Article II. Since the Government maintains a mecessary amount of rice in connection with the China Incident, when it is especially considered necessary it shall be authorized, in accordance with the provisions set forth in the Imperial Ordinance, and after consultation with the Rice Control Committee, to purchase rice in case current prices are lower than that which correspond to the rate of "standard maximum prices" which are fixed by orders issued based upon the Rice Control Regulations.
