1. Purpose:

Inspection at Nippon Oil Co. Kudamatsu Refinery 45-33.

2. Background:

Surveillance in accordance with O.D. 51.

3. Discussion:

Refinery capacity of this refinery is 150,000 barrels of crude oil per month.

They have so far received 17,000 Kilo of imported crude oil and are expecting 17,000 kilo more on 3 March. Presently 800 Kilo is refined per day.

Seven 150 Kilo horizontal tanks were transferred from Oshima Oura Oil Storage area and were released from reparations here on 28 October 1948. One generator (45-4-41313) and one boiler and turbin (45-4-41314) were brought from Osaka during the war by the navy to Suetaka, Kudamatsu City and are now held by this company under the custody of Finance Bureau Hikari Branch as released from reparation.

4. Conclusion:

Although the refinery was idle for several years it is now operating very smoothly. They are hoping to get a large supply of crude oil.

Application is hereby submitted for the above subject with the hope to use Cura Oil Storage Facilities (former Kure Navy Supply Board's Tokuyama Branch) now under control of the State-Property Bureau of the Finance Ministry, for the purpose mentioned hereunder.

1. Particulars of facilities : As per attached sheet.
2. Time of commencement of use : As soon as permission granted.
3. Term of use : For the longest term as practicable.
4. Purpose of use : As follows.

In April 1946, under instructions of the Chief of Mining Bureau, Commerce-Industry Ministry, we were engaged in collection of tank bottom sediment from the tanks of Cura Oil Storage, and at the same time, for the purpose of using these tanks for receiving of petroleum products in future, we made necessary cleaning arrangements at a considerable expense.

In 1948, as there was a plan by P.D.K. to use them for receiving of Bahrain high-viscosity fuel oil, we completed heating equipments to one of the tanks. While we have the permission of temporary use for the land and buildings by the Finance Ministry, the use of tanks alone became impossible due to its designation for Reparations. Its custody and control, however, is instructed us by the same Ministry.

With the establishment of new oil distribution organization by the civil distributors to substitute for the former P.D.K. (Petroleum Distribution Kodan) as from 1 April, our company also has been designated as one of the distributors. As a principle, all the distributors' storage facilities are available for "Joint Use".

As the distribution base for Chugoku (western Honshu), Seibu (Kyushu district) and Shikoku areas, Itozaki Oil Storage is the only one available, which is insufficient to guarantee a smooth oil supply, especially with the gradual increase in quantity of imported oil. Furthermore, Mikoshima Oil Storage is lacking storage capacity to meet with big demands in Moji, Shimaneeki and the northern Kyushu areas, which also influences on oil receiving at Nagasaki Ocean Terminals.

Under the circumstances, with the approval of the above applied permission of temporary use of Oura Oil Storage, which is presently under our custody, we would like to utilize two tanks (10,000kl. each), one of which for fuel oil as it has heating equipments, and the other for gasoline which is greatly lacked at Mikoshima base. Thus, by its joint use by all distributors, we can expect a perfect distribution of petroleum products in the western parts of Japan with Tokuyama as its center.

We should greatly appreciate if you would give this matter your kind consideration and grant us you permission as above

Subject: Application for permission pertaining to Oura Oil Storage  
(Reference to our application to SCAP 1 July 1949)

We hereby submit our application on the above subject as follows.

As per our application dated 1 July 1949, we have already applied for permission for temporary use of 2 tanks as well as its attached facilities of the Oura Oil Storage (consisting of 8 tanks in all), for which we are now expecting an early approval.

In view of the recent improvement of situation, the use of all the above storage facilities, with which as Import Terminal, is greatly necessitated and we now apply for further permission in addition to our previous application.

1. In accordance with the recent SCAP's Memorandum, the re-opening of Pacific Coast Oil Refineries, which were closed for a long time since the termination of the war, has been permitted together with Crude Oil Imports for refining it in Japan. It is expected that these refineries will be resumed rapidly but on the other hand, the present efficiency of storage facilities is rather poor to emphasize this purpose without being able to keep in storage, even for temporary, the refined oil required in this country at present. For storing the crude oil and its products to be reserved for a few months, a large capacity of several times will be necessary over the current storage facilities, and unless some immediate steps are taken to recondition all existing tanks, it will decisively cause serious difficulty to operations of such refineries.

2. The custody of Oura Oil Storage was assigned to us since right after the war ended and we are still in its custody and preservation at a considerable expense for us, which has been kept in far better conditions compared with other storages of the same nature at elsewhere. The remaining 6 tanks (other than those which are already under application for temporary use) are also fitted for perfect use with some repairs, so that they should be taken into first consideration in case additional tanks are to be used (particulars are shown in the attached sketch).

3. At present, Tokuyama, Shimoda and Nagasaki are approved as Import Terminals, which are in status of being insufficient even to keep in storage of only petroleum products for a short term. Consequently, further terminals will be required if in the event of crude oil imports, in which case Oura is highly recommended as rare import terminal from geographical and harbor facilities points of view.

With regard to the sweeping, the Japanese Government has already accomplished the works including the Inland Sea and its outlets - Kanmon, Boyo and Kitan straits, each of which breadth is 2,000 meters and 1,000 meters for the branch route up to Tokuyama harbor. On the other hand, the Occupation Authorities have already announced the sweeping of Kanmon-strait and it is reported that the similar announcement is expected by the end of this year for Boyo and the watercourse up to Tokuyama. In such case Oura is the only good harbor amongst the Inland Sea and best suited Import Terminal in Japan to enable berthing for Japanese and foreign tankers of 20,000-ton capacity.

In view of the above circumstances, we apply for your permission as follows.

1. Permission for temporary use of 6 tanks of Oura Oil Storage Facilities in addition to the 2 tanks as per our previous application.
2. Permission for Oura Oil Storage Facilities as Import Terminal.

We would greatly appreciate for giving this matter your kind consideration.
