FR-I & FR-II are two letters from the Justice Mukherjee Commission (JMC), Kolkata which may kindly be perused.

In FR-I it has been stated that in our office File No. 915/11/C/6/96-Pol (placed below), (photocopy of which has been made available to the Commission) only three note-sheet pages have been provided and noting portion in respect of the remaining correspondence of the file has not been furnished. On this ground, an officer, not below the rank of Joint Secretary, PMO has been asked to appear personally before the Commission on 16.10.2001 at 11 a.m. in the Committee Room 'C' at Vigyan Bhawan Annexe, New Delhi to explain the above anomaly.

This is not only strange but also very unfortunate that despite filing Affidavit before the Commission by Secretary to PM and Joint Secretary to PM to the effect that "...nothing material has been concealed..." (verification portion of both the Affidavits at F/A & F/B refer), the Commission has not felt the need to check the veracity of our statement before asking Joint Secretary to PM to explain the anomaly before the Commission personally.

In this context it may be mentioned that working nature of this office is some what different from other conventional offices of Govt. of India. In this office, noting on the note-sheet is made for taking direction of higher officers or obtaining PM's approval on some important issues. For each and every incoming routine receipts no noting is done on note-sheets. On majority of the cases disposal instruction of a receipt is given by the concerned officer on the receipt itself.

Therefore, if approved, we may inform the JMC that the photo copy of the entire file has already been made available to the Commission including the entire noting portion which consists of only three pages. In fact, if considered appropriate we may ask the Secretary of the Commission to visit this office personally to check the file in question and satisfy himself to remove any doubt.

In FR-II attention has been drawn to Principal Secretary's direction contained in page -3/N of the above referred file (placed below) about asking MEA to make an effort to ascertain if the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose figures in U.N. records as 'War Criminal'. Request has been made to inform the Commission about the out-come of the effort within eight weeks.

In pursuance of Principal Secretary's direction MEA was asked to take necessary action vide our u.o. note at P-192/C. Although more than 33 months have passed we have not received any feed back from MEA in this regard.

In view of the present letter from JMC, we may ask MEA to let us know the result of the effort made in this regard urgently.

In addition to the aforesaid issue the JMC has desired to know the action taken by this office on the letters from Shri Bijon Ghosh (dt. 10.10.1998) at page-182/C and from Prof. Amalendu Guha (dt. 23.1.1999) (Page No. 194/C). It may be observed from the file placed below that while comments of MEA on Shri Bijon Ghosh's letter dated 10.10.1998 had been called for, Prof. Amalendu Guha's letter was referred to MHA on 9.2.1999. In fact, above referred direction of Principal Secretary was given in the context of MEA's reply on Shri Bijon Ghosh's letter.

We may convey the above position to JMC.

Photocopy of all of our relevant files have already been made available to the JMC. We have no information available with us about the above referred Affidavit. Therefore, if approved, we may inform JMC that this office has no knowledge about the aforesaid Affidavit filed by the Govt. of India before the Justice Khosla Commission.

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Subject: Justice Mukherjee Commission of Inquiry for inquiry into the alleged disappearance of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose.

Shri M. Roy, OSD in the Justice Mukherjee Commission of Inquiry (JMCI) has intimated us (F/ 'A') that the next hearing of the Commission will be held on 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2001 (also on 17<sup>th</sup> October, if necessary) at Vigyan Bhawan Annexe, New Delhi. An Officer of PMO on behalf of Secretary to PM is among the persons summoned for witnesses on 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2001. It may be seen that Shri Pranab Mukherjee, former Minister of External Affairs has been summoned on 15.10.2001.

- 2. Shri Tarakeswar Pal, Senior Counsel to the Government of India, in his letter dated 29.9.2001 (F/ 'B') addressed to PMO has given the flavour of questions likely to be raised by the Commission:
  - (i) Government is not producing relevant records-classified or nonclassified (including 9000 files of the Ministry of Defence).
  - (ii) The Government is not taking initiative for foreign records, as well as not making the records collected therefrom public.
  - (iii) As Jawaharlal Nehru was anti-Netaji and anti-INA, he was trying to establish death of the Netaji and so Enquiry Committee was set up in 1956 under his own man, Shah Nawaj Khan and the Justice Khosla Commission was also appointed to draw the said given conclusion and similarly the present Justice Mukherjee Commission has also been appointed with the same aim.
  - (iv) The Government is not making the records, on the basis of which the Prime Minister Morarji Desai and Minister of State Dhanik Lal Mondal expressed, in the Parliament, disagreement with the findings of the Shah Nawaj Committee and the Justice Khosla Commission, public.
  - (v) Jawaharlal Nehru complained to British Premier Attlee against Stalin for the latter's allowing the Netaji in the USSR after 18<sup>th</sup> August, 1945.
  - (vi) Asiatic Society scholars have not been helped by the Government in unearthing the records proving the Netaji's existence in the USSR in spite of Russia's "no objection".
  - (vii) Government of India under Jawarlal Nehru and subsequently as a British Dominion Government included the Netaji as War Criminal and did nothing against such branding to bar him from coming out while the Government of India said to the Shah Nawaj Committee

that it has not in possession of any information as to the Netaji's status as War Criminal, but if reaffirmed in 1971 the said status of the Netaji beyond statutory limitation. (viii) Government of India's apathy to celebrate the Netaji's birth Moves of Sri Pranab Kumar Mukherjee and Sri Jaswant Singh,

former and present Ministers of External Affairs, respectively, to bring "ash" of the Netaji from Renkoji (even after the present Commission was set up).

3. Shri Tarakeswar Pal, Senior Counsel has specifically mentioned that the following questions are likely to be asked from Shri Pranab Mukherjee:

On the basis of which records you took initiative in bringing the (i) "ash" stated to be of the Netaji from Renkoji?

- On the basis of which records you supported conferring (ii) "Posthumous Bharat Ratna" on the Netaji?
- On the basis of which records the programme of bringing "ash" (iii) and conferring "Posthumous Bharat Ratna" was dropped?
- It may be recalled that we have furnished photocopy of relevant files available in PMO to the JMCI. An affidavit by JS (J) on 29.11.2000 and a supplementary affidavit by the then Secretary to PM on 16.1.2001 were filed before the Commission.
- As regards conferment of Bharat Ratna "posthumously" on Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, the following may be perused:
  - Note dated 25.9.1991 put up by Director to PM through Principal (i) Secretary (F/ 'C')
  - Note dated 31.10.1991 recorded by PS to PM for information of (ii) Principal Secretary (F/ 'D')
  - PM's letter dated 10.10.1991 to President proposing conferment of (iii) Bharat Ratna posthumously on Subhash Chandra Bose. (F/ 'E')
  - PM's letter dated 19.1.1992 to President suggesting announcement (iv) of posthumous award to Netaji Subash Chandra Bose (also Maulana Abul Kalam Azad) on 23<sup>rd</sup> January (Netaji's birthday) (F/ 'F')
  - Note dated 13.4.1992 put up by Director to PM through Principal (v) Secretary regarding non-acceptance of award by Netaji's family (F/ 'G')
- The Commission has separately requested that an officer, not below the 6. rank of Joint Secretary, PMO, to appear personally before the Commission on 16.10.2001 at 1100 hrs to explain "anomaly" with regard to documents filed by

PMO before the Commission. The Commission's complaint is that only three note sheet pages have been provided by us of the original file No. 915/11/C/6/96 Pol. The factual position is that a photocopy of the entire file, including the noting portion – which incidentally is three pages only — has already been made available to the Commission. The position may be suitably explained by the PMO officer when he appears before the Commission on 16.10.2001.

7. It is suggested that either AS (P) or JS (J) may be nominated to appear as witness on behalf of Secretary to PM. It may also be useful if Home Secretary is requested to take a meeting on the subject so that a unified stance before the Commission is adopted by the Government.



- 3. The Prime Minister had asked the Home Minister to meet the President and seek his guidance in the matter (page 2/N). HM met the President on 24-3-92. After meeting the President, HM has minuted at page 2/N of the file as below:-

"I have discussed today with President and he said that there is no provision for withdrawing the Bharat Ratna award. It will not be sent to Archives. It may be kept with Home Ministry. It will not be mentioned when the names are called. Nothing needs to be done."

4. Home Minister has sent the file to PM suggesting that no further action is necessary and the matter may be treated as closed.

Justice Mukherjee Commission vide its letter dated 8.12.2001 at P-32/C had pointed out several alleged anomalies in respect of certain documents pertaining to the File No. 915/11/C/6/96-Pol. The Commission has called for our explanation in regard to these anomalies within 8 weeks from to receipt of this letter.

Subsequently, on 16/10/2001 during the Commission's hearing held in the Vigyan Bhavan, as per a specific direction from the Commission, the said file was submitted to the Commission and the same has been received back only in the last week of November, 2001. Due to non-availability of the file the alleged anomalies could not be examined earlier.

Para-wise comments on JMC's letter regarding the alleged anomalies are given below.

- Para (a) It is a fact that the said file actually contains only 3 note sheet pages and 204 pages on the correspondence portion. This file was submitted to the Commission and they must have satisfied themselves.
- Para (b) On receipt of an independent letter on this specific issue from the Commission, further follow up action has been taken in consultation with MEA and finally MEA, being the modal Ministry, has been requested to provide requisite information to the Justice Mukherjee Commission. The Commission has also been informed of the position.
- Para (c) Page No 130 & 131 of the correspondence portion are very much there in the file.
- Para (d) Page 132 and 133 are enclosure of a letter written by Shri Shakti Singh, President, Subash Chandra Bose Rastriya Bichar Manch, Uttar Pradesh. Therefore, no action was required to be taken on these pages.
- Para (e) Being a mere photocopy of a newspaper clipping no action was called for on our part.

- Para (f) Correspondence pages 117 to 165 contain two letters dated 16.5.98 alongwith enclosures addressed to PM by Shri Shakti Singh, President, Subash Chandera Bose Rastriya Bichar Manch, UP. Generally, these kinds of letters are forwarded to MHA for appropriate action. But in the instant case, due to inadvertence these letters were not forwarded to MHA and were simply filed.
- Para (g) Position indicated is correct.MHA's comments does not seem to have been received so far. We may ask MHA to furnish their comments in the matter urgently.

  (Action: PMO/MHA)
- Para (h) Shri Bijon Ghosh's letter was regarding removal of Netaji S.C. Bose's name from the UN records of 'War Criminals'. The present status has been indicated against para (b).
- Para (i) MHA reply dated 12.10.2001 at P-45/c conclusively explains the position regarding removal of Netaji's name from the list of War Criminals in United Kingdom. The same may be made available to the JMC.

Reference JS (J)'s direction on the FR which is a letter dated 29.4.2002 from Justice Mukherjee Commission of Inquiry (JMCI) enclosing photocopy of JMCI's proceedings dated 21.3.2002 and 22.3.2002 together with copy of Status Report as on 19.3.2002.

- 2. So far as proceedings dated 21.3.2002 & 22.3.2002 are concerned, PMO has no action points.
- 3. The Status Report contains several points on which the Commission is expecting response from PMO. These points and the action to be taken or already taken are explained before one by one.
  - Para 6: Contents of JMCI's letter dated 8.10.2001 was examined vide our note at P-12 & 13/N and was submitted to Dir (J) but subsequently, due to inadvertence the file was not submitted to JS (J) and as such Commission's letter has remained unanswered. The note on P-12 & 13/N may kindly be perused and the course of action suggested therein may be approved.
  - Para 9: The Commission's letter dated 2910-2002 may kindly be perused at F/X [on Pt. File No. 915/11/C/2/2000-Pol]. The file [No. 23/156/51-PM] mentioned in the letter is also placed below. Regarding procedure for destruction of document of a file it may be stated that it is done strictly as per the procedure laid down in the chapter X of Manual of Office Procedure (MOP) (A GOI Publication). # AIDE-MEMOIRE

Subject : Myterious disappearance of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bos

The last official stand taken by the office of filminister of India on the floor of Lok Sabha was on 3rd deptember 1978 when Shri Morarji Deai stated: "Shah-Nawa Committee & Khomla Commission hold the report of Netaji Subham Chandra Bose's death following, a Plane Crash as true. Since the readnable doubts have been caused on the correctnesss in the two reports asnd various important contradictions in the estimony of the witnesses have been noticed. Some further contemporary, official documentary record haved allo become available. In the light of those doubts and contradiction and those records Government find; it difficult to accept; that the earlier conclusions are decisive.

The claim in support of Netaji's death consequent to the alleged accident at TAIHOKU on 18.8.1945 was based almost entirely on the evience provided by Col. Habibur Rehman, A.D.C to Netaji and the Japanese Doctor T. Yohimi. Col. Rahman maintained he accompanied Netaji on the reported fateful journey but survived the tragedy. Dr. Yohimi submitted that he unsuccessfully treated Netaji in hospital after the reported incident.

Col. Rehman was twice interrogated by Allied intelligence and he also appeared before the Shah-Nawas Committee. A chart of his statements on these three occasions indicate the rather inconsistent nature of his decriptions is enclosed herewith. The Combined Services Detailed Interrogation Centre (CSDIC) recorded on 25th March, 1946: It appears that Habibur Rehman is not willing to come out with the truth". In fact, the Intelligence Bureau, in New Delhi categorically recorded on 19.5.1946: "Habibur-Rehman's statement is unsatisfactory. The multitude on Counter Intelligence Corps (CIC) in Tokyo and later to C.S.D.I.C. is being taken up".

The last official stand taken by the office of frame Minister of India on the floor of Lok Sabha was on 3rd aptents 1978 when Shri Morarji Deai stated: "Shah-Nawa Commistee a Rhomla Commission hold the report of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose's death following, a Plane Crash as true. Since the reaonable doubts have been caused on the correctnesss in the two reports asnd various important contradictions in the distinony of the witnesses have been noticed. Some further contemporary official documentary record haved allo become available. In the light of those doubts and contradiction and those records, Government find; it difficult to accept; that the earlier conclusions are decisive.

The claim in support of Netaji's death consequent to the alleged accident at TAIHOKU on 18.8.1945 was based almost entirely on the evience provided by Col. Habibur Rehman, A.D.C to Netaji and the Japanese Doctor T. Yohimi. Col. Rahman maintained he accompanied Netaji on the reported fateful journey but survived the tragedy. Dr. Yohimi submitted that he unsuccessfully treated Netaji in hospital after the reported incident.

Col. Rehman was twice interrogated by Allied intelligence and he also appeared before the Shah-Nawas Committee. A chart of his statements on these three occasions indicate the rather inconsistent nature of his decriptions is enclosed herewith. The Combined Services Detailed Interrogation Centre (CSDIC) recorded on 25th March, 1946: It appears that Habibur Rehman is not willing to come out with the truth". In fact, the Intelligence Bureau, in New Delhi categorically recorded on 19.5.1946: "Habibur-Rehman's statement is unsatisfactory. The multitude on Counter Intelligence Corps (CIC) in Tokyo and later to C.S.D.I.C. is being taken up".

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From the NP 3 of the file it appears that one Sri Bijon Ghosh, Advocate of the Supreme Court of India had written to the Prime Minister asking for the removal of the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose from the list of War Criminals and the PMO had sought MEA's advice in the matter. It was noted further by Sri P.P.Sukla the then Joint Secretary (P) in the P.M.O. that the position was that the U.N. "does not maintain any list of war criminals but does maintain records of the U.N. War crimes Commission ". It was further noted by the same Joint Secretary" it is not known whether Netaji's name figures in this list or not. In any case, according to MEA, the list is more in the nature of an archive rather than an actionable list. There is thus no benefit in even seeking to establish whether Netaji's name figures in such a list. MEA, therefore, advised that no further action should be taken by us ". Inspite of this proposal by the Joint Secretary (P) in the P.M.O.'s office. Sri Brajesh Misra, Principal Secretary to the Prime Minister ordered on 21.12.98 that MEA should make an effort to ascertain if the name figured in U.N. records". Again at Cor.P 196 there is a letter dated 12.3.99 from Sri A'.K. Faitandy, Director (ISI) to Sri D.C. Mohanty, Sr./Counsel / standing of the Govt. of India, Orissa High Court, Cuttack, wherein Sri Mohanty was informed that as per information furnished by the Govt. of United Kingdom, the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was not included in the list of war criminals drawn up by them. This letter was in connection with a Writ Application OJC No. 14400 of 1998) filed by one Dr.S.S. Mohapatra before the Hon'ble High Court of Orissa. The information said to have been furnished by the Govt. of United Kingdom or any copy thereof is not in this file. Cor. Page 133 purports to be a letter of Sri Sashi Tharoor, Executive Assistant to the Secretary General of the United Nations, in reply to a letter dated 15.2.77 (cor. page 132) of Air Vice Marshall S. Goyal, Chairman, Netaji Forum, New Delhi. In this letter Sri Tharoor informed Sri Goyal that. the Secretary General of U.N.O. was aware of the great regard in which Netaji was held but he was powerless to undo any reference that might havebeen made in the past. Sri Tharoor, however, added that the Secretary General was confident that no United Nation's Agency or publication would use the term "war criminal" in 'reference to Netaji in the future. This letter palpabably does not put at rest the allegations ffrom different quarters that Netail's name figures in the list of war criminals. There is only an assurance that in fu are the terms 'war criminal' would not be used in refere to Netaji.

- 2. PMI New York has been consulted. It has been ascertained that the UN does not maintain lists of war criminals. In its archival functions, it simply maintains the records of the UN War Crimes Commission. It is not known whether Netaji's name in fact figures on any of the voluminous records of the Commission.
- 3. Even if this was the case, the Secretariat has made it clear that, since the documents have simply been stored for archival purposes, no change of any kind can be made to them. Therefore, it is not feasible, working through the UN, to remove Netaji's name from any of the lists submitted to the Commission, should he figure on them.
- 4. If we want to establish whether Netaji's name figures on the lists, we have to make a formal request from PR to Secretary General for access to the archives to establish this fact. This by itself would be an indication that we suspect he is on the list of war criminals. Since, according to the UN Secretariat, it is not possible to remove names from these lists, it is a moot point whether any purpose would be served by making this request.

Thus it appears that all the correspondences are not reflected in the notes in the note-sheets in the file.

(b) The notesheet pages as also the cor.pages do not appear to indicate what has been the outcome of the Order dated 21.12.98 at note page 3 of Shri Brojesh Mishra, the then Principal Secretary of the Prime Minister.

The cor. page 192, however, shows that the M.E.A.,

Government of India, was requested under Prime Minister's Office U.O. No.915/11/C/6/96-Pol. dated 24.12.98 to take action to ascertain if Netaji's name figures in the U.N. records; but the further development in the matter is not available in the said photo-copy of the file.

The said d.o. letter and its enclosures have been received by the Commission on October 8, 2001 and will be scrutinized in due course.
- The Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India was requested by Commission's letter No. JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37/106 dated May 28, 2001 to send a true copy of the report of the Government of India in the Foreign Ministry allegedly submitted before the Khosla Commission and marked as Exhibit 29-I which is allegedly concerning another alleged report dated 17.10.1945 of the Director of the British Military Intelligence Department on a Secret Japanese message allegedly intercepted by the Chinese advising Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose to be separated from his fellow travellers at the time of his journey from Burma in an aircraft. From the AP 3 of the file it appears that one Sri Bijon Ghosh, Advocate of the Supreme Court of India. had written to the Prime Minister asking for the removal of the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose from the list of War Criminals and the PMO had sought MEA's advice in the matter. It was noted further by Sri P.P.Sukla the then Joint Secretary (P) in the P.M.O. that the position was that the U.N. "does not maintain any list of war criminals but does maintain records of the U.N. War Crimes Commission ". It was further noted by the same Joint Secretary" it is not known whether Netaji's name figures in this list or not. In any case, according to MEA, the list is more in the nature of an archive rather than an actionable list. There is thus no benefit in even seeking to establish whether Netaji's name figures in such a list. MEA, therefore, advised that no further action should be taken by us ". Goyal, Chairman, Netaji Forum, New Delhi. In this letter Sri Tharoor informed Sri Goyal that the Secretary General of U.N.O. was aware of the great regard in which Netaji was held but he was powerless to undo any reference that might havebeen made in the past. Sri Theroor, however, added that the Secretary General was confident that no United Nation's Agency or publication would use the term "war criminal" in 'reference to Metaji in the future. 

These are classified according to the country which filed the charges and the nationality of the persons charged, eg., France vs. Germans; France vs. Italians, etc. There is no entry regarding charges filed by any country against any Indian national.



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
- 1. As far as the records of the International Military Tribunal for the Far East (including indictments, writs of judgement, etc.) are concerned, no evidence is found supporting the alleged arrest, prosecution or conviction as a "War Criminal" of the late Mr. Subhash Chandra Bose by the said Tribunal. Nor exists any evidence supporting the pronouncement by the Tribunal of the late Mr. Chandra Bose as a "Prisoner of War."
- 2. According to various information regarding the late Mr. Chandra Bose (including that from official documents as well as private publications), Mr. Bose was killed

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killed in an aircraft accident on August 18, 1945, upon his departure from the Taipei Airport, where he had stopped on his way from Saigon to Dairen (Talien) by a Japanese military aeroplane offered him through the good offices of the late General J. Terauchi, Supreme Commander of the then Japanese Expeditionary Forces, Southern Regions. As it was not until September 11, 1945, that the arrest of General H. Tojo and other persons was started consequent upon indictment instituted against them by the Military Tribunal, it is inconceivable under the circumstances referred to above that Mr. Bose was pronounced as a "War Criminal" by the said Tribunal.



Of the six witnesses summoned to-day Shri Subrata Bose, Smt. Chitra Ghosh, Shri Supriyo Bose, Smt. Bithi Chatterjee and Shri Satyabrata Tapadar are present. Prayer for time by another witness summoned, Dr. Susanta Kr. Mitra, was allowed vide order dated 08.03.2002.

Smt. Bithi Chatterjee, Shri Subrata Bose, Smt. Chitra Ghosh and Shri Satvabrata Tapadar have been examined as CW.71, CW.72, CW.73 and CW.74 respectively. Shri Subrata Bose in his examination has testified that the statements made in the affidavit filed by him jointly with Smt. Chitra Ghosh and Shri Supriyo Bose before the Commission are correct. The affidavit is marked Exhibit 94. The signatures of Shri Subrata Bose (CW.72) and Smt. Chitra Ghosh (CW.73) on the affidavit have been marked Exhibits 94/1 and 94/2 respectively. A letter dated 01.12.95 written by Smt. Chitra Ghosh (CW.73) to the then Prime Minister has been marked Exhibit 95 (Xerox copy retained).

Shri Supriyo Bose who filed the affidavit along with Shri Subrata Bose (CW.72) and Smt. Chitra Ghosh (CW.73) has not been examined as his evidence would be repetitive

Shri Satya Brata Tapadar (CW.74) has asserted that his statement made in his affidavit filed on 28th January, 2000 and Supplementary affidavits filed on 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2000, 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2001 and 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2002 are correct. The said affidavit and the supplementary affidavits have been marked Exhibits 96, 97, 98 and 99 respectively. His signatures on the affidavit and on the respective supplementary affidavits have been marked Exhibits 96/1, 97/1, 98/1 and 99/1. The booklet titled as "What happened to Netaji after 18th August, 1945 authored and published by him is marked Exhibit 100.

At the outset, Commission wanted to know from Mr. Tarakeswar Pal, Ld. Senior Counsel of the Govt. of India, about the result of inquiry for finding out further relevant records, as two months' time prayed for by Smt. Sangeeta Gairola, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India on December 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2001 and allowed by the Commission, had already elapsed. Shri Pal informed the Commission that two Committees, one for searching the documents within the Ministry and the other for the other departments and the Ministries, had been formed, but the reports of the Committees had not yet reached the Ministry of Home Affairs. So there was the delay in intimating the Commission about the result of further inquiry. Commission expressed its displeasure for dealing with the matter in lackadaisical manner. Commission would pass necessary order, if need be, at the appropriate time.

The deponent Shri Nanda Lal Chakraborty, referring to page 1, paragraph 3, page 3, paragraphs 7(a)(I), 7(a)(ii), 7(a)(iv) of the Status Report, wanted to know about the compliance by the respective Ministry, Govt. of India and requested the Commission to take up the follow-up action where order of the Commission had not been complied with by the respective Ministries.

As regards paragraph 7(a)(i) of the Status Report, the Ministry of External Affairs filed an affidavit in compliance with the order of the Commission on their prayer at the last sitting in Delhi. They stated that they had no further documents. As regards paragraph 7(a)(ii) of the Status Report, in the paper received by the Commission nothing relevant to the terms of reference of the Commission was found.

Follow-up action, wherever necessary, would be taken up.

The deponent, Shri Nanda Lal Chakraborty and Shri Subrata Bose suggested that Commission should also visit Vietnam and Taiwan while visiting Japan, as Mrs. Prova Jagannathan did not appear before the Commission though she was summoned more than once.

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Shri Subrata Bose further suggested that notice regarding foreign visits—by the Commission should be sent to the deponents sufficient ahead so the deponents could arrange for Visas, Passports, etc. to take part in the hearing of the Commission in Japan and other places abroad.

The suggestion would be considered at the appropriate time.

The deponent, Dr. Sushanta Kumar Mitra, pointed out a mistake in the last line but one of paragraph 13(b) at page 9 of the Status Report wherein "October 28, 1978" had been typed instead of "August 28, 1978.

The mistake was rectified accordingly.

Even though six months have since clapsed those documents are yet to be received by the Commission.

Malkani, M.P. due for answer on 06.03.1996 as mentioned at notesheet page 1 of Prime Minister's Office File No.915/II/C/6/96-Pol. as also on the letter dated November 20, 1996 of Shri Ramkrishna Hogda

addressed to the then President of India, indicating the results of the said actions. The Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs was also requested in the said letter of the Commission to send to the Commission within six weeks an authenticated xerox copy of the information furnished by the Government of U.K. as stated in the letter dated 12.03.1999 of the Ministry of Home Affairs, appearing at cor.page 196 of the said file of the Prime Minister's Office. Copies of the aforesaid notesheet page and cor.page were enclosed with the Commission's said letter dated September 18, 2001. The information and documents called for are still awaited.

- 4. Further affidavit, as called for from the Ministry of Defence, Government of India, by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Record/~N.Delhi/99-2000/37/57 dated May 3, 2001 regarding existence/non-existence/availability/non-availability/destruction, etc. of the complete records of the proceedings of the trial of T.N.A. personnel, is still to be submitted by the said Ministry before the Commission.
- in Netaji Vault" authored by Shri Chandan Nandy was sent to the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, with Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/-37/108 dated 28.05.2001 in terms of the letter No.10/SPS-11/-2001(20)-306 dated 17.05.2001 of the Cabinet Secretariat, Government of India, and the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, was requested to furnish a detailed report on the contents of the said article of Shri Chandan Nandy which was published in the "Telegraph", Calcutta on March 26, 2001. The response of the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, in the matter is still awaited.
- 6. In Commission's letter No.JMCI/Meeting-Hearing/99-2000/57(Vol.II)/349 dated October 8, 2001 certain anomalies noticed in the photo copy of File No.915/II/C/6/96-Pol. of the Prime Minister's Office were pointed out to the Secretary of the Prime Minister's Office with the request to furnish necessary explanation/clarification in respect of the said anomalies within eight weeks from the date of receipt of the

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later. The said letter appears to have been received in the Prime Minister's Office on December 12, 2001. Their reply is still awaited.

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- 7.(a)(i) Shri Jayant Prasad, Joint Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, prayed for two months, time at the time of his examination as a witness before the Commission on December 20, 2001, for filing a supplementary affidavit detailing the developments that have taken place since he filed his affidavit dated 14.12.2001 regarding availability of documents from foreign countries. The Hon ble Chairman considered and allowed the prayer with the direction that he should also state in his supplementary affidavit whether there is any classified documents relating to the terms of reference of the Commission.
  - (a)(ii) The Director (CNV), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, in his d.o. letter No.25/4/NGO-Vol.VII dated February 21, 2002 addressed to the Secretary of the Commission has stated inter alia: "following the scrutiny of records" being relied upon by different deponents "It was found that only one document a record of the interview of the then Ambassador to U.S.S.R., Shri K.P.S. Menon, with Stalin pertained to this Ministry."
  - (a)(iii) The said record of the interview of Shri K.P.S. Menon with Stalin received by the Commission on February 7, 2002 from the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, in a sealed cover was opened and read by the Hon'ble Chairman, resealed in his presence and sent back to the Ministry of External Affairs on February 11, 2002 as the Hon'ble Chairman found the said record of interview to be having no relevance whatsoever to any of the terms of reference of this Commission.
  - (a)(iv) A supplementary affidavit sworn by Shri Jayant Prasad, Joint Secretary (CNV), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, has been received on March 4, 2002 by the Commission. In this affidavit the said Joint Secretary has stated, inter alia, that there is no other documents in the Ministry, whether classified or unclassified, relating to the terms of

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reference of this Commission; that the Indian Mission in Washington has informed the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India that all documents once declassified by the U.S. Government are no longer retained by them and are normally stored in the National Archives, Library of Congress or other similar documentation centres; that the classified documents of the U.S. Government can be requisitioned under the U.S. Freedom of Information Act, only by giving specific details of the documents; and that the said Indian Mission has further conveyed that this is a tardy and complicated process.

- 7.(b) At the time of her examination before the Commission as a witness on December 20, 2001, Smt. Sangita Gairola, Jt. Scy., MHA, stated inter alia that a small Committee headed by the Deputy Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs has been formed by the Ministry to find out further relevant records and stated that they would require another two months to continue the inquiry to find out other relevant documents. Even though the said period of two months has expired, the result of the said inquiry by the Ministry of Home Affairs is still awaited.
- On a potition filed on behalf of the Commission the Hon'ble 8. Allahabad High Court (Lucknow Bench) has passed an order on February 6, 2002 and permitted the Commission to bring to its head office in Calcutta the sealed box containing the documents and articles selected by the Commission and kept in a Steel Box, out of the articles and documents allegedly belonging to 'Gumnami Baba' and kept in the Steel Boxes in the District Treasury of Faizabad. Steps could not be taken to bring the said box containing the said selected articles and documents from the District Treasury of Faizabad to the Commission's head office in Calcutta with proper and adequate Police escort before completion of the elections to the Legislative Assembly of the U.P. which commenced on February 14, 2002. After completion of the said elections, some steps were taken for the aforesaid purpose; but the efforts in this regard had to be suspended because of the reported law and The efforts will be renewed order situation in Faizabad. as soon as the situation there becomes normal.

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The Secretary, Prime Minister's Office, has been requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/, 37(Vol.II)/536 dated 29.01.2002 to kindly send to the Commission immediately authenticated xerox copies of the rules and procedures prescribed for destruction of files/documents since it appears from the purported xerox copies of file No.23(156)/51-PM of the Prime Minister's Office as also from their communication dated September 21, 2001 that a number of papers/files of the said office were destroyed.

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10. It has been stated inter alia in the affidavit dated

December 19, 2001 of Smt. Sangita Gairola, Joint Secretary (IS-I),

Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India:

"The averments and allegations made therein (i.e. in the affidavits and supplementary affidavits concerned) are matters of records and subject to the consideration by the Hon'ble Commission. Some of the records available with this Ministry have been made over to the Hon'ble Commission and some others have been discovered with this affidavit (i.e. her affidavit dated December 19, 2001) for consideration by the Hon'ble Commission; and that she has further stated therein that "the Ministry of Home Affairs has also taken up the matter with Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Defence, Intelligence Eureau, National Archives of India, and Prime Minister's Office, to go through the documents and if necessary submit an affidavit to the Commission directly."

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Hence, the Secretaries of the Ministry of External Affairs, the Prime Minister's Office, and the Ministry of Defence as also the Director of Intelligence Bureau, and the Director General of National Archives of India have been requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(Vol.II)/537 dated 29.01.2002 to send their respective affidavits immediately regarding the averments and allegations made in the relevant affidavits and supplementary affidavits of different deponents, the copies of which were furnished by the Commission with the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.

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- The Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government 11.(a) of India, has been requested by Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/533 dated January 28, 2002 to let the Commission know what was the outcome of the action, if any, taken on U.O. No.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. dated September 21, 1990 of the Prime Minister's Office addressed to Shri Naresh Chandra, the then Home Socretary, Government of India, wherewith a copy of the letter dated September 13, 1990 of Shri Amiya Nath Bose addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India and of the enclosure thereto which is a xerox copy of the news titled, "Fresh Clue on Netaji's Death" published in the "Times of India" (New Delhi) dated September 3, 1990 were sent to the Home Secretary, Government of India, for appropriate action. It was also stated in the said letter dated 28.01.2002 of the Commission that the said letter dated September 13, 1990 of Shri Amiya Nath Bose with its enclosure and the said note dated September 21, 1990 are available in File No.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. of the Prime Minister's Office, on the subject, "Netaji Subhas Bose - Bringing in the ashes of" . '
  - (b) The Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, has been requested by Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/532 dated January 28, 2002 to let the Commission know as quickly as possible what was the outcome of the action, if any, taken on U.O. No.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. dated May 23, 1990 of the Prime Minister's Office endorsed to the Joint Secretary (EA), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, wherewith copies of the letter dated May 11, 1990 of Shri Amiya Nath Bose, the reply dated May 19, 1990 thereto given by Shri R. Sen, Joint Secretary of the Prime Minister's Office as also of the letter dated May 4, 1990 addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India jointly authored by Shri Ashok Nath Bose, Shri Amiya Nath Bose and Shri Subrata Bose, all nephews of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, were sent to bring those to the attention of the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. It was stated

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- in the said letter of the Commission that xerox copies of the aforesaid letters and the note are available in the File MD.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. of the Prime Minister's Office.
- (c) The Director, Press Information Bureau, Government of India, has been requested by Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/531 dated January 28, 2001 to find out and furnish this Commission with an authenticated true copy of the Press statement, if any, of Mahatma Gandhi which is alleged in the letter dated May 4, 1990 addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India, authored jointly by Shri Ashok Nath Bose, Shri Amiya Nath Bose, and Shri Subrata Bose, all nephews of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, to have been made in 1945 by Mahatma Gandhi to the effect that Netaji did not die in any air-crash on August 18, 1945, after he spoke in detail to Col. Habibur Rahman regarding alleged death of Netaji in an air-crash on August 18, 1945.
- A xerox copy of a letter dated May 4, 1990 of (d) Sarbashree Ashok Nath Bose, Amiya Nath Bose, and Subrata Bose addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India, which appears at cor. pages 3 to 5 of file No. 800/6/C/1/90-Pol., of the Prime Minister's Office on the subject, "Netaji Subhas Bose - Bringing in the ashes of" has been sent to the Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, with Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/529 dated January 28, 2002 with the request to kindly procure and furnish this Commission as quickly as possible with an authenticated true copy of the report of the American Intelligence Party, as referred to in the said letter dated May 4, 1990, which allegedly went to Taihoku airport from Mc. Arthur's headquarters to make inquiries about the alleged air-crash at Taihoku on August 18, 1945.
- 12. During the visit of the Commission to London in July, 2001 some of the files of the Intelligence and Security Agencies of the Government of the U.K. relating to the relevant period were not allowed to be perused by the Commission on

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the ground that those were classified confidential files, under the order of the Lord Chancellor. The matter was taken up by the Hon'ble Chairman at personal level with the Lord Archer who assured the Commission that he would take up the matter with the Lord Chancellor. The letter dated December 1, 2001 of the Lord Chancellor addressed to the Lord .Archer shows inter alia that those confidential files would not be made available to the Commission and that those files contain no information which is not already made available to the Commission. Lord Archer has been requested by the Hon'ble Chairman in his d.o. No. JMCI/Chairman's Correspondence/2000-01/71/541 dated January 31, 2002 to kindly impress upon the Lord Chancellor to give the Commission an access to those retained papers which may, hopefully, furnish some materials regarding the alleged disappearance of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and thereby remove all sorts of speculations and doubts in this regard. The request has not yet been heeded to.

Shri Jarnail Singh, Joint Secretary to the Prime 13.(a) Minister's Office, has been requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(II)/543 dated February 1, 2002 to clarify immediately to the satisfaction of the Commission his statement made in his affidavit dated December 18, 2001 filed before the Commission on December 20, 2001 that the Prime Minister's Office: "is not in a position to provide any clarifications/explanation regarding the circumstances under which Late Morarji Desai, the then Prime Minister, had made such statement on the floor of the Parliament" viz., "some further contemporary official documentary records have also become available", in view of the notes and remarks at cor. pages 26 and 27 of the Secret File No.2/64/78-PM on the subject, "N.S.C. Bose" received by the Commission from the Prime Minister's Office which appear to show that there were official documents, notes and orders which led the then Prime Minister, Shri Morarji Desal, to make the said statement on August 28, 1978, on the floor of the Parliament (Lok Sabha).

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The Director (LARRTIS) Lok Sabha Secretariat, New Delhi, as requested by the Prime Minister's Office in PMO ID. No. Pt.915/11/C/2/2000-Pol. dated 25.02.2002 has been requested to send immediately authenticated xerox copies of the Parliamentary proceedings (Lok Sabha) dated 28, 1978 and of other papers, if any, connected therewith.

- The Secretaries, Ministry of Home Affairs, and Ministry of 14. Information and Broadcasting, Government of India, have been furnished with a copy of the d.o. letter dated February 3, 1978 of Shri R.C. Mazumder (renowned historian) addressed to Shri Morarji Desai, the then Prime Minister of India and of the notes of Shri Mazumder annexed thereto appearing at cor, pages 16 to 20 of the Secret File No. 2/64/78-PM of the Prime Minister's Office and were requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(II)/542 dated February 1, 2002 to kindly furnish the Commission as quickly as possible with documents or authenticated xerox copies thereof relevant to the various contentions of the said letter of Shr! Mazumder which appear to be relevant to the terms of reference of the Commission. The documents/authenticated copies called for from them are awaited.
- 15. XVIII, XIX, and XXII and other Volumes (excepting first 17 Volumes) along with other relevant



files/documents/records pertaining to the Khosla Commission which have not yet been sent to this Commission. The response of the Ministry of Home Affairs in the matter is awaited.

In reply to d.o. letter No.25/4/NGO-Vol.VII dated December 18, 2001 of the Director, (C.N.V.), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, the Secretary of the Commission by his d.o. No.JMCI/Overseas-Witnesses/2000-01/70/499 dated January 9, 2002 has intimated the Director, (C.N.V.) that the Commission proposes to visit Japan in the second half of March, 2002 and that the tour programme in details will be drawn up and communicated to the Ministry of External Affairs after receiving the requisite details sought for by the Commission from them.

- (b) The Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, was requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37/375 dated October 22, 2001 to send as early as possible, preferably by the end of November, 2001, an authenticated true copy of the reply of the U.N. Secretariat to the purported formal request of the permanent Mission of India, Newyork, made to the U.N. Secretariat and an authenticated true copy of the documents based on which Indian Mission in Tokyo sent their confirmation as stated in the letter No. U II/103/1/98 dated October 15, 2001 of the Director, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.

By Commission's letter No.JMCI/Affidavit-Averments (Follow Up)/ 2000-2001/67/228 dated August 1, 2001 sent by Registered Post with A/D. to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, It has been stated that it is not clear from their letter No. I/12014/10/2001-IS(D.III) dated July 4, 2001 whether or not the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, is at all concerned in the matter of furnishing the documents mentioned and relied upon by the deponents referred to in Commission's letter No.JMCI/Affidavit-Averments (Follow Up)/2000-2001/-67/132 dated May 30, 2001 and they were requested to file a supporting affidavit in the matter by an Officer, not below the rank of Joint Secretary of the Department within four weeks from the date of receipt of this letter. A reminder was sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Affidavit-Averments (Follow Up)/ 2000-2001/67/320 dated September 20, 2001 wherein they were also requested to indicate the name of the authority concerned of the Government of India against each of the documents mentioned and relied upon by the said deponents since those particulars are essentially required by the Commission to pursue effectively with the authorities concerned of the Government of India as advised by the Ministry of Home Affairs in the aforesaid letter dated July 4, 2001 for production before the Commission their respective documents concerned. The said report and the affidavit are yet to be received by the Cormission from the Ministry of Home Affaira, Government of India.
- The Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs has been requested to report to the Commission the action taken by the Government of India for verification of the news of imprisonment of Netaji in Russia as mentioned in cor.page 112 of Secret File No. 2(64)/56-68-PM of the Prime Minister's Office, the details of verification actually made and outcome thereof.

- of India, has also been requested to send an authenticated true copy of the news which claimed that Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose had spoken from Moscow radio after the Taskent Agreement as mentioned at cor.page 153 of the Secret File No.2(64)/56-68-PM of the Prime Minister's Office, the full text of the radio speech, the full particulars of the student in the name of Subhas Chandra who allegedly made the broadcast and the true copy of the report sent by the Radio Moscow authority in the matter.
  - Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, has been requested to report to the Commission the details of action taken on the letter dated 15.10.1970 of Shri M.L. Sondhi, M.P. (Lok Sabha) addressed to Shri V.V. Giri, the then President of India which is lying at cor.pages 177 and 177(a) of Prime Minister Office's Secret File No.2(64)/56-68-PM and the outcome thereof since the said letter appears to contain some important matters relevant for the purpose of inquiry of the Commission.
- 21.(a) The Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, has been requested to report to the Commission immediately the outcome of the action referred to in para 2 of the d.o. letter dated January 30, 1970 of the Director (EA), Ministry of External Affairs, addressed to Sri Srinivasabardhan, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, lying at cor.page 27 of the Prime Minister Office's Secret File No.2(64)/56-70/FM-Fol. Please permit me to draw your attention to a reference to Netaji's death which was published in the American version of Goebbel's Diary in its first edition. As you will notice in the enclosed copy of a page of this book, it has been mentioned in the explanatory note that Netaji was arrested and shot by the American troops. the American troops. This American edition of Goebbel's Diary was withdrawn from circulation by the American Government, but we have been able to trace a copy of this book and I am drawing your attention to this paricular matter because of the Netaji Inquiry Commission (1970) the Government have formed with Justice G.D. Khosla as its Chairman.

- We are all very thankful to you for having agreed to make enother effort to clear the mystery of Netaji's death, but in my view this mystery is surrounded with so much secrecy that unless this Committee of Enquiry has also some members from other countries, the Committee will not be able to achieve anything very sub-Committee will not be sole to achieve anything very substantial. In the first place, Government of India should request the State Department of the U.S. Government to release from its archives all the secret files in concelease from its archives all the secret files in concelease nection with Netaji's death and the same approach should also be made to the Japanese and other Governments.
  - 3. May I, therefore, suggest that you should kindly review the composition of the Enquiry Committee and include in it some internationally well-known jurists and ensure that the injustice done by the Sheh Nawaz Commission of 1956 is not repeated.
  - I have to draw your attention to a related matter which is the Verdict of the Tokyo Trial vis-a-vis Netaji. The consistent position taken by our informed citizens is that the Tokyo Trial was a grave injustice to the Japanese people and to Netaji. There is a popular demand among Indian intellectuals that the Govern-There is a popument of India should take concrete steps to undo the Verdict of the Tokyo Trial. It is a matter of some confort that the renoved Indian judge Radha Binod Pal in his dissenting judgement exposed by implication the malatides of the other Alice Judges on the Tokyo tribunal.

Each of these, whenever brought to Government's notice, has been investigated and generally found to be baseless. 1962, rumour was spread that a Sanyasi of Shaulmari Ashram was in fact Netaji. The Sanyasi, Swami Shradhanand himself denied the rumour. Another claim made by Dr. S.N. Sinha that Netaji was incarcerated in Cell Ho. 46 of Yakutusk prison in Siberia has not been corroborated by any tangible evidence. Lt. Gen. Fujiwara of Japan who came to India to present Wetaji's sword, while urging for further invostigation, did not produce any evidence to contradict the findings of the Shah Nawas Khan Enquiry Committee. Recently a press report in a Bengali Daily, "Jugantar", based on information given by an ex-Indian army personnel, presently employed in Wost Bengal Police (as Inspector of Police, Security Control, Calcutta), that Wetaji left Singapore by submarine towards the end of 1945 was investigated and found to be hearsay and vague information. The latest instance is of the news report claiming that Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose had spoken from Radio Moscow after the Tashkent Agreement. 

Shri Satya Brata Tapadar (CW.74) has asserted that his statement made in his affidavit filed on 28<sup>th</sup> January, 2000 and Supplementary affidavits filed on 11<sup>th</sup> April, 2000, 19<sup>th</sup> January, 2001 and 18<sup>th</sup> January, 2002 are correct. At the outset, Commission wanted to know from Mr. Tarakeswar Pal, Ld. Senior Counsel of the Govt. of India, about the result of inquiry for finding out further relevant records, as two months' time prayed for by Smt. Sangeeta Gairola, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India on December 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2001 and allowed by the Commission, had already elapsed. Shri Pal informed the Commission that two Committees, one for searching the documents within the Ministry and the other for the other departments and the Ministries, had been formed, but the reports of the Committees had not yet reached the Ministry of Home Affairs. So there was the delay in intimating the Commission about the result of further inquiry. Commission expressed its displeasure for dealing with the matter in lackadaisical manner. Commission would pass necessary order, if need be, at the appropriate time.

The deponent Shri Nanda Lal Chakraborty, referring to page 1, paragraph 3, page 3, paragraphs 7(a)(I), 7(a)(ii), 7(a)(iv) of the Status Report, wanted to know about the compliance by the respective Ministry, Govt. of India and requested the Commission to take up the follow-up action where order of the Commission had not been complied with by the respective Ministries.

As regards paragraph 7(a)(i) of the Status Report, the Ministry of External Affairs filed an affidavit in compliance with the order of the Commission on their prayer at the last sitting in Delhi. They stated that they had no further documents. As regards paragraph 7(a)(ii) of the Status Report, in the paper received by the Commission nothing relevant to the terms of reference of the Commission was found.

Follow-up action, wherever necessary, would be taken up.

The deponent, Shri Nanda Lal Chakraborty and Shri Subrata Bose suggested that Commission should also visit Vietnam and Taiwan while visiting Japan, as Mrs. Prova Jagannathan did not appear before the Commission though she was summoned more than once.



Shri Subrata Bose further suggested that notice regarding foreign visits by the Commission should be sent to the deponents sufficient ahead so that deponents could arrange for Visas, Passports, etc. to take part in the hearing of the Commission in Japan and other places abroad.

The suggestion would be considered at the appropriate time.

The deponent, Dr. Sushanta Kumar Mitra, pointed out a mistake in the last line but one of paragraph 13(b) at page 9 of the Status Report wherein "October 28, 1978" had been typed instead of "August 28, 1978.

The mistake was rectified accordingly.

The parties and/or their authorised representatives present today, have been heard on the relevance of the above items to the terms of reference of the Commission. It has been suggested by the parties that the written comments found in the different books, in the margin of newspaper-clippings and on other documents should be examined by a team of, at least, three Handwriting Experts with the specimen handwritings of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Shri Nanda Lal Chakraborty (JMCI/11/2000) has further suggested that the opinion expressed by some Handwriting Experts in this regard, as published in the 'Hindustan Times', be verified by the Commission

It has also been suggested by them that the recovered articles like teeth and pipes be subjected to DNA tests.

Appropriate steps for examination of the handwritings found on the different books, in the margin of the newspaper-clippings and on other documents would be taken after their proper scrutiny. Steps for examination of the aforesaid articles by DNA Experts would also be taken.

#### Witnesses

Shri Kartick Chakraborty, office Secretary of Netaji Research Bureau at Netaji Bhavan who has been authorised by Smt. Krishna Bose, Chairperson of the Bureau to appear before the Commission and produce specimens of



the documents containing handwritings and signatures of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose in Bengali, English and Hindi, has produced photostat copies of specimen of the documents in Bengali and English and photostat copies of the signatures in Bengali, English and Hindi in compliance with the summons JMCI/Meeting-Hearing/99-2000/57(II)/86(2) dated May 20, 2002. He has been examined on oath as C.W.75. The letter of authority has been marked Exhibit 101. Photostat copies of the documents and specimen signatures have been marked Exhibit 102 collectively.

#### Status Report

The parties and / or their lawyers present have been heard about the Status Report as on 06.06.2002, prepared by the Commission and circulated to all the parties present, with particular reference to the availability of the documents from the different ministries, probable date of visit to Japan, Taiwan. Vietnam, Singapore and the classified records lying in UK.

Further follow up action on these issues would be taken up in due course.

No.JMCI/DOC(FOR)/99-2000/56(Vol.II)/286 of that date to inform the Commission whether they have obtained the Micro-Films/Micro-Fiches of the files/documents which were earmarked by the team of the Commission after their study of the relevant files/documents in the British Library and the Public Records Office and also authenticated xerox copies of the entire File No.K 148/A of Mountbatten papers in the Hartley Library of the Southampton University, all of which they (National Archives) undertook to furnish to the Commission. Even though six months have since elapsed those documents are yet to be received by the Commission.
- The Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, was requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37/305 dated September 18, 2001 to let the Commission know immediately what action was taken on the Rajya Sabha Starred Question No. DY. 2198 by Shri K.R. Malkani, M.P. due for answer on 06.03.1996 as mentioned at notesheet page 1 of Prime Minister's Office File No.915/II/C/6/96-Pol. as also on the letter dated November 20, 1996 of Shri Ramkrishna Hogde



addressed to the then President of India, indicating the results of the said actions. The Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs was also requested in the said letter of the Commission to send to the Commission within six weeks an authenticated xerox copy of the information furnished by the Government of U.K. as stated in the letter dated 12.03.1999 of the Ministry of Home Affairs, appearing at cor.page 196 of the said file of the Prime Minister's Office. Copies of the aforesaid notesheet page and cor.page were enclosed with the Commission's said letter dated September 18, 2001. The information and documents called for are still awaited.

- 4. Further affidavit, as called for from the Ministry of Defence, Government of India, by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Record/-N.Delhi/99-2000/37/57 dated May 3, 2001 regarding existence/non-existence/availability/non-availability/destruction, etc. of the complete records of the proceedings of the trial of I.N.A. personnel, is still to be submitted by the said Ministry before the Commission.
- in Netaji Vault" authored by Shri Chandan Nandy was sent to the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, with Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/-37/108 dated 28.05.2001 in terms of the letter No.10/SPS-11/-2001(20)-306 dated 17.05.2001 of the Cabinet Secretariat, Government of India, and the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, was requested to furnish a detailed report on the contents of the said article of Shri Chandan Nandy which was published in the "Telegraph", Calcutta on March 26, 2001. The response of the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, in the matter is still awaited.
- 6. In Commission's letter No.JMCI/Meeting-Hearing/99-2000/57(Vol.II)/349 dated October 8, 2001 certain anomalies noticed in the photo copy of File No.915/II/C/6/96-Pol. of the Prime Minister's Office were pointed out to the Secretary of the Prime Minister's Office with the request to furnish necessary explanation/clarification in respect of the said anomalies within eight weeks from the date of receipt of the



letter. The said letter appears to have been received in the Prime Minister's Office on December 12, 2001. Their reply is still awaited.

- 7.(a)(i) Shri Jayant Prasad, Joint Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, prayed for two months' time at the time of his examination as a witness before the Commission on December 20, 2001, for filing a supplementary affidavit detailing the developments that have taken place since he filed his affidavit dated 14.12.2001 regarding availability of documents from foreign countries. The Hon'ble Chairman considered and allowed the prayer with the direction that he should also state in his supplementary affidavit whether there is any classified documents relating to the terms of reference of the Commission.
  - (a)(ii) The Director (CNV), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, in his d.o. letter No.25/4/NGO-Vol.VII dated February 21, 2002 addressed to the Secretary of the Commission has stated inter alia: "following the scrutiny of records" being relied upon by different deponents "It was found that only one document a record of the interview of the then Ambassador to U.S.S.R., Shri K.P.S. Menon, with Stalin pertained to this Ministry."
  - (a)(iii) The said record of the interview of Shri K.P.S. Menon with Stalin received by the Commission on February 7, 2002 from the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, in a sealed cover was opened and read by the Hon'ble Chairman, resealed in his presence and sent back to the Ministry of External Affairs on February 11, 2002 as the Hon'ble Chairman found the said record of interview to be having no relevance whatsoever to any of the terms of reference of this Commission.
  - (a)(iv) A supplementary affidavit sworn by Shri Jayant Prasad, Joint Secretary (CNV), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, has been received on March 4, 2002 by the Commission. In this affidavit the said Joint Secretary has stated, inter alia, that there is no other documents in the Ministry, whether classified or unclassified, relating to the terms of



reference of this Commission; that the Indian Mission in Washington has informed the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India that all documents once declassified by the U.S. Government are no longer retained by them and are normally stored in the National Archives, Library of Congress or other similar documentation centres; that the classified documents of the U.S. Government can be requisitioned under the U.S. Freedom of Information Act, only by giving specific details of the documents; and that the said Indian Mission has further conveyed that this is a tardy and complicated process.

- 7.(b) At the time of her examination before the Commission as a witness on December 20, 2001, Smt. Sangita Gairola, Jt. Szy., MHA, stated inter alia that a small Committee headed by the Deputy Secretary of the Ministry of Home Affairs has been formed by the Ministry to find out further relevant records and stated that they would require another two months to continue the inquiry to find out other relevant documents. Even though the said period of two months has expired, the result of the said inquiry by the Ministry of Home Affairs is still awaited.
- 8. On a petition filed on behalf of the Commission the Hon'ble Allahabad High Court (Lucknow Bench) has passed an order on February 6, 2002 and permitted the Commission to bring to its head office in Calcutta the sealed box containing the documents and articles selected by the Commission and kept in a Steel Box, out of the articles and documents allegedly belonging to 'Gumnami Baba' and kept in the Steel Boxes in the District Treasury of Faizabad. Steps could not be taken to bring the said box containing the said selected articles and documents from the District Treasury of Faizabad to the Commission's head office in Calcutta with proper and adequate Police escort before completion of the elections to the Legislative Assembly of the U.P. which commenced on February 14, 2002. After completion of the said elections, some steps were taken for the aforesaid purpose; but the efforts in this regard had to be suspended because of the reported law and order situation in Faizabad. The efforts will be renewed as soon as the situation there becomes normal.



9. The Secretary, Prime Minister's Office, has been requested by Commission's letter No.JNCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/, 37(Vol.II)/536 dated 29.01.2002 to kindly send to the Commission immediately authenticated xerox copies of the rules and procedures prescribed for destruction of files/documents since it appears from the purported xerox copies of file No.23(156)/51-PM of the Prime Minister's Office as also from their communication dated September 21, 2001 that a number of papers/files of the said office were destroyed.

Action

10. It has been stated inter alia in the affidavit dated
December 19, 2001 of Smt. Sangita Gairola, Joint Secretary (IS-I),
Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India:

"The averments and allegations made therein (i.e. in the affidavits and supplementary affidavits concerned) are matters of records and subject to the consideration by the Hon'ble Commission. Some of the records available with this Ministry have been made over to the Hon'ble Commission and some others have been discovered with this affidavit (i.e. her affidavit dated December 19, 2001) for consideration by the Hon'ble Commission; and that she has further stated therein that "the Ministry of Home Affairs has also taken up the matter with Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Defence, Intelligence Bureau, National Archives of India, and Prime Minister's Office, to go through the documents and if necessary submit an affidavit to the Commission directly."

Hence, the Secretaries of the Ministry of External Affairs, the Prime Minister's Office, and the Ministry of Defence as also the Director of Intelligence Bureau, and the Director General of National Archives of India have been requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(Vol.II)/537 dated 29.01.2002 to acad their respective affidavits immediately regarding the averments and allegations made in the relevant affidavits and supplementary affidavits of different deponents, the copies of which were furnished by the Commission with the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India.



- The Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government 11.(a) of India, has been requested by Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/533 dated January 28, 2002 to let the Commission know what was the outcome of the action, if any, taken on U.O. No.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. dated September 21, 1990 of the Prime Minister's Office addressed to Shri Naresh Chandra, the then Home Secretary, Government of India, wherewith a copy of the letter dated September 13, 1990 of Shri Amiya Nath Bose addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India and of the enclosure thereto which is a xerox copy of the news titled, "Fresh Clue on Netaji's Death" published in the "Times of India" (New Delhi) dated September 3, 1990 were sent to the Home Secretary, Government of India, for appropriate action. It was also stated in the said letter dated 28.01.2002 of the Commission that the said letter dated September 13, 1990 of Shri Amiya Nath Bose with its enclosure and the said note dated September 21, 1990 are available in File No.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. of the Prime Minister's Office, on the subject, "Netaji Subhas Bose - Bringing in Action 1 MHA. the ashes of".
  - The Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, has been requested by Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/532 dated January 28, 2002 to let the Commission know as quickly as possible what was the outcome of the action, if any, taken on U.O. No.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. dated May 23, 1990 of the Prime Minister's Office endorsed to the Joint Secretary (EA), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, wherewith copies of the letter dated May 11, 1990 of Shri Amiya Nath Bose, the reply dated May 19, 1990 thereto given by Shri R. Sen, Joint Secretary of the Prime Minister's Office as also of the letter dated May 4, 1990 addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India jointly authored by Shri Ashok Nath Bose, Shri Amiya Nath Bose and Shri Subrata Bose, all nephews of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, were sent to bring those to the attention of the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India. It was stated



- in the said letter of the Commission that xerox copies of the aforesaid letters and the note are available in the File No.800/6/C/I/90-Pol. of the Prime Minister's Office.
- of India, has been requested by Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/531 dated January 28, 2001 to find out and furnish this Commission with an authenticated true copy of the Press statement, if any, of Mahatma Gandhi which is alleged in the letter dated May 4, 1990 addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India, authored jointly by Shri Ashok Nath Bose, Shri Amiya Nath Bose, and Shri Cubtata Bose, all nephews of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, to have been made in 1945 by Mahatma Gandhi to the effect that Motaji did not die in any air-crash on August 18, 1945, after he spoke in detail to Col. Habibur Rahman regarding alleged death of Netaji in an air-crash on August 18, 1945.
- A xerox copy of a letter dated May 4, 1990 of Sarbashree Ashok Nath Bose, Amiya Nath Bose, and Subrata Bose addressed to Shri V.P. Singh, the then Prime Minister of India, which appears at cor. pages 3 to 5 of file No. 800/6/C/1/90-Pol., of the Prime Minister's Office on the subject, "Netaji Subhas Bose - Bringing in the ashes of" has been sent to the Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, with Commission's confidential letter No.JMCI/Records/2000-01/37(II)/529 dated January 28, 2002 with the request to kindly procure and furnish this Commission as quickly as possible with an authenticated true copy of the report of the American Intelligence Party, as referred to in the said letter dated May 4, 1990, which allegedly went to Taihoku airport from No. Arthur's headquarters to make inquiries about the alleged air-crash at Taihoku on Action; MEA August 18, 1945.
- 12. During the visit of the Commission to London in July, 2001 some of the files of the Intelligence and Security Agencies of the Government of the U.K. relating to the relevant period were not allowed to be perused by the Commission on



the around that those were classified confidential files under the order of the Lord Chancellor. The matter was takan up by the Hon'ble Chairman at personal level with the Lord Archer who assured the Commission that he would take up the matter with the Lord Chancellor. The letter dated December 1, 2001 of the Lord Chancellor addressed to the Lord Archer shows inter alia that those confidential files would not be made available to the Commission and that those files contain no information which is not already made available to the Commission. Lord Archer has been requested by the Hon'ble Chairman in his d.o. No. JMCI/Chairman's Correspondence/2000-01/71/541 dated January 31, 2002 to kindly impress upon the Lord Chancellor to give the Commission an access to those retained papers which may, hopefully, furnish some materials regarding the alleged disappearance of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and thereby remove all sorts of speculations and doubts in this regard. The request has not yet been heeded to.

13.(a) Shri Jarnail Singh, Joint Secretary to the Prime Minister's Office, has been requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(II)/543 dated February 1, 2002 to clarify immediately to the satisfaction of the Commission his statement made in his affidavit dated December 18, 2001 filed before the Commission on December 20. 2001 that the Prime Minister's Office : "is not in a position to provide any clarifications/explanation regarding the circumstances under which Late Morarji Desai, the then Prime Minister, had made such statement on the floor of the Parliament" viz., "some further contemporary official documentary records have also become available", in view of the notes and remarks at cor. pages 26 and 27 of the Secret File No.2/64/78-PM on the subject, "N.S.C. Bose" received by the Commission from the Prime Minister's Office which appear to show that there were official documents, notes and orders which led the then Prime Minister, Shri Morarji Desai, to make the said statement on August 28, 1978, on the floor of the Parliament (Lok Sabha).

Those documents are being examined by the Commission.

- The Secretaries, Ministry of Home Affair, and the Prime Minister's Office are being requested to send to the Commission immediately an authenticated true copy of the answer of the Government to the Lok Sabha Starred Question D. No.3424 (vide cor. page 132) of the Prime Minister Office's Secret File No.2(64)/56-70-PM. Vol. V and Also of the Government notes on the supplementaries regarding the said Lok Sabha Questions. contd...p.15.

The documents received from different Archives in the Russian Federation by the Russian Foreign Office at the behest of the Indian Mission in Moscow and sent to the Commission by the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, along with their English translation of those documents are required to be scrutinized by the Commission on getting proper verification of the correctness of the said English translation with the help of suitable translators from Russian to English. The Commission has already got some names of such translators.

- 1. Copies of the Status Report as on 19.03.2002 (Forenoon) and copies of the proceedings dated 21.03.2002 and 22.03.2002 of the Commission have been sent to the Secretaries, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of External Affairs, Prime Minister's Office, Cabinet Secretariat, Ministry of Defence, as also to the Director General, National Archives of India, and the Director, Intelligence Bureau, Government of India, under Commission's letter Nos. JMCI/Meeting-Proceedings (Follow Up)/48/46 to 52, all dated 29.04.2002, for necessary action at their end.
- 2. The Commission has been persistently asking the Ministry of Defence for their further affidavit on existence/non-existence/availability/non-availability, etc., of the complete records of the proceedings of the trial of the I.N.A. personnel.
- 3. The Ministry of Home Affairs, the Ministry of External Affairs, the Prime Minister's Office, the Ministry of Defence, and the National Archives of India are being pursued for submission of their affidavits/supplementary affidavits regarding the averments and allegations made in the relevant affidavits and supplementary affidavits of different deponents and furnishing the original or authenticated copies of the documents referred to by the said deponents. The affidavit and the enclosures thereto received from the Intelligence Bureau are under scrutiny.
- 4. Xerox copies / authenticated copies of various files of the Government of India as received from time to time are being scrutinized and further references are being made to the Government of India to elicit further information/documents in appropriate cases.

#### 5. Re: Classified Documents in the U.K.

A reply has since been received from the Lord Peter Archer by his d.o. letter dated May 3, 2002 wherein he has stated inter alia: "I fear that my powers of persuasion have not secured their release...... If you and the Government of India consider it essential to take this forward, I can only suggest that there may be greater success if diplomatic representations were made between Governments." The Ministry of External Affairs is being persuaded again to take up the matter with the Government of the U.K.



- 6. The Hon'ble Chairman has decided to express his views at the appropriate stage on the report given by the Ministry of External Affairs about non-availability of "further contemporary official documentary records" as referred to by the then Prime Minister in his statement made in the Lok Sabha on 28.08.1978.
- 7. Further response from the Ministry of External Affairs regarding finalisation of the visit of the Commission to Japan and Taiwan is still awaited.
- 8. Some documents collected by the National Archives of India from the U.K. as per requisition of the Commission have recently been received by the Commission which are being scrutinized.
- 9. The Commission has received from the Ministry of External Affairs some papers which indicate that the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose does not appear in the list of 'War Criminals'. Those papers are being scrutinized.
- 10. The reply of the Prime Minister's Office in respect of the anomalies noticed by the Commission in the photo-copy of Prime Minister Office's file No.915/11/C/6/96-Pol. is under scrutiny.
- 11. The documents and articles allegedly belonging to 'Gumnami Baba' have since been brought from Faizabad Treasury. While some of them have already been scrutinized, the others are in the process to ascertain their relevancy, if any.
- 12. The authenticated xerox copies of the rules and procedures prescribed for destruction of files/documents of the Government of India as called for are yet to be received from the Prime Minister's Office.
- 13. The documents received from different Archives in the Russian Federation through the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, along with their English translation are being scrutinized by the Commission on getting verification of the correctness of the said English translation from Dr. (Mrs.) Purabi Roy.



#### **AFFIDAVIT**

- I, Smt. Sangita Gairola working as Joint Secretary (Internal Security-I) in the Ministry of Home Affairs do solemnly affirm and state as under: -
  - 1. With regard to the Status Report as on October 9, 2001, actions asked in Paragraphs 2, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 have been shown as pertaining to Ministry of Home Affairs. With regard to each of those paragraphs, our response is given in the succeeding paragraphs.
  - 2. With regard to Paragraph No.2 of the said Status Report, the documents mentioned in Paragraphs (a) (i) and (a) (iii) of the Proceeding dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2000 are not available in the Ministry of Home Affairs. The Ministry of External Affairs, Prime Minister's Office and the Ministry of Defence have been asked on 25.10.2001 and Intelligence Bureau on 5.11.2001 to identify the





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records/files/documents mentioned in the said Paragraphs Nos. a (i) and a(iii) of the proceeding dated 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2000, and report which of them pertain to them and to apprise the Commission directly of the position. Only Ministry of Defence has informed that an affidavit has already been submitted before the Hon'ble Commission on 1<sup>st</sup> February 2001 regarding documents mentioned at the said Paragraphs (a) (i) and (a) (iii) of the proceedings dated March 23, 2000. Intelligence Bureau has filed a separate affidavit on 11.12.2001 regarding their stand with respect to said various documents etc. This Ministry is therefore not in a position to state as to which Ministry/Department, those documents pertain.

3. As regards the requisition made in Paragraph No.5 of the Status Report, certain records pertaining to Khosla Commission were made available to the Hon'ble Commission. The records already made available to the Commission were identified by a representative of Ministry of Home Affairs in the sitting of the Commission on 22.12.2000. However, as per direction of the Hon'ble

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Commission as contained in the Status Report as on October 9, 2001, a vigorous search was launched to locate files/documents mentioned in the proceedings from time to time. As a result of this search, some more documents have since become available and a list thereof is enclosed at Annexure – A herewith, for perusal of the Hon'ble Commission.

- 4. With respect to the "contemporary official documentary records" referred to in Paragraph No.6 of the said Status Report dated 9<sup>th</sup> October, 2001 no such records have been located in this Ministry so far. The matter has also been taken up with Prime Minister's Office on 10.10.2001, requesting them to trace the relevant records at their end.

(ii),(iii),(iv),(v), and (vi) of para 1 of the letter No.281/12/1/2000-TS dated September 19, 2001 of the Cabinet Secretariat, Government of India, addressed to the Commission which indicates that these papers/documents have been sent to the M.H.A. by the Cabinet Secretariat has been enclosed with the Commission's aforesaid letter dated June 14, 2002. The said records are still awaited.

Shri Sanjoy Sinha, Joint Director, Intelligence Bureau, (M.H.A.), Government of India, has been requested by Commission's letter No.JMCI/Meeting-Proceedings (Follow Up)/99-2000/48(III)/99 dated May 29, 2002 to offer his comments on the averments of Shri Sunil Gupta in his affidavit dated May 8, 2002 which is a rejoinder to the affidavit dated 11.12.2001 of Shri Sanjoy Sinha. A copy of the affidavit of Shri Gupta has been enclosed with the aforesaid letter dated May 29, 2002 of the Commission. The matter was

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again referred to the said Joint Director by Commission's Regd. letter No.JMCI/Meeting-Proceedings (Follow Up)/99-2000/48(IV)/384 dated October 22, 2002. The reply is still awaited.

A self-contained reminder has been sent to the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs by Registered Post ggmmmm vide Commission's letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(III)/195 dated July 22, 2002. The reply of the Ministry is still awaited.

  - of the Director, Cabinet Sectt., Rashtrapati Bhawan,
    New Delhi, which is in reply.to Commission's letter No.

    JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(III)/374 dated October 10.

    2002 addressed to the Secretary, Cabinet Sectt., Rashtrapati
    Bhawan, New Delhi, does not contain the information about
    the Departments/Ministry/Office, out of which The Market Addressed to the Cabinet Sectt. was formed or about the
    Department/Ministry/Office of the Government of India
    which used to look after the works now being looked after

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by the Cabinet Sectt., Rashtrapati Bhavan and the Cabinet Sectt., Bikaner House Annexe, New Delhi, as called for.

- 15. By Commission's registered letter No.JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/ 99-2000/37(III)/235 dated August 1, 2002 the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs was requested to report to the Commission immediately what action was taken on the P.M.O.'s endorsement No.870/11/P/10/93-Pol. dated 08.04.93 to the Home Secretary, New Delhi, wherewith copies of the letter dated March 22, 1993 of Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma, the then President of India, along with a copy of the letter dated March 13, 1993, jointly authored by Shri Triguna Sen, Shri Amiya Kumar Mazumder, and Shri Aurobinda Nath Bose, some of the distinguished citizens of Calcutta, addressed to the President of India, were forwarded to the Home Secretary, New Delhi, for appropriate action, as also to report what was the outcome of the said action. CEEEEEEEE Ministry of Home Affairs have stated inter alia in their letter No.I/12014/13/2000-IS(V) dated 24.10.2002 received by the Commission on 30.10.2002 that the matter was referred to the Ministry of External Affairs for appropriate action. No report has yet been received in the matter from the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India.
- 16. To expedite the matters, the Hon'ble Chairman went to Delhi on 28.10.2002 and met the Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs, Government of India. He requested the Hon'ble Minister to persuade the Government of the U.K. to declassify all relevant classified British documents and to take all steps in terms of the d.o. letter No. 25/4/NGO-Vol.VI dated 26.09.2001 of the then Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs. Apropos the said discussion, the Commission's letter No.398 dated 11.11.2002 was sent by Speed Post to the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, with the request to take appropriate action in the matter. The Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs, Government of India, in his d.o. letter

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dated 13.11.2002 addressed to the Hon'ble Chairman has stated inter alia: ".....since the Commission feels that these papers (i.e. classified British records on Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose) could be of vital importance with reference to its mandate, we have again taken up the issue of their release with the British Government and would keep you informed of the outcome in this regard.

I would like to take this opportunity to reassure of all possible assistance from our side to facilitate the inquiry of the Commission."

Further development in the matter is awaited.

- 17. Notwithstanding the statement made by the then Prime Minister in the Lok Sabha on 28.08.1978 regarding availability of "further contemporary official documentary records", no such records could be traced out by the Government of India so far, as reported by them. The said reports received from the Government of India in the matter would be considered by the Hon'ble Chairman at the appropriate stage to express his views thereon.
- 18. The Hon'ble Chairman and the Secretary of the Commission visited Japan in the month of September, 2002 and could examine only one witness, viz., Dr. T. Yoshimi, in spite of publication of a notice about the sitting of the Commission in Japan, in a prominent English daily of Japan before the visit of the Commission to Japan. The Commission could interact with a number of local people at the Renkoji Temple in Tokyo who declined to depose before the Commission as witnesses. They, however, stated that they all believed that Netaji had died in the plane crash on 18th August, 1945 and that the ashes of Netaji were being preserved at the Renkoji Temple; but none of them could adduce any evidence in support of their said beliefs. The Commission could not visually examine the ashes kept in Renkoji Temple as the container thereof could not be opened by the authorities of the Renkoji Temple on that day for some practical difficulties. Since the Commission was leaving for Miyazaki

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on that very day to examine Dr. T. Yoshimi, the Hon'ble Chairman addressed a letter to the Ambassador of India in Japan (who was away from Tokyo on that day) requesting him to get the ashes examined by a competent officer of the Embassy to ascertain whether there was any bone or fragments of bone in them justifying examination of the ashes by D.N.A. test. The report dated November 12/18, 2002 of the Indian Embassy in Japan and the photographs received by the Hon'ble Chairman on 28.11.2002 from the Indian Embassy in Japan show that the casket alleged to be containing the mortal remains of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose appear to be having bone fragments, parts of the skull, some teeth, and a portion of the jaw.

- 19. Shri Nandalal Chakraborty, one of the depenents of the affidavit No.JMCI/11, in his letter dated 01.11.2002 addressed to the Secretary of the Commission, has requested the Commission to visit the USA, the UK, and Germany for reasons mentioned therein. A copy of the said letter has been sent to the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India in continuation of the Commission's letter No.398 dated 11.11.2002, as referred to in para 16 hereinbefore, with the request to act accordingly.
- 20. Some handwritings allegedly of 'Gumnami Baba' were made over to the Government Examiner of Questioned Documents.

  Bureau of Police Research and Development, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, Simla, on 02.09.2002 along with some admitted specimens of the handwritings of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for examination of the said questioned handwritings by comparing with the said admitted specimens of handwritings. The sealed report of the said Government Examiner has been collected and brought to the office of the Commission on 25.11.2002. Efforts are being made to get the aforesaid two sets of handwritings examined independently by two more competent handwriting experts, one after the other. It need be pointed out in this connection that it may take considerable time to get the same done.

- and procedures, which were in force at the time of destruction of different files/documents of the Government of India, as called for, could not be received from the time Prime Minister's Office in spite of close persuastion by the Commission. Hence, it has been decided not to pursue the matter further.

To collect blood samples of persons on the paternal/ maternal lineage of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for the purpose of D.N.A. tests of the relevant specimens out of the articles seized from the house in Faizabad, UP for establishing the identity of the subject to whom those specimens belonged, Sarbasree Nirupam Som, Subrata Bose, Pradip Bose, Sugata Bose, Chandra Kumar Bose, Surya Kumar Bose, Sadhan Kar and Smt. Chitra Ghose were requested by the Commission's letters dated 30,07,2002/ 03.10.2002/04.10.2002 to kindly cooperate with this Commission by communicating their willingness to donate their respective blood samples of one ml. each. no response has yet been received from Sarbasree Chandra Kumar Bose, Sadhan Kar and Smt. Chitra Ghosh. Shri Nirupam Som and Shri Sugata Bose have questioned the efficacy of the proposed D.N.A. test in their respective replies to the Commission in the matter. Shri Surya Kumar Bose, who is now living in Germany, has expressed his willingness to donate the blood but has informed that he has no plan to visit India in near future. Shri Pradip Bose has replied that he has no objection to donate the blood in New Delhi as he will not be able to come to Kolkata in near future. Shri Subrata Bose in his letter dated November 28, 2002 which was received by the Commission at 3.45 P.M. on the same day, conveyed his willingness to denate blood sample for the proposed D.N.A. test on the specimens obtained from Faizabad, UP, "and for no other purpose", The Commission is still making efforts to collect the names and addresses of other eligible donors, if any, of Netaji's family.

- 23. Notice was sent to all deponents and others concerned regarding the hearing of the Commission on December 2, 2002 in the Annexe Building, Mahajati Sadan, Kolkata, and summons were issued to 7 (seven) persons for their examination as witnesses before the Commission on December 2, 2002.
- 24. The Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, was requested by the Commission's registered letter No.JMCI/CPDC/2000/432 dated November 27, 2002 to kindly pursuade the Government of Japan to get from the Government of Taiwan the original Register of Cremation Permits for the period from 18.08.1945 to 21.08.1945, the original application for Cremation Permit allegedly filed on 18.05.1945 in the name of Chandra Bose or Subhas Chandra Bose, the original application for Cremation Permit, if any, filed on 18.08.1945 or 19.08.1945 in the name of Ichiro Okura, the original Death Certificate allegedly issued in the name of Subhas Chandra Bose or Chandra Bose and the original Death Certificate, if any, in the name of Ichiro Okura since the Commission is essentially required to have an access to those documents in view of the facts and circumstances stated in the aforesaid letter dated November 27, 2002 of the Commission. A copy of the said letter along with copies of the enclosures thereto were also sent to the Joint Secretary (Is), Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, on November 27, 2002 by Registered Post.

The report dated November 12/18, 2002 of the Indian Embassy in Japan and the photographs received by the Hon'ble Chairman on 28.11.2002, shows that the casket alleged to be containing the mortal remains of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose appear to be having bone fragments, parts of the skull, some teeth, and a portion of the jaw.
- 7)b) Shri Nandalal Chakraborty, one of the deponents of the affidavit no. JMCI/11, in his letter dated 01.11.2002 addressed to the Secretary of the Commission has requested the Commission to visit the USA, the UK, and Germany for reasons mentioned therein. Copy of the said letter has been sent to the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India in continuation of the Commission's letter no. 398 dated 11.11.2002 to act accordingly.
- 3. The documents collected by the National Archives of India from the UK as per requisition of the Commission have been received and are being scrutinized by the Commission.
- 9. The Commission has received from the Ministry of External Affairs some papers in support of the contention of the Ministry of External Affairs that the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose does not appear in the list of "War Criminals".

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10. The Commission has been pursuing with the Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs, Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, the Intelligence Bureau, etc., Government of India, for various files/documents/records/reports called for from them which are yet to be received by the Commission.

Some handwritings allegedly of "Gumnami Baba" were made over to the Government Examiner of Questioned Documents, Bureau of Police Research and Development, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, Simla, on 02.09.2002 along with some admitted specimens of the handwritings of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for examination of the said questioned handwritings by comparing with the said admitted specimens of handwritings. The sealed report of the said Government Examiner has been collected and brought to the office of the Commission on 25.11.2002. Efforts are being made to get the aforesaid two sets of handwritings examined independently by two more eminent handwriting experts, one after the other. It may be pointed out in this connection that it will take considerable time to get the questioned handwritings, allegedly of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, verified with admitted specimens of his handwritings by 3 (three) eminent handwriting experts independently, one after the other.

- 12. The authenticated xerox copies of the relevant rules and procedures, which were in force at the time of destruction of different files/documents of the Government of India, as called for, could not be received from the Prime Minister's office in spite of close persuasion by the Commission. Hence, it has been decided not to pursue the matter further,
- 13. To collect blood samples of persons on the paternal/maternal lineage of Netaji Subhas 34. Chandra Bose for the purpose of DNA tests of the relevant specimens out of the articles seized from the house in Faizabad, UP for establishing the identity of the subject to whom those specimens belonged, Sarbasree Nirupam Som, Subrata Bose, Pradip Bose, Sugata Bose, Chandra Kumar Bose, Surya Kumar Bose, Sadhan Kar and Smt. Chitra Ghose were requested by the Commission's letters dated 30.07.2002/03.10.2002/04.10.2002 to kindly cooperate with this Commission by communicating their willingness to donate their respective blood samples of one ml. each. While no response has yet been received from Sarbasree Subrata-Bose, Chandra Kumar Bose, Sadhan Kar and Smt. Chitra Ghosh, Shri Nirupam Som and Shri Sugata Bose have questioned the efficacy of the proposed DNA test in their respective replies to the Commission in the matter. Shri Surya Kumar Bose, who is now living in Germany, has however expressed his willingness to donate the blood but has informed that he has no plan to visit India in near future. Shri Pradip Bose has replied that he has no objection to donate the blood in New Delhi as he will not be able to come to Kolkata in near future. The Commission is still making efforts to collect the names and addresses of other eligible donors, if any, of Netaji's family.
- Shri Subrata Bose in his letter dated November 28, 2002 which was received by the Commission at 3.45 PM on the same day, conveyed his willingness to donate blood sample for the proposed DNA test on the specimens obtained from Faizabad, UP, "and for no other purpose".

### JUSTICE M.K. MUKHERJEE COMMISSION OF INQUIRY

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Proceedings dated 2<sup>nd</sup> December, 2002 (Eighteenth) held at Seminar Hall, Annexe Building, Mahajati Sadan, 166, Chittaranjan Avenue, Kolkata-700007

Of the seven witnesses summoned today two witnesses, namely, Shri Subhas Ranjan Dasgupta and Shri Usha Ranjan Bhattacharyya are present. Four witnesses, Shri Sunil Krishna Gupta, Shri Surajit Dasgupta, Shri Bijoy Kumar Nag and Dr. Sushanta Kumar Mitra prayed for time and their prayers were allowed vide order dated 29.11.2002. Another witness, Smt. Krishna Bose, prayed for exemption from her personal appearance on the ground that she has got no personal knowledge about the alleged plane crash at Taihoku and death of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. She has been exempted.

Shri Subhas Ranjan Dasgupta and Shri Usha Ranjan Bhattacharyya have been examined as CW 85 and CW 86 repsectively. Shri Subhas Ranjan Dasgupta in his examination has testified that the statements made in the affidavit and Supplementary affidavit filed by him jointly with Shri Nirmal Sinha, Shri Satyabrata Tapadar and Shri Jayanta Chowdhury on 20th January, 2000 and 11th April, 2000 before the Commission are correct. He has identified his signatures on the affidavit and the Supplementary affidavit which have been marked Exhibits 96/2 and 97/2 respectively. His signature on another Supplementary affidavit filed by him jointly with Shri Satyabrata Tapadar on 19th January, 2002 has been marked Exhibit 98/2. He has asserted that this statement made in the affidavits filed by him on 7th May, 2002 and 31st October, 2002 are correct. These two affidavits have been marked Exhibits 113 and 114 respectively. His signatures on those two affidavits have been marked Exhibits 113 and 114/1 respectively. Two Newspapers: 'Netaji Azad Hind Gazette' dated 15th September, 1965 and pages 6 to 8 of the newspaper 'Rupantar' filed by Shri Dasgupta have been marked Exhibits 115 and 116 respectively.

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Shri Usha Ranjan Bhattacharyya (CW 86) has asserted that his statement in the Midavit filed by him on 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2000 are correct. The said affidavit and his signature have been marked Exhibits 117 and 117/1 respectively. Two books titled 'Netaji-ke Lal-Kellai Hatya' and 'Netaji was murdered in Red Fort' authored by him have been marked Exhibits 118 and 119 respectively.

After examining the witnesses present, the parties and/or their lawyers present have been heard about the Status Report as on 28.11.2002 prepared by the Commission and circulated to all the parties present with particular reference to paragraphs 7(a) and 13. of the Status Report (which deal with the report dated 12/18.11.2002 of the Indian Embassy in Japan and photographs enclosed therewith indicating that the casket alleged to be containing the mortal remains of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose appear to be having bone fragments, parts of the skull, some teeth and portion of the jaw; and collection of blood samples of persons on the paternal/maternal lineage of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for the purpose of DNA test respectively).

Shri Subrata Bose (JMCI/27/2000) prayed for time for discussions and hearing in respect of paragraph 7(a); and as regards paragraph 13 of the Status Report, he submitted that he would try to impress upon some of the descendants in the paternal and maternal lineage of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for donation of blood. Dr. Madhusudan Pal (JMCI/14/2000) and other deponents also prayed for some time for discussion on paragrapgh 7 (a) of the Status Report. 

On being requested by the Commission, the Indian Embassy in Japan has agreed on December 27, 2002 to solicit the services of an expert to re-examine the bones allegedly of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose kept in Renkoji temple "to seek his opinion on whether any material exists from which D.N.A. may be isolated for the purpose of a D.N.A. test." Further development in the matter is awaited.



- 20. Shri Nandalal Chakraborty, one of the deponents of the affidavit No.JMCI/11, in his letter dated 01.11.2002 addressed to the Secretary of the Commission, has requested the Commission to visit the USA, the UK, and Germany for reasons mentioned therein. A copy of the said letter has been sent to the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, in continuation of the Commission's letter No.398 dated 11.11.2002 as referred to para 17 hereinbefore, with the request to act accordingly. The reply of the Ministry of External Affairs in the matter is awaited.
- 21. Some handwritings allegedly of 'Gumnami Baba' were made over to the Government Examiner of Questioned Documents. Bureau of Police Research and Development, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, Simla, on 02.09.2002 along with some admitted specimens of the handwritings of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for examination of the said questioned handwritings by comparing with the said admitted specimens of handwritings. The sealed report of the said Government Examiner has been collected and brought to the office of the Commission on 25.11.2002. The aforesaid two sets of handwritings have been made over to another competent handwriting expert in the last week of December. 2002. It need be pointed out in this connection that it may take considerable time to get the aforesaid two sets of handwritings examined by the said second expert and thereafter by the third expert.
- 22. Shri Subrata Bose, a nephew of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose has stated before the Commission at the time of its hearing on 02.12.2002 that he would try to impress upon some of the descendents in the paternal and maternal lineage of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose to donate blood. Shri Nirupam Som, who earlier questioned the efficacy of the proposed D.N.A. test, has stated inter alia in his letter dated 05.12.2002 to the Secretary of the Commission: "I see no reason to deviate from the stand taken by me in my earlier letter to you. I am also sure that Shri Subrata Bose is aware of the points raised in the same. Hence, since this important matter of blood donation is being

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delayed, I hereby express my willingness to donate blood for the D.N.A. test provided Shri Subrata Bose has also given concurrence and has donated the same." Shri Sadhan Kar in his letter dated 26.12.2002received by the Commission on 06.01.03 has expressed his willingness to cooperate with the Commission for the proposed D.N.A. test. The Commission by its Registered letter No.495 dated December 31, 2002 has requested Shri Dwarka Nath Bose, son of Netaji's elder brother Late Sunil Chandra Bose to convey in writing his willingness to donate his blood sample of one ml. for the purpose of the proposed D.N.A. test. The Commission is still making efforts to collect the names and addresses of other eligible donors, if any, of Netaji's family.

23. Necessary steps have been taken for the hearing of the Commission scheduled to be held on January 9, 2003 in Annexe Building, Mahajati Sadan, Kolkata on the contents of the paragraph 7(a)of the Status Report as on 28.11.2002 (copy enclosed).

The Secretary, Ministry of External Affairs, Government of

India, has been requested by the Commission's registered letter No.JMCI/CPDC/2000/432 dated November 27, 2002 to kindly pursuade the Government of Japan to get from the Government of Taiwan the original Register of Cremation Permits for the period from 18.08.1945 to 21.08.1945, the original application for cremation Permit allegedly filed on 18.05.1945 in the name of Chandra Bose or Subhas Chandra Bose, the original application for Cremation Permit, if any, filed on 18.08.1945 or 19.08.1945 in the name of Ichiro Okura, the original Death Certificate allegedly issued in the name of Subhas Chandra Bose or Chandra Bose and the original Death Certificate, if any, in the name of Ichiro Okura, since the Commission is essentially required to have an access to those documents in view of the facts and circumstances stated in the aforesaid letter dated November 27, 2002

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of the Commission. A copy of the said letter along with copies of the enclosures thereto has also been sent to the Joint Secretary (IS), Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, on November 27, 2002 by Registered Post. Their response is awaited.



- Status Report as on 28.11.2002 showing action taken on/compliance with orders/directions including those contained in the proceedings dated 10.06.2002 read with the proceedings dated 23.03.2000, 13.06.2000, 31.08.2000, 28.09.2000, 23.11.2000, 21.12.2000, 17.01.2001, 04.04.2001, 13.06.2001, 17.10.2001, 20.12.2001 & 22.03.2002 of the Commission.
  - 1. Xerox copies of the Commission's Status Report as on 06.06.2002 and of the proceedings dated June 10, 2002 and July 16, 2002 were sent to the Secretaries, Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of External Affairs, Prime Minister's Office, Cabinet Secretariat, Ministry of Defence, as also to the Director General, National Archives of India, and the Director, Intelligence Bureau, Government of India, under Commission's registered letter no. JMCI/Meeting-Proceedings (Follow up)/ 99-2000/48 (IV)/237 (7) dated 01.08.2002 for their information and taking necessary action at their end. The Commission's Status Report from 01.10.2002 to 31.10.2002 was sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs on 11.11.2002 by Registered Post for necessary action at their end.
  - 2. The Commission has been persistently asking the Ministry of Defence, Government of India, for their affidavit on existence/non-existence/availability/non-availability, etc. of the complete records of the proceedings of the trial of the INA personnel.
  - 3. No counter-affidavit or affidavit-in-opposition was filed by Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of External Affairs, Prime Minister's office, Cabinet Secretariat, Ministry of Defence Govt and Intelligence Bureau. of India averments/contentions/allegations contained in the affidavits/supplementary affidavits of different deponents in spite of repeated reminders. Hence, they have been intimated by registered letter no 300 dated September 03, 2002 that because of the said default of the said Ministries/Departments/Offices of the Government of India, the Commission presumed that the formers did not want to file any counter-affidavits or affidavits-inopposition as they had nothing with them to enable them to say anything contrary to or rebut on oath the averments and contentions contained in the aforesaid affidavits.
  - 4. Xerox copies/authenticated copies of various files of the Government of India as received from time to time are being scrutinized and further references are being made to the Government of India to elicit further information/documents in appropriate cases.
  - 5. To expedite the matters, the Hon'ble Chairman went to Delhi on 28.10.2002 and met the Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs, Government of India. He requested the Hon'ble Minister to persuade the Government of the U.K. to declassify all relevant classified British documents and to take all steps in terms of the d.o. letter No. 25/4/NGO-Vol.VI dated 26.09.2001 of the then Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs. Apropos the said discussion, the Commission's letter No 398 dated 11.11.2002 was sent by Speed Post to the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, with the request to take appropriate action in the matter. The Hon'ble Minister of External Affairs, Government of India, in his d.o. letter dated 13.11.2002 addressed to the Hon'ble chairman has stated inter alia: "...... since the Commission feels that these papers (i.e. classified British records on Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose) could be of vital importance with reference to its mandate, we have again

taken up the issue of their release with the British Government and would keep you informed of the outcome in this regard.

I would like to take this opportunity to reassure of all possible assistance from our side to facilitate the inquiry of the Commission."

Further development in the matter is awaited.

- 6. Notwithstanding the statement made by the then Prime Minister in the Lok Sobha on 28.08.1978 regarding availability of "further contemporary official documentary records", no such records could be traced out by the Government of India, as reported by them. The reports given by the Ministry of External Affairs, Prime Minister's Office, the Ministry of Home Affairs, etc. in the matter would be considered by the Hon'ble Chairman at the appropriate stage to express his views thereon.
- 7(a) The Hon'ble Chairman and the Secretary of the Commission visited Japan in the month of September, 2002 and could examine only one witness, viz., Dr. T. Yoshimi, in spite of publication of a notice about the sitting of the Commission in Japan, in a prominent English daily of Japan before the visit of the Commission to Japan. The Commission could interact with a number of local people at the Renkoji Temple in Tokyo who declined to depose before the Commission as witnesses. They have, however, stated that they all believe that Netaji had died in the plane crash on 18th August, 1945 and that the ashes of Netaji are being preserved at the Renkoji Temple; but none of them could adduce any evidence in support of their said beliefs. The Commission could not visually examine the ashes kept in Renkoji Temple as the container thereof could not be opened by the authorities of the Renkoji Temple on that day for some practical difficulties. Since the Commission was leaving for Miyazaki on that very day to examine Dr. T. Yoshimi, the Hon'ble Chairman addressed a letter to the Ambassador of India in Japan (who was away from Tokyo on that day) requesting him to get the ashes examined by a competent officer of the Embassy to ascertain whether there is any bone or fragments of bone in them justifying examination of the ashes by D.N.A. test. The report dated November 12/18, 2002 of the Indian Embassy in Japan and the photographs received by the Hon'ble Chairman on 28.11.2002, shows that the casket alleged to be containing the mortal remains of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose appear to be having bone fragments, parts of the skull, some teeth, and a portion of the jaw.
- 7)b) Shri Nandalal Chakraborty, one of the deponents of the affidavit no. JMCI/11, in his letter dated 01.11.2002 addressed to the Secretary of the Commission has requested the Commission to visit the USA, the UK, and Germany for reasons mentioned therein. Copy of the said letter has been sent to the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India in continuation of the Commission's letter no. 398 dated 11.11.2002 to act accordingly.
- 8. The documents collected by the National Archives of India from the UK as per requisition of the Commission have been received and are being scrutinized by the Commission.
- 9. The Commission has received from the Ministry of External Affairs some papers in support of the contention of the Ministry of External Affairs that the name of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose does not appear in the list of "War Criminals".

- 10. The Commission has been pursuing with the Ministry of External Affairs, Ministry of Home Affairs, Prime Minister's Office, Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, the Intelligence Bureau, etc., Government of India, for various files/documents/records/reports called for from them which are yet to be received by the Commission.
- 11. Some handwritings allegedly of "Gumnami Baba" were made over to the Government Examiner of Questioned Documents, Bureau of Police Research and Development, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, Simla, on 02.09.2002 along with some admitted specimens of the handwritings of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for examination of the said questioned handwritings by comparing with the said admitted specimens of handwritings. The sealed report of the said Government Examiner has been collected and brought to the office of the Commission on 25.11.2002. Efforts are being made to get the aforesaid two sets of handwritings examined independently by two more eminent handwriting experts, one after the other. It may be pointed out in this connection that it will take considerable time to get the questioned handwritings, allegedly of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, verified with admitted specimens of his handwritings by 3 (three) eminent handwriting experts independently, one after the other.
- 12. The authenticated xerox copies of the relevant rules and procedures, which were in force at the time of destruction of different files/documents of the Government of India, as called for, could not be received from the Prime Minister's office in spite of close persuasion by the Commission. Hence, it has been decided not to pursue the matter further.
- 13. To collect blood samples of persons on the paternal/maternal lineage of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose for the purpose of DNA tests of the relevant specimens out of the articles seized from the house in Faizabad, UP for establishing the identity of the subject to whom those specimens belonged, Sarbasree Nirupam Som, Subrata Bose, Pradip Bose, Sugata Bose, Chandra Kumar Bose, Surya Kumar Bose, Sadhan Kar and Smt. Chitra Ghose were requested by the Commission's letters dated 30.07.2002/03.10.2002/04.10.2002 to kindly cooperate with this Commission by communicating their willingness to donate their respective blood samples of one ml. each. While no response has yet been received from Sarbasree Chandra Kumar Bose, Sadhan Kar and Smt. Chitra Ghosh, Shri Nirupam Som and Shri Sugata Bose have questioned the efficacy of the proposed DNA test in their respective replies to the Commission in the matter. Shri Surya Kumar Bose, who is now living in Germany, has however expressed his willingness to donate the blood but has informed that he has no plan to visit India in near future. Shri Pradip Bose has replied that he has no objection to donate the blood in New Delhi as he will not be able to come to Kolkata in near future. Shri Subrata Bose in his letter dated November 28, 2002 which was received by the Commission at 3.45 PM on the same day, conveyed his willingness to donate blood sample for the proposed DNA test on the specimens obtained from Faizabad, UP, "and for no other purpose". The Commission is still making efforts to collect the names and addresses of other eligible donors, if any, of Netaji's family.

Proceedings dated 5th February, 2004 (26th) held at the Seminar Hall, Annexe Building, Mahajati Sadan, 166, Chittaranjan Avenue, Kolkata-700007.

Of the five witnesses summoned today two witnesses, namely, Shri Sugata Bose and Shri Swadhin Sanyal have prayed for adjournment by filing different petitions beforehand on the common ground of their prior commitments while Shri Pabitia Kumar Ghosh has, as on the earlier occasion, prayed for adjournment on the ground of illness. Other two witnesses, Smt. Jayanti Bhattacharya and Shri Rishi Ranjan Chakraborty, are absent without any intimation.

#### STATUS REPORT

The Parties have been heard in respect of the Status Report as on 29.01.2004.

Senior Coursel for the Government of India has been directed to pursue the matter with the concerned departments by writing letters to them and apprise the Commission of their reply.

Attention of Shri Subrata Bose (JMCI-27/2000) was drawn to paragraph 9 of the news item titled, "Netaji Convaissioner Kaj Niye Kendrer Birudhey Humki Andoloner" published in the 'Bastaman' dated 03.02.2004 where he was quoted "..... there are materials to prove that NETAJI WAS IN THE CITY OF OMSK IN SOUTH RUSSIA IN 1946". He stated that he was misquoted.

Referring to paragraph 7 of the Status Report, Dr. Madhusudan Pal (JMCI-14/2000) has submitted that he has also received a letter from the Chief of Protocol Office, Taipei City Government informing him that the Cremation Permits issued before 1968 by Taipei City Government, Department of Health were unfortunately destroyed.

Shri Nanda Lai Chakraborty (JMCI-11/2000) and Shri Sukhendu Kumar Baur (JMCI-31/2000) liave submitted that sufficient time should be given to the different deponents for advancing their arguments in the matter. Commission assured them of giving sufficient time.

By Commission's letter No. JMCI/CPDC/2002/86/394 dated Manuary 08, 2004 addressed to the Director (CNV), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, her attention has been drawn to her d.o. letter bearing No. 25/4/NGO/Vol.X dated 25.11.2003 and she has been requested to kindly send to the

Consequently, the Commission made endeavours to contact the authorities in Taiwan xx to know about the availability of relevant documents and relevant witnesses in Taiwan as the Ministry of External Affiairs, Government of India, expressed their difficulties to render the required help and assistance in the matter to the Commission on the ground that the Government of India is not having any diplomatic relations with the Government of Taiwan. Subsequently, the Ministry of External Affairs advised the Commission (vide d.c. letter No. 25/4/NGO/ Vol. IX dated September 24, 2003 of the Director (CNV), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, to the Secretary of t the Commission) not to approach the authorities of Taiwan in the aforesaid matters directly but to write to the Ministry of External Affairs for the information required to be obtained by the Commission from Talwan.

SOME OF THE IMPORTANT MATTERS WHICH THE COMMISSION HAS BEEN CONSTRAINED NOT TO PURSUE ON THE REPEATED FAILURE OF THE MINISTRIES/DEPARTMENTS CONCERNED OF THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA TO COMPLY WITH THE DIRECTIVES OF THE COMMISSION SENT IN THAT REGARD FROM TIME TO TIME.

- 1. Shri Morarji Desai, the then Prime Minister of India, made a statement on the floor of the Parliament (Lok Sabha) on August 28, 1978 that 'some further contemporary official documentary records have become available' in the light of which "it is difficult to accept that the earlier conclusions (of the Shah Nawaz Khan Committee and the Khosla Commission) are decisive". But the said'further contemporary official documentary records' have not been made available to the Commission by the Government of India.
- External Affairs, Government of India, as requested by the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India on the letter dated March 22, 1993 of Dr. Shankar Dayal Sharma, the then President of India (vide Commission(s letter No. JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(III)/449 dated December 5, 2002 addressed to the Joint Secretary (CNV), Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India).

The documents mentioned in the d.o. letter Nated February 3, 1998 of Dr. Ramesh Chandra Majumdar (a renowned historian, since deceased) addressed to Shri Norarji Desii, the then Prime Minister of India, as also those mentioned in the note attached to the said d.o. letter of Dr. Mazumdar (vide c.p.s. 16-20 of the Secret File No. 2/64/78-PM of the Prime Minister(s Office) have not been made available by the Secretaries, Ministry of Home Affairs and Ministry of Information and Broadcasting as called for from them by the Commission's letter No. JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37 (vol.II)/542 dated February 1, 2002.

- 4. Vol.Nos. XVIII, XIX and XXII pertaining to the Khosla Commission along with other relevant files/documents/records which have been shown in the Affidavit dated December 19, 2001 of Smt. Sangeeta Gairola, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, as called for by the Commission's letter No. JMCI/Records/N.Delhi/99-2000/37(Vol)II)/534 dated January 29, 2002 addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, have not been made available to the Commission.
- 5. The Affidavit allegedly filed by the Government of India before the Khosla Commission regarding destruction/missing of 34 confidential files on Netaji has not been made available to the Commission.
- 6. The documents filed by the Government of India and other parties, if any, before the Khosla Commission which were made exhibits by the said Commission, have not been furnished by the Government of India to this Commission. Not even a comprehensive list of the said exhibits has been filed by the Government of India to this Commission.
- nents before this Commission were sent to the Ministry of Home affairs, Government of India, so that the Ministries Departments/Offices concerned of the Government of India, might like to controvert the allegations/assertions contained in the said affidatits. In spite of close persuasion, no such counter-affidavits have been filed before this Commission by any of the authorities of the Government of India. Consequently, the Commission has presumed that the authorities concerned of the Government of India have nothing to say regarding the allegations/assertions of the said deponents made in their said affidavits and the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, have been kept informed by the Commission accordingly.
- 8. The Ministry of Home Affairs and the Ministry of External Affairs, Government of India, have been repeatedly requested by the Commission, in vain, to take up the matter with the Govt. of the U.K. at appropriate levels so that the classified British documents on Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose/INA are got declassified and the Commission can peruse them for the purpose of its inquiry.
