Marmaduke Frattle

was the only son of John Grattle Esq. of Yarmouth, in the isled Wight, who was Mayor ofthat town about the year 1743. His mother was a Miss Langdale, a descen--dant of Sir Marmaduke Langdale who commanded the left wing of King Charles' army at the battle of Nase--by. The subject ofthis sketch was born Fieb: 3, 1752. He connenced life as a West India merchant in London, which occupation he pursued with unsullied horror & integrity to his death. He resided for 50 years in the ree--tory house of Allhallows, London Wall, where he died and was brisied at 8t. Michael Royal, Tower bile, with the Lang. -dale family. His residence was the focus quearly all the numismatists of his day. His urbanity of manners, diver--sity quitelligence +hospitality, made him amost valua--ble friend. Having acquired an ample fortune which he dovoted to his Javorite pursuits, his collection of rare of valuable gens, natural history, library, and above all, his extensive eabinets of ancient and modern coins of all nations and of every age, caused him to be visited and valued by every lover of the refined arts. He died outhe 26th day of September, 1831, in his 80th year. A portrait of Mr. Trattle has recently been engraved from a medallion by Wyon.




