NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1st Battalion (-), 11th Marines entered the month of July with three 105mm batteries located south of DaNang, RVN. A and B/1/11 remained collocated at grid BT01286268 (1/11's forward position) while C/1/11 was positioned at grid AT99086754, the 1st Marines rear directly to the north. L/1/11 remained rein. 1/11 and 3rd Platoon of 3rd 8" Battery GS/rein. 1/11. On 4 July, B/1/11 was displaced to Hill 55, grid AT9611-6112 to facilitate support of a battalion sweep on the southern tip of "Go Noi" Island for Operation Pipestone Canyon. B/1/11 returned to 1/11 forward the same evening.

On 9 July, as commitments to Operation Pipestone Canyon diminished, L/1/11 and 3rd Platoon of 3rd 8" Battery reverted to GS. To increase 1/11's capacity to answer calls for fire in southern "Go Noi" Island, 2 155mm towed howitzers were picked up by 1/11. The howitzers were to be located, after crew training, at A/1/11's position. At the same time, 9 July, B/1/11 was displaced to B/1/11 rear located at grid BT07036561. On 10 July 1/11 reestablished its FDC on Hill 34, grid AT99837140 and ~~relocated~~ the forward FDC as the CP group moved back to Hill 34.

At 101000H 1/11 assumed operational control of A/1/13 and W/1/11 from BLT 1/26. Both units were chopped back to the BLT at 111700H.

1/11 assumed operational control of F/2/11 at 191100H while the battery was temporarily located on Hill 34. On the same day, 191300H, B/1/11 displaced to Hill 55. Upon arrival at Hill 55, B/1/11 was chopped to the operational control of 2/11 for support of Operation Durham Peak.

The following day, 20 July at 0800H 1/11 once again picked up A/1/13 and W/1/11 from BLT 1/26. On the 21st, W/1/11 collocated with A/1/11 to more readily support operations in the "Dodge City" portion of the AO. The same day at 1300H, C/1/11 was displaced to Hill 55 to support operations in southern "Go Noi" Island. Later at 1650H F/2/11 displaced to Hill 55 and upon arrival was chopped to 2/11 for support of Operation Durham Peak.

The month ended with the batteries located as follows: A/1/11 at grid BT01286268, A/1/13 at grid BT07036561, C/1/11 at grid AT96176118, and W/1/11 collocated with A/1/11 at grid BT01286268.

SECRET**b. Intelligence**

The month of July was characterized by an unusually low level of enemy activity within the 1st Marines TACP and the Operation Pipestone Canyon AO. Contact with the enemy was light and scattered. All significant contacts were the result of USMC initiated action as repeated infantry battalion sized operations were conducted in the "Dodge City" area throughout the month.

Intelligence reports indicate that the enemy was using this period of relative quiet for resupply of food and ammunition. A POW from the 111st NVA Regiment revealed under interrogation that he had attended a meeting at which plans were discussed for an upcoming offensive in the Daifon area. Although no specific date was established it is felt that some enemy offensive will be launched in the near future.

c. Maintenance, Equipment and Supply

Throughout the month of July considerable emphasis was placed on maintenance of equipment resulting in a low state of items deadlined for maintenance only. Due to a high deadline rate within the 11th Motor Transport Battalion, nonorganic ammunition resupply was curtailed and ammunition resupply for the battalion was conducted utilizing organic motor transport exclusively. During the month of July "B" Battery was chopped OPCON to the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines. Thereafter logistical support for the battery was provided by 2nd Battalion, 11th Marines through the ISA at An Hoa.

In mid July "A" Battery, 1st Battalion, 13th Marines and Whiskey Battery, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines came under the operational control of 1st Battalion, 11th Marines. Appropriate logistical support for these two batteries was furnished through the battalion's existing logistical system.

A Command Material Management Inspection was held on this battalion during the last week of July and the logistical commodity areas received a satisfactory evaluation.

d. Civic Action/Civil Affairs

The emphasis of the Battalion's Civic Action Program continued to be MEDCAPs and DENTCAPs to Tuy Loan Village. Although the local dispensary in the village is doing quite well in providing medical attention to the local populace, the dental assistance provided by the battalion is still sorely needed. There is always a great deal of response to the dentist's weekly visit.

Arrangements are being made to provide lumber and tin for improvements to stalls in the marketplace and to the local police station. Numerous leaflets and posters were distributed during the month on topics such as personal hygiene, "Chieu Hoi", and VIP fund rewards. The "Ban Tin" newspaper was also distributed through the local information center.

Clothing and educational supplies were received from stateside families, associations and agencies for distribution to orphans and Tuy Loan Villagers. Ammunition boxes were provided for construction of pig troughs and bunkers. The Commanding Officer, Operations Officer and Civil Affairs Officer attended the lecture at Regiment during the month which was designed to familiarize local commanders with the resources available in the Civil Operations Revolutionary Development Support Program.

e. Training

Training remains oriented toward operations as is to be expected. Special emphasis, however, continues to be placed upon GMST and initial orientation of replacement troops. Career planning, medical lectures, weapons safety and operation have received special attention.

As is to be expected OJT remains a mainstay of the battalion's training programs. Newly initiated in the past month was a combined formal FADAC school with OJT for all FDC personnel. Also to participate in this school will be TAD personnel from 2/11.

f. Organization and Operations

Activity in connection with Operation Pipestone Canyon diminished considerably in July. L/4/11 and 3rd Platoon of 3rd 8" Battery reverted to CS on 9 July. Due to decreased operational commitments L/11 FDC displaced to Hill 34 on 10 July and resumed operational control from that position.

Operation Pipestone Canyon was continued in July but was generally confined to land clearing on "Go Noi" Island and battalion sized sweeps in the "Dodge City" area. Both B/1/11 and C/1/11 had displaced during the month to Hill 55 to facilitate support of these activities. The month ended with C/1/11 located on Hill 55.

A/1/13 and W/1/11 became OPCON to L/11 on the 20th. A/1/13 replaced B/1/11 when B/1/11 was chopped to 2/11 on the 19th. W/1/11 was colocated with A/1/11 as the month ended.
