Prevention Idea:

(1) Sponsoring of training courses:

Re-educational short-term training courses are held at four or five places for these active service such as doctors and health nurses with lecturers from the headquarters.

(2) Sponsoring of lecture courses:

Lecture courses are held in the area under the jurisdiction of each health center with a view to popularizing tuberculosis prevention idea among citizens.

(3) Distribution of printed matter:

In response to verbal requisition on activity of Miss Chino Majima re: Nursing Affairs in Nagasaki Ken.

Miss Chino Majima, Kyushu representative of National Nurses Association, was selected by vote at general meeting for 3 year term. She travels thru out Kyushu on association business. She is employed by Asahi Press in Kokura.

Miss Honda, Ken Chief Nurse, is under the impression Miss Majima also inspects welfare institutions e.g. orphanages. We have not been able to confirm this with Ken Welfare Section. Infact they do not know her.

Miss Majima arrived in Omura 3 September and stayed one day only. She talked with Dr Shinozaki, Mrs Eguchi and Miss Sakai - each privately. She wanted Miss Ikuta, a St Lukes Nurse who was working in Bioko High School in Shimonoseki to be employed as instructor in Omura National Hospital Training School.

Miss Majima stated that Miss Baca said all full time clinical nurse instructors must have the 4 month clinical nurse instructor course in Tokyo. She also stated that Miss Baca said that Miss Oba is not qualified as a full time instructor - only as a part time instructor. Miss Majima stated that none of the present instructors, Mrs Koga, Miss Oba, Mrs Eguchi and Miss Ueki are qualified clinical nurse instructors.

Mrs Eguchi, Miss Sakai and Mrs Kotani came to the Civil Affairs Office to ask advise as what should be done. They felt Miss Majima means well but also feel that she does not have an understanding of nursing laws and the present nursing education programs. They also question her authority and feel if she has any business in Nagasaki Ken at all it should be handled only thru Miss Honda.

Miss Majima did not contact Miss Honda who is both chief nurse in Ken and president of the Nagasaki Nurses Association.

Further information reveals that Miss Majima says she graduated from Kyoto Doshisha University Hospital Training School and that she also studied in England.

On 3 October Miss Majima lectured to the Omura city midwives at their request. Where ever she visits she usually makes a speech to nurses or midwives or both when requested.

1. In compliance with letter, your headquarters, subject as above, dated 11 October 1949, the following report is submitted.
2. Investigations reveal that there is evidence of recurrences of block (or similar system) organization activities in Beppu and Oita cities. Though there are no formal organizations the activities are somewhat similar to the old Buraku-kai or Chonai-kai organizations. As far as could be ascertained they do not function as the old so-called Sanitary Associations or deal with matters pertaining to the public health program but function more or less as pseudo city officials as information dispatchers and contribution collectors. Householders are assessed monthly fees of 3 to 10 yen for the service. The leaders of the activities are self appointed.
3. A conference was held by the Legal and Government and Public Health Section of this team with the corresponding officials from the prefectural government. The matter of violation of Cabinet Order No. 15 of 1947 was pointed out having been referred to PHMJG No. 69, 16 August 1948. The prefectural officials agreed to take care of the matter promptly through the proper channels.

3. Relationship of location of cases to occupation billets and installations: cases in Fukuoka City are scattered throughout the city and are in the vicinity of various occupation billets and installations; however; no cases have occurred in areas immediately adjacent to occupation installations.

4. Occupation employees in installations close to reported cases were vaccinated.

5. Control measures: publicity campaign urging early reporting to the Fukuoka Health Center of cases by patients and doctors, isolation of patients and immediate contacts in the Fukuoka City Aratsu Contagious Diseases Hospital, patients' homes are roped off and quarantined for two weeks; contact history and contact tracing is done on each patient. Fukuoka Police Department and City Health Department is conducting a door-to-door case finding program, mass vaccination of population in quarantined and surrounding areas, 100% vaccination of all babies two to twelve months of age.

10. The scattered location of cases in Fukuoka City and the  
probability of multiple scattered secondary cases, in recurrent crops at  
two week intervals, would indicate that nothing short of 100% mass vac-  
cination of the population of Fukuoka City will guarantee complete  
control of the epidemic. The sooner this is accomplished the less the  
danger that the epidemic will spread beyond the confines of the city  
and into the rest of the prefecture and other prefectures as well.

11. The cases reported in Moji and Omuta Cities were in well lo-  
calized areas, and as yet it appears that; there is no danger of  
epidemic spread from those cities.





1. A pharmaceutical inspector become suspicious of some packaged ephedrin tablets in the Tsurusaki Pharmacy, Kiuragi-mura, Higashimatsuura-gun. Samples were taken and on analysis they consisted of starch but no ephedrin. The design of the tablet, container, and label was identical with that of apparently reliable companys in Osaka-shi; Nikka Yakuhin K.K. and Dainippon Seiyaku K.K.

2. These tablets were purchased from the Tsuji Drug Co., Keratsu-shi which had originally purchased 100 packages (20 tab each) from a salesman representing himself as an agent of the Aoki Store (Drug and Sanitary Materials), Osaka-shi. The name of this salesman is not known.

3. Action taken; all of these tablets that are known to exist have been confiscated. The Welfare Ministry was notified. Information was sent to the Osaka Prefectural Health Department.

SUBJECT: Diphtheria Epidemic

TO : COMMANDING OFFICER, Kyushu Military Government Region,

The following information is furnished concerning diphtheria epidemic at Ureshino-machi (population 13,783).

1. 37 cases had been diagnosed as of 26 Feb 1949 by culture methods.
  - a. 13 cases are among dependents of the Ureshino National Hospital Staff.
  - b. Remaining 24 are in the town of Ureshino.
  - c. One death has occurred.
  - d. Cases are among children (for the most part pre-school age).
2. No toxoid or anti-toxin is available. A telegram was sent to the Welfare Ministry asking for material to immunize 3,000 people.
3. The cases are mild for the most part.
4. Control measures taken are as follows:
  - a. Disinfection of the Hospital with carboric acid.
  - b. Use of masks and gargle by Hospital Staff.
  - c. Isolation or quarantine of the patients.
5. 17 of the patients had received diphtheria immunization in Oct 1948.
6. The hospital has a large outpatient practice who come from areas 10 to 12 miles away.
