MEMORANDUM FOR ALL OFFICER, ENLISTED AND CIVILIAN PERSONNEL:

SUBJECT: Security

1. There have been numerous indiscretions noted of late in conversations at social gatherings, on public conveyances and in other public places. This laxness is dangerous both to the safety of our troops and to our cause and must be terminated without delay. Any comments regarding military matters made to families, friends, or unauthorized individuals indicate the lack of a proper sense of official responsibility. Under no circumstances will any individual discuss anything that he has learned in his connection with the War Department with or in the presence of any unauthorized person in any place in which the individual is known to be, or assumed to be, an officer or employee of the War Department.

2. The seriousness of the situation cannot be stressed too highly and the cooperation of all concerned is urgently requested.

With reference to Mr. McCloy's complaint last Saturday that Mr. Clayton had addressed a letter directly to the Joint Chiefs of Staff rather than through the proper channels, the Secretaries of War and of the Navy, which he said was shown in JCS 369, I obtained a copy of JCS Information Memorandum 369, which deals with "Discussions Concerning Proposals for Setting Up Machinery for Control of Indigenous Resources of Northwest Europe" published by the JCS.

This paper shows that Mr. Clayton wrote the Secretary of the Navy on February 1, on the above mentioned subject and that the Secretary of the Navy, on February 28, referred Mr. Clayton's letter to the JCS.

The Department's records show that Mr. Clayton sent an identical letter on February 1, to the Secretary of War. There is no record in the Department's files or in Mr. Clayton's office that he addressed any communication on this subject to the JCS.



War Department Representative on Informal Committee to Discuss Problems Re Procurement of Natural Rubber, 15 Feb 45

SUMMARY

1. Letter from Assistant Secretary of State W. L. Clayton, 12 February 1945, stated he had discussed with the War Department (Col. Boyd), officers of the Foreign Economic Administration, War Production Board, Rubber Development Corporation, Rubber Reserve Company, Office of War Mobilization, and Navy Department the suggestion that an informal committee was needed to discuss operating problems and related policy questions concerning procurement of natural rubber when the questions involved are of interest to several departments or agencies of the government to learn whether it was generally believed that the proposal for such a committee had merit.
2. Those to whom he talked reacted favorably and he asked the Secretary of War if he would name a representative for the War Department. It will be entirely satisfactory if this representative attends only those meetings which are of particular interest to this department.
3. Mr. B. F. Haley, Director of the Office of Commercial Policy, is to act as representative of the Department of State and as chairman of the committee.
4. Reply to the Assistant Secretary for signature of the Secretary of War appoints Colonel James Boyd, Executive to the Director of Material, ASF, as the War Department representative, with Colonel J. S. Cooke, Chief, Materials Branch, Production Division, ASF, as his alternate.

My dear Mr. Secretary:

It has recently been suggested that there is a need for an informal committee to discuss operating problems and related policy questions concerning the procurement of natural rubber when the questions involved are of interest to several departments or agencies of Government. Such problems are likely to have great importance during the coming year, particularly if rubber producing areas in the East are liberated in the near future. I was asked to discuss the matter with representatives of other interested agencies of the Government and to learn whether it was generally believed that the proposal for such a committee had merit.

The matter has now been discussed with Colonel James Boyd of the War Department, and with officers of the Foreign Economic Administration, War Production Board, Rubber Development Corporation, Rubber Reserve Company, the Office of War Mobilization, and the Navy Department. Since each of those with whom the matter has been discussed has reacted favorably to the suggestion that such a committee should be established, I am taking the liberty of asking you to name a representative on the committee.

It is quite likely, however, that a considerable proportion of the work of the committee may not be of interest to your Department. If, consequently, you would prefer to have your representative attend only those meetings at which matters of particular concern to the War Department are to be discussed, I am sure that this will be entirely satisfactory.

In view of the fact that the problems involved largely concern our economic foreign relations with rubber producing and consuming nations I am asking Mr. B. F. Haley, Director of the Office of Commercial Policy, to act as representative of the Department of State and as chairman of the committee.

In view of the fact that some of the problems that need to be considered require prompt attention, I would appreciate it if you could let me have the name of the representative of the War Department as early as convenient.

Dear Mr. Secretary:

In a letter dated 16 September 1944, Mr. Adolf A. Berle, then Assistant Secretary of State, invited the War Department to send a representative to a preliminary meeting, on 21 September 1944, to discuss the subject of an International Conference to be held for the purpose of revising the International Convention for the Safety of Life at Sea, 1929.

I replied thereto on 29 September 1944, naming Brigadier General John M. Franklin, Transportation Corps, to be the War Department representative. He is at present a member of the General Committee on the proposed International Conference.

Since the International Aviation Conference at Chicago, it has become apparent that air-sea rescue and communications problems will play a much more prominent part at the proposed Conference on Safety of Life at Sea than was contemplated when the War Department was first invited to participate. Pursuant to an informal invitation from Vice Admiral R. R. Weesche, the War Department is naming representatives to the Communications Committee and the Air-Sea Rescue Committee. I believe that an additional War Department representative, to be selected from the Army Air Forces, would also be of great value in assisting the General Committee.

I would greatly appreciate your views on the matter, and if informed that you agree to the appointment of an additional War Department representative on the General Committee, I will promptly submit the name of a qualified officer.

This, I understand, is what you want. Gen. 4. On civil affairs matters, Gen. Hilldring to be the War Department representative. ✓

Gen. Embick and Gen. Fairchild would, of course, continue on the Strategic Survey Committee, and Gen. Strong would continue to head the Joint Post-War Committee of the Joint Chiefs of Staff organization.

1ST MEETING - 19 DECEMBER 1944.

1. The business of the 1st Meeting was restricted to questions of internal organization of the Committee and its Secretariat.

2ND MEETING - 22 DECEMBER 1944.

2. The Committee continued discussion of organization and procedure and considered a draft of a letter to be forwarded to the Joint Chiefs of Staff. The Secretariat has redrafted the letter, and it has been approved by the State and War Department members of the Committee. The Navy Department member has made some amendments to the letter which will have to be approved by the Committee.

3. It was intended to discuss questions relating to United Nations Prisoners of War but the matter was deferred due to the fact the papers were not ready. 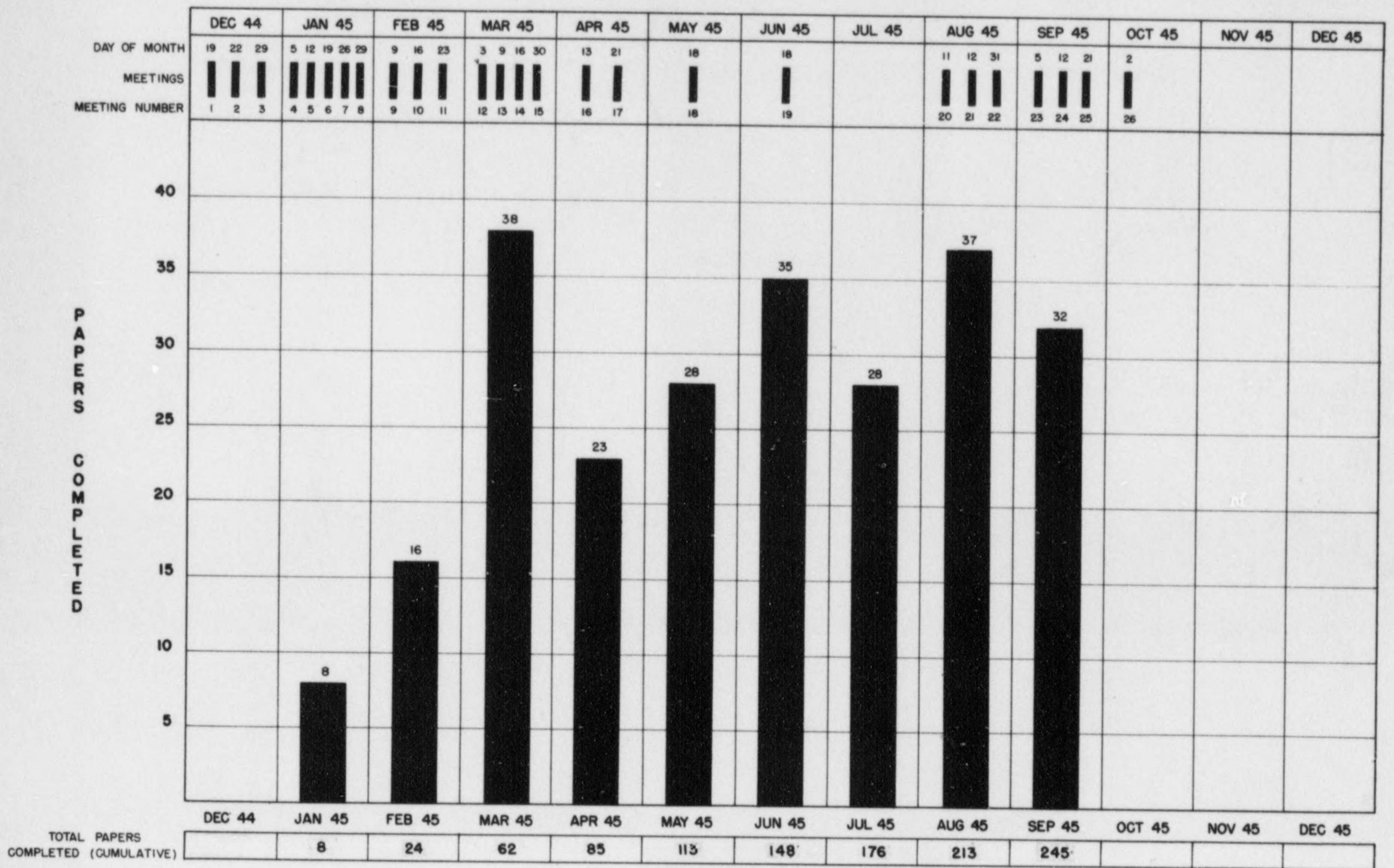

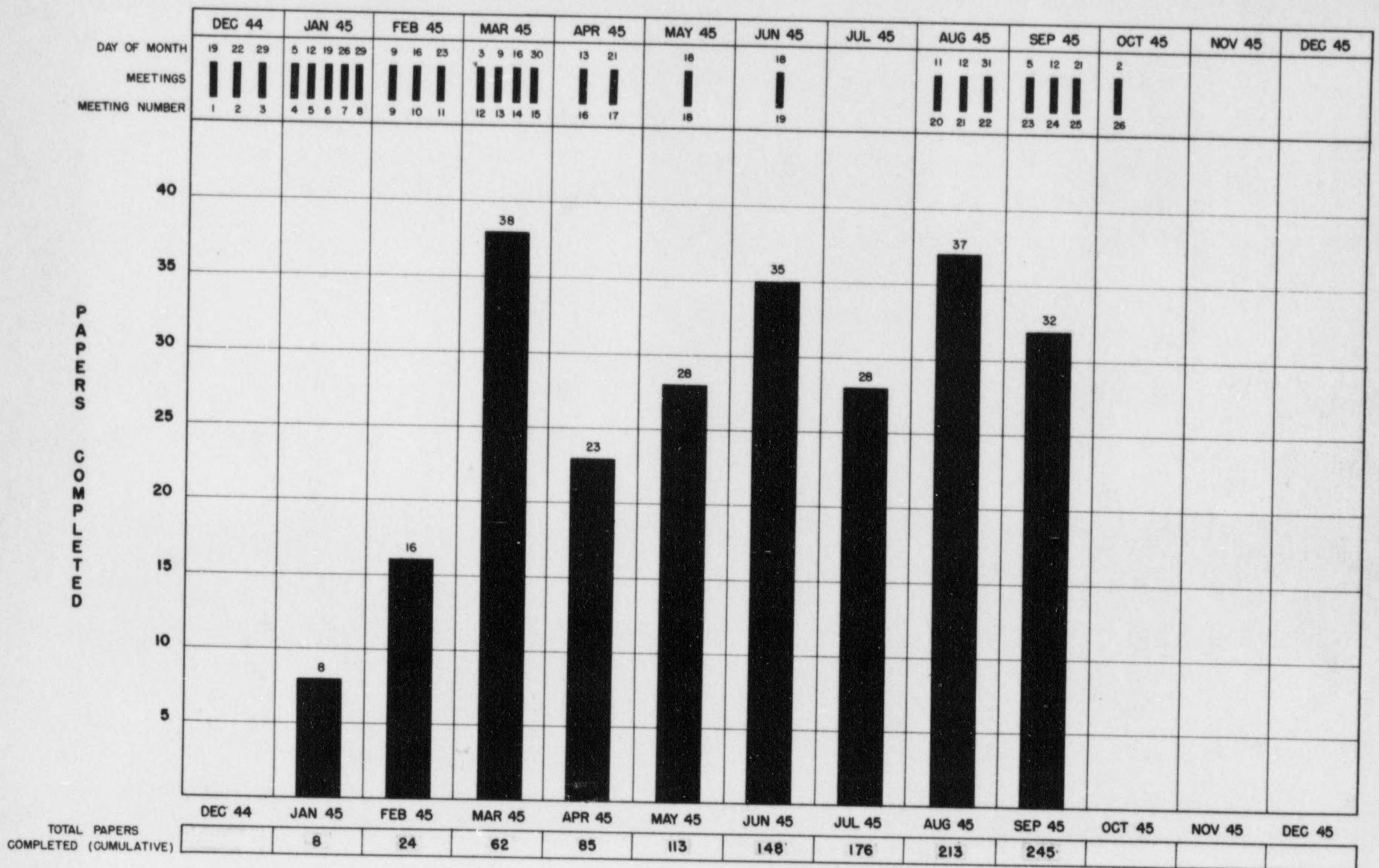
