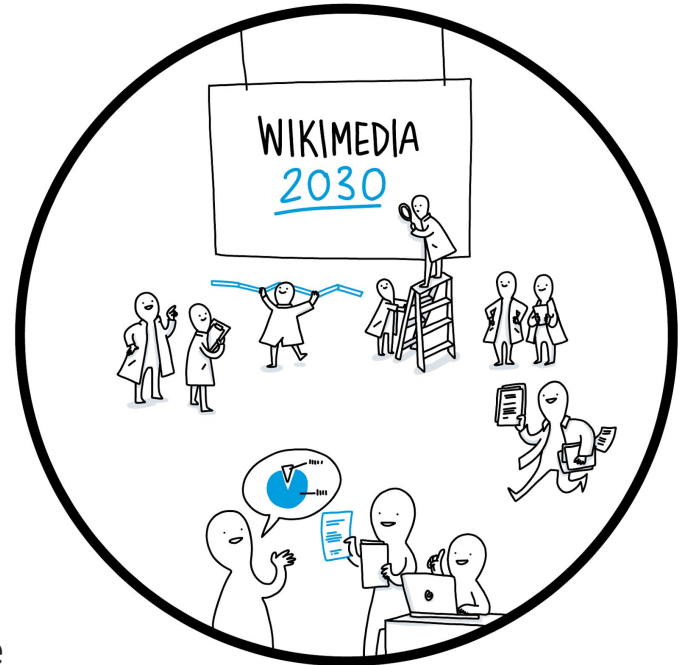






# Movement Charter Context

- The Movement Charter is a document that will define roles and responsibilities for all the members and entities of the Wikimedia Movement.
- It was identified by the Wikimedia movement as a strategic priority for 2030.
- A broad ratification process is expected for its adoption. **The MCDC wants your input on the methodology to ratify the Charter.**



# Last + Next 6 Months of Movement Charter

## Completed work

- Initial drafts of Preamble, Values & Principles, and Roles & Responsibilities statement of intent (Nov 2022)
- First community consultation cycle around those drafts (Nov-Dec 2022)

## Current work

- Drafting of Roles & Responsibilities, Decision-Making, Global Council, and Hubs content
- **Ratification methodology proposal (April 2023)**
- Updating drafts of Preamble, Values & Principles, and Roles & Responsibilities statement based on feedback
- Stakeholder outreach

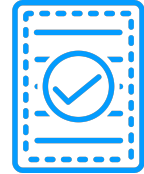
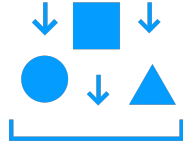
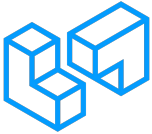

# Ratification of the Movement Charter

- The Movement Charter will be ratified or declined as a whole, rather than voting on individual chapters of the Charter.
- 4 Voting Groups: each group has to vote in favor of ratification for the Movement Charter to ratify
  - Individual contributors
  - Wikimedia projects
  - Affiliates
  - WMF Board of Trustees

# Who are the Voting Groups (VG)?

<b>Individual Contributors</b>	<b>Wikimedia Projects</b>	<b>Affiliates</b>	<b>Board of Trustees</b>
Defined as all individuals eligible to vote in the Board of Trustees elections	Defined as every language project outside the incubator and every single-language projects. Several non-content “projects” are also included. A small additional number of projects may be added at the discretion of the Charter Electoral Commission & MCDC. Test projects are excluded.	Defined as chapters, user groups, thematic orgs  (Pilot) Hubs are excluded from the Affiliates voting group to reduce double-counting.	Defined as members of the Board of Trustees
60,000+ of individual contributors	~800 language projects	170+ affiliates	12 Trustees

# Who is eligible to vote?

Individual Contributors	Wikimedia Projects	Affiliates	Board of Trustees
<p>Individual eligibility will be assessed in the same way as in the ratification vote on the enforcement guidelines for the BoT elections, with suitably amended timelines.</p> <p>That is, groups such as WMF staff/contractors &amp; volunteer developers are also eligible.</p>	<p>The majority of individual voters are associated with a project, and individual voters will select their preferred project to vote with (from a list of projects they are eligible to vote with)</p>	<p>Each Wikimedia affiliate has one single vote on behalf of their affiliate. Affiliates are eligible to vote within their voting group as long as they are recognised by the Affiliations Committee.</p>	<p>Members of the Board may vote.</p>



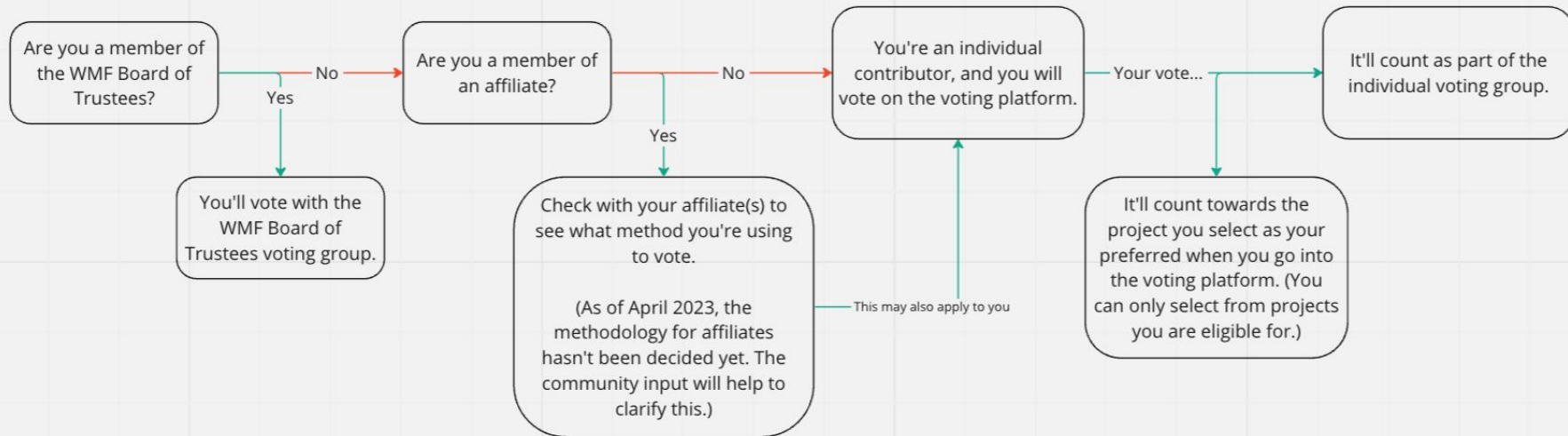
# How does each VG vote?

Individual Contributors	Wikimedia Projects	Affiliates	Board of Trustees
<p>Individuals will vote through the standard Securepoll/votewiki platform, or equivalent platform.</p>	<p>When individuals vote, they will be offered a list of projects they are eligible to vote with and be asked to select one that their vote will count towards. The total votes at the end will determine whether a certain project votes in favor or against ratification.</p>	<p>[community input requested]</p> <p>What methodology should chapters and thematic organizations use to vote?</p> <p>What methodology should user groups use to vote?</p>	<p>The Board will use their usual process for voting, per their bylaws.</p>

# What is the threshold in favor of ratification?

# Ratification Process

- Individual, Project and Affiliate VGs will all vote concurrently. Outcomes should not be published openly (especially on-wiki) until all outcomes can be published.
  - If all three VGs choose to ratify, the WMF BoT will then vote within 4 weeks.

# Ratification Oversight

- The **Charter Electoral Commission** will consist of 5 election commissioners drawing from at least 3 different home projects to oversee the ratification vote.
  - Community input requested
    - How will they be recruited?
    - Who will select the 5 commissioners?
    - What types of experience should they have?
- **Scrutineers**
  - There will be 3 scrutineers from the volunteer stewards.
- Commissioners must not be scrutineers, and neither must be a part of the Elections Committee.



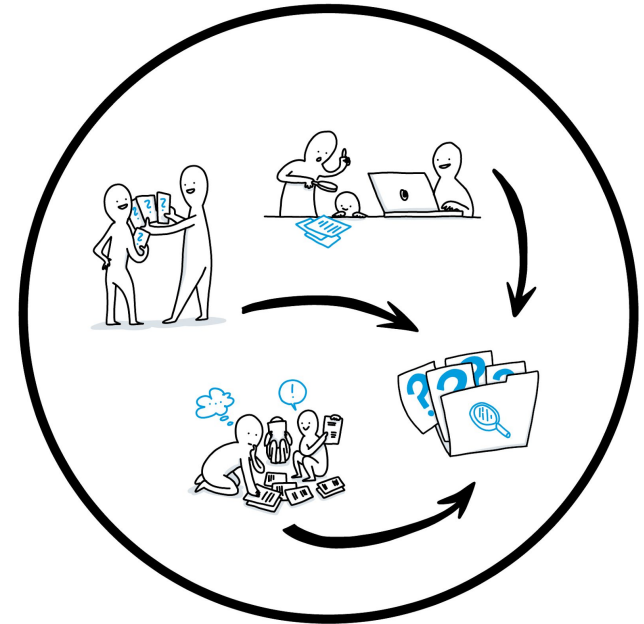
# After the Vote

- WMF support staff will provide a full, anonymized provision of all feedback comments (striking harmful or inappropriate sections).
- Feedback comments are the basis for revisions or changes to the Charter, depending on the ratification outcome.



# Potential Scenarios of After the Vote

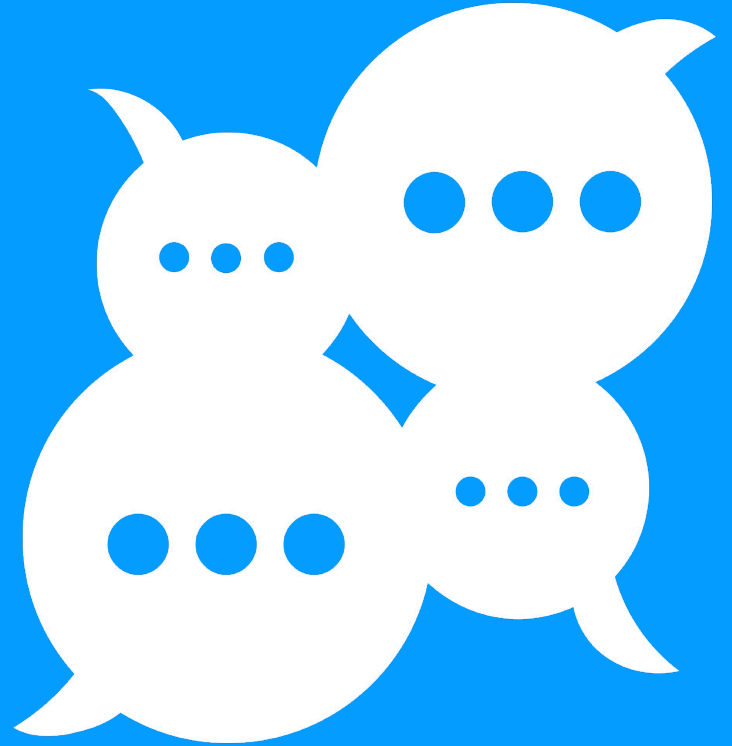
- **Ratified** as is → implementation (according to the forthcoming Amendments & Implementation chapter of the Movement Charter)
- Ratified but requires significant **revisions** → revisions to be made to the Charter according to feedback, and a ratification vote must be conducted on the revisions only
- **Not ratified** → changes to be made to the Charter according to feedback, and another ratification vote can be conducted

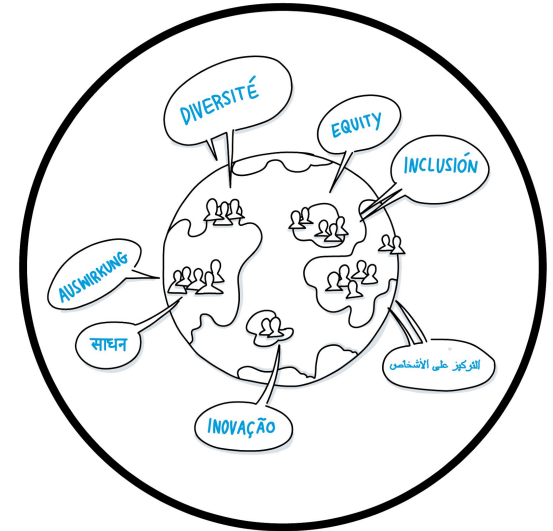

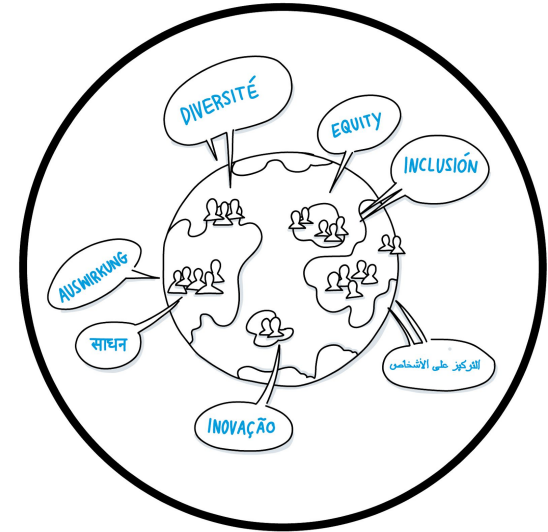

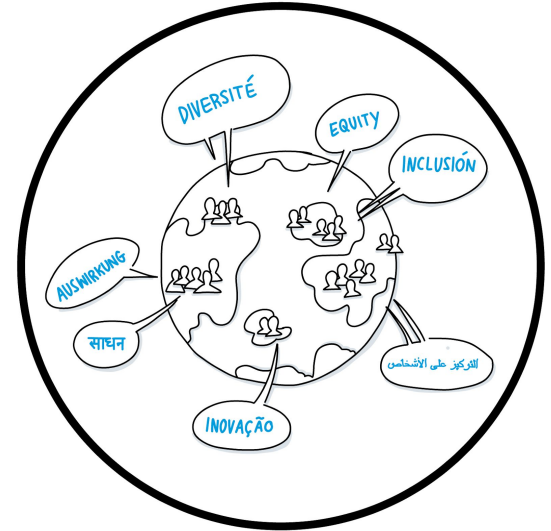
- A. UGs will determine the voting method themselves and report back only on the results of the vote.

- C. The CEC will specify the voting method to be applied to all UGs.



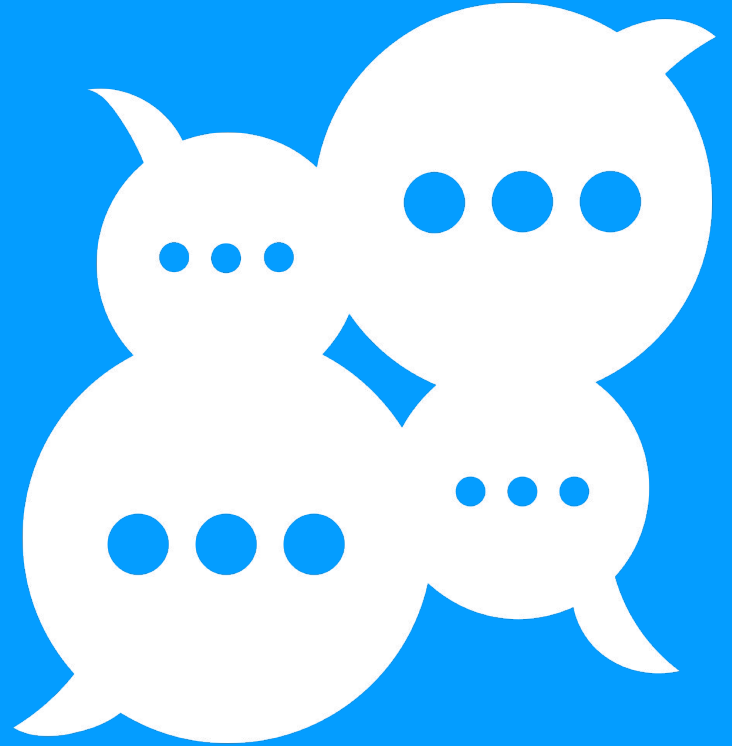

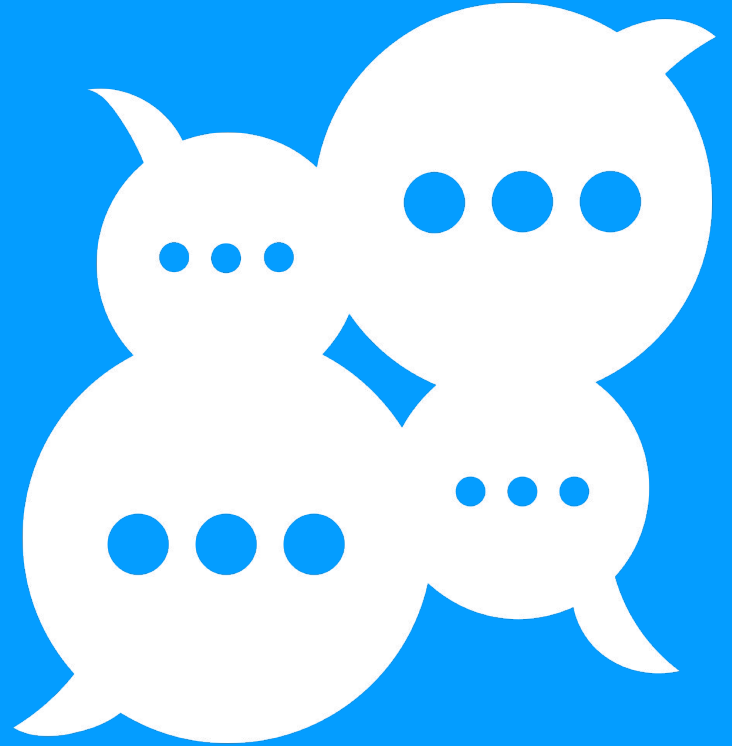

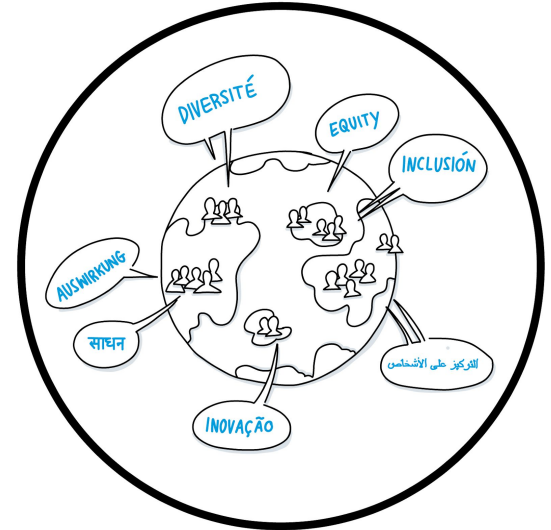


# Re: the Charter Electoral Commission (CEC)

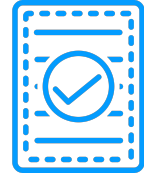
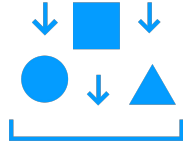
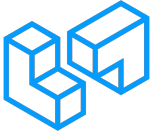
