MISSION LOG REPORT  
REPORT NO. 6

8 May 1945.

MISSION: Napalm mission to MALABANG.

FLIGHT COMPOSITION: Baka, Clason, Danckaert, Chellson,

TIME: TFO: 5 May 1945 0940. ATA: 8 May 1945 1105.

WEATHER: Sav. 1-2. Visibility unlimited.

COMMENTS: Beta 2 dropped Napalm bombs on target at 1050 on 5 May 1945. Target, 1500 yds. east of MINTAL, represented g positions and was covered by three bombs on the target, and one near miss (by 100 yds., where smoke shell had fallen). All bombs exploded. Plumes rose to 50-60 feet high, and lasted for three to five minutes. Three strafing runs were made against two buildings from which light and inaccurate machine gun fire was observed. The machine gun fire was silenced by the strafing. Pilots landed at MALABANG at 1205 on 5 May 1945.
