


In presenting this catalogue to you for 1904, I have to do it without the great satisfaction which I enjoyed in former years. With much regret I have to inform you, former years. With much regret I have to inform you, that nearly all seed-crops have produced only small, or very limited supply. Peas, Beans, and Sweet Corn have produced only half the usual yield, and some sorts were almost a failure. Melons was a short crop, particularly Musk Melon. Cucumber was almost a total failure, and Squash, Pumpkin, Tomato, and all the varieties of Clover, and Grass are very scarce, and prices are very ligher in wholesale trade than L have listed.

Seeds are higher in wholesale trade than I have listed them post'g'-paid. My catalogue was printed before the full extent of shortage was known, and I was obliged to pay more for many varieties than I had listed them. can supply customers at my low prices while present stocks last. Please compare my prices with others to see the difference. I believe there is no better seeds sold in the world, and my price is close to the cost of producing them. I have them grown in localities which is known as best, and give them earliness and strong germination.
