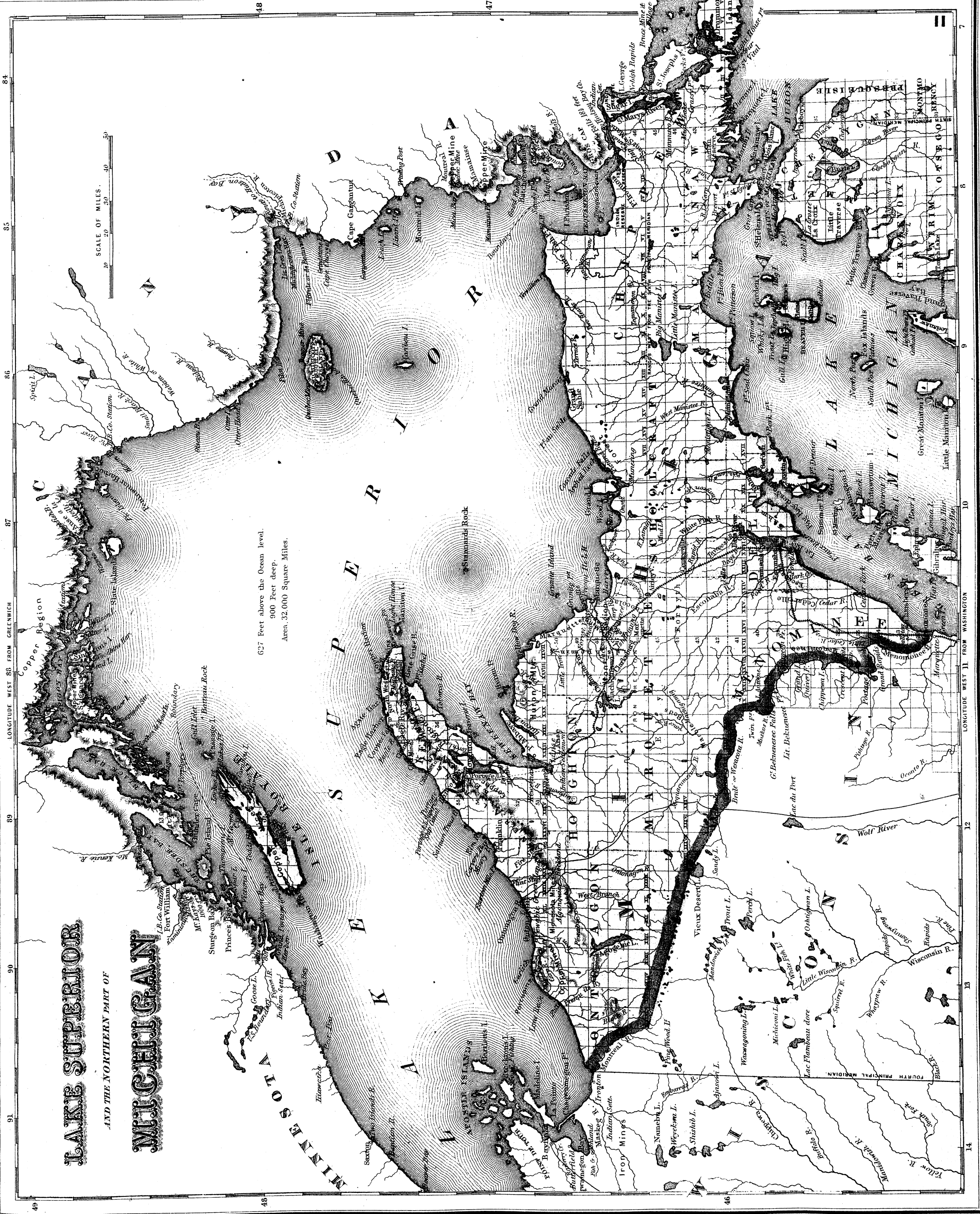

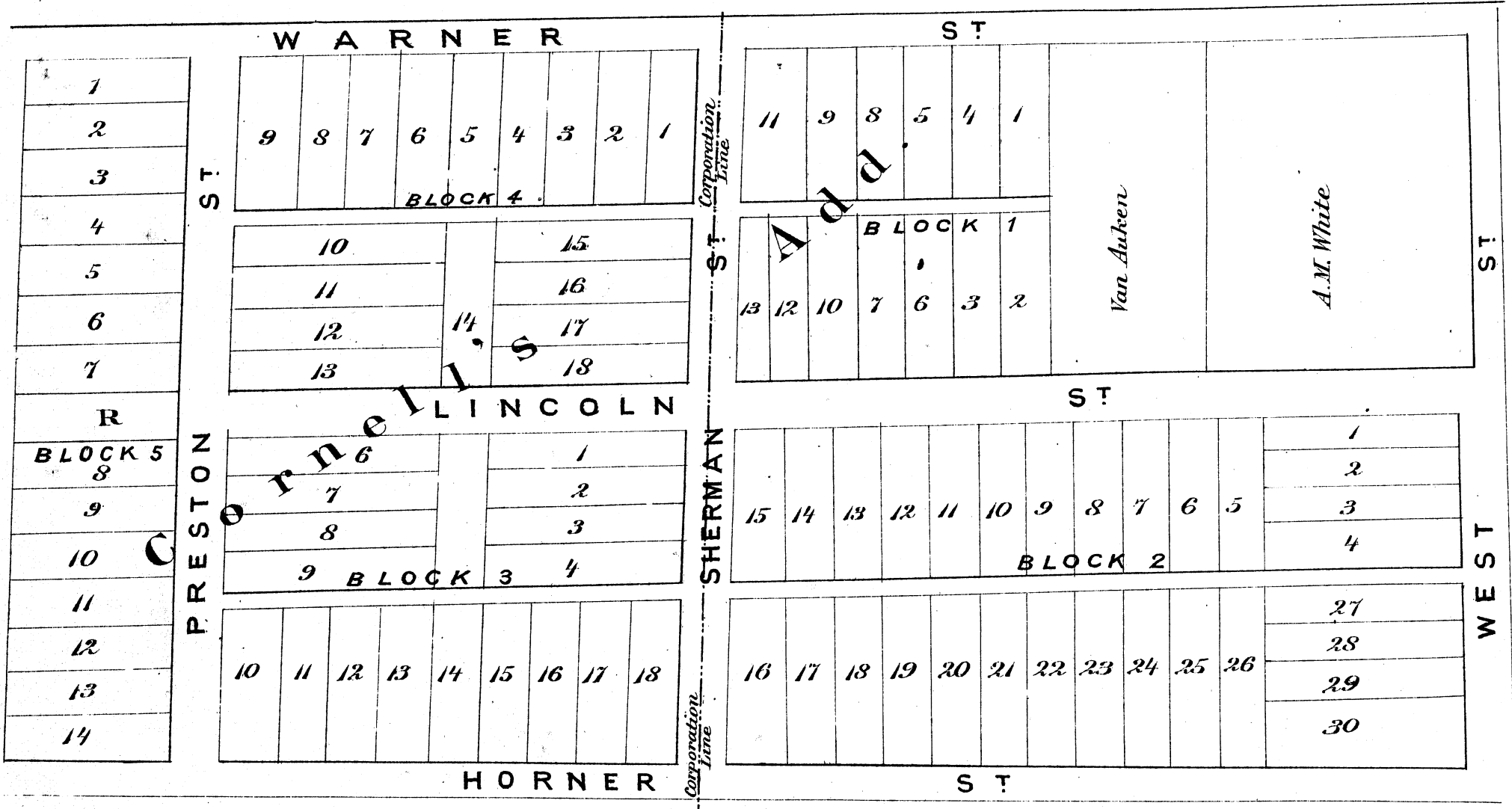


INDEX PLAN
