Substitution.

Count everything you put in your letter, checks, orders or whatever form it is in, whether intended for goods, prepaid expressage, or both, and tell us what the amount is and your wishes as to its disposition.

By almost every mail we receive letters which bear neither date, signature nor address, some of which contain money. Too great care cannot be taken in respect to distinctness of name and address.

Every time you write to us, no matter how often, it is necessary you should sign __ar name legibly and give your full address—Post-office, County and State.
