I, LOY W. HENDERSON, state that during the years 1936, 1937 and the first half of 1938 I served as First Secretary of the American Embassy at Moscow. At times during this period, in the absence of the American Ambassador, I was Charge d'Affaires ad interim at Moscow.

In my capacity as Charge d'Affaires, or as First
Secretary of the Embassy, I had numerous conversations
with Mr. SHIGEMITSU while the latter was Japanese
Ambassador to the Soviet Union. As a result of these
conversations, as well as of talks of a personal
nature, I came to the firm belief that Mr. SHIGEMITSU
was out of sympathy with the expansionist and aggressive policies of the Japanese militarists and
was deeply concerned lest their growing influence might
involve Japan in a world war; that he was endeavoring
to prevail upon his Government not to follow an expansionist policy or to look upon war, or the threat of
war as a legitimate means for attain political objectives;
and that he was sincerely striving to bring about a

liquidation

liquidation by friendly negotiation of the differences existing at that time between the U.S.S.R. and Japan.

Mr. SHIGEMITSU was frank during the course of our various conversations in condemning the aggressive policies of the Japanese militarists toward China and in deploring the tendencies of the Japanese Government to cooperate with the Axis powers rather than with the great democracies of the West.

During my association with Mr. SHIGEMITSU I came to have the highest regard for him because I believed him to be a man of personal integrity and idealism, a belief which was shared by most members of the American Embassy at Moscow.
