

Baker. It is not easily distinguishable from *R. aquatilis*, var. *trichophythus*, except in their extreme forms, when in the one the leaves are peltate, parted mostly by threes, segments long filiform - in the other, palmately parted from a very short petiole, segments shorter & more rigid. The fruit may give more positive differences, - here glabrous & beaked, there somewhat hispid & obtuse.

No constant difference exists between this + (*A. californica*, Lindl., + *A. exigua*, Howitt.) as it varies in the length of the petals - in the relative lengths of the sepals + spurs.

six inches high. Root coarsely fibrous, leaves all radical, 3-lobed, lateral lobes 2-3 cleft, terminal one 3-cleft & pinnatifid - divisions incisely once or twice cleft, segments narrow.
