The original target was Bulan Field on Samar but fust before takeoff was changed to Tacloban Field on Leyte following recekpt of a report from another group that Bulan offered nothing of interest.

Pilots had been briefed on all airfields on Leyte and Semar. The strike proceeded without delay.

Tacloban also proved disappointing. There was no air opposition. VB and VT cratered the strip. 2VB strafed buildings and barracks adjacent; VT's rockets appeared to be effective in revetment areas.

Commente

San Pablo Field appeared to be nothing but a large green pasture with shallow revetments scattered about. There was no air opposition and no anti-aircraft fire.

VF strafed two Zekes on the strip at San Pablo. VB dropped bombs on San Pedro strip and also on Bayug and Buri, two nearby fields that proved equally unimpressive.

VT selected the rickety buildins around the air strips. Returning, 4VT fired rockets at a hundred-ton freighter near Guiuan, Samar. One rocket penetrated the stern, causing an explosion.

Note: As indicated in (c) and (d) above, visibility of target was poor, making damage assessment impossible. Subsequent strikes in same target area revealed sersious damage had been inflicted on the target, but it was not ascertained by what strike. It was not possible to shoot damage assessment photographs due to obscurity of target.

The group commander led this strike of 12 VB, 12 VB and 9VT, the first carrier attack on Luzon since it fell to the aps in 1942. The fighter sweep that was to have preceeded this attack had not

arrived. Nevertheless, Commander ELLIS gave the word to attack. It was obvious from absence of airborne opposition and anti-aircraft that complete surprise had been achieved.

VF maintained high cover for the formation throughtout. The few enemy planes observed made no attempt to close.

... One VT returned to base because of engine trouble; the remainder dropped on barracks and supply building at W Angeles Field, Dau Twon and Camp Stotsenburg, with devastating effectiveness.

Since there was no air opposition on the area, VF strafed at leasure hitting many planes that burned readily, working over many others repeatedly, without success.

..Visibility was obsecured by haze and a .9 cloud cover at 4000 ft. Also with many planes simultaneously dropping similar bombs on the same small target area, assessment of individual drops is impossible. The photographs attached indicate severe damage to shipping and in-

stallations in the harbor area.

The planes from the USS LANGLEY joined up with the ESSEX group, then with the rest of the strike, and climbed to 11000 feet on the way to the target. Because of intense AA fire, the target coordinator gave instructions that no one was to do masthead bombing. Instead he ordered area bombing on enemy shipping in the inner basin of Manila Harbor.

At O620I on 14 November 1944 six TBM-1C of VT-44 escorted by four F6F-3,5 took off from U.S.S. LANGLEY for a strike against shipping in Manila Harbor, Luzon, P.I. Six VT and four VF left from the target at 0740I, climbed to 12,000 feet enroute, coming in on the target at 0808I, approximately five minutes after the preceding strike made by strike planes from the U.S.S TICONDEROGA. The LANGLEY planes made a high speed approach at 230 knots, pushed over at 9000 feet, three miles distant from the target and dove northwest, out of thexaitmexaitmexaitmextenxiamextangetxandxanuex sun, releasing their AN-M66, 2000 lb bombs on the inner harbor and dock areas. The bombs were released at an average altitude of 3500 feet,
