arrived from Austria February 25 having left Vienha about 18. 503 for several years acquainted with HOTTEL one of Viennese SS chiefs who knew vaguely that 503 had direct contacts with Americans Switzerland. Prior 503's recent departure from Vienna for Switzerland Hottel informed him that KALTENBRUNNER chief of SD wanted to see him. Kaltenbruhner informed 503 that he and Himmler most anxious to end war and as first step were contemplating liquidation of " war mongers" within Nazi party especially BORMANN. Himmler and Kaltenbrunner were most anxious to establish contact with British and Americans and asked 503 to make effort in this direction on his trip to Switzerland and wontemplated sending here high SS official to speak on their behalf provided contact could be established. 503 on own initiative suggested that Alfred POTOCKI brother of former Polish Minister to Washington should be permitted to go to Switzerland with him as he felt Potocki had first class contacts with British. Hottel arranged for immediate exit visa for Potocki and his mother. Potocki expected proceed first to Liechtenstein where he has not yet arrived. While 503 is rather lightweight consider above approach interesting as sign of increasing disintegration within Nazi party and as indication antics of Himmler to prepare alibis, According, 503 Himmler now organizing defense on eastern front and largely in command of this theatre of war.

Referring my 609 London 748 Paris 617 Caserta 431. From 110.

Further conversations with 503 indicate that his SD contacts and information have more importance than I originally believed. Information received from other good sources tends to bear out indications brought by 503 that Himmler Kaltenbrunner and certain other high SS officials might not go along with die-hard fanatics and might try to gain some immunity by serving as "Uebergangs" regime between Hitler and occupation forces. They might possibly prefer this to joining Hitler Bormann et al. in German reduit. Please note particularly significant statement my 609 attributed to Kaltenbrunner that Himmler anxious to liquidate "war mongers such as Bormann."

Naturally persons of Himmler Kaltenbrunner type can gain no immunity from us but as long as they believe this is possible it might give us opportunity to drive a wedge in SD and thus reduce effectiveness of German reduit plans. This seems to be a matter well worth handling by clandes—tine methods as I fell one need have no scruples in double—crossing types such as Himmler Kaltenbrunner et al. Through indirect channels we are arranging to have HOTTEL come to Swiss frontier where trusted intermediary will see him.

It would be most interesting to know if you have any other clews bearing on this situation.

HOETTEL who intimate friend Kaltenbruhner and operates. Vienna. Previously represented Kaltenbrunner in Hungary to supervise activities Vessenmayer. Recently given task by Kaltenbrunner of establishing contact with opposition groups in Austria. Alleges that within SS there is socalled Austrian opposition represented by Kaltenbrunner, NEUBARHER, himself and others, and that they have been responsible for saving many people from SS.persecution, including Count BERCHERM, and AMSTER, of Abwehr. MAROGNIA, chief of Abwehr in Vienna, participated July 20 and executed. HOETTEL also claims he responsible for transfer of SEITZ from concentration camp Silesia to Bavaria, and hopes shortly to free Seitz.

Report B-2084. See my 703 Snafu 516 Lammy 839 following conversation reported in this message. HOETTEL made second trip here from Vienna and on this occasion we arranged put our 502 in contact with him. Heettel who I am convinced is righthand man of KALTENBRUNNER gave following picture of situation Vienna:

Within ranks of Austrian SS the majority, who mostly Austrian nationals, desires liquidate Party and arrange orderly transfer of administration to Western Powers. This plan involves elimination of SS elements favoring continuation of war, particularly BORNANN supporters and a number of the Gauleiters.

This viewpoint was also confirmed to us by 503 who has also been here again and who saw Kaltenbrunner between Hoettel's first and second trip and who advised us that second trip was at Kaltenbrunner's special request. According to Hoettel Kaltenbrunner had entrusted him with task of establishing contact with Austrian opposition circles with view of supporting anti-Communist elements. Because of his Catholicism and fact his father Social Democratic school reformer Hoettel deemed qualified for this task which facilitated by anti-Communist leaning of Austrian workers. Hoettel claimed contact with anti-Nazi worker leaders Steiermark. Wiener Neustadt and Vienna and also with Catholic opposition groups and cited name of Catholic leader RUDOLPH as opposition leader. (From 110. This name checks with K-28 report). Claimed he knew other leaders only under their cover names. Hoettel promised raturn here with certain opposition leaders and hinted even at possibility of bringing out SEITZ as well as representatives of workers and Catholic opposition.

This program was subject of discussion in Salzburg attended by Kaltenbrunner, NEUBACHER, GLAISE HORSTENAU,

NEUSTAEDTER-STUERMER, and Hoettel upon latter's return to Austria after second trip.

Regarding general situation Hoettel declared Nazis expected wave of Anti-Communism in Balkan area, that in Rumania Iron Guard strengthened and present party of Maniu opposed to Communism. Similar developments in Jugoslavia. He gave these developments as reason why at present time in spite of unfavorable situation on East and West Fronts SS divisions among them Leibstandarte remained on PLATTEN-SEE front while von WEICHS'S army in Croatia remained there and relatively inactive. He said Alpine reduit would be finished and stocked in about 3 months, that STEYRWERKE is already underground and producing particularly such defensive weapons as Panzerfäuste. It is intended that Wehrmanht units as well as SS be taken into reduit including families of fighting men.

As regards situation within Nazi party Hoettel stated that split between West and East oriented persons becoming more apparent. LEY and Argeitsfront plus Bormann and many Gauleiters go with latter. Kaltenbrunner and his followers belong to western oriented group. He predicted sort of TAU-ROGGEN movement with the uncovering of Western front and march toward East leaving government of Germany to Western Allies while continuing to fight as free-corps bands.

From 110. The above is well within range of possibility. As you know there are other indications that certain SS elements are trying to save their skins by turning to West, dropping their attacks against local anti-Nazi movements or even favoring them and preparing to follow line which will obviate necessity of their joining die-hards in last ditch struggle in reduit.

Elements of similarity in movements of von EPP in Bavaria, Kaltenbrunner in Austria and our contacts in Italy are striking. It seems to me that these trends offer possibility of checkmating any effective organization of German reduit. Interesting question is whether Himmler is pulling strings behind these varying movements and possibly preparing himself to desert the die-hards.

- 1. Regarding London Caserta 1277(4). Not sent elsewhere.
- 2. Further inquiry regarding HOETTL indicates he was one of SS group wishing separate Austria control under Austrian SS.
- 3. This is more extreme view than source attributes to so-called METTERNICH group of KALTENBRUNNER who is said to desire control Austria and Bavaria within greater Germany. Austrian Gauleiters said to oppose this centralization wishing rule own GAUS individually.
- 4. HOETTL said to be under influence of TRISCA or TRISCHKA, deputy of Gauleiter Vienna, and of Meckel or Mickel, former police attaché Budapest and VOLKSSTURM referent Vienna, both fanatical Nazis. No further traces of either here.
- 5. Trisca reported by some to be ambitious sly thinks self most important figure in Austria. Said to have been Kultur Attaché at Budapest and man powerful RSHA representative in Hungary. Said to have direct relations with Himmler and to be important member of Kaltenbrunner's Vienna circle.
- 6. No further confirmation of above which is view of single well-placed source.


Saint information Saint Washington and Paris. YMMK Regarding our Caserta 1314(4), Bern 710(7), Washington 1932(4), Paris 5762(4) and Paris pouch FPX 002-2803C of 27 March.

- 1. Further information just available indicates need for caution in dealing with HOETTL.
- 2. Source quoted in above cable stresses Hoettl long identified with extremist S^S clique and that Kalten-brunner and Mueller unlikely genuinely favor understanding with Western Powers.
- 3. Kaltenbrunner could hardly approach Western Powers especially through man like Hoettl without news reaching Schellengerg and thus Himmler soon, considering SCHEELGAULEITER SALZBURG and ROESENERSSUFF under him both Himmler men and personal foes of Kaltenbrunner.
- 4. Source thinks it probable Himmler using Kalten-brunner and Hoettl in hope of embroiling Western Powers with Russians since negotiations likely to become known. Hoettl known to have been in close touch summer 1944 with Hungarian and Slovak circles in contact with Russia.
- 5. Source's opinion on other subjects has been found generally reliable.

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 I believe that in their different ways both H. and W. are important contacts, well worth developing.

H. is, of course, dangerous. He is a Nazi and an admitted associate of such men as Glaise-Horstenau and Meindh. Henra a Tanatical anti-Russian and, for this reason, we can not very well collaborate with him - at least not without informing the Sussians. But I see no reason why we should not use him in the furtherance of interests common both to the United Nations and to him and his associates, namely, the hastening of the end of resistance in Austria by the disruption of the Réduit. I feel that we should make full use of the Nachrichtendienst which he is organizing, of the propaganda services which he is setting up, and of the material which he can supply for this propaganda. I fully concur with him that psychological warfare must play a tremendously important rôle in combatting the Réduit. Further, I feel that we should encourage him in his attempts to create opposition groups within the Réduit. Although it is impossible to have any real sympathy for a man of his type, he nevertheless made a favourable impression on me. I believe he is sincere and to be trusted, provided we give him a certain measure of confidence. There is considerable evidence of his good will in his rescuing of such men as Seitz and Messner, and in his bringing out a man like W. There is also W.'s opinion of him, and G.'s trust of him as reported by W.

To avoid any accusation that we are working with a Nazi reactionary and a fanatical anti-Russian, I believe that we should keep our contact with him as indirect as possible. A., L., and possibly Grimm should be the people to deal with him, if and when he comes out again (and he expects to do so very shortly). I might possibly see him again but not alone and only in the capacity of an interested observer at his discussions with A. and Co. In such a capacity, I can always give him the encouragement he seeks without committing us in any way to any direct form of collaboration.

In this connection, it is amusing that H. told me that upon his return to Germany, he would have to show his Nazi masters something for his visit here. He stated that he would like to say that he had managed to obtain contacts with the Americans and had discovered from them that their divergencies with the Russians were very real. I told him that if he made any such reports, there was no question of my ever seeing him again, nor I imagine, of any collaboration with the Austrian group here. A., who was present, fully confirmed this. H. then asked me if I could provide him with any material to pass on his Nazi masters — Something less harmful, such as reports of difficulties we were having with



the German population in occupied Germany. As a matter of amusement, I asked him why he did not go back and report the truth, to which he answered that his Nazi masters were only concerned to receive information which pleased them. This question of supplying him with material for his Nazi masters should, I feel, be further discussed.

Interesting is the fact that H. never hinted to me that he wanted any return from us for his services. I think, however, he takes it for granted that we will take into account his present services when judging his past activities. Furthermore, I believe that he hopes that he and his associates will be able to play a political rôle in the future Austria as a result of his present activities. To make our position clear on these points, I told him that no man need fear for his security, provided he was not guilty of any war crime, and further, that the future of any political group in Austria depended not on us, but on the Austrian people. He seemed quite satisfied with this.

Both A. and Grimm confirmed my own impression that H. is a sincere man whom we can most usefully use, but with whom we should in no way collaborate. He also made a favourable impression on Pater Schmidt.

- 2. W. is an entirely different person. I am convinced that he has always been a violent anti-Nazi and that he and his associates have done their "Austrian best" to fight Nazism. The people he represents are somewhat reactionary and his strong anti-Russian feelings are embarrassing. However, he strikes me as important, being our first really sound contact with what is an obviously important political grouping in Austria. His plans for the political future of his country strike me as sound, and I believe that he too can help in the internal disruption of the Réduit. The impression he made on me was altogether favourable, and I see numerous ways in which we can use him, such as obtaining from him reports on political trends inside Austria, white and black lists, advice in various Austrian questions. I strongly advise further talks with him during his stay in Switzerland, and I, myself, plan to see him again today.
- 3. Both H. and G. are also important for the positions which they hold and their consequent powers and authority. They are friends, and powerful friends, in the enemy's camp, and can be used as such. A contact with G. would be most interesting, but I understand there is little chance of his coming here.
- 4. Meindl is, I believe, a "bad egg". But here again his position makes him important, and H, is quite convinced that he would actively work for the opposition if given the least encouragement. For this reason, I advised that H. should bring him



out here.

out here. If and when he comes, I do not think that we should see him. Grimm strikes me as the ideal person to deal with him.

- 5. I did not like Westen, and he struck me as definitely dangerous, owing to his indiscretions (which led to the Swiss arresting him and H. and pushing them over the frontier) and to his "love of the bottle". I see no object in having anything more to do with him, unless he is an indispensible link in H.'s chain of contacts between the Réduit and here.
- 6. I think there is a danger of regarding H. and W. as representatives of any one political grouping in Austria. The associates whom they listed include representatives of such a variety of political schools that they defy labelling as a group.
- 7. Pater Schmidt told me that he was going to put W. into contact with his British friends. In these circumstances, I think it would be well if we were to warn the British beforehand of what this whole affair is about and the part we have played in it.

THE REDUIT.

H. states that the Réduit is to be taken very seriously. It is too late now to prevent it, and he is convinced that it will be put into effect. W. on the other hand, believes that in Switzerland we take the Réduit too seriously, arguing that it will contain so many unreliable elements that it can never hold out for long.

Both H. and W. are convinced that the original Nazi plans for the Réduit have been entirely upset by the rapid military developments.

According to H., the original plan was that only "reliable" SS and police troops and party leaders would go into the Réduit. This plan has now been given up. Instead, a strong military Réduit has been planned with many Wehrmacht units as well. Particularly the troops in North Italy and Croatia are to go in, although it is doubtful if the former will ever get there. On the other hand, General Löhr's men from Croatia are farily certain to get there. Their morale is good. They lack material, but not much will be needed in the mountains. Certain other groups from the Balkans (Mihailowitch) with strong anti-Bolshevist tendencies may also go in. It is, however, difficult at the moment to say who is going in, as this will largely depend on military developments.

In all cases, there is no longer any question of organizing and controlling those who are to go in. Consequently, it is certain that a large number of unreliable elements will get in. Both H. and W. repeatedly strsses this, W. adding that the control of reliable elements has become increasingly difficult, as all but the most important archives are now being destroyed by retreating Nazi services.

The rapid military developments are also responsible for lack of preparations within the Réduit, where individual Gauleiters are feverishly trying to organize their respective territories as best they can. Food supplies are not well organized, nor are radio services.

The local populace is being left within the Réduit, although lists of "unreliables" are being drawn up.

Once the Réduit is established, the valleys giving entrance to it will be blown up, so that the forces inside will be completely cut off from the outside world. In such circumstances, and with their families around the, they are likely to resist any attack, unless their fighting morale is undermined by clever propaganda.

Considerable defence preparations are noticeable in the Berchtesgaden region. A number of Bavarian Alpine troops have recently arrived in the Salzburg neighborhood.




H. gives the following boundaries of the Réduit:

THE BALKANS.

According to H., there exist anti-Bolshevist national groups throughout the Balkans, particularly in:

Albania Macedonia Greece Rumania Bulgaria Hungary

H. is quite convinced that the western Allies have made contact with and are even encouraging these groups because of their anti-Bolshevist tendencies. W. tells the same story; thus, he claims to have spoken freely with the head of the American mission attached to Mihailowitch, a man called Mac.Dowell, with whom he claims to have been on the best of terms.

According to H., these groups are still controlled by the Nazis, who organized them. They are well armed, the Germans having handed over their arms to them when withdrawing. However, they lack munitions.

The Nazis still have radio contacts with all of these groups, who will act the moment they receive the word to do so from the Nazis.

THE DEFENCE OF VIENNA.

Vienna's defence, according to H., was comparatively weak because the Germans had not anticipated that the Russians would reach it so soon.

When the German offensive in Hungary failed, the Germans were forced to go over from the offensive to the defensive. The resulting chaos was such that there was no possibility of holding the Russian drive to the south.

The German troops employed in Vienna's defence comprised:

1. The 5th Panzer Army.

Theoretically, this included the following five Panzer divisions:

Leibstandarbe Adolf Hitler, Reichsstandarbe, Hitlerjugend, ' Totenkopf, Hermann Goering,

In fact, their real strength amounted to a maximum of two divisions.

- 2. About two and one half divisions, comprising 25,000 men, in Vienna itself.
- About another two and one half divisions, comprising 25,000 men, in the surroundings of Vienna.

WEREWOLF ORGANIZATION.

This organization is based upon the SS Jagddivision Brandenburg and other SS Jagdverbände.

The overall chief of the organization is a man called Prutzmann. The military chief is Scorceni (the man who rescued Mussolini). His second-in-command for south eastern Europe is Major Benes. According to W., Scorceni has under his command about 100,000 SS and "reliable" Wehrmacht men, including Generals, who come from the Aschaffenburg and Thuringia districts. Hitler has ordered Scorceni to take these 100,000 men with him into the Réduit.

The political direction is, presently, under the Foreign Office. It comprises the following persons:

After the Réduit collapses, the SD and AST are to be dissolved. They may, however, carry on underground in occupied Germany with no central headquarters (Schellenberg is head of the SD and AST. In the Foreign Section there are more AST people).

When the SD and AST are dissolved, the underground Werewolf organization will take over. No decision has yet been taken as to where its central headquarters should be located. This is one of the most worrying problems facing the Nazis today.

According to H., the Werewolf should be taken seriously. It has been systematically organized for the past two years. There are concealed depots of arms, explosives, medicaments, etc. There is also an ample supply of funds.

In H.'s opinion, the future of the organization will depend largely on the political and economic situations prevailing after the war. If these are good, the organization is likely to disrupt quickly. On the other hand, if there is much political unrest and economic discontent, it will thrive.

Yesterday an acquaintance from Freising, Bavaria, reliability untested, told me the following:

One Albert HÖRTL (Dr.), an Austrian 36 years old, has been working in Freising for the American intelligence center on such things as Ciano's diary, etc. He claimed to be working for Dulles and Leslie. Some time ago he left Freising, but he is believed to be still with the Third Army, working with CIC.

In July Höftl asked my friend to take to Switzerland a letter addressed to Count POTOCKI, which my friend did. At the end of August Hörtle asked him to take another letter addressed to Alfred PREUSS in Liechtenstein. My friend in the meantime had learned that Hörtl was an SS and refused to take the letter, asking why Hörtl did not send it via the Americans. Höftl replied that he did not wish it to be seen by the Americans.

Recently one Franz ROTHEN, an Austrian, 45-48, formerly a diplomat in the Balkans, (home address Altaussee, Austria), knowing that my friend was coming to Switzerland asked him to communicate with Dulles and Leslie and have them get into communication with Höttl, as Höttl wanted to go to South America.

Rothen said that Höttl had corresponded, in addition to Preuss and Count Alfred Potocki, c/o Prince Liechtenstein, Vaduz, with the following person:

Prince Alois Auersperg Chalet Gentian Villars sur Ollon.

Höftl's wife, Frau Doktor Alfred höftl, lives at Altausee, Puchen 61.

- l. A colleague in Jl reports that a friend in Germany whose reliability he has not tested told him that Alfred HOETTL (presumably identical with Dr. Wilhelm HOETTL) was working in Freising, Bayaria, for 110 and LESLIE of the American Intelligence Services on such things as the Ciano Diary, etc. He states that HOETTL left Freising some time ago and is believed to be attached now to the CIC, Third Army. In July, HOETTL asked him to deliver a letter to Count Alfred POTOCKI in Switzerland and our informant agreed. At the end of August HOETTL asked him to take another letter to Alfred PREUSS in Liechtenstein. In the meanwhile, however, our informant had learned of HOETTL's connection with the SS and refused. He suggested that HOETTL send the letter through the Americans to which HOETTL replied that he did not wish to have the letter seen by the Americans.
- 2. Recently, Franz ROTHEN, a former Austrian diplomat residing at Altaussee, Austria, asked our informant who was planning to come to Switzerland if he would see 110 and Leslie and ask them to contact HOETTL who was eager to go to South America. ROTHEN disclosed that in addition to RREUSS and POTOCKI (care of Prince LIECHTENSTEIN, Vaduz), HOETTL had also communicated with Prince Alois AUERSPERG, Chalet Gentian, Villars sur Ollon. He also reported that Frau Doktor Alfred HOETTL lives at Altausee, Puchen 61.
- 3. Herewith photostats offenwo letters from AUERSPERG and PREUSS addressed to HOETTL that our informant has been asked to deliver to him in Germany. We have requested him to do so and to continue to act as a letter drop until we have your comments.

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION

In 1944 he was described as being well built, his height varied from the sources as 5'9", 5'10" and 1.75m. Hair light brown, parted on left; light complexion, grey eyes and a full face with strong features.

After his capture in 1945, his height was reported as 1.79m, hair

dark, complexion salls, and was of slender build.

He is married and has 2 children. His wife was expecting a 3rd in 1945.

TEMPERAMENT

Hoettl had made a good impression with sources and was believed to be trustworthy and sincere. This observation was made when a source believed him to be cooperating with the allies to save his own skin.

Hoettl's enemy VEESENMAYER judged him as a fanatic Nazi, an narrow minded radical who would leave nothing undone in order to achieve his goal, no matter what it might be. He attacked every project with a logic-fight mind, unswaying and making no concessions.

VEESENMAYER hated Hoettl for a period of years and made these statements during interrogation so perhaps in some respects it is not a fair observation. What he said must be considered in the light of their unpleasant relationship.

SHERET

MILITARY RECORD OF DR. WILHELM HOETTL

Between 1940 and 1945, Hoettl engaged in intelligence work in Bulgaria as the Balkan expert in Gruppe VI E of the RSHA. While employed at the S.D. Leitabschnitt, he took many journeys into the country by car and managed to collaborate with several good Bulgarian specialists.

In 1941, Hoettl was Leiter of Referat VI in Vienna. During December of that year, he became envolved in disciplinary troubles and dismissed from his post by his successor Gerhardt MULLER® MANDEL. One source says Hoettl had been working too closely with Jewish agents and was dishonest in money matters. Hoettl claims that he was dismissed because HEYDRICH saw that he failed to adopt the Nazi party policy toward Jews. Hoettl's political views were unpopular with Berlin as he supported the moderate National Socialists who on an understanding with him, made a break with the Arrow Cross Party while Berlin supported the latter.

With this break and dismissal from the S.D., Hoettl was inducted as a Private and war reporter with SS regiment Prinz Eugen in Belgrade.

In 1943, Hoettl was rehabilitated to Amt VI and posted to the high position of SS Sturmbannfuehrer in Berlin, possibly as HANKE'S successor. He was appointed advisor to VEESENMAYER and to the Hoehere SS und Poliseifuehrer WINKELMANN. He was also the Liason between the Chef der Sicher-Leitepolizei and VEESENMAYER.

During this year he was an important member of the Italian section and head of the Croation Section of Amt VI RSHA. He was also instremental in getting Count CIANO'S Diary.

He had no longer any direct influence on the intelligence work of the Referat for Bulgaria, but nevertheless as the Gruppenleiter's deputy, he was informed of the current events so he could follow developments closely.

He again came close to being dismissed. This time he chose to differ with VEESENMAYER on a matter of policy and was retained only because HIMMLER disagreed with VON RIBBENTROP on recalling him.

In 1944, he was reported to have been at the sabotage branch of Amt VI in Berlin. He had the opportunity to observe material on Jap intelligence activities in the Caucasus, in Turkey and in Germany.

In 1945 his rank was reported as Obersturmbannfuehrer.

He was reported as the S.D. chief in Rome in the "Cloister Affair."

In the early months of 1945, he organized extensive W/T networks throughout southeast Europe consisting of 5 major stations and about 30 agents not including minor feeders. His HQ was in the South Tyrol.

He was captured by the U.S. army at his home in Altausee, Austria about 21 May 1945.

CERRET

POLITICAL VIEWS OF DR. WILHELM HOETTL

During the war years, Hoettl's political views were unpopular with Berlin. He supported the moderate National Socialists like Count PALFEY and BAKY, who on an understanding with Hoettl, made a break with the Arrow Cross Party of SZALASI while Berlin supported the latter.

HOETTL'S opponent VEESENMAYER claimed Hoettl did everthing in his power to prevent SZALASI and his Arrow Cross Party from gainging accession in Hungary. Hoettl, himself, says he was the avowed opponent of SZALASI. SZALASI was in the "Pfeilkrevzler" movement which had the goal of assimilation of the various racial elements in Hungary into a nationalistic homogeneous people.

Hoettl worked for KALTENBRUNNER and HIMMLER and had their protection at all times. He was influencial in Hungarian policy making because of his backing. VEESENMAYER alleged Hoettl's chief concern was the small group of National Socialists in Budapest with whom he associated.


There is no mention of just what this official policy was; to HIMMLER he was reliable, to von RIBBENTROP he definitely was not. It appears that von RIBBENTROP represented the official policy and that Hoettl's disagreement found him shelter only through his official position with HIEMLER and KALTENBRUNNER.

Hoettl made contact with the OWI in 19 April 1945 in Switzerland. He claimed to represent the moderate Nazi group of Austrian conservative circles including the Catholic church, legitimists, the more moderate Nazis, and General GLAISE-HORSTENAU of the Separtist movement to whom he looked as his leader. But Hoettl could not be considered representative of a political group in Austria; these associates defy labelling as a group.

Source MESITE believed that the motive of Hoettl and his circle was not merely to save their own skins, but also to play a political role in the future of Austria. Hoettl feared Russian imperialism and wanted to link Austria to western democratic ideas against the Russians. He particularly wanted strengthening of anti-Russian leaders in a socialism movement.

Hoettl, after his capture, said he was a devout and active Catholic and joined the NSDAP on 13 March 1938 because he thought National Socialism would save Austria from Bolshevism. He later became convinced that the only salvation from Bolshevism was in a free and independent Austria with a strong alliance and support from Western nations. He favored support of the Catholic church but because it had monarchist leanings, he feared a monarchist controversy.

He was considered a political expert on Bulgarian affairs, but source does not reflect Hoettl's own personal views.

- 1945 South Tyrol, controlled radio facilities.



- 2. A glance through the documents will reveal that they are a portion of a permanent file of reports and correspondence kept in chronological form by STRANGL. Though each report occupies only a portion of a page, they are typed in sequence with several on each page, so that the originals could be cut apart and handled separately. Mixed with the reports are letters of a certain "Sehr geehrter Herr Doktor", who is almost certainly Dr. Wilhelm HOETTL. These letters, of which () has permitted us to have twenty-three, are curiesa of the most amusing order and contain here and there a grain of operationally interesting material. They have been separated from the other reports and are clipped in chronological order. We commend them to the attention of () whose experience in the problem of Stranglism is extensive.
- 3. Some of the conclusions to be drawn from the letters can be summarized here:
- a. As early as June 1951 HOETTL had steady employment or at least a steady contact with some intelligence agency. STRANGL sent HOETTL sheaves of reports which HOETTL undertook to rewrite and market. Both men were aware of the dangers of multiple dissemination, since on 26 June STRANGL cautioned HOETTL that "die Berichte sind nicht exklusiv." This caution is repeated later, and on 12 July 1951 he remarks "since you are rewriting the report I am somewhat less anxious". Again on 31 July he congratulates HOETTL on his "Redaktion", and on 21 August says "you have the biggest job since you must always paraphrase (umstilisieren) the reports". STRANGL

admitted to HOETTL that he was passing his reports to other customers and never seriously pretended that he worked exclusively for any service.

- b. At Hoettl's instigation STRANGL took up a contact with a man named "Sepp", presumably Josef MASCHER, but as far as he told HOETTL, this contact was not rewarding. On 12 July he reported that Sepp was selling to the Stapo, reselling the same reports elsewhere, and finally giving them every Saturday to a "Mysterious X", together with a travel diary. Some of his reports concerned the Burgenland.
- c. Both STRANGL and HOETTL used newspapers a great deal in their work, and sent each other bundles of newspapers, presumably to use in preparing reports.
- d. HOETTL, at the instigation of some unidentified person, asked STRANGL to acquire Hungarian information, suggesting phony reports on border crossers. On 14 August Marier remarked that STRANGL such border reports could not be sold because the customers had access to the non-coded broadcasts of the Hungarian police. He proposed instead actual debriefing of refugees, but not through the Austrian gendarmerie.
- e. HOETTL asked STRANGL to report on something referred to as "BH", which may stand for Bundesheer (Federal Army). STRANGL on 3 September turned in a short report on REGELE, LIEBITZKY, NEUGEBAUR, Matthias GRUBER, Generalmajor BORNEMANN, etc.
- f. HOETTL was in touch with a group referred to as the Hamburg Shop (Hamburger Firms). On 19 September STRANGL sent twelve reports with the suggestion that HOETTL might use them in his dealings with this group. One suspects that Zipper and the Berlin Base may be able between them to clarify the identity of the group.
- g. STRANGL attempted to get assistance for a journalist friend from HOETTL, and asked on 14 August that HOETTL send his friend some (Soviet?) army newspapers. One might guess from Gruesome knowledge of STRANGL's activity that the journalist in question is William Gerald BISHOP.
- h. HOETTL's pay to STRANGL was only a fraction of STRANGL's income, amounting to 1000 AS per month with some additional payment to cover expenses. On one occaion (13 September) relations involving money became slightly strained, but HOETTL evidently came through with the sum demanded.



Information regarding "Group Hottl" at 0-2 in Linz is as follows:

The former German Officer Baron Finck who was awarded the Knights' Gross, works for G-2 in Linz. Baron Finck had previously spoken to Baron Mast, wishing to collaborate with him in Linz. Mast in turn conferred with Dr. Hottl who concurred. He also received approval from "Bonn" with the information that the "Bonn" office in Munich was already collaborating with G-2 in Munich.

Thereupon the "Group Hottl" transmitted some data regarding Finck which information was entirely satisfactory to the G-2 Offics at Linz.

On Monday 14 July however, there appeared in the office of Baren Finck in Linz/Bindermichl, a major from G-2/8 dzburg, introducing himself as "Mr. Brown". He demanded that Herr Finck inform him as to who Baron Mast and his collaborators were. Baron Finck did not comply but told "Mr. Brown" that Baron Mast and associates were not agents but rather representatives of an official service (command). "Mr. Brown" returned to Ealzburg without the desired information while Baron Finck discussed the matter with his superior officer, also a major. The major complimented Baron Finck on his handking of the incident and departed for Salzburg the same day (Monday afternoon) to have the matter clarified.

Upon arrival at Headquarters G-2/Salzburg the officer was informed that the members of the "Hottl Group" were political swindlers; that Hottl and party would pass themselves of as members of the new Intelligence Service of Bonn and that furthormore it was not true that was or would be Chief of German Secret Service.





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"Purpose of this meeting was, as he (HOETTL) stated, to discuss with CC-2 his new literary plans, but there was no time...He only informed CC-2 on his present personal situation which had changed a few days ago. He told that he had been fired once again. His former "big chief" (Col. HEINZ) had informed him by letter that he had to be dropped upon U.S. interference; he, HOETTL, was blamed for having delivered exaggerated and untrue reports. He further stated that the U.S. representative who had demanded HOETTL's dismissal had acted also in the name of the British and French Occupation Forces.

HOTTL believes that no official steps have been taken by the U.S. representative, but that possibly a private conversation could have taken place between a U.S. intelligence officer and a Bonn official. HOTTL believes that connections with his former employer cannot be restored, but he intended to go to Munich and possibly Bonn on 13 October 1952 in order to receive some more severance payments for his collaborators.

HOTTL asked CC 2 to all the telephone number Salzburg 60944 next week, to ask for one Herr ALBERT, and to pick up from ALBERT an envelope containing a sum of D-Marks, which CC 2 should change, and return to the same person the countervalue in Austrian Schillings in a sealed envelope addressed to "Willi". Nationality, German, born 1908, teacher of philosophy at University of Vienna. Rank: SS Sturmbannfueher. Well built, 5'10", light brown hair, fairish, parted on left, large head, grey eves, always wears civilian clothes.

In April 41, Hoettl enlisted agent Goetz under cover name of KAUFMANN to work at intelligence for S.D.

Dec of 41, while Leiter of Referat VI in Vienna, Hoettl was involved in desciplinary troubles and dismissed from his post by his successor Gerhardt MULLER @ MANDEL. Hoettl had been working too closely with Jewish agents and was dishonest in money matters.

His political views were unpopular with Berlin as he supported the moderate National Socialists like Count PALFEY, BAKY, who on an understanding with Hoettl, made a break with the Arrow Cross Party of SZALLSY while Berlin supported the latter.

During 1942, Hoettl transferred to the SS regiment Prinz Eugen in Belgrade where he served as a war reporter.

1943, Hoettl was reinstated in the S.D. and posted to Amt VI E at the RSHA in Berlin, possibly as HANKE'S successor.

Oct 43 Hoettl sent Pierre LETAY- an S.D. agent sent on a political mission to Syria in 1944-to Amt VI C, the Persian section, for employement.

In Nov 43, Hoettl was promoted to Sturmbannfueheer. It was after this that he tried to get into the good graces of SCHELLENBERG.

In 1944 Sept, Hoettl wa in touch with Richard KLATT of Abwehr I (Luft) and asked him to pass on any information about British agents in Europe.

VON WINKLER makes good impression but needs further checking. Document gives Winkler's resistance group. Info on Winkler. Hoettl claims method to undermine reduit.

17 April 45 Memo from Mr. Leslie for Mr. Mayer, Dulles and vonGaevernitz.

Leslie believes whole Hoettl affair is a group of Austrian condervative circles, including Cath church circles and large proportion of legitimists and the more moderate Nazis. A reactionary group altho both Hoettl and Winkler would hotly deny it.

An importanct member of the group is Obersturmbandfuhrer GOTTSCH. He

He is head of a department of Vienna, S.D. and worked with Winkler for years. GOTTSCH brought Hoettl into contact with Winkler.

Hoettl said KALTENBRUNNER told him to contact op ositional elements to find out about them and of possible collaboration. Hoettl entrusted Gottsch with the internal contacts while confining himself to external contacts.

... Hoettl appears to represent the moderate Nazis in the group. He obvioually looks upon a GLAISE*HORSTENAU as his leader.

These moderate Austrian Nazis collaborated with the German Nazis from the very beginning for the following reasons:

- 1. Their belief in the "Gross-Deutschland Gedanke."
- 2. Their anti-Communist convictions.
- 3. Their anti-Jewish tendencies.
- 4. Their belief that some sort of union with Germany was the only solution to Austrian economic problems.

These people withdrew when the more radical Nazi elements (such as HEYDRICH) came into the fore. It is Leslie's personal impression that their motive is not only to save their skins, but also to play a political role in the future of Austria. They fear Russian imperialism and want to link Austria to westerm democratic ideas against the Russians. Hoettl expressed the conviction that strong divergence exists betw en westerm allies and Russia. Hoettl had summarized his plans for undermining the reduit including propaganda suggestions.

Hoettl believes that in the Reduit the Wehrmacht and SS are likely to get together against the party. Allied propaganda should exploit this.

Hoettl givies info on the Social Democrats. He wants strengthening of anti - Russian leaders in a xalatia socialism movement. His observations of Austrian workers .. Catholic movement, the Communists.

()thinks Hoettl and Winkler are important contac's and worth developing.

Heeltl is called dangerous because of his being a Nazi, his associates,

and being fanatically anti-Russ. () thought it best to inform Russ of any collaboration with him. His use is for furthering interests to United Nations and hastening end of resistance in Austria by disruption of the Reduit.

He has made a favorable impression on () and is believed to be trustworthy and sincere. To avoid accusation of our working ith Nazi and anti-Russ, our contact with him has to be indirect.

believes that Hoettl hopes that he and his associates will be able to play a political role in the future Austria as a result of his present activities. Hoettl is to be used, but not collaborated with...

Hoettl is important for the position which he holds and the consequent powers and authority. Hoettl cannot be considered representative of a political group in Austria. The lists he gave of associates defies labelling as a group.

We had best warn () of our part in this affair since Winkler was to be put in contact with () thru another party.

At the time of reporting to the CICIN KIRCHDORF, Hoettl was staying at his family home in ALTAUSEE, AUSTRIA, the community in which KALTENBRUNNER was captured.

He is 3% 37 years old, married and father of 2 children and his wife was now pregnant. Height 1.79, eyes grey, hair dark, complexion sallow, build slender.

He says he is a devout and active Catholic, and joined the NSDAP on 13 March 1938 because he thought National Socialism would save Austria from Bolshevism. He was ousted frm the SD by HEYDRICH because of his failure to adopt the Nazi Party tune toward Jews. In addition he was inducted into the army as a private. When KALTENBRUNNER succeeded Heydrich and began to surround himself with Austrians, Hoettl was restored to official rank in RSHA.

Hoettl states that he had become convinced that the hope of Austria and her salvation frm Bolshevism did not lie in German National Socialism but in a free and independent Austria with strong alliance and support from Western nations. Accordingly, he began to administer his post with such an underlying aim in mind. Hence, his radio network, composed of his own men in key positions, all of whom share his own anti*Bolshevist, pro-allied views.

In addition to the W/T net, one of his henchmen RUPERT MANDEL, has organized the EINSATZ GRUPPEN which have been parachuted into Jugoslavia during the past 3 months.

He calls his group the "USTACHA". He said it was allied with the Austrian Separatist Movement headed by General GLAISE*HORSTENA. Thruogh contact with the Papal Legate to Vienna, Hoettl states, there is reason to believe that the

Vatican would give at least tacit support to his movement. The papeal legate, however, has monarchist leanings, according to Hoettl, and Hoettl did not want his movement involved in the monarchist controversy as yet.

19 March 44, Dr. Hoettl makes acquaintance with Veesenmayer in Budapest. Hoettl with German Nachrichtendienst in Budapest. From 10 March 44 until 1 April 44, both discussed political moves. Veesenmayer judged Hoettl as a fanatic Nazi, a narrow minded person who would leave nothing undone in order to achieve his goal, no matter what it might be. Hoettl disregarded the German Legation and its function. Hoettl described Veesenmayer to his superiors as a weakling and a defeatist for which he was reprimanded. The two didn't get along.

Hoettl was a determined opponent of SZALASI who was in the "Pfeilkrevzler" movement which had the goal of assimilation of the various racial element in Hungary into a nationalistic homogeneous people.

Hoettl worked for KALTENBRUNNER and HIMMLER and had their protection at all times. Hoettl was influencial in Bungarian policy making because of his backing. Hoettl was a narrow minded radical who attacked every project with a logic fight mind, unswaying, and making no concessions, his chief concern was the small group of National Socialists in Budapest with whom he associated.

It is difficult to arrive at his official point of view; to HIMMLER he was reliable, to von Ribbentrop he definitely was not. It appears from

contrary to Reich policy. Hoettl answered he would report to KALTENBRUNNER as Veesenmayers policies in Hungary would lead to disaster. Himmler allowed Hoettl to stay in Hungary since it was the opposing opinion to Ribbentrop.


