## EXTRAORDINARY.

TUESDAY MORNING, NOVEMBER 5, 1816.

**W**E have the pleasure to announce the arrival of the Hannah, Capt. Heathorn, at this port, yesterday afternoon, from Liverpool, which place she left on the 6th July.

### PASSENGERS.

The only intelligence of importance, which we have been able to learn that she has brought, is, that in Paris a plot had been detected of an attempt to assassinate the Duke of Wellington and most of the Royal family of France at a grand fête given by the former, and many persons concerned in it had been in consequence apprehended. The account had been officially published in England, just before the Hannah left and we are in great hopes, that we shall, from the kindness of our friends, be able to procure the latest English journals which have come out; when we shall lose no time in publishing the particulars of the above affair with whatever else we may find interesting. Lord Wellington had arrived in England.

We are happy to be informed that the Princess Charlotte of Wales had recovered from her late indisposition. The riots in England had entirely subsided.

The Lowjee Family, from this port had arrived off Weymouth the 1st, and passed Dover the 2d, July. We understand also that the Apollo, Captain Talbot, had reached England, and some men of war from St. Helena. The Mary, Howel, for this port had sailed some time before the Hannah and may therefore be daily expected to arrive. There were three Ships in Liverpool ready to sail for Bengal; and a large Brig, the Wellington, was coming out to this port, she would sail from London about the 10th July.

The Hannah has brought a Dispatches from the Honourable Court of Directors and a small Packet of letters for individuals.

Another ship is now standing into the Harbour from the Southward, which we believe is the Dadaloy from Calcutta, the Hannah having spoken to her the day before.
