

My dear Mr. Ambassador,



1. Attached for information is copy of letter, 26 June 1946, from Minister Counselor of former Siamese Embassy to Diplomatic Section regarding 243 cases of official Siamese property and personal effects of official personnel as well as approximately 96 pieces of luggage belonging to non-official Siamese, which are expected to accompany the Siamese repatriation party.

2. Cases in question are additional to approximately 15 tons of naval supplies understood to have been cleared for export by ESS/IE under direct arrangement with Lt. Pongpanit of former Embassy.

NOTE FOR RECORD (1)

1. Major White, G-3 Repatriation, stated that it is impossible, because of charter conditions, for the Siamese to be repatriated on July 3 on the S/S John Ouster, now in Uraga.

2. It is planned that Siamese should go on a Japanese hospital ship, the Arimesan-maru, which will arrive from China in Kyushu (either Sasebo or Hakata) about July 9.

3. The IJG will be instructed to transport the Siamese Embassy's 243 cases of archives and property together with the Naval Attache's 15 tons of naval goods to the port and put them aboard ship. The IJG will also be asked to furnish transportation to the port for the 45 members of the repatriating party and their luggage, and will be instructed also to keep in touch with ESS/IE regarding the transportation of the naval goods, for which ESS/IE has issued an export permit.

4. Food on the repatriation ship will be furnished by the Eighth Army.

5. G-3 Repatriation expects the Siamese to pay all costs of railway transportation. The Siamese have orally agreed.

Note for Record (2)

1. The Siamese Minister Counselor called at Diplomatic Section 27 June, 3:30 p.m., and was orally given the contents of the attached NOTE FOR RECORD (1).

2. Lt. Col. Hudgins, G-1, stated that there would be no baggage limitations for the Siamese official repatriates or for the private Siamese subjects accompanying them.

3. He further stated that the principles of radio WX-93860, 22 Jan 1946, would be applied to this repatriation.

4. Lt. Col. Hudgins also said that all relevant documents and instructions were being sent to the Eighth Army and that Eighth Army would maintain liaison with Mr. Johnson (Yokohama Branch - Diplomatic Section) in regard to the details of the Siamese repatriation.

I beg to submit herewith a list of official property including archives of the Siamese Government and personal belongings which the Siamese Diplomatic Mission desire to take along with them on their forthcoming repatriation.

These do not include personal effects of the students to be repatriated with the Mission. Their personal luggages may be estimated on the average of 3 pieces to one person which would make additional luggages of about 96 pieces.

It is estimated that the entire lot would weigh about 15 tons and would have a volume of about 100 cubic meters.

I shall be indeed very grateful to the General Headquarters for arrangements to transport the above-mentioned property from the Siamese Embassy building in Tokyo to the ship that will be assigned for our repatriation as was kindly done in previous cases.

SUBJECT : THE SIAMESE EMBASSY BUILDING.
TO : THE SUPREME COMMANDER FOR THE ALLIED
POWERS.
THROUGH : G-2 FOREIGN LIAISON SECTION.

With reference to the Siamese Government's offer of the use of the Siamese Embassy building in Tokyo to the Allied Occupation Forces, the Minister and Counselor of the Siamese Embassy, in charge of Siamese interests in Japan begs to invite consideration and decision of the Allied Occupation authorities on the following matters pertaining to the building in question.

1. Whether a detached house at the rear of the building in the Embassy's compound now occupied by a Japanese house-keeper and his family will be required. The Japanese house-keeper in question has been in the service of the Siamese Government for nearly 30 years. Such being the case and if there be no objection on the part of the Allied Occupation authorities, it is desired to reserve the detached house for the use of the house-keeper in question.
2. Whether a Siamese servant and his family who are living in a wooden shed in the compound of the Embassy will be permitted to continue living there. This servant has been in the employment of the Siamese Government for several years and desires to stay on in Japan.
3. Besides these two employees the Siamese Embassy has three maids, one gardener and one stoker. Whether the service of these employees would be required at the Embassy building by the Allied Occupation authorities.
4. Whether the Allied Occupation authorities desire the use of all furnitures, rugs, curtains, art objects and other household articles some of which are stored in the basement safe.
5. There are two strong rooms in the compound of the Embassy and one safe room in the basement of the building
