
MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Reference IOM from CO, 441st CIC Detachment to G2, subject:  
"extension of Overseas Service, SFC Henry M. Waskevitch", dated 30 Oct 51.  
(Incl 1). 1

2. SFC Henry M. Waskevitch is presently assigned to the 8016th Army Unit, Camp Crawford, Hokkaido. He is a Russian linguist and has cooperated with the 6th CIC District for a period of approximately eight (8) months in furnishing information concerning a Soviet personality, Antipin, Evgeni Sergevitch.

3. Due to Subject's Russian linguistic ability and family background, he has gained the confidence of Antipin and has developed his friendship to a point where SFC Waskevitch's contribution to the accomplishment of the CIC mission is of considerable value. In October 1951, SFC Waskevitch applied for an extension of his overseas tour in the Far East Command. At that time this headquarters requested G2, FEC to intercede with G1, FEC to obtain approval of Subject's extension. This extension was granted.

4. On 3 March 1952 Waskevitch submitted a request for another extension of his overseas tour through channels. Due to Subject's increased value in providing information concerning an individual of considerable counter intelligence interest, recommend that G1 again be requested to have JLC take necessary action to retain SFC Waskevitch for an additional six (6) months period.

5. Recommend approval of attached Check Sheet, G2 to G1, (Incl 2).

1. Reference attached application for extension of Foreign Service Tour of M Sgt Ishimoto, for period of six (6) months.
2. In view of the great number of personnel lost thru rotation it is felt that the additional loss of M Sgt Ishimoto will greatly hinder the operations from a counter-intelligence standpoint. M Sgt Ishimoto is a seasoned investigator, an excellent Japanese linguist and a good translator. M Sgt Ishimoto is assigned as resident agent in the Otaru sub-office, Sapporo Area. This position requires an individual who can work with a minimum of supervision, who is a linguist, and an interpreter with a rating of 10.06.
3. M Sgt Ishimoto's duties consist of reporting on JCP activities in the Otaru, Kutchan, Iwanai and Yoichi areas, maintaining liaison with MSA, Police Departments and Municipal agencies of the above areas. In addition, he is also responsible for the reorganization of the Coastal Watch Plan which extends approximately 100 miles in this area.
4. If an experienced Counter Intelligence Corps Agent, with excellent command of the Japanese language, becomes available, it is estimated that it will require sixty to ninety days on-the-job training to qualify him as a replacement for M Sgt Ishimoto.
5. Recommend approval.
