Prices Quoted are for the STOCKS IN FRANCE ; (boxing at lowest rates) after being carefully packed, insured and delivered to the forwarders, they travel entirely at the expense and risk of the purchaser.

The Grades named are in MILLIMETRES of which there are 25 TO THE INCH, and are measured at the collar.

Thus 6 to 8 m. m. are equal to about 1-4 to 5-16 inches ; 7 to 12 m. m. equal about 9-32 to 15-32 inches ; 5 to 7 m. m. equal a little over 3-16 to nearly 5-16 inches ; 3 to 5 m. m. equal 2-16 to 3-16 inches, etc.

CLEMATIS—LARGE FLOWERING VARIETIES.

I have always made a speciality of this popular class of climbers and the large increase in my orders for them the past season, caused me to import largely not only from France, but also from Holland and Germany. In the last named countries I found two and three year plants *grown from layers*, splendidly rooted, and tops with one to three or more vigorous shoots. These strong plants seem particularly adapted to the AMERICAN RETAIL TRADE, and to those who used them last spring, gave *perfect satisfaction*. I have arranged for a choice selection in all three countries, and expect to *personally attend* to the *grading* and *packing* of the same.
