


So... who writes Wikipedia?

Wikipedia for Schools Project

- Aim: to bring improved access to free information, especially critical educational content, to Kenya's students and teachers through the installation of Offline Wikipedia in Primary & Secondary Schools across the country.

OpenZIM Project:

- Mission: To make Wiki content available offline, with primary focus on the contents of Wikipedia and other Wikimedia projects.
- Creation of the Wikipedia for Schools which has 20,000,000 words and 34,000 images – Size 3GB

Offline solution pipeline

CONTENT: Selecting the Wikimedia content to be displayed offline

PEDIAPRESS

STORAGE: Packaging the selected content in a standard file format

READER: Accessing the stored
Wikimedia content via a platform



DISTRIBUTION: Spreading the package into areas that need it!




SCOPE OF WORK:



- Install and configure the Offline Wikipedia in the computers.
- Provide a simple printed Wikipedia guide that will assist beginners in getting started.
- Give out lectures at each school: For the teachers, and the students. The two tutorials taught the students/teachers on how to gain maximum benefit when using Wikipedia.
- Provided each school with a hard copy of the offline Wikipedia, for recovery purposes.

Wikipedia is primarily available for only for those with Internet Access, or <30% of the world

Internet users per 100 inhabitants 1997-2007 (Source: ITU)



- 8% broadband penetration globally
- •5B people without access to Internet
- .71% of developed economies are online
- 21% of developing economies are online
- 9.6% of Africans have access to Internet
