REQUISITIONING PROCEDURE

TO: ALL MEDICAL SUPPLY OFFICERS

1. In order to facilitate the expeditious processing of requisitions received by this depot, it is requested that all Medical Supply Officers strictly comply with the following instructions.

a. Monthly requisitions should be submitted so as to arrive at this depot on the requisitioning date assigned to your station. See attached Inclosure No. 1.

b. It is requested that stations include on every requisition their complete shipping address, and also the telephone number where the Medical Supply Officer can be reached. Express and LCL shipments are often delayed or refused due to incomplete consignee address. Considerable delay occurs each time it is necessary for the depot to contact the station Medical Supply Officer when the correct exchange and telephone number is not available.

c. As soon as the requisition has been processed and filled, this depot will notify the station Medical Supply Officer by telephone that the supplies are ready to be picked up. Due to the fact that this depot has an acute shortage of shipping floor space, it is imperative that the station Medical Supply Officer make arrangements to pick up his supplies on the date he is notified. This applies only to those stations that have in the past been picking up their supplies.

d. Requisitions will be typed, double spaced, and submitted in quadruplicate. Each requisition will show requisition number, item number, nomenclature, unit, control level (authorized allowance), quantity on hand, quantity due in, and quantity required.

- (1) Prior to the date specified by the attached monthly requisition schedule, the Medical Supply Officer should review his stock record cards. Where the quantity on hand, plus that "due in" from the depot (or on back order at the depot), minus "due outs" is less than three-fourths of the station control level, a requisition should be placed for the difference.



(2) The "station control level" is the greatest quantity of an item authorized to be on hand and/or on order at any one time. Since this "station control level" represents the sum of "on hand" and "on order", actual stocks on hand should not reach this level.

e. Basis on all requisitions will indicate appropriate T/O & E, TB/A, SLOE, troop strength, special authority, or other authorization which justifies submission of requisition.

f. Separate requisitions (in quadruplicate) will be prepared for the following classifications of items:

- (1) Non-expendable items.
- (2) Expendable items.
- (3) Alcohol, narcotics, and precious metals.
- (4) Biologicals (refrigerated items).

g. Alcohol, narcotics, and precious metals (security items) must be picked up by a commissioned officer.

h. Requisitions for non-expendable items in excess of T/O & E allowances must be accompanied by a letter of justification showing need for equipment in excess of allowances. Fixed hospitals, dispensaries and laboratories are not required to submit to Headquarters. Eighth Army requests for special authorization to requisition items in excess of T/O & E allowances. See paragraph 3, Section I, Circular number 284, Headquarters Eighth Army, dated 10 October 1946.

i. True emergency requisitions may be submitted at any time the need arises. However, those requisitions must be accompanied by a statement of justification signed by the unit commander showing circumstances requiring emergency issue of supplies.

j. Requisitions will be honored only if prepared in accordance with this memorandum, numbered serially, bear Account Number, and are signed by the Medical Supply Officer or Accountable Officer.

2. Medical Supply Memorandum No. 1 and attached Inclosure No. 1, dated 21 October 1946, are hereby rescinded and the above instructions substituted therefor.
