## AMPELOPSIS ENGELMANNI

The attention of nurseryinen and florists is particularly called to this clinging form of the Hardy Virginia Creeper, which was introduced by me several years ago. The leaves are thinder and smaller than in virginiana and cling to walls like the English ivy. The fall coloring is much more brilliant than the common form, which it is now superseding wherever known. it is the only satisfactory climhing vine for the severe Northwest.
