



SITUATION

Severe weather, including heavy rains and strong winds, affected several areas of Indonesia over the last two weeks causing floods and landslides.

- Sumatra:** nearly 680 people evacuated their inundated homes in South Sumatra province, while landslides in Jambi killed three people. Moreover strong winds injured three people and damaged several houses in Bengkulu province. Floods affected also the province of Aceh two weeks ago, forcing 1 500 people to evacuate, as well as Riau province, where more than 2 000 houses were flooded.
- Java:** floods affected East Java province forcing 500 people to evacuate.
- Bali:** 92 families were displaced in Buleleng due to floods.
- Kalimantan:** floods affected 2 900 families in six villages of East Kalimantan province, while strong winds damaged more than 30 houses in West Kalimantan.
- Sulawesi:** one person died due to a landslide in North Sulawesi and houses of over 300 families were inundated in six districts of Gorontalo province on the island.

FORECAST: Over the next week moderate (locally heavy) rainfall may still affect several areas of Indonesia, especially the provinces of West and East Nusa Tenggara, as well as some areas of north-western and southern Sumatra, south-eastern Java and central Kalimantan.
