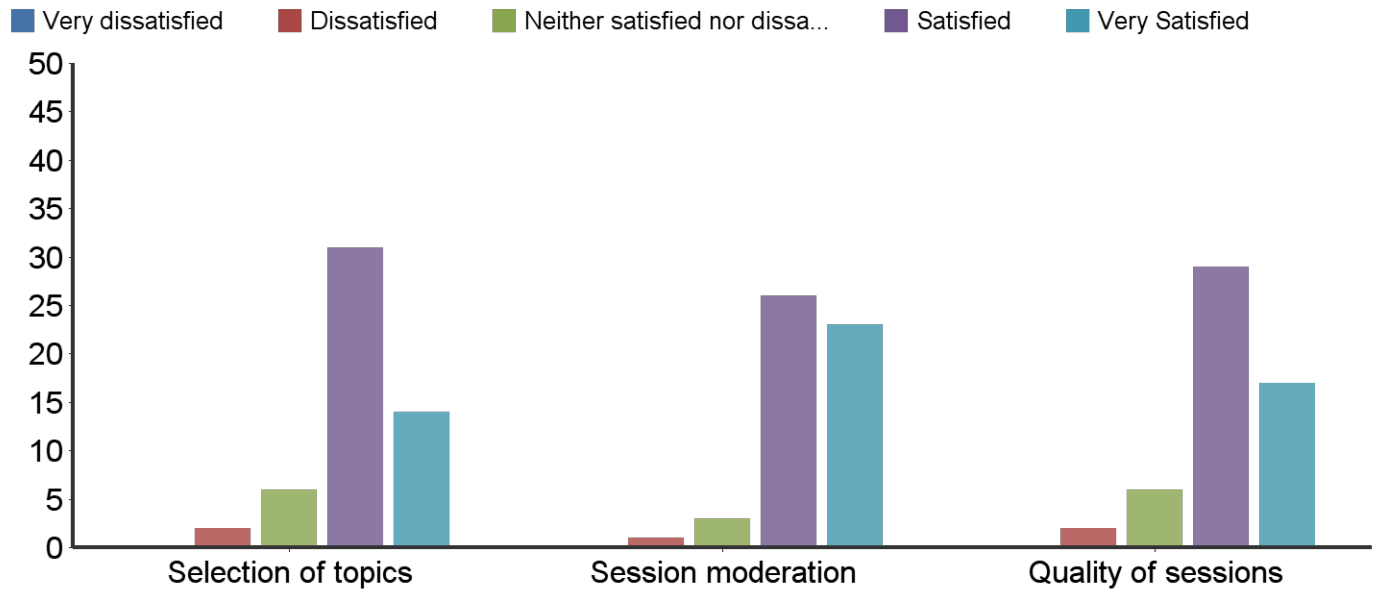

Consider giving more tips about how to engage audiences in presentations. A huge strength of Wikimedia conferences is getting everyone in the same room and working together. There are always going to be quiet people in the room and trying to find ways to engage all voices is a good idea. This means break out groups and other session styles.

Some sessions that had a nice title ended up in the programme, but turned out to be not so interesting and/or the presenter had poor skills.

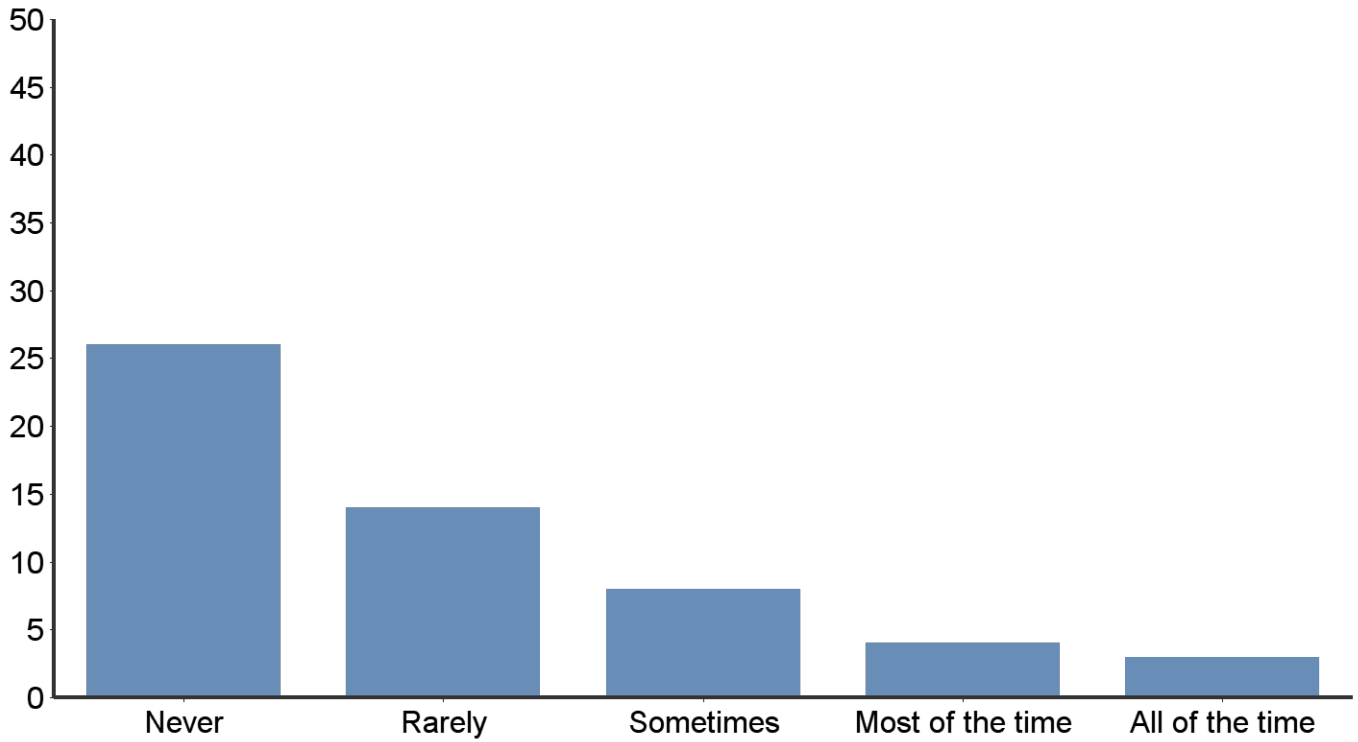
#### Conflict Managment
