1.- Communicative (Adjective)

Definition:Willing, eager, or able to talk or impart information.

Example : Lew was a very communicative chap

Pronunciation : /kə'mju:nɪkətɪv/

Synonym: **talkative**

2.- Compound (Noun)

Definition: A thing consisting of two or more separate things combined together

Example : A compound sentence is common to do.

Pronunciation : /'kɑ:mpaʊnd/

3.- Conjunction (Noun)

Definition: A word that joins words, phrases or sentences,

Example : Then they turned bottom side up, **and** continued to roll

Pronunciation : /kən'dʒʌŋkʃn/

4.- Conjunctive adverbs

Definition: Parts of speech that are used to connect one clause to another

Example : Jeremy kept talking in class; therefore, he got in trouble.

5: Correlative conjunction (grammar)

Definition: Pairs of words that connect words, phrases or clauses. Examples: both...and, either....or, not only...but also.

Example : I want **either** the cheesecake **or** the chocolate cake.

6.- Declarative sentence

Definition: A sentence that makes a statement or declaration

Example : My dog is sick.

Pronunciation : /dɪ'klærətɪv/ /'sentəns/

7.-Essay (noun)

Definition: A short piece of writing by a student as part of a course of study

Example : I think that my essay is not good.

8.-_Exclamatory sentence

Definition: A sentence expressing strong feeling, usually punctuated with an exclamation mark.

Example : There is a monster !

9.- Facts (noun)

Definition: A thing that is known to be true, especially when it can be proved

Example : This is a fact of life.

10.-Grammar (noun)

Definition: The rules in a language for changing the form of words and joining them into sentences

Example : The basic rules of grammar

Pronunciation : /'græmə/

11.- Habits (noun)

Definition: Fixed behaviors that you use automatically

Example : I have many habits that I need to change.

12.- Imperative sentence (grammar)

Definition: Sentence used to command, enjoin, implore, or entreat.

Example : Don't close the door.

Pronunciation : /ɪm'perətɪv// 'sentəns/

13:- Mechanics (noun)

Definition: Indicates the conventions of spelling, punctuation, quotation, and capitalization of edited American English

Example : There is a monster!

14.- Parallel (noun)

Definition: two or more lines that are parallel to each other are the same distance apart at every point

Example : Though still a committed painter, in 1978 she launched a parallel career as a photographer.

15.-Past perfect (grammar)

Definition: Tense with the past participle and helping verb HAD

Example : I had been in New York.

16.-Poetry

Definition: Poems in general; poems as a genre of literature

Example : There was poetry in all her gestures.

18.- Past tense (grammar)

Definition: Shows action that has already happened

Example : I went to the school yesterday.

17.- Structure (noun)

Definition: the way in which the parts of something are connected together, arranged or organized; a particular arrangement of parts

Example : Sub+verb+complement.

Pronunciation : /'strʌktʃər/

19: Rationale (noun)

Definition: A word that joins words, phrases or sentences,

Example : The rationale behind the changes is not at all evident

20.- Rhetorical (adjective)

Definition: (of a question) Asked only to make a statement or to produce an effect rather than to get an answer

Example : 'Don't you care what I do?' he asked, but it was a rhetorical question.

Pronunciation : /rɪ'tɔ:rɪkl/

21.- **Semantics** (noun)

Definition: The study of the meanings of words and phrases

Example : The semantics of the language

23.- **Syntax**

Definition: the way that words and phrases are put together to form sentences in a language; the rules of grammar for this

Example : The instructions were not carried out because of a syntax error
