We hereby submit to you the subject report as follows in compliance with your request made by phone on 12 June 1950.

## I. Health education conducted to the general public in the prefecture.

In concert with "Anti - TB Week" started at national level beginning 25 May 1950, Public Health Dept., Government of Saitama Prefecture issued a notification to each health center in the prefecture for the purpose of permeating thoroughly the knowledge of anti-TB into the minds of the general public in the prefecture with the cooperation of all health centers. Nature of contents is as undermentioned, and we believe that considerably favorable results have been obtained.

## A. Program of Public Health Dept. Saitama Pref. Government.

## (1) Plan of disseminating knowledge of anti-TB.

## a. Through MHK network.

Made efforts to permeate among the people in the prefecture the method of preventing and stamping out TB, and the role of health centers in the anti-TB activities to enlighten the people on the proper knowledge of TB prevention.





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- b. Propagation on collection of anti-TB posters.

Drew the attentions of the people in the prefecture to the collection of anti-TB posters broadcasting to the effect through NHK network.

- c. Information by magazines and newspapers.

Inserted the above article (b) in the 1 June issue of "Saitama Megaphone."

- d. Distribution of pictures for travelling-exhibit use.

Distributed one set of 10 pieces of pictures for travelling-exhibit use to each health center.

- e. Wall-papers.

Distributed wall-papers on TB prevention (on which 12 advices on home-treatment are printed) to each health center.

- (2) Collection of anti-TB posters.

With a view to stimulating the attentions and the consciousnesses of the people in the prefecture in the prevention of TB, collected anti-TB posters, and offered the prize for the best work.

- B. Program of each health center.

- (1) Travelling-exhibit.

Utilizing the pictures for travelling-exhibit use to the full, held an exhibition using the places and the halls disengaged.

- (2) Wall-papers.

Put the papers on the walls in each health center building, for instance, in a waiting-room so that all the comers might read them.

- (3) Lecture meeting and slide-showing.

Health center sponsored a lecture meeting or slide-showing obtaining the cooperation from national sanatoria, local Physicians Assns



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and agencies concerned. The films for the use of slide-showing distributed from the pref. gov't. were well utilized.

(4) Opening of consultation station for anti-TB.

Opened a consultation station for anti-TB to disseminate and permeate the proper knowledge on the prevention and the stamping-out of TB.

(5) Anti - TB education activities.

Conducted an anti-TB education activity to the people in the prefecture referring to the anti-TB education and information standard in 24, EIHATSU NO. 7,613 dated Oct., 1949 (Gist of Activity Program for Anti-TB Week in Saitama Prefecture and reference materials for Anti-TB activity).

(6) Utilization of 'Kosei-koho-dayori' (Public Welfare Information News)

Make an active and proper use of 'Kosei-koho-dayori' which is distributed after the notification made in 25, EIHATSU NO. 25, dated 17 Feb. 1950.

(7) Other measures necessary for the thorough dissemination of this activity.

II. Health education conducted to special organizations.

a. On Mothers' Day (8 May) held a lecture meeting for the women of general working class and the general housewives with the intention to permeating among them health education and promoting working women's health.

b. Held a formal official commendation of midwives, health nurses and clinic nurses on 12 May, the anniversary of Miss Nightingale's birthday, so as to encourage the qualitative improvement of midwives, health nurses and clinic nurses.

III. Radio Warning.

With the prevailing season of dysentery and other communicable diseases close at hand, our department sounded a warning to the general public in the pref. on the prevention of the diseases on 10 May through NHK network.



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## IV. Health education in schools.

Although this subject is under the jurisdiction of Health Sect., Culture & Welfare Dept., Pref. Board of Education, our department is making every effort to think out various means for health education in schools to provide them with careful health programs with the help of health centers, constantly keeping in touch with Pref. Board of Education.

## V. Plan of establishing health education program in doctorless village.

On 19 and 20 May the officials in charge of health education at Medical Administration Section, Public Health Dept. were despatched to Yano-mura, Kodama-gun to get detailed report on the sanitary condition of the village. As the result of conferring with the village-head, the officials and the authorities concerned with public health, they were agreed by Honjo Health Center which is in charge of the village that (1) physicians be sent to the village periodically thereafter for the maintenance of villagers' health and (2) a lecture-meeting or slide-showing be held for the dissemination and improvement of the sanitary knowledge.

By the way, the actual circumstance of Yano-mura as the doctorless village was recorded in NHK record, which was broadcasted to the whole country on 26 May, from 5:45 A.M.

## VI. Propulsion of mothers' and children's health program.

As in April, held an exhibition concerning marriage and child care in Urawa-shi (Under the auspices of Saitama Branch of Boshi-aiku-kai and with the support of Public Health Dept. pref. gov't). The latter contributed to the propulsion of mothers' and children's health by offering projector and films available.

## VII. Expected plan of Mouth Sanitation Week activity.

As one week was set aside for Mouth Sanitation Week beginning 1 June in Saitama Prefecture, various plans and preparations were made for the full conduct of mouth sanitation education.



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VIII. Expected plans of Foods Sanitation Week and Insects Control Week activities.

In the light of the fact that foods and insects sometimes serve as a means of transmitting communicable diseases, preparations were made for the weeks to be started June 12, to enlighten the general public on the proper knowledge of foods sanitation and insects control.

IX. Other health education activities.

Utilization of health center.

As was pointed out by Kanto Civil Affairs Region authorities, the health centers are not well utilized by the general public because of the fact that the centers have not yet been fully and broadly known by the people. Therefore, in conducting health education, utmost effort was made to drive home the aim and importance of health centers from all sorts of angles each sect. concerned closely tying up.



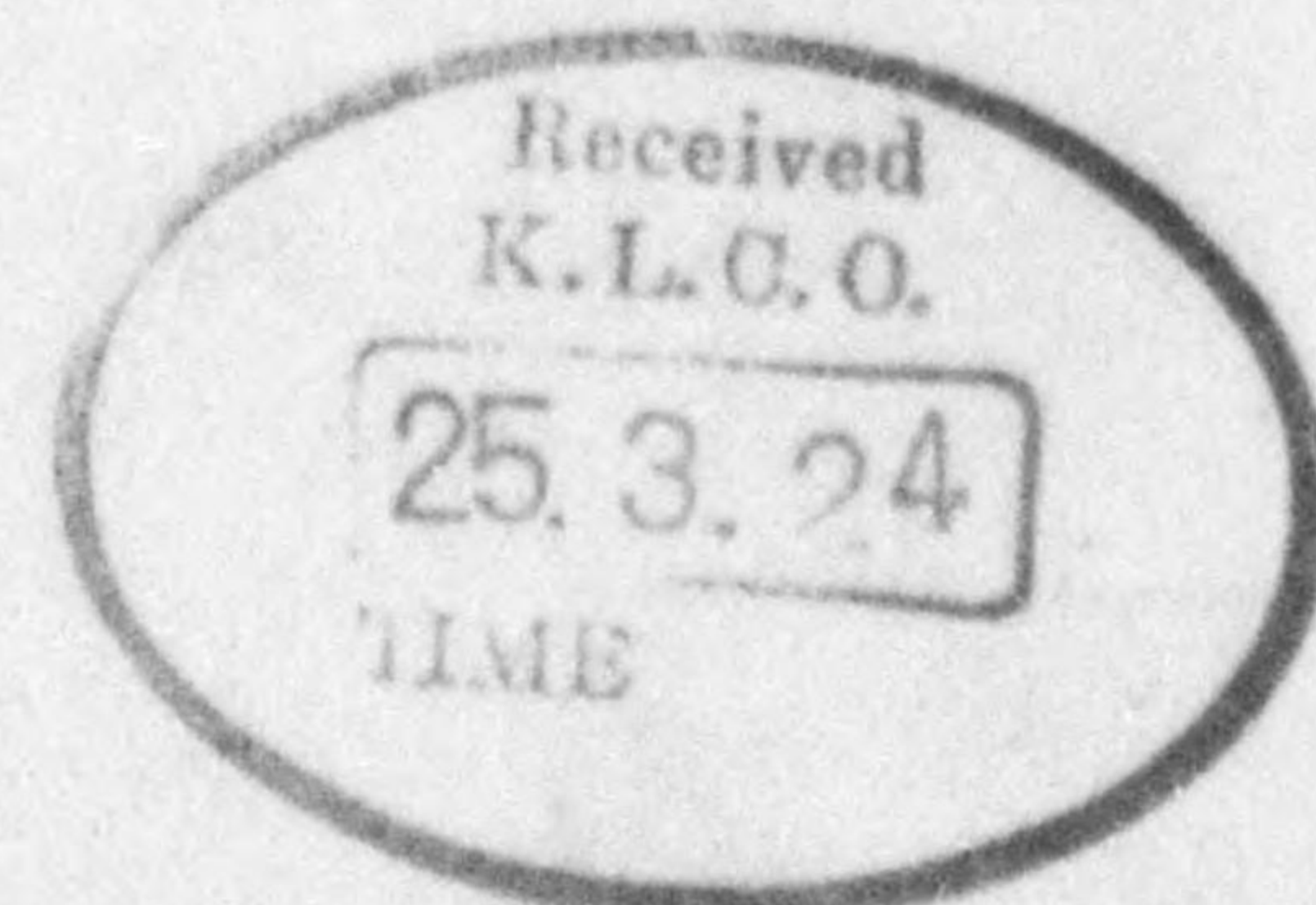

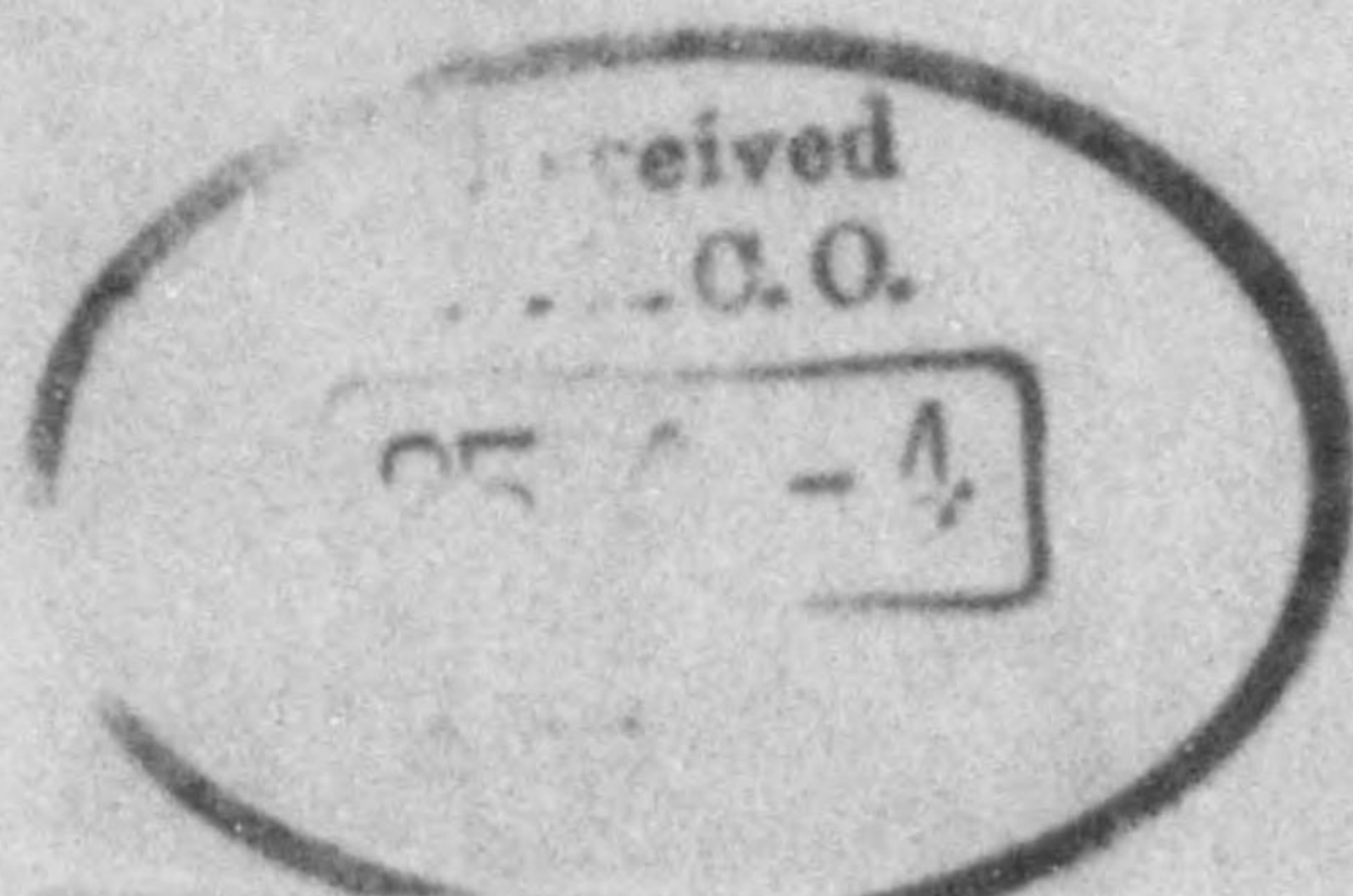

INSPECTION OF OMIYA RED CROSS HOSPITAL  
AND  
NURSING SCHOOL WITH KANTO REGION GRADING COMMITTEE

31 January 1950

*Saitama*  
Omiya Red Cross Hospital is a well constructed building in fairly good repair.

At present there are eight first year and eight second year students. They plan to admit at least thirty students in 1950. This hospital needs help with nurse recruiting. The high school graduates prefer to go to Tokyo for training.

The grading committee spent a great deal of time in discussion of curriculum and floor assignments. Some misunderstandings were explained. Mrs. Mukasa will continue to work with the instructors on the curriculum. Doctors are very cooperative and anxious to do everything necessary to establish a good class "A" nursing school.

Students are x-rayed and given physical examinations on entrance and twice yearly. Weight, sed rate and vital capacity are recorded each month. If tuberculine is positive, students are not assigned to TB wards.

Surgery was not seen as an operation was in progress. Scrub room and preparation rooms were orderly and quite clean.

Delivery room was orderly but had not been cleaned recently. Spider webs were numerous. Need for improved technique was discussed with Chief midwife.

Patients are not separated by services. The importance of segregation of patients in the nursing teaching plan was explained.

Doctors orders are written in a separate book and do not become part of the patients permanent record. Otherwise the records are good.

A formula kitchen has been set up. It is clean but sterile technique is not observed. They plan to use this kitchen for the special diet kitchen also.

The central kitchen was clean. Food and dishes were well stored. Food is served hot.

A central supply room has been set up and is in operation. The sterile trays include (1) intravenous, (2) pneumothorax, (3) lumbar puncture, (4) catheterization trays and (5) gastric lavage. Sterile dressings are prepared here. There is a separate room for autoclave and distilled water.

The outpatient clinics are well set up and clean. Patients are given privacy during examination and consultation. There is a separate room used only for pneumothorax.

There are two small class rooms and one large lecture room which need a new blackboard. There is also a large lecture hall used for meetings, mothers classes, nutritional classes, etc.

The student dormitory is not adequate. A new wing will be added soon.

There is no reason why this hospital should not have a good school of nursing. There should be at least twenty students in each class.

INSPECTION OF SAITAMA NATIONAL HOSPITAL AND NURSING SCHOOL  
WITH KANTO REGION GRADING COMMITTEE

1 February 1950

Saitama National Hospital is an old converted army barracks located near the Tokyo-To and Saitama boundary. The hospital consists of eight large barn-like buildings in poor repair connected by long, open runways. The treatment rooms are too large and poorly planned.

The wards are clean and orderly. Nurses are doing bedside nursing. Some attendants are still being used. Much of the hospital space is not well used. If necessary the bed capacity could be increased. There are now about sixty empty beds.

The director has worked with St Lukes nurses and other well trained nurses and is very anxious to have a good nurses training school.

The class rooms and demonstration room were very good. The demonstration room has ten beds and the equipment is complete. This building has been newly renovated.

The nurses dormitory does not meet regulations as it is an old army barracks. Improvements are now being made which will enable the hospital to meet fire regulations. (Two stairways are being installed.)

The problem of getting high school graduates to enter training here is serious. The hospital and dormitory are cold and the dormitory is not comfortable by Japanese standards. It is easy to understand why students prefer to enter training in hospitals in Tokyo-To.

The central kitchen is large and improvements are being made. The food is brought from the kitchen in one cart and trays. No effort is made to keep food hot. This was discussed with hospital personnel.

The surgery and delivery rooms were not clean. This was discussed with surgery supervisor and chief midwife. This hospital averages only 4-7 deliveries a month and it is doubtful that the cases necessary for student experience will be available.

The equipment of this hospital is old and much of it is in bad repair.

The hospital has no laundry and the students must wash and iron their own uniforms.

Many improvements need to be made here for a class "A" nursing school. There is evidence that considerable effort has been made to improve standards to meet nursing school requirements.

INSPECTION OF SATTE AGRICULTURE HOSPITAL AND KASUKABE HOSPITALS  
WITH KANTO REGION GRADING COMMITTEE

30 January 1950

It is planned to use Kasukabe Hospital for student experience until Satte Agriculture Hospital has increased its average patient load. They hope to be able to establish an "A" school in the near future in Kasukabe which is fifteen minutes away by bus. Kasukabe has a capacity of 101 patients. At present, the average daily load is forty. There are sixteen nurses, seven doctors and three part-time doctors on the staff. Both of these hospitals plan to have open staffs by the time the small hospital will be closed by the Medical Service law. As these are the only large hospitals within a 25 mile radius, it is felt that both hospitals will be used to capacity. At present the directors of both hospitals are applying for war surplus medical equipment needed for surgery, central, kitchens, etc. As both of these hospitals have made a great effort to meet all requirements of the nursing law, any help which can be given them will be well used and appreciated by both doctors and nurses. At present Kasukabe has no central kitchen or dormitory. The kitchen at Satte is very clean but too small.

There are still eleven old style nursing students who will graduate in June 1950.

Satte hospital will be enlarged as soon as the new road is surveyed, as there is a question of where the building should be placed.

Importance of segregating patients into service, both for improved care of patients and for improved student training, was explained at length.

Class rooms <sup>were</sup> good. There was a large demonstration room with four beds and five of each article required on the equipment list.

It is felt that when bedside nursing is established, more patients will be coming into the hospital.

## 2. Field Trip Schedule:

Urawa (Saitama Prefecture) - 24 January 1950

## 3. Purpose of the Trip:

- a. Group Conference - All health center directors, directors of hospitals having 50 or more beds, representatives of prefectural Medical and Dental Associations, chief and section heads of prefectural Health Department.
- b. Conference with Prefectural Health Department.

## 4. Observations and Recommendations:

Dr. Manittoff accompanied by Dr. Edelman and Mr. Miura held a group conference with the mentioned medical groups at 1000 hours in the prefectural assembly hall. Number of attendants, 56..

Full understanding and cooperation to the all objectives of the groups conference was obtained by Dr. Manittoff's speech of friendly advice, recommendation and encouragement. Questions were accepted as many as the time permits. A hospital director asked about the number of nurses who he should have in his hospital (ration of patients and nurses) and also whether he could employ student-nurses instead of nurses. Another question was made about medical education in Japan. The group conference was closed at 1210 hours.

Chief of Prefectural Health Department had not been notified of the conference with health department by Kanto Liaison Office. Department Chief and all section heads, however, could meet at 1300 hours in the room of Prefectural Assembly Chairman, and the conference was started according to the schedule.



Medical library is not functioning. Nobody except prefectural Health Department personnel are reading these medical magazines. There is no doctor for hospital work in the Health Department.

Recommend multiple puncture method in smallpox vaccination instead of scar method. Emphatically advised to immediately report major epidemic diseases as outlined by directives. Advised to carefully read Bihatsu 1244 of Influenza and to act in compliance with that.

Fifty-four (54) villages have no doctors. Twenty-five (25) of these villages are located near health centers. Health center nurses and doctors are required for prophylactic services in all non-doctor villages. Some reliable (?) doctors, being appointed by prefectural Health Department, are acting examination of mothers and babies for the additional ration of sugar. This is considered unnecessary, because health centers are able to do that enough by themselves. One (1) information man is on duty in the Health Department.
