The following letter has been crowd-i ed over from day to day, by a press of other matter:

SAN JOSE, Jan. 2d. Editors of the Pacific News:

The advent of the New Year in this locality during the whole of yesterday, seemed veiled in an impenetrable fog. The hazy atmosphere cast a melancholy gloom over maids, matrons, gents, politicians, hotel keepers, office seekers, and a host of strange faces that are now congregating at the Capital of California. But today, as if to make the contrast stand out in bold relief, glorious "Old Sol" shines with magnificent lustre, imparting as it were, a mirrored grandeur to all animated nature. The feathered tribe are enraptured at the gorgeous beauty of the elements—the blackbirds warble melodious tunes, and the grave and demure looking crows hop with more sprightliness, while the burrowing squirrel may be seen frisking about with gay humor and gladdened hearts. The truth is, this is most decidedly a lovely and beautiful place. The location of San Jose is admirable in all respects, and those who visit here cannot be otherwise than favorably impressed in its behalf. No Italian skies or sunny climes of the Mediterranean, can excel this climate in healthful luxuriance. The air is fragrant, and the lungs expand and breathe freeer as we inhale the floating breezes of Heaven. The disciples of Galen or Esculapius are not likely to realize very large 'piles' in this region, for almost every body appears disposed to "throw physic to the dogs."

The accommodations here for the coming session of the General Assembly, are ample, far excelling anything I had reason to expect. The 'Mansion House' is arranged in admirable order, and TAAFT, the polite landlord, is ever on the alert to make his guests comfortable. McAlpin, of the 'City Hotel,' is equally bland and smiling, and is prepared to do the agreeable in handsome style. The one hails from Wisconsin, the other from Alabama, and they together, present a union of the North and South: a kind of wedlock of the White and Red

A little feeling is discoverable on the surface among the denizens of San Jose, in regard to the contemplated removal of the session to San Francisco. Though somewhat apprehensive, I think they have no cause to be frightened at the prospect of such a calamity; for I cannot believe sufficient members can be found who are willing to leap the chasm, and contribute to bring about such a result. Whatever impressions the 'borers' at the 'Union Hotel' may make, the "sober second thought" will speedily dissipate them, when grave Senators and Representatives arrive at the Pueblo.

The Senatorship excites discussion in political circles. The idea here is that the chances for the re-election of Col. FREMONT are increasing. Were it an original choice, the contest would doubtless be different, but the comity of political associations, usages and friendships, lead to the conviction that it is due to a Senator to be re-elected for a second term, unless he has done something in his official or private capacity, obnoxious to public opinion. Such is not believed to be the fact with regard to Col. Fremont. He has served but a short period—only about three weeks—and it would be doing violence to the political annals of the State to cast aside a high-minded and honorable man, without first giving him a fair opportunity to display his statesmanship. Besides, Col. F. has strong claims upon the public confidence. He has done much and suffered much for California. He has freely risked his life in her acquisition, and in the darkest hours of her struggling trials. The Whale Fishery.

There is no one department of our commerce which is entitled to, or which has received, a larger share of the attention and fostering care of Government, than that engaged in the whale fishery; and much of the credit awarded to us from abroad, for persevering and indomitable energy, adventurous courage, and nautical skill, is justly due to that spirit of enterprize, which seeks employment, regardless of every privation which a separation from friends and from home compels the whaleman to undergo, and of every danger a long and tedious voyage is sure to impose upon the hardy mariner, who looks for a requital for his labor in the waters of the South Atlantic, Indian and Pacific oceans

It is one of the peculiar characteristics of our gallant and hardy Tar, to laugh at the dangers which a landsman sees in the ponderous jaw of the whale, or death-dealing sweep of his huge frame, when lashed into fury by the wound inflicted by the unerring aim of the harpoon, and the cry of "stern all," mingles its echoes with the joyous notes which are heard far above the ocean's surge -" pull briskly my lads-together, away!

It is only since we came in possession of the "Report of the Secretary of the Treasury." for the fiscal year ending June 30. 1849, that we were fully aware of the amount of American tonnage engaged in this branch of commerce. From this document we learn that New Bedford, Nantucket, New London, Stonington and Sag Harbor, employ not less than 170,000 tons in this business, besides other places less extensively engaged in it. but whose tonnage, if added to the former amount, would swell the aggregate to 200,-000. It had often occurred to us that a very large portion, or at least an equal number of vessels could be profitably employed in San Francisco, and this port be to the Pacific what New Bedford is to the Atlantic, and eventually become the great "oil market" for the world

The inequalities of price for labor and outfit, will soon be overcome, and California be enabled to enjoy all the necessaries, and many of the luxuries of living, which are so freely indulged in by the older States, only adding the difference of transportation between Michigan, or Ohio, or Louisiana and New York, to the cost of bringing the same articles to San Francisco.

The expenses of an outfit for a three year's voyage will then be avoided as well as the great loss of time; and when a portion of the enterprise of this State shall seek occupation in this channel, then will California begin to realize the glories of that destiny which awaits her, in the immediate future, in all that pertains to that important feature of a nations greatness, an extensive and successful commerce.

A letter from "The Old Soldier

Our Washington Correspondence. WASHINGTON CITY, Nov. 25, 1850 Editors of the Pacific News: I must contradict the P. S. in my last let-

ter. Mr. Hunt, the Whig, has been elected Governor of New York by about 500 majority. The democratic Lt. Governor, was, however, elected by about 5000, and all the other officers nominated by that party were elected. We have also gained 16 members of Congress, and every day shows that the Union feeling is triumphant in New York. So far as the elections have taken place, the Democratic party have gained 26 members of the House. The Senate for the ensuing term will be of similar sentiments, by about two to one! So that the Republic is safe, any how. My last sentence reminds me of the Republic newspaper of this city. It is edited with great ability by our friend Mr. Sargent, and keeps up a hot fire against all disunion projects. The National Intelligencer has touched certain agitators rather delicately until quite lately. Its editorial on Thompson's advent to Boston, was, however, without any qualification. Such language from so old and respectable a paper, will do much good. They feel, no doubt, more prepared to speak strongly on all vexed topics, for they have succeeded in getting the contract for the Census printing. Blair & Rives cleared \$100,000 by a similar job. Should Gales & Seaton do as well, nobody will grumble much. They are both personally popular, and are ever ready to contribute of their means for the melioration of the necessitous. "golden report" from the new discovered El Dorado, by one of the millionaires expectant of the company. According to the estimate of \$43,000,000 each, there will be \$1,720, 000,000 to be divided by the "40." Allowing the sand to yield one dollar a pan, we have 1,720,000,000 pans, each weighing 25 pounds-making 12,040,000.000 pounds, or 6.020,000 tons. Now, allow a vessel to carry 300 tons, we have employment for 20,100 vessels. But I presume the fortunate possessors of this immense bluff, will do the washing on the ground, as there will probably be water enough in the Pacific for that purpose, as soon as the shin-canal is cut through to let in the waters of the Atlantic. At \$192 to the pound, we have 8,921,864 lbs. of gold, or 4461 tons-enough to load lifteen vessels of 300 tons. It is estimated that there is now circulating \$500,000,000.
