FLUSHING MEADOW, N. Y. DEC. 3-(INS)-THE UNITED STATES AND FIVE OTHER MEMBERS OF THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL DRAFTED SATURDAY A REQUEST THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY CALL ON COMMUNIST CHINA TO GET OUT OF KOREA.

BRITAIN, FRANCE, CUBA, NORWAY AND ECUADOR JOINED IN DRAWING UP
THE DOCUMENT.

GEN. DOUGLAS MACARTHUR'S ANNOUNCEMENT IN TOKYO THAT AN "UNDECLARED WAR" EXISTS BETWEEN THE UN AND RED CHINA IS RECOGNIZED AT FLUSHING MEADOW AS FACTUALLY CORRECT. BUT IT IS REGARDED, NEVERTHELESS, AS SOMEWHAT AHEAD OF MAJORITY SENTIMENT AMONG MEMBER GOVERNMENTS OF THE WORLD BODY.

CONSEQUENTLY, IT IS PREDICTED THAT NEITHER THE U.S. NOR OTHER WESTERN POWERS WILL ASK AT PRESENT THAT MACARTHUR BE GIVEN AUTHORITY BY THE UN TO STEPUP MILITARY MEASURES AGAINST THE CHINESE REDS AND EXPAND BOMBINGS INTO MANCHURIA.

THE ASSUMPTION AMONG THE UN DELEGATES IS THAT SUCH A STEP MUST AWAIT THE OUTCOME OF NEXT WEEK'S CONSULTATIONS BETWEEN PRESIDENT TRUMAN AND BRITISH PRIME MINISTER ATTLEE.

IT IS FELT, FURTHERMORE, THAT RED CHIA MUST FIRST BE GIVEN A FINAL CHANCE TO COMPLY WITH THE FORTHCOMING SIX POWER RESOLUTION WHICH IS ALMOST SURE TO BE APPROVED BY THE VETOLESS ASSEMBLY.

THE REQUEST, IDENTICAL TO THE RESOLUTION VETOED IN THE SECURITY COUNCIL BY RUSSIA, ASKS ALSO FOR THE CONDEMNATION OF CHINESE INTERVENTION IN KOREA AND OFFERS PEIPING A GUARANTEE THAT UN FORCES WILL RESPECT THE MANCHURIAN BORDER.

INITIAL STEPS IN GETTING ACTION AWAITS A LETTER FROM THE U.S. TO ASSEMBLY PRESIDENT, NASROLLAH ENTEZAM. THE LETTER WILL BE FORWARDED SHORTLY AFTER WARREN AUSTIN AND ERNEST A. GROSS, THE TWO TOP AMERICAN DELEGATES, RETURN FROM AN EMERGENCY CONSULTATION IN WASHINGTON WITH SECRETARY OF STATE ACHESON.

THE U.S. REQUEST FOR AN ADDITIONAL ITEM ON THE ASSEMBLY'S AGENDA AT THIS LATE STAGE OF PROCEDURE REQUIRES A TWO THIRDS CONSENT FROM THE 14-NATION STEERING COMMITTEE. THIS MEANS THE SUMMONING OF THAT GROUP, OF WHICH RUSSIA IS A MEMBER, SOMETIME EARLY NEXT WEEK. BITTER OPPOSITION TO INCLUDING THE ITEM ON THE AGENDA CAN BE EXPECTED FROM THE SOVIET.

THE DRAFT RESOLUTION, AS IT NOW STANDS, LEAVES THE DOOR OPEN TO
PEIPING REPRESENTATIVES NOW IN NEW YORK FOR TALKS ON A PEACEFUL
SETTLEMENT IN KOREA. WHILE APPEASEMENT DEALS ARE EXCLUDED BY EVERY
NON-COMMUNIST UN DELEGATE, IT STILL IS BELIEVED POSSIBLE THAT COMMUNIST
CHINA MIGHT BE INDUCED TO VEER AWAY FROM MOSCOW CONTROL AND AGREE
TO A CEAS FIRE IN KOREA IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

A HINT THAT PEIPING MAY BE WILLING TO TALK TERMS WITH THE WEST APART FROM THE RUSSIANS CAME WHEN ONE OF THE SEVERAL ADVISORS TO WU HSIU-CHUAN, HEAD OF THE NINE MEMBER TEAM FROM MAG TSE-TUNG'S REGIME, APPEARED ALONE AT THE UN.

THE WU SPOKESMAN -- CHEN CHIAO -- CONFERRED WITH SECRETARY GENERAL TRYGVE LIE ON THE QUESTION OF "FURTHER MEETINGS." THE MEAGER INFORMATION ELICITED FROM CHIAO SEEMED TO INDICATE, NEVERTHELESS, THAT PEIPING CAVE THE "GO-AHEAD" TO WU FOR PRIVATE TALKS WITH THE WEST, YESTERDAY HE CONFERRED WITH INDIA'S SIR BENEGAL RAW AND LIE, RAW SAID

FOR AN ARMISTICE PENDING A KOREAN SETTLEMENT.

AT THE SAME TIME, BRITISH PRIME MINISTER OF STATE KENNETH YOUNGER UNDERLINED BRITAIN'S SUPPORT OF INDIA'S EFFORTS TO ESTABLISH DIRECT NEGOTIATIONS WITH COMMUNIST CHINA. HE STRESSED THAT REFUSAL TO TALK WITH PEIPING MERELY WOULD BE PLAYING INTO THE HANDS OF RUSSIA. HE URGED ALL POSSIBLE EFFORTS TO EFFECT A SPLIT BETWEEN MOSCOW AND PEIPING.

MACARTHUR'S STATEMENT THAT HE NEVER HAS ASKED FOR UN PERMISSION
TO BOMB MANCHURIA WAS FAVORABLY RECEIVED IN THAT IT CLEARED AWAY
CONSIDERABLE CONFUSION AND CONTROVERSY ON THAT POINT, IT IS RECALLED
THAT THE SECURITY COUNCIL RESOLUTION OF JUNE 25 ASKED ALL
GOVERNMENTS TO REFRAIN FROM AIDING THE NORTH KOREAN COMMUNIST
ACGRESSORS.

COMMUNIST CHINA'S ENTRY INTO THE CONFLICT PRECIPITATED A NEW SITUATION BUT THE UN BAN ON THE BOMBING OF MANCHURIA IS IMPLIED IN THE OFFER OF A BORDER GUARANTEE TO PEIPING CONTAINED IN THE MANDATE GIVEN THE UN KOREAN COMMISSION AND THE RESOLUTION VETOED BY RUSSIA EARLIER THIS WEEK.

TOKYO, DEC. 3-(INS)-GEN. DOUGLAS MACARTHUR ANNOUNCED SATURDAY THAT "A STATE OF UNDECLARED WAR" EXISTS BETWEEN THE CHINESE COMMUNISTS AND UNITED NATIONS FORCES.

THE TOTAL ENEMY TROOPS IN KOREA, HE SAID, NOW NUMBER BETWEEN 600,000 AND 650,000 MEN, AND ADDED GRIMLY, "THIS OVERWHELMINGLY OUTNUMBERS OUR FORCES."

IN ADDITION TO THE NORTH KOREANS, HE SAID, U. N. FORCES ARE BATTLING "APPROX MATELY 500,000" CHINESE COMMUNISTS "DIVIDED INTO TWO GREAT ECHELONS."

THE ENEMY, MACARTHUR SAID, IS "THOROUGHLY EQUIPPED WITH MODERN AND EFFICIENT WEAPONS."

THE SUPREME COMMANDER ISSUED A LENGTHY STATEMENT IN RESPONSE TO QUESTIONS OF CORRESPONDENTS AS THE COMMUNIST ARMIES POURING DOWN FROM THE NORTH THREATENED TO CUT OFF THE U.S. TENTH CORPS IN NORTHEAST KOREA FROM THE EIGHTH ARMY BY DRIVING EAST TO WITHIN 45 MILES OF THE EAST COAST PORT OF WONSAN, THE COMMUNISTS HAVE CAPTURED SONGCHON AND YANGDOK ON THE MAIN ROAD TO THE SUPPLY PORT.

MACARTHUR SAID HE KNEW OF NO WAY IN WHICH THE RECENT ALLIED
REVERSES COULD HAVE BEEN AVOIDED "UNDER THE CONDITIONS WHICH EXISTED."
HIS COMMAND, HE SAID, "HAS ACTED IN COMPLETE HARMONY AND
COORDINATION WITH HIGHER AUTHORITY."

MACARTHUR SAID, "THIS IN MY OPINION IS A NEW WAR WITH A NEW OPPONENT AND A NEW ARMY."

HE REITERATED PREVIOUS STATEMENTS THAT THE ILL FATED UNITED NATIONS
"END THE WAR" OFFENSIVE LAUNCHED A WEEK AGO "WAS THE ONLY CHANCE WE
HAD TO ASCERTAIN THE TRUTH OR FALSITY OF THE CHINESE CONTENTION THAT
HIS INTERVENTION WAS MERELY ON A VOLUNTEER AND INDIVIDUAL BASIS."
MACARTHUR ALSO DECLARED:

"IT WOULD BE A GRAVE MISTAKE TO ATTRIBUTE TO ANY INCIDENTS OF THE CAMPAIGN THE MOMENTOUS ACTION OF LAUNCHING WAR WHICH HAS BEEN TAKEN BY THE CHINESE ARMY.

"THE MOMENTOUS NATURE OF THE DECISIONS AND ACTIONS WHICH HAVE BEEN TAKEN CLEARLY SHOW THEM TO BE BASIC INDESIGN RATHER THAN OF SUPERFICIAL IMPULSE.

"IT IS MANIFEST NOW FROM THE BEGINNING THE DECISION WAS TAKEN,
AND, AS PART OF THE ONSLAUGHT OF NORTH KOREAN FORCES IN THE ATTACK ON
JUNE 25, THEY WERE ASSURED OF SUCH PRACTICAL SUPPORT AS THEY ARE NOW
RECEIVING.

"THE EARLY SUCCESSES OF THE NORTH KOREAN INVAION INTO SOUTH KOREA OBVIATED THE NECESSITY AT THAT TIME OF OPEN SUPPORT, WHICH IS NOW BEING FURNISHED.
