# BEAUTIFUL OHIO INTRODUCED FALL OF 1935

Introduced by Heberling's Gladiolus, Inc., Easton, Ill.

Originated by Mr. J. A. Hullibarger, Route 1, Box 203, Bowling Green, Ohio.

The Originator, Mr. Hullibarger, preferred the name Miss Ohio, but accepted our suggestion of Beautiful Ohio.

The spikes are thirty-six to forty-six inches tall. The flower head is sixteen to eighteen inches long, with sixteen to twenty open flowers and buds to the spike. The flower head and placement are of the Minuet type. The spike is straight and strong and does not crook in heat.

The substance is as heavy or heavier than Minuet and florets are set close to the spike and flowers open wide.

The color is best described as Tyrian Pink and is almost a self except for a slightly lighter rib in the center of each petal and a touch of Tyrian Rose in the throat. For those who do not have a color chart I would say it is a beautiful light rose with a tint of lavender. The color is unusually clear.

Beautiful Ohio has been bred where our summer days are hot and the spike and flower will stand an unusual amount of heat without burning. Spikes did not burn in the summers of 1934 and 1936 which were the hottest on record.

Beautiful Ohio produces bulblets in about the same quantities as Minuet and about the same size. They germinate quite well, much better than Minuet bulblets. Without special care those we planted this season germinated from seventy-five to eighty per cent.

In the spring of 1935 we purchased one-half of the stock of Beautiful Ohio and since then have grown in in our own gardens. The originator, Mr. Hullibarger, is owner of the other half and is offering his stock at the same prices as quoted below.

Beautiful Ohio was awarded the Blue Ribbon in the three spike class at the New England Gladiolus Show at Boston in 1936. Beautiful Ohio in mixed basket was awarded gold medal at the same show.

#### REPORT FROM E. A. LINS, TRIAL GARDENS, SPRING GREEN, WIS.

September 12, 1936.

"Beautiful Ohio planted May 21st, bloomed August 17th. Forty-eight inches or more tall, carried twenty (20) buds  $4\frac{3}{4}$  to 5 inches when open. Opens six with six buds in color. Spike always straight, medium weight, medium upright healthy foliage. Placement very good and very good facing. Blooms of good substance. Very good pink. Considering the drought and 114 degree heat we had in the shade I feel this performed exceptionally well."

## GOLDEN LANCER

#### **OUR 1936 INTRODUCTION**

A large Pinard Yellow, with short delicate rose red lines in throat, producing spikes from 40 to 48 inches tall. The florets measure from  $4\frac{1}{2}$  to 5 inches in size with four to six open. The spikes carry from 18 to 21 buds and flowers which are well placed on a long flower head. Golden Lancer produced the largest florets of any yellow in our garden the past season. It is a strong, sturdy plant with healthy foliage and produces clean healthy bulbs. Both bulbs and bulblets possess great vitality and practically all of the bulblets germinate. It produces many large bulblets and many of them, if planted early, will make bulbs of size one and two the first season under favorable conditions. I regard this variety as a very outstanding commercial yellow. A few of these bulbs were sent to customers last season for trial under the name of Seedling No. 101 and we have some very good reports from them.

## IRRIGATION SUCCESSFUL WITH GLADIOLUS

#### EASTON GROWER HAS TWENTY ACRES OF CHOICE FLOWERS

A visit to J. H. Heberling's gladiolus field at Easton is of unusual interest. Regardless of the hot, dry, and parched season there are 20 acres of beautiful green and blooming spikes. Thousands of beautiful gladiolus spikes have been shipped from the Mason City express office to every part of the state and even beyond.

#### HAS IRRIGATION SYSTEM

One naturally asks how was this remarkable crop secured in this year of heat and drought. Irrigation answers the whole question. The 20-acre tract adjoins Easton on the southeast being easily accessible to the town.

Mr. Heberling has established a complete system of overhead irrigation which embraces the entire 20-acre tract. About half of this field is sprayed from overhead pipes and this section can all be watered in a period of 48 hours. These

pipes are placed at a height of from five to six feet and are properly distanced to cover all the ground between each two rows of pipes. Water is forced through apertures in the pipes by means of a gasoline force pump. The other half of the field is watered by two immense oscillating sprayers which may be moved from place to place over the field. They are connected with the main pumping station with movable pipes. These immense sprays move back and forth with a heavy spray of water which will cover a tract of ground 60 by 120 feet. When an inch of water has been sprayed the sprayers are moved on to the next 120 feet until this entire half is watered.

Mr. Heberling has an inexhaustible water supply from two wells only 50 feet deep. The irrigating pumps have been operated 24 hours a day all summer and 90,000 gallons of water have been pumped on to the field every 24 hours.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT**

Prior to 1933 Heberling's Gladiolus had been exhibited at two American Gladiclus Society Shows and four Illinois Gladiolus Society Shows. In these six exhibitions they were awarded 13 silver cups, one silver pitcher, eight gold medals, 17 silver medals, and 18 bronze medals. They won ten purple ribbons, 109 blue ribbons, 73 red ribbons, and 43 white ribbons.

At the Indiana Gladiolus Society Show, 1933, at LaPorte, Indiana, in which the American and Michigan Gladiolus Societies participated, Heberling's Gladiolus won the Konyenburg and Mark Challenge Cup for the third time in five years—thereby gaining permanent possession of it. This trophy was awarded for the best display of varieties originated by Wilhelm Pfitzer, Ltd., of whose varieties we have one of the finest collections in America.

At the Illinois Gladiolus Society Show at A Century of Progress Exposition, Chicago, August 12-14, 1933, Heberling's Gladiolus were awarded A Century of Progress Gold Medal for the best display of gladiolus arranged for educational and artistic effect. They were awarded the I. G. S. Challenge Trophy for the best basket of gladiolus in the Commercial Division, and they were awarded the American Gladiolus Society Gold Achievement Medal for winning the most points in the First or Commercial Division.

The Illinois Gladiolus Society on August 24, 1935, awarded to Heberling's Gladiolus Blue Ribbon and cash award for best large commercial display at Canton, Illinois. Display occupied five hundred square feet.

The Illinois Gladiolus Society on August 22, 1936, awarded to Heberling's Gladiolus Inc., 44 Blue Ribbons, 16 Red Ribbons, and 12 White Ribbons. These awards included First Award for the 300 square feet, 150 square feet, and 100 square feet, all commercial displays. Also First for the 100 square foot Island Display. Special Award was made to the Island Display for being the most outstanding. Our introduction, Beautiful Ohio, received four First Awards in its color class.
