Definition: Willing, eager, or able to talk or impart information.

Example : Lew was a very communicative chap

2.- Compound (Noun)

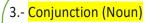
Definition: A thing consisting of two or more separate things combined together

17.- Structure (noun)

Definition: the way in which the parts of something are connected together, arranged or organized; a particular arrangement of parts
