- (2) After the Allied forces landed in the MARIANAS, IWO JIMA was made a refueling base for operations of the HAMAMATSU KYODO, HIKOSHIDAN and the 110th HIKOSENTAI.
- (3) In January 1944 1 CHUTAI of the 23rd HIKOSENTAI (about 10 fighter planes) was sent to IWO JIMA to escort convoys and conduct anti-submarine patrols.
