Appointed Chief of the Mavy General Staff; succeeds Admiral Shigetero SHIMADA. Formerly Chief of Staff of the Mavy Station of Kure; Commander of the Maval Air Arm; and in 1938 Commander of the Japanese Fleet in Chinese waters; in 1940 he took over the command of the Yokosuka Maval Station and was Haval Minister in 1940 and 1941; he was a member of the Supreme War Council.

(88) A strict disciplinarian. In 1938 reported as able to get along with foreigners fairly well. (163) A member of a well to do family, his naval career began as a hobby. He is a great reader, interested particularly in history, philisophy and religion, and an authority on Chinese affairs. (88)
