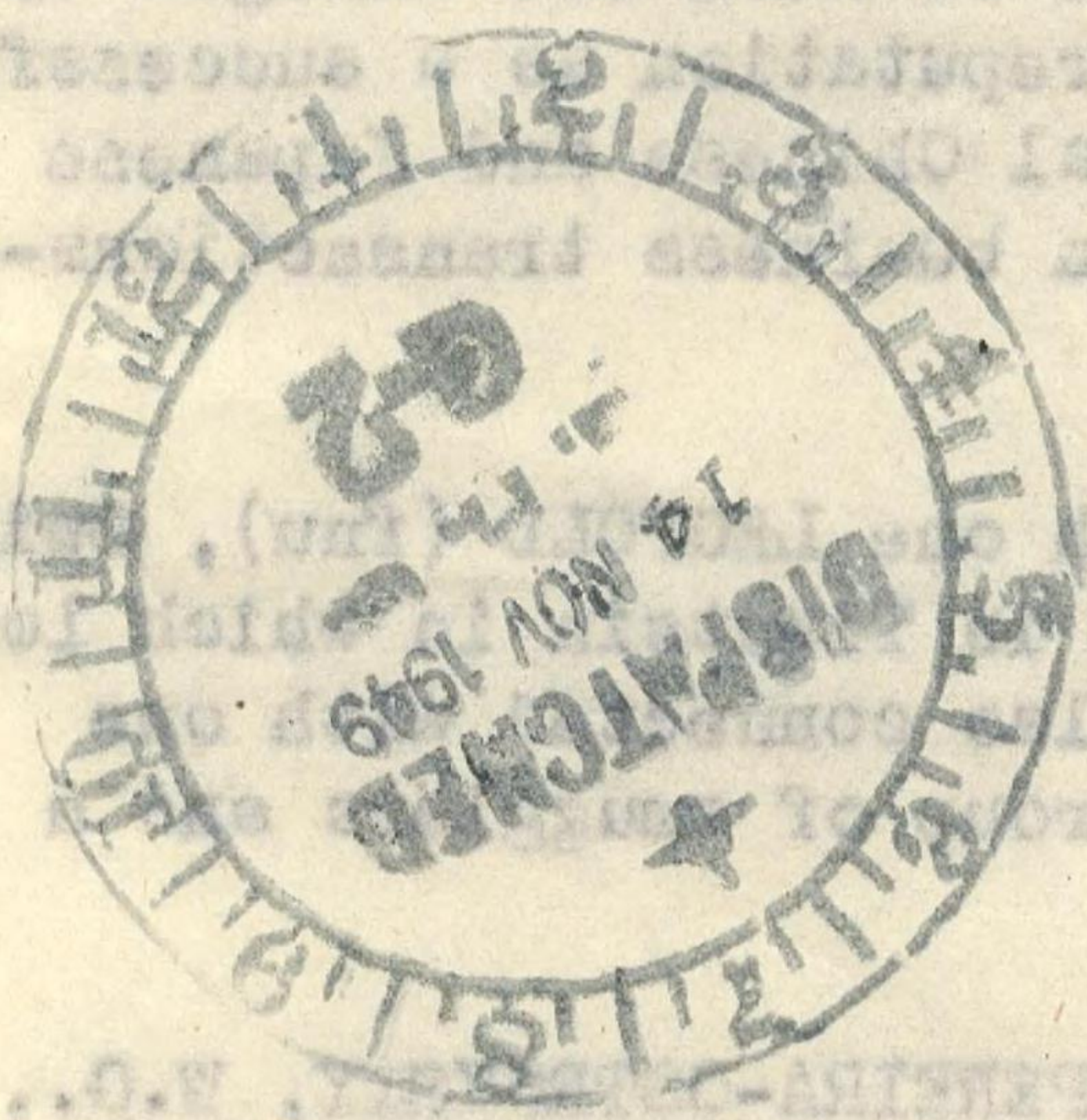

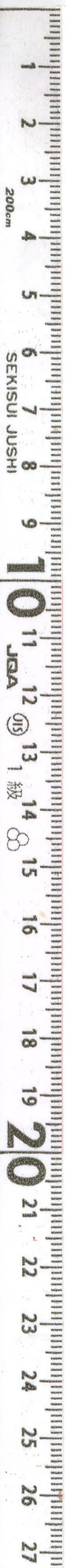

Basic DA Ltr, Subj: "Joseph W. RYSSIN, ex-ASN 39003307", dtd 9 Nov 49 refers to the following: Class B fanfold card from GHQ, FEC, G-2, dtd 28 May 48, pertaining to subj & SR 600-220-2, dtd 9 Jun 49 & requests source and date of info contained on fanfold card; copies of any R/I's (in dupl) on subj which may be available to FEC G-2; present status, classification of subj and present whereabouts of subj. Subj was employed by Central Purchasing Office, GHQ, FEC, fr 7 Jun 46 to 4 Dec 48 as a Buyer. On 7 Aug 47 the GHQ Loy Com recommended subj not be employed where he would have access to classified material. GHQ Loy Com recommendations were based on file fr 6th Army which contained an S/I dtd 25 Apr 47 by G-2, 6th Army. The S/I discloses: subj was investigated in Jul 41 as an applicant for Corps of Intel Police; subj was then a Pfc at Camp Roberts, Calif; inves disclosed membership in the Marine Cooks & Steward Union (Communist-dominated); info indicated subj may be a member of the CP; credit standing is bad; skip tracers have been after subj since 1931 and references furnished by subj not considered substantial or truthful. Subj's case was processed thru G-2, G-1, CPS and CPO, who vouched for subj and requested he be continued in his same employment as Buyer. This was concurred in by G-1.

Subj was removed fr his position as Buyer, CAF-11, for CPO, GHQ, FEC on 4 Dec 48 for the unauthorized participation in international trade for personal gain. 1. The inclosed Summary of Information dated 25 November 1949, subject as above, is forwarded as a matter of interest to you.

2. Gen. SHANG Chen received SCAP approval to remain in Japan as a private citizen following his resignation as Chief of the Chinese Mission and his subsequent retirement to a resort town near Tokyo. He is not on good terms with his successor, Lt. General CHU Shih-ming. In view of current rumors concerning possible defection of the Chinese Mission in Japan, it was sought to discover Gen. SHANG's attitude. This report is the result of that investigation and indicates that he has no sympathy with the Chinese Communists. He is reported to be a wealthy man and is believed to have financial and business interests in Japan in addition to bank accounts and properties in the United States.

1. Reference is made to our message C 54041, dated 19 December 1949, regarding Subject's background in Japan.
2. Forwarded herewith is a more detailed report based on local investigation.

a. According to one informant, Subject was born in Tokyo, Japan. His father died when Subject was about three years old and his mother when he was about five. Subject attended Kobe Koyo High School and Meiji University. From 1 April 1949 to 3 November 1949, Subject lived in this informant's house while teaching at NISHINARI Korean Primary School, Osaka. Informant states that Subject resigned from this school, where he had been teaching Korean history, and told informant that he was going to Kobe to visit friends, saying he would be gone for a few months. Informant has not seen Subject since.

b. Records of NISHINARI Korean Primary School show that from 8 April 1949 to 11 October 1949 Subject was a teacher of Korean history at that school. He resigned, voluntarily, due to unfavorable comments from the NISHINARI Parent-Teacher's Association concerning his comments on the people of Cheju Island and South Korea in historical perspective.

c. Two fellow teachers at the NISHINARI School picture Subject as a quiet studious person to whom going to the United States had become an obsession. On very frequent occasions, Subject had expressed and discussed this desire, but neither of these teachers had any definite knowledge as to his actually going. Both of them stated that Subject had no particular political ideologies.

1. The following data concerning movements of Agnes Smedley is sent in accord with your request of 23 May 1949. It should be of assistance in identifying Smedley in files there.
2. American citizen, born 23 February 1892 at Osgood, Missouri, U.S.A. Sailed from New York in 1919 on a Polish-American freighter as a stewardess; jumped ship in Danzig and went to Berlin.
3. Lived in Berlin from 1920 to 1928 as the wife of Virendranath (Viren) Chattopadhyaya, Hindu revolutionist. Went to Moscow in June, 1921, as a member of a German delegation to a meeting of Indian revolutionaries, held at the Hotel Lux. In October 1921 went to Geneva, Switzerland and also attended the Congress of German Syndicalists at Dusseldorf; in the latter case, travelled as Mrs. Petroikos. Between the years 1923 and 1927 taught an English seminar at the University of Berlin and lectured on Indian history. During this period entered the University of Berlin to study for Ph. D., but dropped out before the end of the first term; was sponsored by Karl Hausofer of the Institute fur Geopolitik. As entrance requirement produced two works on Indian history which were published in leading German historical magazines, one of which was the "Zeitschrift fur Geopolitik." Belonged to a group of Republican, Socialist and Communist physicians trying to establish the first state birth-control clinic in Berlin. In 1927 spent a number of months in Denmark and Czechoslovakia; went to France in 1928.
4. Returned to Germany in 1928 and secured a position as correspondent for the "Frankfurter Zeitung" and proceeded to China, traveling from Berlin via Moscow, Harbin, Mukden, Tientsin and Peking.
5. Arrived Shanghai May 1929 on passport issued 27 June 1928 by the U.S. Consulate in Berlin.

1. Reference is made to letter, your headquarters, dated 25 April 1949, and our interim replies dated 17 June 1949, 11 October 1949, and 7 November 1949, all subject as above.

2. Dr. Karl August BALSER, former German Consul in KOBE-OSAKA, Japan, was interviewed concerning his knowledge of SORGE and SMEDLEY.

a. BALSER stated that he had never heard of SMEDLEY. Gunther STEIN was also unknown to him.

b. Richard SORGE was known to BALSER, who saw him frequently at the home of Ambassador OTT, and was amazed at his excellent orientation on Japanese affairs, until he learned that one of SORGE's best friends was the private secretary of Premier Prince KONOYE.

c. On the heels of KONOYE's resignation of the Premiership came the wave of arrests which swept up KONOYE's former secretary and SORGE. BALSER had never known more of SORGE than that he was an extremely alert newspaperman for a FRANKFURT newspaper, and that he was reportedly born in Russia of a Russian mother.

2. Friedrich H. GLIMPF, former chief of the DNB (Deutsches Nachrichten Buero) in SHANGHAI stated when interviewed that he met SORGE once or twice in TOKYO and several times in SHANGHAI between 1939 and 1949. GLIMPF maintained neither business nor social contacts with SORGE. Prior to SORGE's arrest by the Japanese in 1941, German circles were not aware of SORGE's COMINTERN connections. In 1949 SORGE allegedly told subject that he (SORGE) had knowledge of the contents of secret telegrams sent to German Ambassador OTT. After SORGE's arrest on 16 October 1941 it was generally believed in German circles in Japan that this action by Japanese

authorities was unjustified. However, this belief was later changed as a result of claims made by Japanese authorities. SORGE allegedly worked directly with the Russian Embassy in Japan instead of maintaining relations with the COMINTERN in that country.

3. GLIMPF stated that SMEDLEY was well known in China as a highly intellectual woman with leftist tendencies. In press circles in SHANGHAI, it was believed that Agnes SMEDLEY's first husband was an Indian. Allegedly she was very active in the Indian Liberty movement in BERLIN during the 1930's. According to reports reaching NANKING, Agnes SMEDLEY was very active in behalf of Communism during the "Sian Fu" revolution in 1936 when Generallissimo CHINAG KAI SHEK was arrested by troops of the "Young Marshal", CHANG HSUEH LIANG, the war lord of Manchuria. Agnes SMEDLEY was seen in the leading hotels attending conferences arranged by circles belonging to the National Front, an organization in opposition to the Nationalist government in NANKING. During the Sian Fu revolution Agnes SMEDLEY allegedly made Communist propaganda broadcasts in German over the Sian radio network. Subject met Agnes SMEDLEY only once and then only for a few minutes at a press conference in HANKOW in 1938. Aside from the fact that Agnes SMEDLEY made no secret of her definite leftist leanings, she did nothing to indicate that she was connected with Comintern or espionage activities in Japan.

4. Interview with Eugen OTT, former German Ambassador to Japan, revealed substantially the same information as that procured from Friedrich GLIMPF. OTT was personally acquainted with SORGE only, but could shed no light on subject's COMINFORM activities.

5. Helene ABT, former Secretary of Joseph MEISINGER, Police Attache at the German Embassy, was interviewed with largely negative results.

6. It is believed by this division that all persons possessing positive information concerning the activities of STEIN, SORGE, and SMEDLEY have been interviewed. In view of the fact that further investigation is deemed unlikely to develop information of value, request your concurrence in suspending further investigation of this case.

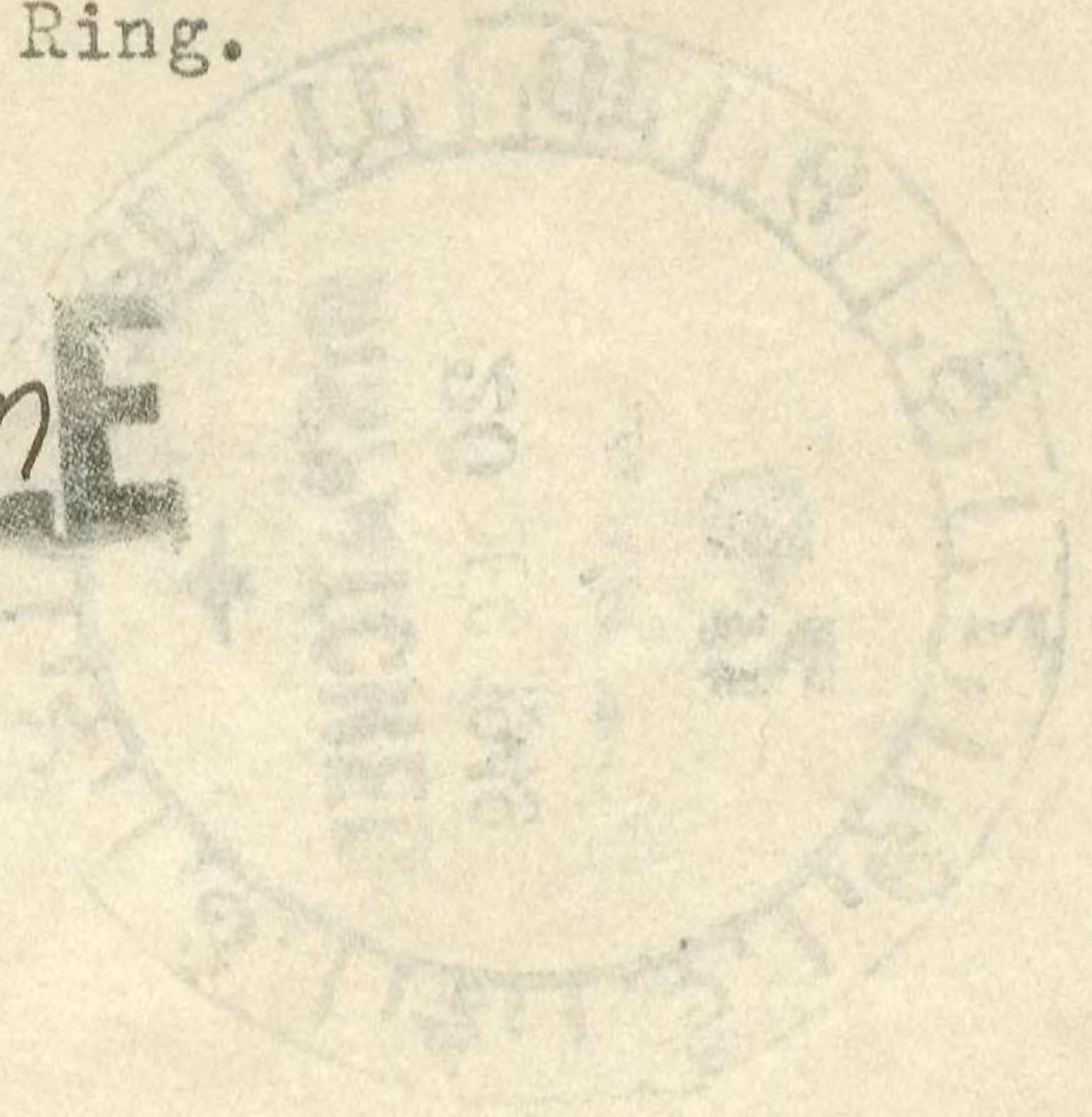

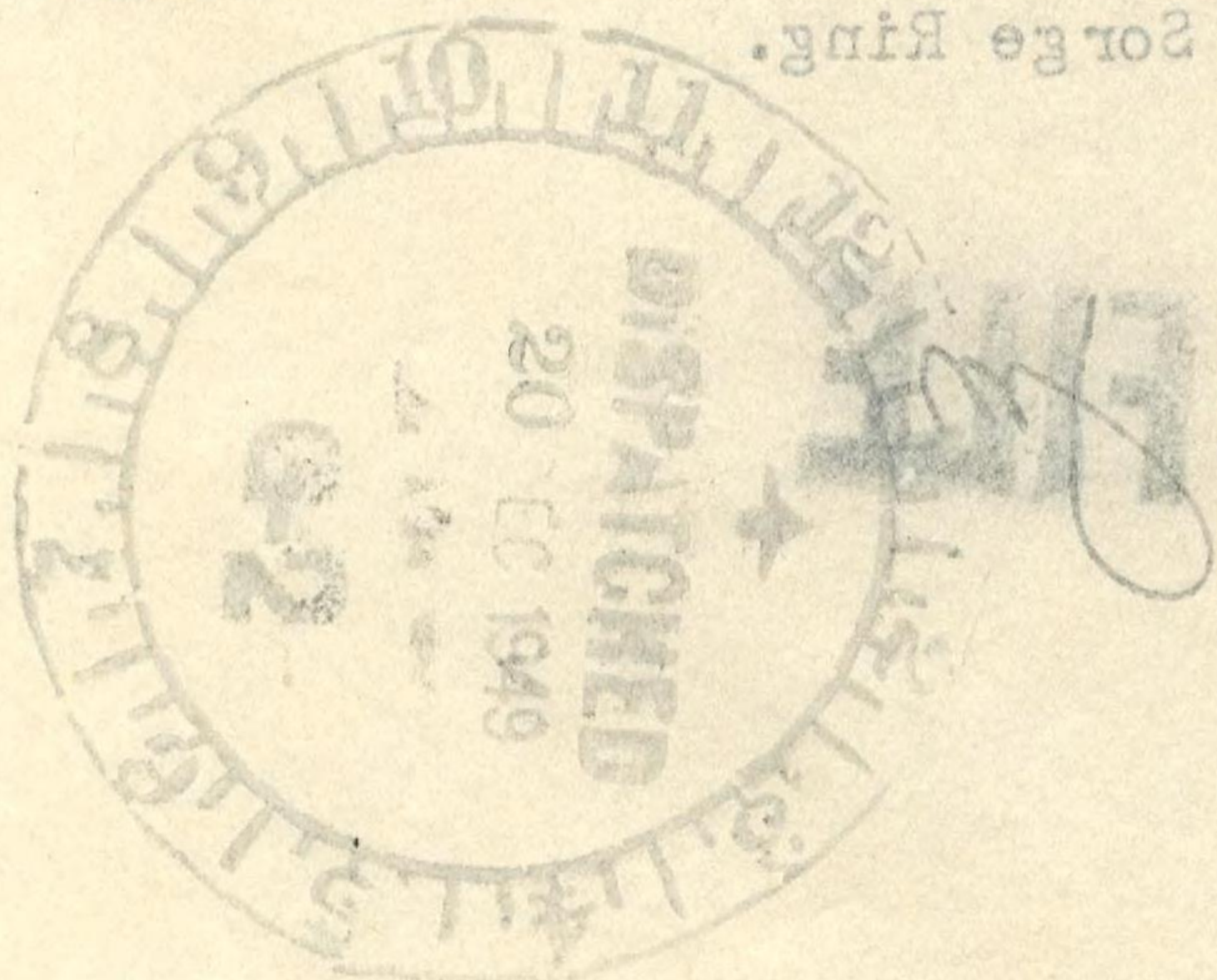

2. This present issue, listed as #30 in the Consecutive Exhibit Series, contains extracts pertinent to the Moscow - Smedley - Stein and Sorge linkage and reduces reading time from 202 pages of the complete yearbook (Consecutive Exhibit No. 13) to approximately twenty (20) pages exclusive of photostats, supporting the text.

3. The "Foreign Affairs Yearbook" was an annual official volume issued by the Criminal Affairs Bureau of the Japanese Ministry of Justice and the 1942 issue (pages 398 - 600) though reiterating to some extent the confessions of "Sorge's Own Story" presented many additional details of value to officials and functionaries conducting the investigations of 1941 - 42 and the subsequent trials in 1943 - 44.

4. It is felt that this shipment of fifty (50) copies, for MID internal distribution and as reference-texts for the House Un-American Affairs Committee will facilitate a rapid appreciation of the thoroughness of investigations and interlocking character of all testimony and evidence presented in the Sorge Trials.

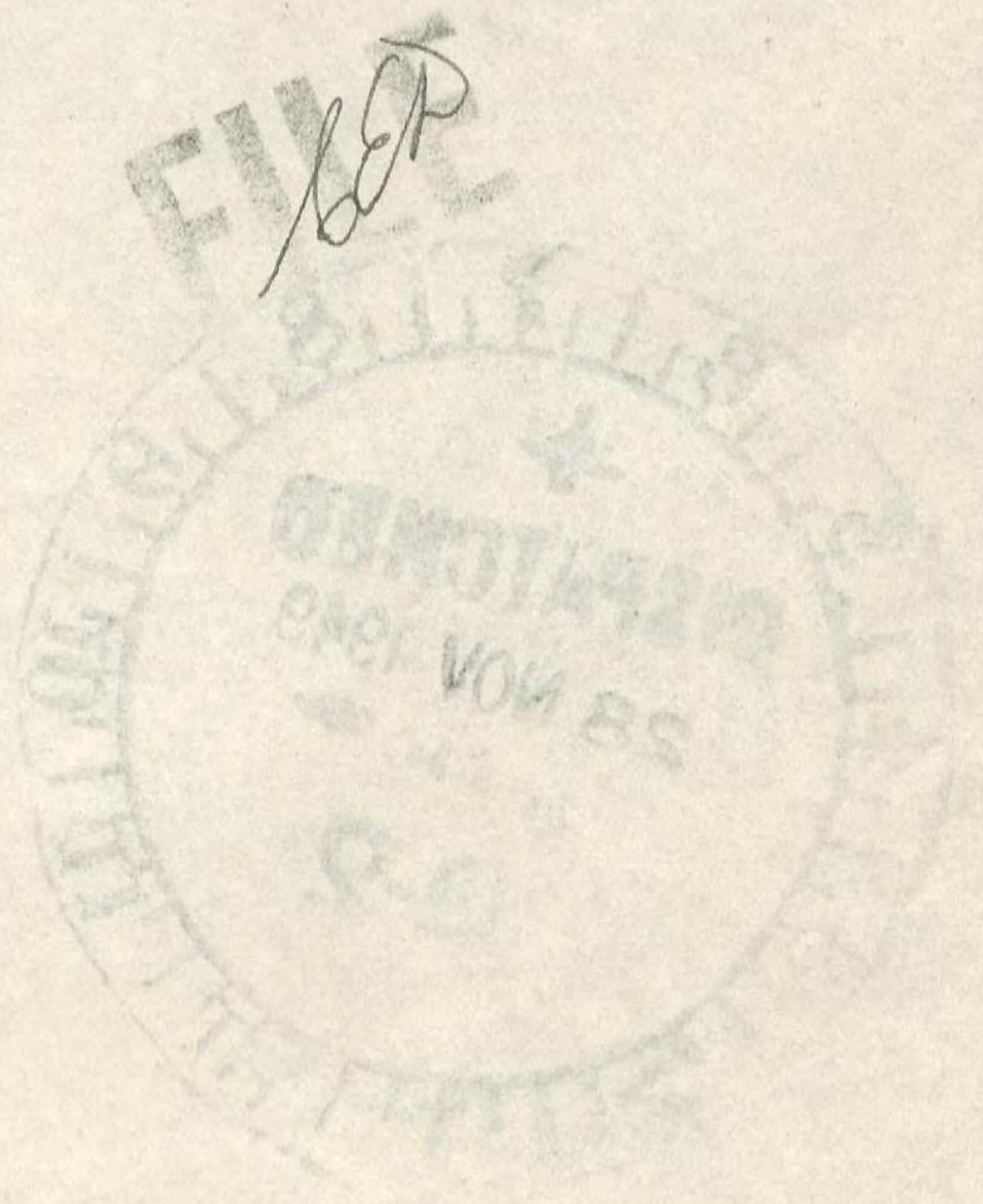

SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

SUBJECT: ZAITSEV Viktor Sergevitch

1. The SUBJECT was discussed during the interrogation of Klausen, a record of which is a part of the Foreign Affairs Yearbook for 1942 of the Police Bureau, Home Ministry which was translated and transmitted to Washington as Consecutive Exhibit Number 13 in the Documentation of the Sorge Espionage Ring Case. The record reveals the following information concerning SUBJECT:

a. In the 6th interrogation of Max Klausen by the police, held on 25 December 1941, Max Klausen identifies SUBJECT as the one whom he met as "Serge" and through whom he received funds from Moscow for the Sorge espionage ring.

b. In the same interrogation Max Klausen describes SUBJECT as being about five feet six inches tall, broad shouldered, round faced, and about 30 years old. Klausen also describes meetings between Zaitsev and himself and also a meeting of Sorge, Zaitsev and Klausen.

2. Honda, Ryuhei (本多隆平), a Foreign Ministry official currently assigned to the 3rd Research Section (Western Europe Affairs), Research Bureau, Foreign Ministry, revealed that he remembers SUBJECT through meeting him frequently in 1941 when SUBJECT was 2nd Secretary in the Russian Embassy and Honda was assigned to the 3rd Section (Russian and Balkan Affairs) of the Europe and Asia Bureau, Foreign Ministry.

a. Honda described SUBJECT as heavy set, about 5 feet 6 inches, broad shouldered, in the middle thirties, dark haired, brown eyed, with the features of a Balt or a Ukranian.

b. Honda stated that he got the impression that SUBJECT was not a career diplomat but appeared to be a member of the GPU.

c. Foreign Ministry files reveal that SUBJECT was officially assigned to Japan from January 1941 to December 1942 but was not seen after December 1941.

3. Narita, Katsushiro (坂田勝四郎), Honda's former Section Chief who is now in Kyoto was contacted and was unable to describe the SUBJECT more fully. Copies of snapshots, taken at a reception at the Soviet Embassy during the period SUBJECT was in Japan, did not include SUBJECT.

4. Ohashi, Hideo (大橋浩彦) who, as a member of the Foreign Section, Special Higher Police Division, Metropolitan Police Board (Tokyo), interrogated Sorge revealed that he frequently "shadowed" SUBJECT and that he borrowed a photograph of SUBJECT from the Foreign Ministry for the interrogations of Sorge and Max Klausen. Foreign Ministry files no longer contain the above photograph.

5. SUBJECT is listed as 2nd Secretary and Chief of the Consular Section, USSR Embassy in the Chronicle Directory 1941-42 which also gives the address of Mr. and Mrs. Viktor Zaitsev as c/o USSR Embassy, 1 Mamiana-cho, Azabu-ku, Tokyo.

6. It was reported in 1947 that Zaitsev had been assigned to the Soviet Mission as 1st Secretary. However, there is no evidence that SUBJECT ever reported to Tokyo at that time or since.

7. Above information is considered reliable, having been extracted from Japanese Court and Police Records in investigation of the Sorge Spy Ring Case and current information from Japanese Foreign Office and police officials.

This Exhibit, based on various files, dossiers and police cards of the Shanghai Municipal Police, (International Settlement), links Agnes Smedley, "registered with Comintern Headquarters" (pg. 520 Foreign Affairs Yearbook, 1942) with the IIId Comintern Apparatus and its many national trade, cultural and other "front" organizations. The operations of Richard Sorge from 1929 to 1932, linked with other espionage units in Shanghai, Canton, Peiping, Mukden and Harbin, were part and parcel of the Soviet-directed IIId International and involved persons of all nationalities, including Americans. Smedley did her part. Sorge, under Moscow's orders, moved on to Tokyo in 1933 to create the greatest of all international espionage units, "The Sorge Spy Ring," to the end of his "eventful life," on a Japanese gallows.
3. The Shanghai Police Files, though fragmentary, dovetail perfectly into the present Sorge Records and obviously complement them as an independent collateral source.

His known movements, according to a record from the files of the Shanghai Municipal Police, are as follows: first visited Shanghai for a period of four months in 1929; arrived Shanghai the second time January 1931 from Germany via the USSR; departed Shanghai for Manchukuo in February 1934; resided in Mukden and Harbin until November 1934, when he proceeded to Japan via Korea; returned to China from Japan 1 February 1935 on the SS Empress of Japan. Died in Shanghai in 1943.

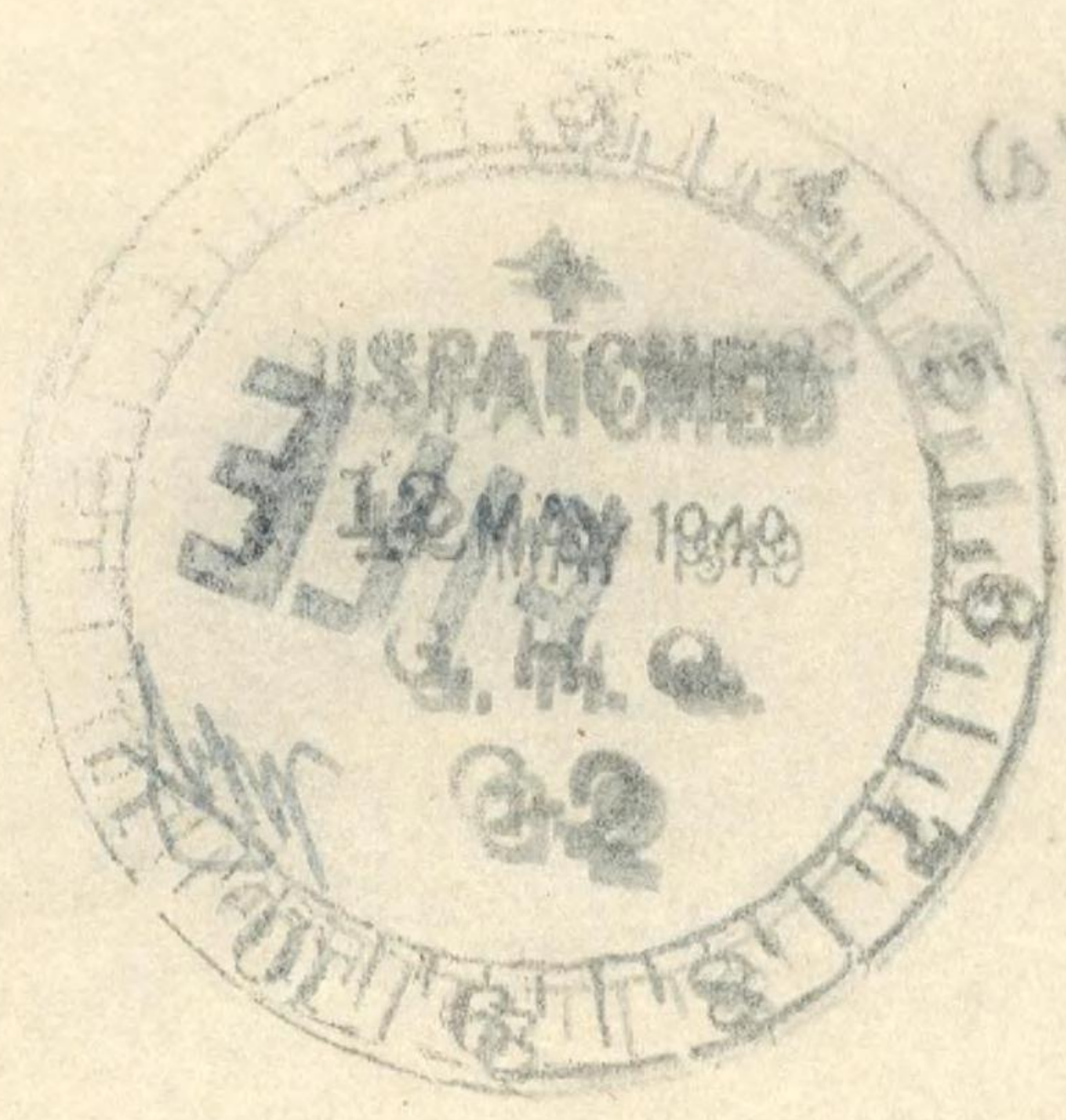
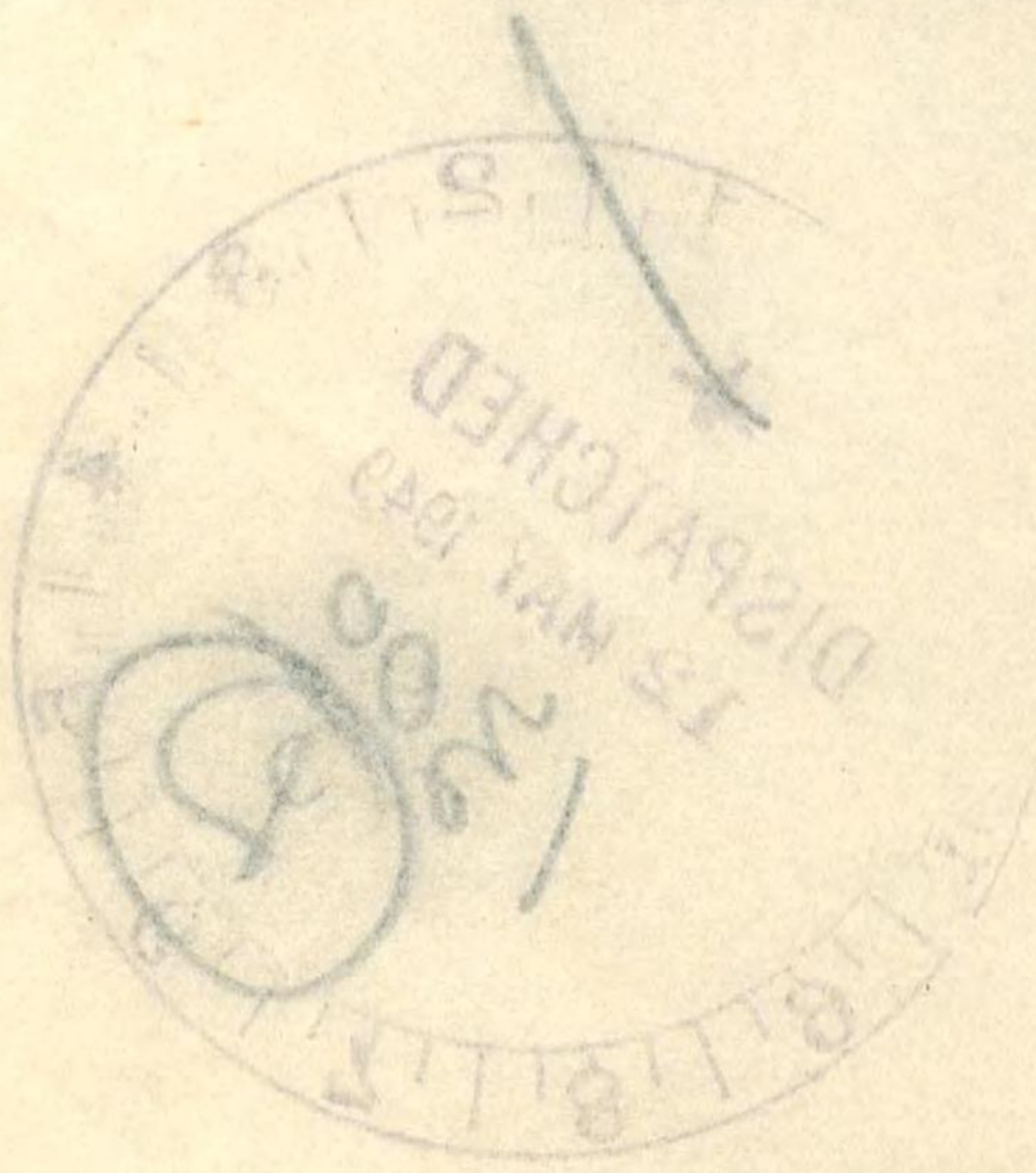

His known movements, according to a record from the files of the Shanghai Municipal Police, are as follows: first visited Shanghai for a period of four months in 1929; arrived Shanghai the second time January 1931 from Germany via the USSR; departed Shanghai for Manchukuo in February 1934; resided in Mukden and Harbin until November 1934, when he proceeded to Japan via Korea; returned to China from Japan 1 February 1935 on the SS Empress of Japan. Died in Shanghai in 1943.

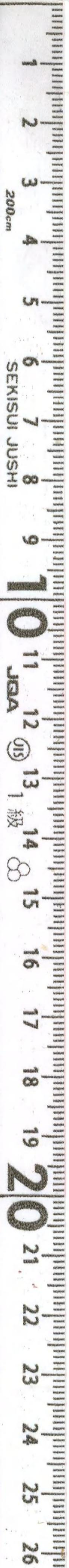

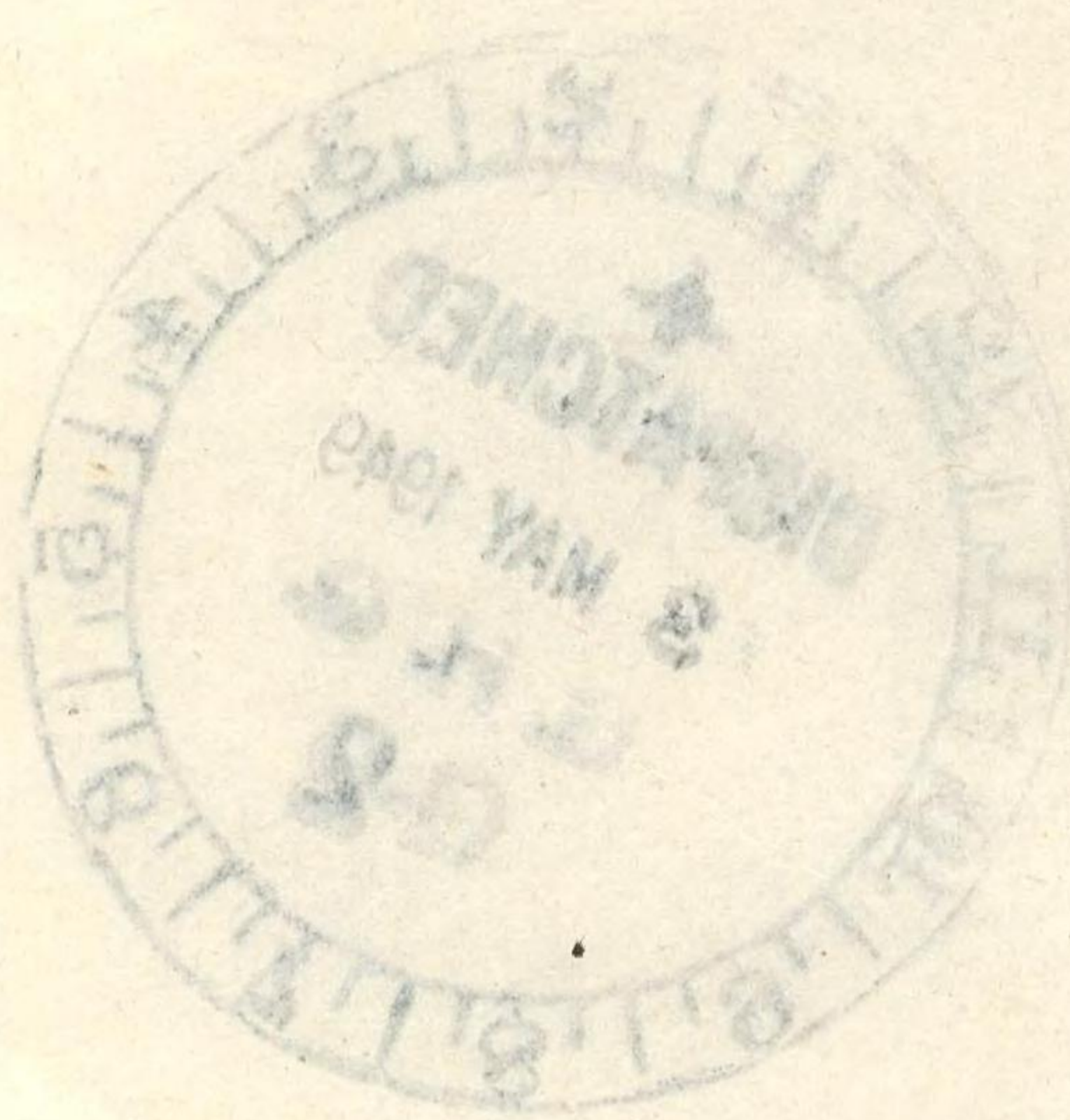
