VII (r) Results:

<u>Name</u>	<u>Target No</u>	<u>Contact Pt.</u>
Lt. Melin	1	One temporarily hung and fell in water; The other was long-missed target.
Lt. Habish	1	Bomb hit tank but skipped off before exploding. No damage.
Lt. Jerominski	1	Bombs released simultaneously; One hit on either side of tank-probable damage but no fire.
Lt. Habish	2	Near miss-target covered with dirt-probably no damage.
Lt. Baker	3	Jettisoned bombs over wooded area on Urukthapel when returning to base with engine trouble. Damage undetermined.

No specific targets were assigned to this four plane barge sweep. Target #1 is a large buried storage tank on Malalal which has remained impervious to many previous bombing attacks. Two similar adjacent tanks have been destroyed. Target #2 which on aerial photographs resembled a possible generator and search light installation turned out to be dummy gun emplacements when closely inspected.

Lt. Baker returned to base early when his engine began to backfire and to run rough. He released his bombs over a wooded area on Urukthapel. Some six hundred enemy troops are reported to garrison this island and it is possible that some damage resulted.

Strafing attacks were made on the below listed targets:

- TX(639-963)--- Truck in a revetment was strafed and burned.
- TX(606-983)--- A 20' boat on the shore was strafed and riddled.
- TX(652-990)--- One 20' boat sunk by strafing and one damaged.
- TX(656-012)--- Two double ended lighters, approximately 30' long X 10' wide, thoroughly strafed and damaged.
- TX(631-863)--- Here a pastoral scene, consisting of a bull pulling a two wheeled ox-cart along with three Japanese, was interrupted.. The bull was killed along with the Japanese.

No trace remains of the sugar dog sea truck the attack on which was described in ACA-2 report No. 1.
