



CONDITIONS OF SALE.

The Lots to be taken away at the Buyer's Expense and Risk, within three days from the conclusion of the Sale, and the remainder of the Purchase Money to be absolutely paid, or otherwise settled for, to the satisfaction of the Vendor, on or before delivery; in default of which Messrs. Geo. A. Leavitt & Co. will not hold themselves responsible if the Lots be lost, stolen, damaged, or destroyed, but they will be left at the sole risk of the Purchaser.
- 4. The Sale of any Painting, Engraving, Print, Furniture, Works of Art, or any other article, is not to be set aside on account of any error in the description. All articles are exposed for Public Exhibition one or more days, and are sold just as they are without recourse.
- 5. To prevent maccuracy in delivery, and inconvenience in the settlement of the Purchases, no Lot can, on any account, be removed during the Sale.
- 6. Upon failure of complying with the above conditions, the money deposited in part payment shall be forfeited; all Lots uncleared within the time aforesaid shall be re-sold by public or private Sale, without further notice, and the deficiency (if any) attending such re-sale, shall be made good by the Defaulter at this Sale, together with all charges attending the same. This Condition is without prejudice to the right of the Auctioneers to enforce the contract made at this Sale, without such re-sale, if they think fit.

The scene reproduced by the artist was suggested by Racine's tragedy. Bajazet was brother of Amurat, fourth Sultan of the Turkish Empire, who ascended the throne 1623. This sovereign had designated from among his wives Roxana to bear the title of Sultana. This lady forgot the debt of gratitude she owed to him who had preferred her to her rivals, in abandoning herself without scruples to the passion she felt awakening in her heart for Bajazet. She was in possession of an order for his death, that Amurat had confided to her prior to his departure for the Conquest of Babylonia. Roxana did not long hide from the knowledge of this prince the power with which she was clothed, and, furthermore, oftered to aid him to usurp the throne, if he would put himself at the head of a revolt which would result in the death of Amurat, on condition he would marry her. Bajazet had long loved Attahda, his cousin, an obscure personage at the imperial court. Roxana, annoyed by the repeated refusals of Bajazet, ordered his assassination; she herself was soon put to death by a messenger sent by Amurat, who had been secretly informed of her projects of treason toward her master.



The old brown binding of pine tree leather, and the small, thick duodecimo size, have all the character of a work published in 1812. "Companions of my sad hie journey, now dispersed abroad. O my friends! O you who were so dear to me, gather up my faulty songs as your legacy—save from oblivion a few of my verses. And you for whom I die! women! you whom I forgive, your outlines still present themselves before my troubled vision like a sunbeam in autumn or a dream at daybreak. Gentle visions, approach! My shade implores of you one final memento of regret and love. Strew at the foot of my cypress the leaves of the roses which live but for a day."

Translation of Mr. Gerome's letter to the owner of the picture.

PARIS, 22d March, 1878,

65 BOULEVARD DE CLICHY.

DEAR SIR:

When I arrived in London, the year of the war, with my wife and children, I had neither brushes, canvas, colors or costumes. I soon made the necessary acquisitions, and as I found some Italians near at hand, I hastened to profit by this in employing them as models. I recollect the picture, but it would be difficult to appreciate its full value, considering the length of time; but I remember that it had much success at Mr. Wallis' exhibition in Pall Mall. I know that I did it carefully and labored on it sufficiently to finish it properly, so I may say without any fear of mistake that the work is respectable, worthy of me and worthy of figuring in any serious collection of works of art. of figuring in any serious collection of works of art.
