NARCISSI

Narissi are probably the favorite flowers of the garden in early spring, and by proper selection of varieties the blooming season will reach from March until early May. Of the easiest culture in both house and garden, the massive trumpets of the Ajax section or the dainty blooms of the smaller varieties are alike satisfactory.

PRICES

Prices here quoted are for sound healthy bulbs and roots of full standard blooming sizes and are delivered free to buyer.

PLANTING

In the case of tulips and narcissi the bulbs should be planted about four times their size below the surface but peonies should not have the topmost eye more than 2 inches below the surface. In every case the soil should be well drained, rich and porous but no green manure. Peonies will do well in very heavy clay if well enriched. In fact, no flowers will thrive under neglect, so don't expect that you can get the best results without care. Love is the keynote to success with flowers as well as with humanity.

Tulips, Hyacinths and Narcissus bulbs as well as Peony roots may be successfully planted from September 1st until the ground freezes, but the better way is to plant during September and October.
