耶穌受難之教訓

蔣中正

人生不能無宗教之信仰，革命者對於其革命主義亦不能無宗教式之自信心；否則，無論大小事業，皆無所成就。世人處世每多遇難而退，或半途而廢者，皆無自信心，即無宗教之信仰故也。余信奉耶穌將近十年，讀經修道，靡日或間。客冬西安變亂，事起倉卒，孑然一身，被困於叛部二週，嘗向監視者索讀聖經，益覺親切有味。而耶穌博愛精神之偉大，更使我提高精神，以與惡勢力相搏擊，卒能克復仇魔，伸張正氣。復承教會諸同道爲余祈禱，精神感應，爲力實多，此余應於感謝諸

同道之餘，更不能不於諸同道前，歸榮於耶穌也。耶穌之聖德，余不能稱述其萬一。今日適爲吾主耶穌受難節，故謹本吾心之所得，爲諸同道陳之。夫十架七言，非我主耶穌最後之遺言乎？首句卽爲仇殺者祈求上帝曰：「天父乎，彼輩所爲，彼輩不知也，乞赦之。」大哉耶穌之博愛，吾於此思過半矣。今請以西安事變之事實爲例，當予二次入陝之先，卽已察知部隊之思想龐雜，言動歧異，且有種種複雜離奇之報告，甚至謂將有非常之密謀與變亂者，左右勸阻，爭欲尼之。余就所負之責任言，國家統一始基已奠，身爲統帥，教導之責萬不敢辭。况此身屬於黨國，安危更不容計。卽就余之宗教信仰言，當我主耶穌末次入耶路撒冷城時，明瞭危機四伏，

猶昂然騎驢直入，不稍規避，至大至剛，亦勇亦義。余何人斯？退縮莫前。矧余之愛部屬，一如愛子弟，決不計及其他。於是輕裝減從，毅然赴陝。變生肘腋，躬蹈其危，使中樞憂勞，人民惶慮，與夫同道懇切祈禱，歎仄良深。而余之良知因以日進，余之愛心因以日厚矣。被劫持後，有以條件要挾者，有以甘言相誘惑者，有以武器相恫嚇者，有以交與「人民陣綫」公斷相威脅者，險象環生，不可言喻。然余為篤信基督耶穌，於此環境中，每一念及

傳福音給萬民聽

想起「四海之內，皆兄弟也」的說話聯想到耶穌的

福音廣播季刊

教訓：你們往普天下去，傳福音給萬民聽！

在初期教會的時候，傳播福音的範圍很小，只靠口頭上和個人的行動上表現福音的真理，即使彼得傳道的時候，聽衆雖有數千之多，但交通不方便，所以只能在小亞細亞一帶傳道。後來用信函的傳遞，福音漸漸廣播

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，但是，所能傳播的地方是需相當的時日。所以自基督復生以後，差不多經過千餘年的歷史然後將福音傳播於五洲。好像浸信會教士來華的歷史，也只是百年而已。

到了科學發達的現世，因爲交通工具的增加，我們已覺得這地球是這麼狹小，人類的來往更加接近，我們更覺得基督的福音更應努力的傳播。

自無線廣播電台設立以來，對於文化，娛樂等等都有相當的影響，自上海福音廣播電台設立以來，其使命不但在提倡福音廣播的事業，更是給與社會一種積極的，良善的廣播程序，在人的生活上有良善的修養。

我們知道這是廣「播」電台。我是担任粵語佈道的部

分，起初自己對着一個圓圓的東西講道的時候，完全不知道聽衆是大學教授，或是商店職員，或醫生……。不過，自己絕對相信基督的福音是配合世人的，是世人所需要的，沒有職業的分別，沒有教育程度的高低，所以我就坦然的求上帝賜給我思想和口才。這是「播」的地方。很難知道所收獲的是什麼。後來得着聽者的來函，對福音電台的贊助。更有人因此而自證往禮拜堂崇拜上帝或與我作個人的談話。

我相信，我所播下的是良美的種子，將來一定有良美的菓子。

聖經研究一課

周志禹播音稿

腓立比書 第四章二節三節

勸兩女信徒在主裏同心

我們讀哥林多後書十一章廿六節往下一段，看見使徒保羅雖在百般患難危險之中，還是切心掛念教會的事，「除了這外面的事，還有爲衆教會掛心的事，天天壓在我身上，有誰軟弱，我不軟弱呢？有誰跌倒，我不焦

急呢？」他寫腓立比書時，身體雖在羅馬拘所中，但他的心卻常常在各地教會內，（參林前五3）聽見教會中有甚麼不純正的道理，有甚麼不和睦的事情，就寫信勸戒他們。他看教會比普通入看自己的家庭更關切；他對教會中的信徒，比普通入看自己的兒女更愛惜，真不愧爲好牧人的代表，現在教會領袖們的榜樣！

本段保羅對腓立比教會中兩位姊妹的事，也不出這例子，照樣關懷她們。今將本段分三層討論如左：

（一）這二婦人是誰。腓立比教會，是從甘其底河邊的婦女祈禱會起頭的，（徒十六）友阿爹和循都基，想必就是那些初熟果子中的重要份子，甚至也有人想，其中有一位就是最先信主的呂底亞。她們自歸主後，就與保羅同工，爲主作證「她們在福音上曾與我一同勞苦。」可見她們不是平常女流，乃是熱心愛主，很有地位的教會領袖；她們二人不同心，也必是在處理教會的事工上，意見不合，有關教會大計；所以竟報告到那飽經憂患，身在縲紲，爲衆信徒所敬愛，所體惜的使徒面前。但她們二人既是熱心愛主，爲主勞苦的人，怎能發生這種不幸的事呢？可見魔鬼的厲害！我們若在祈禱和自

省工夫上，稍微寬鬆一點，他就乘隙而入，用各樣方法，離開我們，以阻擋福音的工作。因為同事不同心，其陣線必不固，其事工必受阻。我們豈可不儆防備麼？（參彼前五8）

（二）使徒勸在主裏同心。使徒想必已從以巴弗提聽取得這二位姊妹發生齟齬的原因。看23好像她們有點爭地位的樣式。但他把這原因不明指出，免得叫以巴弗提為難；乃是從根本上着想，先在勸大眾的話中暗示，叫他們『行事為人與基督的福音相稱……』（一27）又舉出主耶穌怎樣自卑，連降七級（二5—8）為榜樣，再以自己怎樣糞土肉體，努力追求完善為激勵。（三章）然後在這裏指出她們名字的時候，就單用『主裏』二字，以為規勸；因人與人發生任何事情，或是齟齬，或是別的事情，必是先與主的交通有所疏忽。正如喬威忒博士所說：『心中發生猜疑之時，必是敬虔的聖火燻得不旺之故；污穢的空氣，進入心靈之時，必是窗戶不向無限量者開啓之故』所以保羅要友阿爹循都基同心，就叫他們在『主裏』同心。她們二人看見『主裏』二字，必是大受感動的，因為在『主裏』她們同蒙救恩，同得

生命，同為肢體，同負一轆，同作一工，同事一主，同具一個目的，同抱一個指望；根本相同，怎可不手足相助呢？我在教會中有不和睦的人麼？我當怎樣呢？（參雅五16首二句太五23 24 18 15—35）

（三）使徒請同道幫助她們同心。教會是基督的身體，信徒是互為肢體的。（參林前十二）人身上若有一個肢體發生事情，必是全身總動員，大家相助的。教會也該如此，所以保羅因為要幫助這二位姊妹起見，除自己直接勸導她們要在主裏同心外，又重託那真實同負一轆的，一同相助。這同負一轆的，原文是新資格司，是教會中一位主要領袖的名字，這名字的意思就是同負一轆。保羅因為他與自己同心，所以稱他為真實同負一轆的。不但託新資格司，也託革利免和其他一切同勞的人相助；正如人身上，一個肢體不舒服，全身的肢體一同相助一樣。我明白互為肢體的道理麼？我對於教會中不和睦的人當怎樣呢？（參太五9 參加六2）

有興趣的宗教來函選粹（王完白）

上帝賜我的機會，能在各電台播音演講救恩與醫學

(一)大夏大學張君

本爲極端無神論者今願得救自己再去救人

(第一信)我每於聽先生的節目時，常有一個感覺在心理蕩動着，覺得先生的人生是最有價值了，一個人能治他人身體上的痛苦，又能救他人心靈上的痛苦，這種事業是何等的偉大呀！可惜我沒有學醫，又沒有進教，現在讀醫學是再沒有機會了，但我現在已決定進教，目的是想得救自己，以後再去救人，想請先生寫一封介紹信。

行動來潑冷水，爲此我很需要有幾個同道的朋友。(下略，後仍通信多次，謂決受洗，並索福音轉送至好親友，書上自題贈言是：「只有上帝能賜給你真實的能力，使你做一個超人，我祝福你得到永生。」)

(二)甯波李女士

本不愛聽播音偶聞宗教竟得重生

這封信是個不相識者給你，同時也愛聽你播音的學徒，我雖與你空中相識，但實情尙未見過，日深渴慕，然讀廣播季刊，婉如曾見一次，(指書中照片)使我得着十分快樂，敝舍自購收音機以來，至今雖有年餘，但愛作你學徒還不過半年，我從前對於收音機所發的聲音，是很不注意，簡直不愛聽它，然個人思想很能改變的，當於某日午後，耳聆先生有價值有培養有興味的宗教和醫學，從這天津有味的語氣激動我沉寂的思想，此後我自午膳以後，像雅片癮似的要渴慕你，現在的收音機，真可認爲生活唯一的良伴了，承蒙先生熱誠愛主，廣播真道，至爲感佩，我得與你的播音接觸，深覺是天父的宏恩。

前後在慕爾堂受洗的聽衆雖二十餘人

各地聽衆，自無線電聽道歸主，爲數頗多，受洗的也不少，照我所知，單在上海慕爾堂一處，已有二十餘人，因我比較常去，所以知道的，最近復活節前，我得在姑嶺路振新學校吳先生一封信，大意如下：(按此信在本期英文版有譯文)

記得民國廿三年春，就收聽先生在中西電台的醫學演講，但當時注意在醫學，對於宗教素無興趣，半年後又收聽福音電台的演講，每日二次，從不間斷。後來得了基督的感召，漸漸的喜聽先生的宗教教義，且曾向先生索閱新約全書，拜讀之後，覺得基督愛的偉大，使我流淚，因之每星期日往慕爾堂聽講。現我定於三月二十八復活節受洗，小兒小女們定於四月四日受洗，想到我家悔改重生，得到新生命，實出先生引領，感謝基督，亦要感謝先生，並請於復活節那天來堂觀禮，願與先生面談云云。

因此我於復活節，百忙中趕到慕爾堂去，那天受洗的人甚多，我與吳君又從未會過，以致彼此無法招呼，仍未晤談，但在大門口站立，却另見相識之聽衆多人，因而發現今日受洗的人中，有五人見無線電中的果子，除了吳君以外，其他四人略爲介紹於左：

二位是上海名人穆氏的媳婦，少年夫婦同時受洗，真是嘉話，他倆的信主，是由夫人先得救恩，起初向我

討了一本新約，不過一個人天天讀經祈禱，因着心境改變，竟連環境也改變了，因為她的丈夫慢慢地也起了信仰，同着到靈修會來聚會，親愛如度蜜月，今日夫婦倆同時受洗了。（參看季刊第三期有興趣的聽衆軼事）

一位是開針廠的朱君，他在五年前就是一個每日收聽的老同志，但是因病不能出來，常在床上休養，唯一的安慰是無線電內的基督教訓，我送他的聖經也看得舊了。最近聽得慕爾堂將施行洗禮，並且聽我對聽衆說，已經信仰基督的，應該受洗，做正式基督徒，以求進步。他就勉強起來，居然到江長川牧師地方去考信德，今日又鼓着勇氣出來受洗。

還有一位是奚老太太，她的公子就是福音廣播特刊所記「幾位空氣中蒙召的人」一文中的第五人，那時他從無線電中聽我講慢性病的精神療法，欲得心中平安快樂，非醫藥所能解決，惟有信仰基督方可得到，因此來信基督，後在靈修會中曉得信徒應該絕對的誠實，清潔，無私博愛，他就想到自己對人有一筆一千元債務，曾用不誠實的方法避免了責任，他就決意去賠償對方，因此感動對方，同來熱心事主。諸位也許還記得這件故

事，現在奚君已全家信仰，今日這位老母親，也棄了十年的舊信仰，來受洗歸主。

當日受洗的人中，除了以上五位外，有沒有別的人是從無線電講道而來的，我不知道，也不一定要知道，因為我們爲主作證，不過是盡本分，有時沒有看得見的效果也不必灰心，有時看見了很大的效果也不要自滿，人得救乃是主的恩賜，不是人的力量。

至於第一段所記的吳先生，後來到底遇見了，剛剛在上禮拜日，（四月廿五號）那天在慈園路的靈修會中，無線電同志不約而同地來聚會的有十多個人，有的從外埠來，有的從鄉間來，好幾個人都是初次見面，不過他們中間有三分之二已經是受過洗禮的，主的恩慈是當讚美的。

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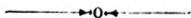

We shall try to trace their footsteps into Macedonia, to Corinth and to Athens and back to Antioch. We shall travel with Paul and his friends to Ephesus and eventually back to Jerusalem for the last time.

His adventure will, I hope, stir our imagination; his determination will fill us with shame at our own wavering purpose; his steadfast defence of the freedom of the Gospel of Christ will cause us to be filled with gratitude. As the clouds gather over this man of God, and we see him going towards his doom, we shall, I trust, remember more vividly the power of Jesus Christ who helped him to conquer.

The subject of the NINTH talk will be the life of Paul in Rome, after his perilous journey. Here our data is scanty, but, calling his letters to our help, we shall see the prisoner continuing his work, ever mindful of his fellow countrymen, the Jews; ever full of kindly concern for his old friends in Asia Minor, Macedonia and Greece.

The TENTH talk will be given entirely to a rapid survey of the Letter of Paul; the ELEVENTH to an account of the activities of the other Apostles, as far as we are able to reconstruct them; while the TWELVE will give some information on the subject of the remaining books in the New Testament.

It is a wonderful Story, this Story of the Planting of the Christian Church. Like one of the seeds about which Jesus loved to talk, the Christian Church began in a small way, in a small country of Western Asia, and it grew and grew, until, within less than one hundred years, it was established in the heart of the Roman Empire itself.

It is the Story of the triumph of Jesus Christ, and the desire of the Shanghai Christian Broadcasting Association is that every listener should turn with awe and devotion to Him who, through sacrifice of Himself, called forth the sacrifice of others. The story teller will be more than repaid, if even only one of his hearers should be led through these talks to find in Jesus Christ his Lord and his God.

My Plans and Subjects for My Noonday Meditations

Rev. A. J. Garnier.

During the next twelve weeks, I would like to take "The Story of the Planting of Christianity," as my general subject for Saturday Noon Day meditations broadcasted from the studio of the Shanghai Christian Broadcasting Association. I have covered this ground in a little book prepared for Bible Classes for students in China, and I hope that, by means of the radio, the story of the wonderful beginnings of the Christian Church, may awaken the interest of hearers who will never see that small book.

Right through the twelve talks, the Preaching of the Gospel is the main theme: -

The Motive: "The son of God loved me, and gave Himself for me"

The Need: "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God".

The Means: "There is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved".

The Struggle: "I have fought the good fight, I have kept the faith".

The Goal: "And having made peace through the blood of His cross, by Him to reconcile all things unto Himself".

The FIRST talk will necessarily be of an introductory character: it will deal with the various factors which made the preaching of the Gospel in the Roman Empire so timely; it will also call attention to the amazing change which come over the disciples of Jesus in Jerusalem after they had seen their Lord risen from the dead.

In the SECOND talk the early experiences of the disciples will relate the period of waiting in Jerusalem; the descent of the Spirit followed by the excitement of the crowds and the preaching of Peter; the first experiment in communal life.

The THIRD talk will tell of the story of Stephen, the first martyr of the Church, who died with words of forgiveness for his enemies; the story of the unforeseen results of this early persecution, of the work of Philip in Samaria, of the visit of Peter to Caesarea and of the debate to which it gave rise among the believers in Jerusalem.

In the FOURTH talk, we shall try to understand something of Saul of Tarsus, who from being a persecutor of the Christian Church, became its greatest Apostle; from being a proud Pharisee became a "slave" of Jesus Christ. Some attempt will be made to understand the change which came over this man and to see in this change the triumph of Jesus Christ.

The FIFTH, SIXTH and SEVENTH talks will deal with the three missionary campaigns led by Paul of Tarsus. We shall meet there with the kindly Barnabas and his young relative Mark, with Silas and Luke, with Timothy, Aquila

will, therefore my subject will be based for the most part on the Gospel.

Such subjects are to my mind amongst the most refreshing and inspiring that can be given. The speaker is able to give the personal touch, he is able to speak from his own experience, and what the seeker wants to know is, what is it that makes the Christian happy? Where-in lies his strength at times of trial and stress? Why is the Christian different from me and what has he that I have not?

For the past few months we at the Cathedral have been taking Meditations from the Acts of the Apostles and are now speaking on Meditations from the Gospel according to St. Mark. By giving these we feel that there is continuity in our noonday meditation which we give every Wednesday. There is much to be said in favour of courses and series, but I will here make a plea for the personal touch. What China needs today, and in fact the rest of the world as well, is something which will provide both a challenge and an inspira-

tion to life. We know what will do this and the prayers of all speakers over the Christian Broadcast Station in Shanghai is that God will use them to bring His message before the listeners, Foreign and Chinese, Christian and non-Christian in such a way that they will be challenged to follow Christ and by so doing lead a life inspired by the Holy Spirit.

In closing may I appeal to all readers of this Bulletin to pray earnestly for all who are connected with this Broadcast Association. We all know what a marvellous opportunity lies at hand, and we do like to ask you all to pray regularly for us as we try to serve God by sowing the seeds of His Truth in this way.

The Sunday School Lessons

I have been asked to tell something of plans and subjects for my Evangelistic Services. More than a year has passed since I first started to give Evangelistic talks over the Radio Station.

After some time it was thought well to introduce a change and it was suggested that someone might take up a series of talks on definite subjects, and this led to my undertaking to broadcast studies on the International Sunday School Lessons every Saturday for the following Sunday, hoping that these studies might be helpful to many teachers in Sunday Schools and Bible classes, and others desirous of improving their knowledge of the Bible.

The Subjects chosen are based on the International Uniform Sunday School outlines copyrighted by the International Council of Religious Education which are planned a year ahead, and for this year provide studies from both Old and New Testaments which should prove very helpful and instructive.

For the First Quarter just completed we studied the "Message of the Gospel according to St. John" taking the Life and teachings of Jesus Christ week by week as recorded by St. John, I would like to testify of the blessing and help that the study of the lessons have been to me in the preparation of some from

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language. Therefore the opportunity to win souls for Christ is unique.

The time allowed for the meditation is twenty minutes. In that period the speaker keeps before him the main purpose of his presence there before the microphone, namely, the desire to spread the message of the Kingdom of God and to establish the principles of the Christian faith in the hearts of those who are listening in. He is just a sower; being assured that his seed is good and well prepared the speaker delivers the message. At times the speaker is tempted perhaps to say to himself, "What's the use of coming along to the studio week after week and speaking over the radio? Who listens in?" That is just the point. The speaker does not know. He cannot tell the amount of good he is doing by giving out the Christian message. Who knows but what some poor fallen Christian is listening in and seeking for the hope which the speaker gives out? Who knows but what someone is not looking for Christ and finds Him in the message which he or she hears over the radio?

Who knows but what some tired missionary up-country, over-worked and often disappointed, hears the Christian message to "keep on," and goes out to his or her work of evangelism refreshed and inspired to persevere?

Ought not the speaker to be thrilled when he realizes all these points which might quite possibly, and most probably, do take place every day? Who can tell?

When asked to write this short article by Mr. C. J. Lowe, I asked myself "What are my plans for the Noonday Meditation?" After some thought my answer came as follows:- "To give out a simple Christian message." That was Christ's way and surely it must be ours.

Now as regards the second part of the heading, "Subjects for the noonday meditations." These are legion. So much depends on what the speaker has in mind as regards his plans. This article must necessarily be a personal one and therefore I will say that as my plans are based on the desire to give out the Message of Love, Peace, and Good-

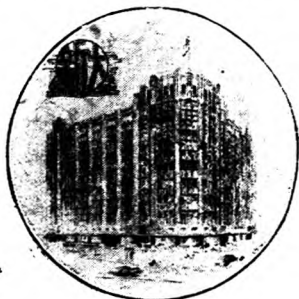
The daily study of the Bible has given me understanding and appreciation of the wonders of God's mighty power in His creation.

My Goodbye Message.

Harold G. Newsham

As I bring my small part in the activities of the Christian Broadcasting Association to a close, on leaving for England I should like to say how great a privilege I have felt it was to have conducted the Monday noon meditations. Though it has not been possible to discover with an exactitude the number of listeners to such broadcasts, I have had sufficient confirmation of the fact that they have been regularly received in places of the most diverse sorts to have

made the experience thoroughly worth while. Missionaries in the out-ports as well as people in Shanghai; invalids laid aside in bed as well as at least one busy Chinese employer of labour in his private office; homes in the suburbs and at least one listener in some unknown backland of the city; have been amongst one's audience. Would that the messages could more adequately have met their needs!

I shall follow with profound interest the future of the Association. Its possibilities are incalculable. Could those in former days who gave their lives for Jesus Christ in China have foreseen what is actually happening in our midst today, with all their faith they might well have been unbelieving. The vision

and treasonable actions, were naturally afraid. Remembering that Christ enjoined us to forgive those who sin against us until seventy times seven and upon their repentance, I felt that they should be allowed to start life anew! At the same time I was greatly humbled that my own faith had not been of such quality as to influence my followers and to restrain them. -

Ever since training the cadets and launching the expedition, I have repeated to my followers these two principles: (1) On detecting the slightest selfishness on my part, or discovering plans contrary to the interest of the country and the people, any one may accuse me of guilt and put me to death; (2) Should my words and actions betray lack of truth and good faith, or indicate departure from the revolutionary cause and principles, any of my subordinates may take me for an enemy and put me to death. I honestly believe that these two sayings were prompted by sincerity and grew out of my religious faith. They are in line with the spirit of the love of Christ, and the forbearance and magnanimity of Dr. Sun Yat-sen.

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The life of Christ reveals a long record of affliction and constant persecution. His spirit of forbearance, His love and His benevolence shine through it all. No more valuable lesson has yet come to me out of my Christian experiences.

Dr. Sun Yat-sen was a Christian, and the greatest thing he received from Christ was love—love for the emancipation of the weaker races, and for the welfare of the oppressed people. This spirit remains with us and reaches to the skies. I am an ardent follower of the revolution, and, although my faith in Dr. Sun at the outset did not appear to have any religious significance, it was similar to a religious faith. For this reason I have become a follower of Dr. Sun and his revolution base on San San Min Chu I.

Today, I find that I have taken a further step and have become a follower of Jesus Christ. This makes me realise more fully that the success of the revolution depends upon men of faith and that men of character, because of their faith, cannot sacrifice their principles for personal safety under

meditations I found these thoughts recurring and providing me with rich spiritual sustenance.

To illustrate, I am going to recount some of my experiences at Sian. Before I went to Shensi on my second trip I was already conscious of perverted thoughts and unusual activities in the army there. I had previously received reports of intrigues and revolutionary rumblings that were threatening to undermine the unity of the state. My immediate associates tried to persuade me to abandon the journey, but I replied: "Now that our country is unified and the foundations of the state established, the commander-in-chief of the armies has responsibilities for direction and enlightenment from which he dare not withdraw. Furthermore, I have dedicated my soul and body to the service of the state, and there can never be any consideration of my personal safety."

According to the record of the New Testament, when Christ entered Jerusalem for the last time, he plainly knew that danger was ahead, but triumphantly, on an ass, he rode into the city without anguish, without fears. What greatness! What courage! In comparison, how unimportant my life must be. So why should I hesitate?

My fondness for my troops has always been as great as the love between brothers and this love drew me into the heart of the rebellion. Such disregard

of danger in the face of duty caused deep concern to the government, worried the people and, for this, numerous prayers were offered by Christian friends. In the midst of it all my understanding increased and my love multiplied.

Following my detention my captors presented me with terms and demands, with tempting words of kindnesses,

with threats of violence and torture and with a public trial by the "People's Front." On every hand I was beset by danger but I had no thought of yielding to pressure. My faith in Christ increased. In this strange predicament I distinctly recalled the forty days and nights Christ passed in the wilderness withstanding temptation, His prayers in the garden of Gethsemane and the indignities heaped upon Him at His trial. The prayers he offered for His enemies upon the Cross were ever in my thoughts. I naturally remembered the prayers offered by Dr. Sun Yat-sen during his imprisonment in London. These scenes passed vividly before me

again and again like so many pictures. My strength was redoubled to resist the recalcitrants and with the spirit of Christ on the Cross I was preparing to make the final sacrifice at the trial of the so-called "People's Front." Having determined upon this course of action, I was comforted and at rest.

Following the settlement of the Sian affair, the rebels, knowing their unwise

My Spiritual Conception of Good Friday

By Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek.

An address to the Central Conference of Eastern Asia of the Methodist

Episcopal Church in session at Wesley Church, Nanking, China, Good Friday Evening, March 26, 1937.

Without religious faith there can be no real understanding of life. Faith in the cause of a revolution is not unlike religious faith. Without faith, human affairs, both great and small, are difficult of achievement. Often when faced to face with opposition and possible danger we mortals are prone to retreat and to abandon our work halfway. Such lack of confidence in ourselves is often due to the absence of a strong religious faith.

I have now been a Christian for nearly ten years and during that time I have been a constant reader of the Bible. Never before has this sacred book been so interesting to me as during my two weeks' captivity in Sian. This unfortunate affair took place all of sudden and I found myself placed under detention without having a single earthly belonging. From my captors I asked but one thing, a copy of the Bible. In my solitude I had ample opportunity for reading and meditation. The greatness and love of Christ burst upon me with new inspiration, increasing my strength to struggle against evil, to overcome temptation and to uphold righteousness.

I am, indeed, grateful to all my fellow Christians who continually offered prayers on my behalf. I was deeply conscious of a strong spiritual support for which I extend my hearty thanks to all Christians, and to which, before you all today, I testify that the name of God may be glorified.

The many virtues of Christ I cannot possibly enumerate. Today, being Good Friday, I merely wish to explain some of the lessons I have derived from the trials of Christ. His utterances from the Cross are our spiritual inheritance. Entreating forgiveness for His enemies, He cried: "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do." Truly great is the love of Christ! In all my
