Bekku, President of the Sumitomo Electric Industries, Limited, 60 Okijima Minamino-cho, Konchaku, Osaka states that the silver which was seized from them by the 4th Infantry had been supplied by the Nippon Precious Metal Distribution Company, Limited, in late 1944 and early 1945. It was intended for the manufacture of solder, and a portion of it had already been used for that purpose. Receipts from the Nippon Precious Metal Distribution Company to Sumitomo Electric Industries regarding the silver were destroyed by bombing.



The platinum bullion seized from the Director of the Osaka Railway Division, Ministry of Transportation, Ofuka-cho, Kita-ku, Osaka City, by the 4th Infantry had been given to the Ministry of Transportation by the Japanese Army on 15 August 1945. The Ministry had no use for the metal, and thus the amount seized by the 4th Infantry was the original amount received from the Japanese Army. Although the platinum was assigned to the Ministry on 15 August 1945 it was not transported there until 28 February 1946.


With reference to the difference in quantity of silver granules which were collected from our plant on 2nd August from what had previously been reported to have been in our possession, we report as follows:-

The silver granules in question were buried underground in March 1945 with a view to securing their safe custody against air-raids, and had been kept there ever since. They were packed in kerosene tins and buried in a pit. When they were dug out of the pit for handing over, they were so corroded that the granules were found all mixed up with mud. They were separated from the mud but were short of 40,733.5gms. in comparison with our previous report.

On investigation into the circumstances under which the granules were buried in the midst of the air-raid, we came to the conclusion that the actual quantity that had been underground must have been less than the quantity we were supposed to be in possession, apart from the actual loss sustained in the ground.

We hope that the above explanation have made our situation clear.
