We are just in receipt of your letter of yesterday saying that you enclosed an Invoice of 6 bales Cottons, but it was omitted - Please send one -

You say you will send us a list of your taxable property and that you will do on us at 6 mos. ought to be done at 5%. We quoted the rate yesterday $5\frac{1}{2}$ % and I had not heard 6 mos. paper of any name or quality - quoted at less -

Our acceptance will sell in Wall Street at the very lowest rate for paper of equal date, and when any 6 months paper is done at 5% ours will be -

We wrote you yesterday that we would run the Mill in jointure with you till May if the Manufacturing could be contracted for at not over $2\frac{1}{8}$ ¢ - We hope you will be able to get it for 2¢

We shall be glad to hear from you soon as it may be well to be on the look out for cheap cotton - If it should go down we should be far buying all we could till May
