# PERU – Severe weather

 Heavy rainfall affected the northern part of Cusco region on 21 September, triggerring a landslide in the town of Sirenachayocc which killed three people and destroyed nine houses.

# URUGUAY - Floods

- Heavy rainfall in mid-September affected central Uruguay, causing river overflows in the departments of Durazno, Florida, Soriano and Canelones.
- SINAE reports over 4 500 people displaced in the former three departments, 321 houses destroyed or severely damaged in Durazno.

# INDIA – Severe Weather

- Heavy rainfall affected the north-eastern states of Assam and Meghalaya causing floods and landslides.
- 14 people have been killed in Meghalaya, where over 100 villages have been flooded. 14 people were killed also in Assam.
- Red Warning for heavy to extremely heavy rainfall at places in Assam and Meghalaya, as well as Orange Warnings for the rest of north-eastern India.

# China – Tropical Cyclone FUNG-WONG-14

- On 22 September UTC, it made landfall in the northern area of Zhejiang province near Xiangshan, second landfall took place in the area of Shanghai.
- Damage of buildings were reported and the preventive relocation of 158 000 people.
- On 23 September, it is expected to move into the East China Sea continuing north-east, towards southern South Korea, weakening into a Tropical Depression.

# SOUTH SUDAN - Population Displacement

- Displacement figures remain very high but "stable".
- Ongoing fighting in Renk (Upper Nile) is creating additional displacement in the area.
- Possible negative impact on aid programs as government circular published excludes all UN agencies and diplomatic missions and organisations such as IGAD, USAID, etc.

# SOUTH SUDAN - Presence of aid workers across Darfur

- 5 540 aid workers working for international aid agencies in Darfur. 97% of these aid workers are Sudanese nationals.
- Since the end of 2013, the number of aid workers has decreased by 20%. This decrease has occurred against the backdrop of increasing humanitarian needs in Darfur, where some 400 000 people in 2014 have been newly displaced.

# 🟃 SUDAN – South Sudanese refugees

- UNHCR indicates the displacement of 92 970 South-Sudanese into Sudan with approximately 41 901 in White Nile State and 29 018 in Khartoum. Arrivals rate in White Nile State has increased from 500/600 people per week to around 1 000 people.
- All sites in White Nile State, which is the area of concern, considering the current arrival rate are currently beyond capacity.
- At present no concrete plans of authorities to scale up on additional arrivals. Access for UNHCR staff to White Nile sites remains a concern as only short term travel permits were granted.
