1. Reference: Letter, AG 720(27 Feb 47)CE, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 5 November 1951, subject: Refuse Collection and Disposal (inclosure 1).

2. Paragraph 4 of referenced letter is amended to read as follows, and paragraph 5 is added as indicated:

"4. A recent study by the major subordinate commands reveals that at the majority of installations the most economical method of refuse collection and disposal is by written agreements or contracts with responsible individuals or firms providing for the performance of such services at little or no expense to the United States Government. For the purpose of determining whether or not monetary consideration will be involved in effecting agreements or contracts for the collection and disposal of refuse at Armed Services installations, direct contact with local individuals or firms by the appropriate installation commanders having logistical responsibilities is authorized, notwithstanding the prohibition set forth in paragraph 1-203, Japan Logistical Procurement Regulations. Agreements or contracts for the collection and disposal of refuse at Armed Services installations will be effected in accordance with current procurement directives citing Japanese appropriated funds when monetary considerations are involved. Where there is no monetary consideration involved, arrangement other than agreements or contracts for the collection and disposal of refuse at Armed Services installations may be effected by the installation commander or his designated representative.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

1. Reference: Letter, AG 720(27 Feb 47)CE, General Headquarters, Far East Command, 5 November 1951, subject: Refuse Collection and Disposal, with first indorsement from FEAF, 16 November 1951. The indorsement states that Section 2, paragraph 1-203 of Japan Logistical Command Occupation Forces Procurement Regulation dated 30 October 1950, as amended, prohibits any agency other than the Special Procurement Board from contacting or discussing the procurement of or agreement for services with the Japanese Government, contractors, or civilian suppliers.

2. It is considered desirable to waive the prohibition against such contacts, so that thereby determination may be made as to whether or not there will be a monetary consideration involved in the collection and disposal of refuse at an Armed Forces installation.

3. The waiving of the prohibition will expedite the securing of such services when no monetary consideration is involved, as the installation commander or his designated representative can then make a local arrangement other than an agreement or contract for the collection.

4. Instant letter informs the major subordinate commands of amendment of paragraph 4 referenced letter, so as to include:

- a. Authorization of direct contacts, for a specific purpose.
- b. Prescribed procedure to be followed in securing subject services.

Subject: Refuse Collection and Disposal

1. By C/N 4, undated, Engr forwards to COM and G4 for concurrence the following proposed documents:

a. Letter to major subordinate commands which amends paragraph 4 of letter GHQ, FEC, AG 720 (27 Feb 47)CE, subject: Refuse Collection and Disposal, dated 5 Nov 51.

b. 2d Ind reply to CG FEAF which states that action is being taken to authorize direct contact between installation commanders and local individuals or firms in effecting agreements or contracts for refuse collection and disposal.

c. Letter to C-in-C, BCOF, which forwards a copy of the Refuse Collection and Disposal letter and sets forth the amendment thereto.

2. G4 by C/N 2, requested that

a. COM make a determination as to the funds to be obligated in the event a contract for these services should involve a monetary consideration.

b. Engr to revise the proposed letter to allow installation commanders to make arrangements other than by contracts or agreements for the collection and disposal of refuse.

3. a. The determination by COM as requested by G4 was made in C/N 3, in which it is stated that contracts will cite Japanese appropriated funds.

b. Engr has revised the proposed letter as requested by G4.

c. G4 has no further objection to the letters as proposed by Engr and as concurred in by COM.

4. Concurrence of COM is indicated only by initials (LW) on C/N 4; therefore, C/N 5 forwards the proposed letters to AG for signature and dispatch, and requests that current checknote series be retained by AG as part of the permanent file.
