## What is Yet to be Done.

The first step is taken, the first tangible indication given of the character which our next Council will bear, if the Whigs should prove triumphant. The candidates already the public may feel proud to support, such honesty and ability, if they be put into office. Some Whig aspirants have not received a nomination, yet we doubt not they will lend their entire influence and votes to carry triumphantly the entire Whig ticket through the contest in which it is now engaged. The feeling displayed on Tuesday night was excellent. The most reliable men have taken up the matter at last, and seem determined to rest in the back ground no longer. Our elections have passed away from mere cliques and reckless office seekers, we hope forever.

The next step in the good work is soon to be made, and it behooves those entrusted with its responsibility to be careful how they move. They should seriously consider what are the respective duties of the officers of the city, and who, among the number of those whose names are submitted to them as candidates possess most eminently those qualifications best adopted for fulfilling these duties, combined with popularity among the the people. For without the former, a candidate elected would prove a misfortune to the party, as well as to the city; and without the latter, no matter what might be his qualifications, he could scarcely be expected to be elected. The office of Mayor is one of great importance, great trusts and responsibilities, and it requires a man of firmness. shrewdness, honor and honesty to faithfully and efficiently perform its duties. We do not think that great abilities are absolutely re- failure of a "Savings Bank." quired, although they would be acceptable. It is a fortunate thing that the simple, plain. explicit system adopted in most of our institutions, is capable of being comprehended by any ordinary intellect. While, therefore, transcendent abilities are not out of place in any respectable office, those of a much more moderate quality may be fully equal to all its demands. Honesty is the great desid-

So of other offices. A peculiar fitness is probably requisite for each; as, for in stance, that which would pre-eminently qualify a man for Marshal, might be but a poor recommendation for City Attorney or Comptroller. It is for the Delegates to consider all these questions, and to decide with an eye to the interests of the city. There is much for our next corporation to do. The city is in great need of suitable jails for the safe keeping of prisoners. It is in much need of some system for supplying it and the inhabitants with water. It needs to have the streets lighted. It needs a good ystem of police. It needs many other things too numerous to mention here, and it needs men who are capable of supplying these and weighing five pounds and a half. wants, as far as they are reasonable, and the means can legitimately be obtained. It needs men bold and honest enough to inscribe 'reform' upon their banner and stamp it upon their conduct in municipal affairs. It needs men of financial acilities equal to the task of conducting the city through the sea of indebtedness in which she is nearly upon the point of foundering, without wrecking her. The delegates have therefore a very important task before them, to select the best men within their power, to accomplish all these and a thousand other necessary things. The signs are propitious. The right spirit seems prevalent. We shall triumph gloriously if we are wise, industrious, energetic; yielding a little when necessary for the good of the whole. We have never seen so promising a spirit among the Whigs in California before. Let us cultivate it, reaping, like wise men, all the advantages to which it leads.

MARCH OF IMPROVEMENT .- We thall soon be compelled to employ a special reporter to keep pace with the improvements of our city. Two months ago, the street above the Oriental Hotel, was a high sand-hill, over which it was excessive labor to climb; and that portion of Sansome and Davis streets, stowards Happy Valley, was a sand heap, which tried one's footing to walk over. Now, those streets are finely graded, and planked nearly to completion. Water lots are being filled up, and fine warehouses and buildings are going up in all directions. Rincon Point is also covered with comfortable, and in some instances, handsome houses, where, five or six weeks ago, only two or three shanties stood, and in a short time it will form a pleasant part of the city.

THE NAPA MURDER.-We understand that the time for the execution of McCauley, has been extended by the Governor. He was to have been hanged on Monday next, the 14th. Much feeling exists against the murderer, as well as against the Executive for his interference. The murder was a cold-blooded unprovoked outrage, and with as few mitigating circumstances as any similar offense in California. The people feel mighty like taing the law into their own hands.

Institutions known as "Savings Banks," properly organized, and, with the necessary safeguards thrown around them to prevent fraud and dishonesty, are of great utility to the poorer and laboring classes, enabling them to lay away, and accumulate, little by little, an aggregate of funds that shall prove of essential use, which, without a place of deposite of the kind, would, in nine cases out of ten, be squandered in profitless pleasure. For the poor, laboring classes, are these institutions especially designed. The rich have no need of them. They are their own bankers, and can protect themselves from loss by accident or bad management; or from swindling cashiers and managers.

These institutions then, being especially designed for the convenience of men of limited means, too many safe-guards cannot be thrown around them to prevent fraud. But is this the case in California? One or two already exist in our city, and a design is now on foot to organize another on a large scale. But are these institutions safe depositories selected are generally such as the party and of the little bags of toil-carned dust of the miner? Is there any responsibility attached as to give a guarantee of fidelity, vigilance, to the managers, or any confidence to be placed in their operations? Is not the dust and coin quite as safe in the hands of the owner, as in those of any other private individual? Should a flaming gilt sign " Savings Bank," induce confidence more than the "shingle" of a lawyer, a physician, a printer, or a dealer in Manila sugar and Southong tea ? We fancy not. Yet hundreds, who come down from the mines, will be induced to deposite their all in some one of these institutions, and we much fear that by-and-by, there will be less cash in bank than is necessary to balance the pass-book.

We throw out these suggestions for the protection of community. Depositors should think before they act; should look well to and held a secret session for two or three the responsibility of these "Saving Banks" before they are trusted with deposits. If they are in a sound, healthy condition, they reverse, they will dodge the test of public scrutiny, and finally "close," leaving the poor to shed tears over the results of mis- presided. placed confidence. In other States, guarded as they have been by stringent laws, these institutions have swindled many an honest laborer out of his hard earnings. So much greater the necessity for caution, then, in California, where there are no safeguards, no legal organizations, no definite responsibility resting any where, no directors to hold up before the community, and no one to look to for reimbursement, in case of a

Opening of the British Parliament

Our English friends hereabouts will be interested in the following description of the session of Parliament for 1851, which was done by her Majesty in person, on Tuesday. February 4th .:

The doors of the House of Lords were thrown open at twelve o'clock, and shortly after the peeresses and other ladies who had obtained orders from the Lord Great Chamberlain began to arrive, and continued to do so until the House was crowded by a galaxy of beauty and fashion, greater and fashion, greater and more diversified than we have ever witnessed on a similar occasion. There was also an unusual number of peers udges, and foreign ministers present.

That portion of the House which is set apart

for the foreign ministers was crowded, the rep-scutatives of almost all the States of Europe being present.
Shortly before two o'clock, the Lord Chan-

cellor took his seat on the woolsack, and soon

after the booming of caunon announced the Her Majesty, who was attired in a white satin brocade dress embroidered with gold, and wore a splendid tiara of diamonds, entered the House at twenty minutes past two o'clock, being led by the Prince Consort (who wore a field mar-shal's uniform, with the Order of the Garter.) and accompanied by the officers of state, her-alds, pages, &c. Her Majesty appeared in ex-cellent health and spirits, and whilst waiting for the attendance of the Commons, entered into conversation with the Duchess of Sutherland, by whem she was attended. The Marquis of Lansdowne bore the crown, the Duke of Wellington the sword of state, and the Marquis

of Winchester the cap of maintenance. The Prince Consort were crape on his left arm as mourning for the Queen of the Bel-

gians.
When her Majesty had ascended the throne the whole House rose, and remained standing until her Majesty motioned the House to be seated. At this period, the scene presented was of a most brilliant and dazzling character, and one which might justly cause the heart of an Englishman to beat with pride and exultation. The sun who so often lends his rays to gild these gorgeous spectacles, shone with unusual splendor for this season of the year, and heightened the effect of the scene.

Mr. Pulman, the deputy usher of the black rod, having summoned the Commons to the bar of their lordships' House, the dignified silence which for some minutes had reigned in the mag-nificent hull, in which were assembled the reatest of England's nobles and the 'elite' of her beauty, was broken by the unceremonious rushing and jostling of the members of the Lower House, who, headed by the Speaker, dressed in his robes of state, all but fought their way to the bar. York Commercial says: The quotations of the continental exchanges continue steady, and there is at present no prospect of a renewal of the recent drain of gold from the Bank. The West India mail, which arrived yesterday, brought no less than \$900,000 in gold from California.

The Richest Man in Virginia.

From the Richmond, Va. Whig.

GENTLEMEN : I have thought, for some time, I would write to your paper something in relation to the richest man in Virginia, and the largest slaveholder in the Union, and perhaps in the world, unless the serfs of Russia be considered slaves; and the wish in your paper, a few days ago, to know whom it was so wealthy in Virginia, induce me the wish in your paper.

in Virginia, induces me to write this now.

Samuel Hairston of Pittsylvania, is the gen-Samuel Hairston of Pittsylvania, is the gentleman. When I was in his section, a year or two ago, he was the owner of between 1,600 and 1,700 slaves, in his own right, having but a little while before taken a census. He also has a prospective right to about 1,000 slaves more, which are now owned by his mother-in law, Mrs Ruth Hairston, he having mouvied here Mrs. Ruth Hairston, he having married her only child. He now has the management of them, which makes the number of his slaves them, which makes the number of his slaves reach near three thousand. They increase at the rate of near 1,000 every year; and he has to purchase a large plantation every year to settle them on. A large number of his plantations are in Henry and Patrick counties, Virginia. He has large estates in North Carolina. His landed property in Stokes alone, is assessed at \$600,000. His wealth is differently estimated at from \$3,000,000 to \$5,000,000, and I should think it was nearer the latter. You

should think it was nearer the latter. You think he has a hard lot; but I assure you Mr. Hairston manages all his matters as easily as most persons would an estate of \$10,000.
