Forwarded herewith G-2 Foreign Liaison translation: a) No. 456, dated 10 June 1949, "Cities of USSR, Dvyskiy Settlement, Suburb of Aleksandrovsk, Sakhalin," extracted from the Soviet daily newspaper, "Sovetskiy Sakhalin," published in YUZHNO-SAKHALINSK, 12 June 1948; b) No. 457 dated 10 June 1948, "Cities of USSR, Construction of Roads in City of Aleksandrovsk, Sakhalin," extracted from "SOVETSKIY SAKHALINSK" 13 June 1948 issue.

The foregoing translations are quoted verbatim:

STUDENT SETTLEMENT IS IMPROVED

a) "In 1939 six ten-apartment homes were built on the outskirts of Aleksandrovsk (50°54'N 142°10'E) as a small settlement for the workers of the Aleksandrovsk coal trust. However, the managers of the trust did not take care of this settlement and it finally fell into disrepair; the streets were full of holes and were nearly impassable, and there was not a single tree or bit of green around the homes.

Not long ago the Sakhalin coal trust gave some of the homes of the Dvyskiy settlement to the newly organized mining school. The students and faculty decided to improve the area themselves, and pledged themselves to dig 1,640 feet of drain gutters,

to build one cross-bridge and 820 feet of sidewalk, to equip a sports field and gymnastic platform, to plant 250 trees, to lay out flower beds, and to pave 400 feet of roadway with stone...

Already 1800 feet of drain ditches have been built, 575 feet of roadway has been prepared for stone paving and gardening work has been done. Moreover, the students have completed a major overhaul of one home, remodeling it as a boarding house. It will be called "Studencheskiy Gorodok" (Student's Town.)"

b) "About one and a half miles of new, paved road, 32,400 square feet of sidewalks and 7,500 feet of lawn strips are being built by the citizens of Aleksandrovsk (50°54'N, 142°10'E)... When a "Voskresnik" (mass gatherings for extra work on free days) was held for planting trees in the city, hundreds of citizens took part and 12 automobiles were used. More than two thousand trees were planted, considerably more than was planned, and the 15 May Square was completely planted. In the third ten days of May alone more than 3,200 square feet of pavement was laid and about 14,000 cubic feet of paving stone and gravel were brought to the construction site."

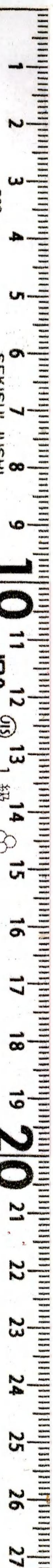

Forwarded herewith G-2 Foreign Liaison translation (a) No. 156, dated 10 June 1958, "Cities of USSR, Daily Settlement, Journal of Aleksandrovsk, Sakhalin," extracted from the Soviet daily newspaper, "Sovetskaya Sakhalin," published in YUZHO-SAKHALINSK, 15 June 1958; (b) No. 157 dated 10 June 1958, "Cities of USSR, Construction of Roads in City of Aleksandrovsk, Sakhalin," extracted from "SOVETSKAYA SAKHALINSK" 13 June 1958 issue.

The foregoing translations are quoted verbatim:

STUDENT SETTLEMENT IS IMPROVED

(a) "In 1958 six ten-apartment houses were built on the outskirts of Aleksandrovsk (50° 54' N 142° 10' E) as a small settlement for the workers of the Aleksandrovsk coal tract. However, the managers of the tract did not take care of this settlement and it finally fell into disrepair; the streets were full of holes and were nearly impassable, and there was not a single tree or bit of green around the houses.

Not long ago the Sakhalin coal tract gave some of the houses of the Dvynsk settlement to the newly organized mining school. The students and faculty decided to improve the area themselves, and pledged themselves to dig 1,000 feet of drain gutters,

to build one cross-bulldoze and 820 feet of sidewalk, to equip a sports field and gymnastic stadium, to plant 250 trees, to lay out flower beds, and to have 100 feet of roadway with stone...

Already 1800 feet of drain ditches have been dug, and 100 feet of roadway has been prepared for stone paving and guttering work. Moreover, the students have completed a major overhaul of one house, and a boarding house. It will be called "Stechencheskiy Gorodok" (Stechencheskiy).

(b) "About one and a half miles of new streets are being built in the city of Aleksandrovsk (50° 54' N 142° 10' E) ... When a "Vozzrenie" (View) ... was held for planting trees in the city, more than two thousand trees were planted, considerably more than was planned, and the 15 May Square was completely planted. In the third ten days of May alone more than 5,000 square feet of pavement was laid and about 14,000 cubic feet of paving stone and gravel were brought to the construction site."

Forwarded herewith G-2 translation No 415, dated 27 May 1949, "Towns and Villages in USSR, Growth of Mining Settlement Dolinskaya on Sakhalin," an extract from the Soviet daily newspaper "Sovetskiy Sakhalin," published in YUZHNO-SAKHALINSK, 27 June 1948.

The translation is quoted verbatim:

"In the mining village of Dolinskaya [possibly near Dolinsk, 47°20'N 142°47'E] 200 homes were repaired and 12 new homes constructed. By the end of the year construction of no less than 20 homes will be completed. Preparations are being made for the construction of a new club.

There are eight stores, a movie theater, four mess halls, two bakeries and a tea room. An equipped, mechanized laundry is in operation as well as three barber shops, shoe repair shop, a tailor shop, two bath houses and a photo shop."

About 150 acres are reserved for individual gardening where more than 800 families of miners planted potatoes and other vegetables.

There is a hospital, a dispensary, drug store, and an under-ground first aid station. The hospital has modern equipment. Two telephone switchboards are in operation and there is a well equipped radio relay point connected with 200 apartments. In 1949, there will be 2000 dwellings equipped with radio. Every apartment has electric lighting.

There is a hotel with 20 beds, a nursery, a kindergarten, one primary and one secondary school. The settlement has a trade school where 200 students are studying the mining profession. Next year a rest home will be opened in a picturesque locality not far from the settlement. Miners have opportunity to visit southern resorts of the country.

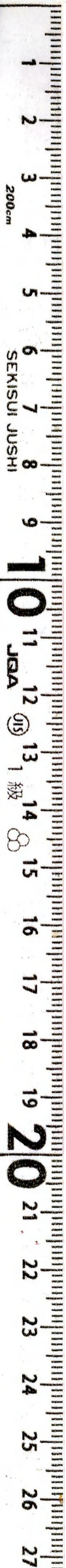

1. It is requested that the following information be furnished this Headquarters as soon as possible for transmittal to Director of Intelligence, United States Air Force:

a. Copy of compilation instructions and overlay for each chart, map, or city plan produced by Allied Translator and Interpreter Section, which show the reliability of:

- (1) Cartographic base.
- (2) Existence of industrial installations as shown.
- (3) Accuracy of placement of each industrial installation.
- (4) Existence of specific structures with industrial installations shown.
- (5) Accuracy of placement of specific structures within installations shown.

2. There is an urgent immediate and continuing requirement by United States Air Force for this information relative to all city plans already produced or to be produced by Allied Translator and Interpreter Section.

TO: Assistant Chief of Staff, A-2, Far East Air Forces, APO 925

1. The Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2 (Translator and Interpreter Service) is unable to completely fulfill the request contained in basic communication due to continuing personnel shortages and to pressure of other intelligence commitments.

2. Inclosed is list of city plans which have been published by Translator and Interpreter Service to date, indicating cartographic bases, together with supplementary compilation information utilized in the preparation of these plans.

3. An analysis of the reliability of information on each industrial installation, based on the number of observations and reports used, would be inconclusive, since it must be evaluated on the basis that 95 percent of the material is derived from observations, estimates and opinions of repatriates who are untrained in observing and reporting information of this type.

4. Source material requested by the Far East Air Forces, however, will be made available to the Air Liaison Section now working with Central Interrogation Center, Translator and Interpreter Service, for extraction and reproduction as desired. Translator and Interpreter Service personnel will render all assistance possible to the Air Liaison Group.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Basic is request fr CG, FEAF, to C-in-C, requesting copies of compilation instructions and overlays for each map, chart and city plan produced by ATIS, together with an evaluation of the reliability of the information on each industrial installation shown.

2. Estimates indicate that approximately 1,056 man hours would be required to accomplish the necessary analysis incident to evaluating information requested, exclusive of time necessary to duplicate source material. It is felt that this request entails unwarranted expenditure on the part of ATIS and falls properly within the function of the FEAF Air Liaison Group of two (2) officers and four (4) DACs presently with ATIS Central Interrogation Center.

3. In above connection, G-2 furnished FEAF on 24 May 49, at their request made in ltr, subj: "Geographic Data", 11 May 49, fifteen (15) negatives of city plans produced by ATIS.
