MONEY MARKET.

We have again to record a general depletion in the money market, consequent principally upon the shipment of cotton to Europe, and the removal of the pressure on the part of the N. Y. Banks to advance the rates for money, aided by the usual contraction preparatory to showing their condition, in quarterly statements. The Bank rate in this city may be said to be $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. asked, taken for 1 and 6 months paper; on prime 60 day acceptances, $3\frac{1}{2}$; while demand loans, though some banks hold out for 1 per cent., are still effected as low as 3 per cent., and in some cases heavy amounts of Government Stocks, on which loans had been obtained three months since at $2\frac{1}{2}$ and $2\frac{3}{4}$ per cent., have not been called in. City, State, and Government Stocks, at present prices, will yield but about $4\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. The dividend paying Rail-Roads and Bank Stocks, as will be seen by our Stock list, command a high premium. Manufacturing and Insurance Stocks have maintained their quotations with an upward tendency, while the fancy valuable prospective Stocks are firm and buoyant at their present advanced prices.

The Western Rail-Road Stock has undergone large speculative movements within the last month, ranging from \$51 to \$61 per share. Two parties strove for the ascendancy, known as the high and low fare parties respectively, and the upshot of the operation appears to be this: Both are endeavoring to keep the Stock up, the successful portion, for interest and feeling's sake; the other, to get rid of their shares without loss. This Stock has always been subject to severe fluctuations, originating and ending in speculative operations, with but little regard to any immediate favorable alteration in the affairs of the Corporation. It, however, cannot be denied, that from the ascertained capabilities of this Road, with its favorable expectations from the future movements of the N. Y. Legislature, in regard to the extension of the liberty of carrying freight on their Rail-Roads immediately connected with this, and from the great number of collateral roads that from its central situation must connect with it, as well as its highly advantageous geographical position, that the time is not far distant when the Western Rail-Road will become a safe and profitable investment, as well as a lasting monument of the perseverance, enterprise, and sagacity of the people of Massachusetts.

The immense amount of capital concentrated in this city, together with the facilities which so large a market offers to its vicinity, in monetary transactions, considerably enhances the importance and usefulness of the Boston Board of Brokers. The daily negotiations at this board, are intended to show actual sales, and to place a fair value on the Government, State and City Securities, with accurate quotations of all the principal Stocks in New England. Investments, mortgages, and all other financial operations, are more readily effected by its members than elsewhere.

The doings of the New York Stock Boards, although indicating the immediate market value of most of the securities quoted, is still characterized by immense speculative operations, which tend to place a fictitious present value upon a certain stock, which, under other circumstances, its intrinsic worth would not justify.

American Stocks in London, with the exception of Massachusetts State, which is higher there than at home, bear about the same price as in this country. Nothing has yet been done by the non-dividend paying States towards liquidation.

As the amount of the notes of the New York State Banks are daily getting more and more into circulation in the New England States, we have deemed it of use to give some remarks in relation to the Banking law at present existing in that State.

The original banking law was called the 'Safety Fund'; this was a fund formed by contribution from all the banks in the State, the proceeds of which went to paying the unredeemed notes of any bank among them, which should become bankrupt. Of this class of banks there are 84 now remaining, with an aggregate capital of \$2,391,460. Circulation, \$13,850,334. Specie, \$1,953,270. Deposits, \$22,107,761. In 1838, the number was 95, since which 10 have failed, and there is now outstanding \$89,311 of their circulation, which will be redeemed by the 'Safety Fund.'

In 1838 the 'Free Banking' law was established, which provided that any individual or association of individuals, could on hypothecation of any of the State or Government securities, receive an equal amount of circulating notes, which bank notes are countersigned by the Comptroller and Register, and by law are obliged to be redeemed at $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. discount, either in New York city or Albany, or in specie at home, and, in the ultimate failure of the concern, by the Comptroller of the State, from the proceeds of the hypothecated stocks, a memorandum of which was printed on the face of the note. This law, owing to the depreciation of many of the State stocks so pledged, and consequent insecurity of the circulating notes based upon them, and to increase the demand for New York stocks, which at that time were falling in the market, was amended so as to exclude all stocks, except those of that state, on which basis it now stands.

Of this class, there are now existing 58 associations and individual Bankers, with an aggregate circulation of \$1,299,258, raised upon \$52,000. U. S. Stocks, \$1,771,431.38; New York State Stocks, \$64,000; Maine and Kentucky, \$510,663.66; Michigan, worth \$29,000—\$170,000; Indiana, worth \$35,000—\$531,000; Illinois, worth

\$171,000—\$587,000; Arkansas, worth \$291,000—\$11,000; Alabama, worth \$28,000; Cash deposited, \$17,731.11. Bonds and Mortgages, \$1,525,000. Total, \$1,270,705.15. In 1838, there were 93 Free Banks, since which, 26 have failed. At the time of their failure, their aggregate circulation was \$1,197,517. There has been redeemed by the Comptroller, \$1,163,981, leaving outstanding, to be redeemed, \$33,536.

This description is known as the 'Red Back' or 'Red Dog' money, from the check plate, stamped on the back, in red ink, and all of the same date.

By an act of the last Legislature, all the chartered Banks, that is, all that are not 'free Banks,' are required to surrender their plates to the Comptroller, with a statement of all the impressions that have been taken from them, to be delivered up to the Comptroller, and new notes issued, with the Comptroller's die upon them, countersigned and registered by him; the plates, &c. to remain in the hands of the State, and notes given to the Banks as needed.

A Free Banking Law, similar to that existing in the State of New York, authorizing the issuing of Bank Notes to a certain extent, on pledge of Ohio State Stock, is now before the Legislature of that State. If it should become a law, it will have a tendency to withdraw the State Stock from the market, and maintain higher and more uniform prices. A good currency is much needed in that State.

The amount of the notes of the New England country Banks redeemed annually, at par, at the Suffolk Bank, Boston, is not far from \$120,000,000. The amount of notes of the Banks in the State of New York, redeemed annually, at $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. discount, is about \$100,000,000, showing an aggregate loss to the bill holders of \$500,000 which is nearly equal to the net proceeds of the mill tax in that State.

\$1,598,300 notes, of the denomination of 'Fifty' Dollars, had been issued by the Treasury, up to the 1st of February. Of this amount, less than \$100,000 have been redeemed by the government banks.

COUNTERFEITS ON PERKINS' OLD STEREO TYPE PLATE.

It will be observed, that in all genuine notes, of either denomination of the Stereotype Plate, the white lines composing the ground or lattice work bearing the title of the Bank, the State and location, the fine white lines run into the white letters, without any line of separation; in the counterfeit there may be clearly seen a well defined line, around each white letter. The ONES, TWOS, and THREES, it will be noticed, have in each corner a triangular piece of dot work, not found in the larger denominations; this, in the true note, presents on the curved or inner side, a rough and apparently unfinished edge, different from the outer, which have a line drawn around them; this edge, in all bad notes, is smooth, showing a distinct hair line completely encircling each of the four pieces of dot work.

The above description applies alike to all the Bank notes of whatever denomination, that are done on the Perkins' (Old Stereotype Steel Plate, except those that have the check plate on the back, these have never been counterfeited.
