



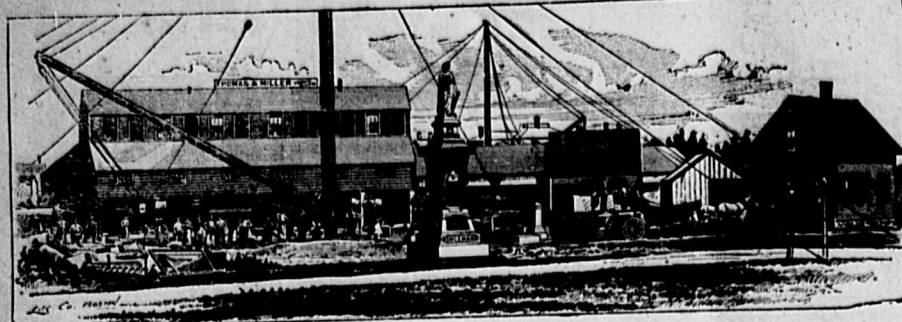

FARM GARDEN

ELECTRICITY AND POULTRY.

The Hen Man Presses the Button, and Electricity does the Rest.

Below is a description of Mr. O. W. Borden's improved poultry house, as detailed by him in The Rural New Yorker. These houses are intended to accommodate 40 hens each. The hens are housed in two rows over stony hillside pasture fields. No yards are used in connection with them, and they are set eight rods distant from each other, allowing about 100 hens to the acre. By means of an improved feedbox any number of flocks can be fed simultaneously, each in its own house, by simply pressing an electric button. The doors can be opened or closed in the same way.

Each house is 12 feet long by 10 wide, 8 feet high in front and 5 feet 4 inches in the rear. The floor and roof are of matched spruce, the siding is of matched pine. The roof is covered with 2-ply tarred roofing felt, and the sides are lined with single ply tarred paper. The floor is covered in winter with a good coating of dry earth. This is to stop any drafts from coming up through the floor, and also to prevent a good dust bath for the hens. The roof should be painted occasionally with coal tar. Once a year is sufficient. An hour can be spent in cleaning the house out, and laying a wide board over it after he has put in the feed, the hens will find it impossible to get into the feed box, or to deposit any droppings in it. If they now raise the board a few inches, their breakfast is ready. Now raise the board a few inches from the floor, and it takes a lively bird to scratch any litter from the floor into it. The cover is fastened in this way. As one touches the button, the electric feedbox or hopper. The small door on the floor, which is held open by pulleys and drops of its own weight when the catch which holds it is released. The electromagnet seems to do this, and also to operate the hopper, which is placed in the bottom of the feedbox, allowing the grain to fall to the floor. In fall, it strikes a metal disk, which scatters it and warns birds that supper is ready. It is interesting to note that the button, which seems to touch a nerve in each individual member of the flock. Instantly every head goes up, and every eye looks toward the button. The cost of lumber and material for such a house is about \$35.

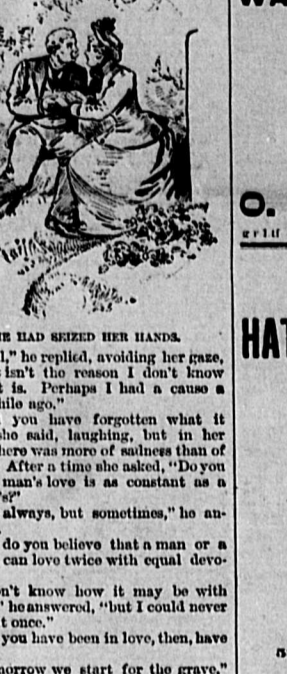
