Explanation of the Articles of the Calendar.

These pages are calculated for Toronto and Quebec, and for ordinary purposes will serve with sufficient accuracy for every city in Canada.

MOON'S PHASES.—This Table gives the times for the two meridians when the moon passes the geocentric longitudes of 0° , 90° , 180° and 270° east of the sun. It gives also the times of her greatest and least distance from the earth.

TWILIGHT.—In this table are given the times at which twilight begins in the morning and ends in the evening, i.e., the times when the sun's centre is 18° below the horizon.

GREATEST ELONGATION OF THE POLE STAR.—This column gives the greatest azimuth of the Pole Star east or west from the meridian as observed at a place in latitude 43° . When the greatest elongation corresponding to any other latitude is required, the number given in the column should be corrected by means of the following table.

The 1st correction for the degrees of latitude is to be subtracted from the greatest elongation given in the calendar, or added to it, according as the degrees of latitude are less or greater than 45° .

The 2nd correction, which is always additive, is found by multiplying the number given in the third line of the table by the number of minutes in the latitude.

Thus for latitude $43^{\circ} 20'$...1st correction = $-4' 5''$ 2nd correction + $2.0 \times 20 = + 40''$

THE PLANETS.—The times of rising and setting of the five chief planets are calculated for Toronto, and are corrected for refraction. The times of culmination, although computed for the meridian of Toronto, will serve approximately for the whole of Canada. The meridian zenith distances, being designed merely to aid in finding the planets, have been given only to the nearest tenth of a degree, as seen from the latitude of Toronto.

When the planetary day is shorter than the mean solar day, and commences soon after the midnight of the preceding day, the planet will sometimes arrive a second time on the meridian before the expiration of the actual civil day. From analogous causes a planet will sometimes rise twice or set twice in the same civil day. When two culminations occur in the same day, or two risings or settings, the times of both are registered.

The times of the SUN'S RISING AND SETTING are given for the upper limb, and are corrected for refraction both for Toronto and Quebec.

The civil times both for the rising and setting of the Moon's centre are given for every day for Toronto and Quebec.

The Moon's MERIDIAN ZENITH DISTANCES are given to the nearest tenth of a degree for Toronto. They are not corrected for parallax or refraction.

The column **SUN ON MERIDIAN** gives the time that a watch should shew when the shadow of a sun dial is on the noon mark.

MOON'S AGE.—This column shews to the nearest tenth of a day the Moon's age at Toronto Noon.

The column, MOON ON THE MERIDIAN, gives the mean time at which the moon's centre passes the meridian of Toronto. When in the column headed Moon's rising or setting or Moon on meridian the letters A.M. occur, unaccompanied by





any number, they denote that the numbers given for the succeeding days relate to the morning, and those for the preceding days to the afternoon, but that the Moon does not rise or set or cross the meridian (as the case may be) on that day.

The column, **UPPER TRANSIT OF POLE STAR** shows for every day the mean time at which the Pole Star makes its upper transit across the meridian of Toronto. It passes in the morning from April 9 to October 9, and in the afternoon for the rest of the year. On October 9 there will be a second transit, occurring at 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

The four last columns, although computed for Toronto, will serve with sufficient accuracy for the whole of Canada.

The time at which the lower transit of the Pole Star occurs may be found by adding 11 h. 58 m. 2 s. to the time of its preceding upper transit.

From the time of the upper transit of the pole star may be found the time of its greatest western or eastern elongation, by adding or subtracting the constants given in the annexed Table.

Star Table.

From the times of the upper transit of the Pole Star may be derived, with the aid of the following table, the times of culmination, and of the rising and setting of the principal fixed stars, as seen from the parallel of 45° north latitude.

To ascertain when any star found in the following table will be on the meridian, add the number in the left-hand column of figures to the preceding meridian transit of the pole star given in the calendar. To find the time of rising of a star, subtract the number opposite it in the right-hand column of figures from the time of its meridian passage. For the *setting* of a Star, add the same number to the time of its meridian passage. Those stars marked (.....) revolve in a circle of perpetual apparition, and do not rise or set at places in and to the north of latitude 45°.

Eclipses.

In the year 1867 there will be two Eclipses of the Sun, and two of the Moon.

1.—An annular eclipse of the Sun, March 5-6, 1867, invisible in Canada.

III.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, March 19, 1867, partly visible at the stations in the annexed table, which gives the local astronomical time at which the different phases that are visible take place. At the time of last contact with the penumbra the point of last contact will be below the horizon.

The first contact with the shadow occurs at 112° from the northernmost point of the moon's limb towards the East, and the last contact at 107° towards the West.

IV.—A partial eclipse of the Moon, September 13, 1867, partly visible at the stations in the annexed table, which gives the local astronomical time at which the different phases that are visible take place.

The first contact with the penumbra will occur before the rising of the Moon; and at the time of the first contact with the shadow, the Moon, or the point where the first contact with the shadow takes place, will be below the horizon.

The first contact with the shadow occurs at 31° from the northernmost point of the Moon's limb towards the East, and the last contact at 69° towards the West.

The mean temperature of the year 1865 was $44^{\circ}.92$, or $1^{\circ}.75$ in excess of the average of 25 years. The deviation of the monthly means above or below their respective averages and irrespective of sign had an average amplitude of $2^{\circ}.51$, the average amplitude in 25 years being $2^{\circ}.23$. The highest temperature was observed on September 14th, when the thermometer marked $90^{\circ}.5$ Fahr., and the lowest on February 13th, when -10° was recorded, giving a range of $100^{\circ}.5$ for the year.

The warmest day of the year was August 2nd, having a mean temperature of $76^{\circ}.67$; and the coldest day January 17th, with a mean temperature of $10^{\circ}.77$.

The yearly range of the barometer was 1.047, or 0.936 below the average of the past 25 years. The yearly mean pressure 29.6330 was above the average of the past 18 years by .0167. The highest pressure 30.254 was noted at 11 a.m. on November 10th, the lowest 28.707 at 11 a.m. on 22nd March.

The amount of rain which fell during the year was less than the average of the preceding 24 years by 3.856 in inches. The month in which the greatest amount of rain fell was May, over 17 days, during which period 1.005 inches of water were precipitated. The most average rainy month during the past 24 years was November, with an average fall of 3.765. The most rainy month was September, 1843, when 9.760 inches fell; and the least rainy month was September, 1848, when only 3.115 inches were precipitated.

The amount of snow which fell during the year was less than the average of the preceding 23 years by 0.01 in inches. The month in which the greatest amount of snow fell was March, over 18 days, during which period 1.89 inches fell. The most average snowy month during the past 24 years was February, with an average fall of 18.1. The most snowy month was February, 1840, when 46.1 inches fell; and the least snowy month was December, 1851, when 10.7 inches only fell.

The number of nights possible to Aurora during the year was 201, as follows: in January, 13; February, 13; March, 11; April, 14; May, 20; June, 18; July, 24; August 22; September, 23; October, 19; November, 11; December, 13. Number of Auroras observed 55, distributed over the year as follows: in January, 3; February, 4; March, 2; April, 4; May, 5; June, 5; July, 7; August, 8; September 7; October, 9; November, 1; December, 0.

Mean elasticity of aqueous vapour was in January .086, February .105, March .159, April .203, May .278, June .432, July .402, August .434, September .458, October .240, November .156, December .120; mean for the year being .250; average for the past seven years being .260.

THE ROYAL FAMILY.

HER MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY (ALEXANDRA) VICTORIA,—By the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith. Her Majesty, the only daughter and heir of the late Prince Edward, Duke of Kent, fourth son of King George III., and Victoria-Maria-Louisa (Princess Dowager of Leiningen), Duchess of Kent, and sister of the King of the Belgians. Her Majesty was born at Kensington Palace, on the 24th of May, 1819; baptised on the 21st of June, 1819, ascended the throne on the demise of her uncle, King William IV., 20th June, 1837; and was crowned at Westminster, on the 28th June, 1838. TABLE OF PROHIBITIONS.—The following articles be prohibited to be imported under a penalty of two hundred dollars, together with the forfeiture of the parcel or package of goods in which the same may be found, viz.:—Books, Drawings, Paintings and Prints, of an immoral or indecent character; Coin base or counterfeit.

TRADE WITH THE BRITISH NORTH AMERICAN PROVINCES.—The articles hereunder mentioned, when of the growth and produce of any of the British North American Provinces, may be admitted into this Province, *free of duty*, from and after the passing of the Act, that is to say:—Grain, Flour, and Breadstuffs of all kinds; Animals of all kinds; Fresh Smoked and Salted Meats; Seeds and Vegetables; Green and Dried Fruits; Fish of all kinds; Products of Fish and of all creatures living in the water; Poultry, Butter, Cheese, Lard, Tallow; Timber and Lumber of all kinds, round, hewed, sawed, but not otherwise manufactured in whole or in part; Fish Oil; Gypsum, ground or unground.

TRADE WITH THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.—Any or all the articles mentioned in the next preceding resolution when of the growth and produce of the United States of America, may be admitted into this Province *free of duty*, upon proclamation by the Governor in Council, whenever satisfactory arrangements shall be entered into with the United States for the importation of similar articles from Canada into that country.

EXPORT DUTY.—Upon saw logs and shingle bolts exported out of Canada, except the same be exported directly to any of the British North American Provinces.

LETTER RATES.

Letters posted in Canada addressed to any place within the Province **post**, if prepaid, for 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., but if posted unpaid such letters are charged 7 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

On Letters to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and Prince Edward's Island, the rate is 5 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., with optional prepayment.

The rate on Letters to the United Kingdom is, by Canadian Packet,

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. - - - - - 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ cents.
Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. and not exceeding 1 oz. - - - - 25 " and so on, increasing one rate of postage for each additional half ounce.

And by Cunard Packet, 17 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., &c.

Letters for the United Kingdom must be prepaid, or they will be charged a fine of 6d. sterling on delivery.

Letters for British Colonies and Possessions beyond Sea, and Foreign Countries, via England, must be prepaid.

The rate on letters for the U. States, is 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. " to Cuba - - - - - 23 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

There is a further charge on delivery of letters addressed to British Columbia.

Letters - - - - - 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.
Newspapers - - - - - 2 cents each.

MAILS FOR CANADA FROM ENGLAND.

Two Ocean Steamers carrying mails for Canada leave Liverpool in each week, viz.: a Canadian Packet on every

Thursday, via Derry on Friday, sailing to Quebec in summer and Portland in Winter, by which the Postage rate is 6d. stg. per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.; and a Cunard Packet every Saturday, via Cork on Sunday, bringing Mails for Canada, alternately to Boston and New York, by which the Postage rate to Canada is 6d. stg. per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz.

The British Post Office forwards letters to Canada by the first packet sailing after the letter is posted, unless the letters bear a special direction—"By Canadian Packet" or "By British Packet"—and in that case they are kept over for the Packet designated—"By Canadian Mail" is not a distinctive superscription; for any Mail to Canada is a "Canadian Mail," by whatever Packet forwarded.

REGISTRATION OF LETTERS.

Persons posting Letters containing value, should be careful to require them to be registered, and to obtain from the Post Master a Certificate of receipt for Registration.

The charge for Registration, in addition to the Postage, is as follows, viz.:

On Letters to any other place in Canada, or British North America - - - - - 2 cents.

On Letters for the United States - - - - - 5 "

On Letters for the United Kingdom - - - - - 8 "

On Letters for British Colonies or Possessions, sent via England - - - - - 25 "

On Letters for France and other Foreign Countries, via France an amount equal to the postage rate.

Both the postage charge and registration fee must in all cases be prepaid.

Registration is not an absolute guarantee against the miscarriage or loss of a Letter; but a Registered Letter can be traced when an Unregistered Letter cannot, and the posting and delivery or non-delivery can be proven. A Registered Letter is thus secured against many of the casualties which, from incorrect address, forgetfulness of the receiver, or other error, may affect an Unregistered Letter.

MISCELLANEOUS CHARGES.

The charge on Parcels by the Parcel Post, which is limited to places within the Province, is 25 cts. per lb. (with 3 cts. additional if Registered.)

One cent per oz., payable in advance by Postage stamp, is the rate on Printed Circulars (Printed Circulars, if sent in envelopes, whether sealed or unsealed, are liable to letter postage). Prices Current, Hand Bills and other Printed Matter of a like character, and on Books, bound or unbound,

These rates must invariably be *prepaid* on transmission from Canada. Photographs, provided they are not upon glass or in cases containing glass, may be forwarded to Great Britain, &c., at the *Book rate of postage*. Book Packets addressed to the United Kingdom may be registered on payment of the ordinary registration fee, viz., 8 cents in addition to the postage.

NEWSPAPERS AND PERIODICALS.

Newspapers published in Canada may be sent by Post from the office of publication, addressed to any place in Canada, at the following rates, *if paid quarterly in advance* by either the publisher at the post office where the papers are posted, or by the subscriber at the delivering post office:

For a paper published 6 times a week, 40 cents per quarter.

When the above rates are not paid in advance by either publisher or subscriber, such papers are charged one cent each on delivery.

TRANSIENT NEWSPAPERS.

Transient Newspapers—that is to say, Canadian Newspapers posted otherwise than from the office of publication, and American or British papers posted or re-posted in Canada, must be prepaid 1 cent each, by postage stamp, or they cannot be forwarded—except only *British Newspapers* distributed to regular subscribers by Canadian Booksellers or News Agents—such papers pass free as they would do if received in the Canadian Packet Mails.

NEWSPAPERS BY MAIL FROM ENGLAND OR UNITED STATES.

Newspapers received from England by the Canadian Packet Mails are delivered free.

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. (This is the American transit charge.)

United States Newspapers brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

PERIODICAL PUBLICATIONS.

The rate on all Periodicals, other than Newspapers, passing by mail in Canada, save such as may be addressed to or received from the United Kingdom, and such as are exempted from postage by Statute, will henceforth be one cent per 1 oz. weight of package containing periodical matter, whether the package contains one or more numbers.

Any fraction of 4 oz. to be charged as a full rate.

On Periodicals posted from the office of publication or by News Agents or Booksellers, to regular subscribers within

the Province, this rate may remain to be collected on delivery, and must in such cases be marked upon the packages and charged in the Letter Bills, but when mailed to go out of the Province such Periodical matter must be prepaid by Postage Stamp. British and United States Periodicals may be posted in Canada by News Agents and Booksellers to regular subscribers in the Province under this regulation.

Transient Periodical matter posted in Canada must in all cases be prepaid by Postage Stamp.

The above rate will be payable on delivery on all Periodical matter received from the United States, except that Canadian Editors may receive Exchange Periodicals from the United States free of Canadian Postage.

Periodicals, printed and published in Canada, may be posted addressed to any place in the United Kingdom by Canadian Packet, on prepayment by Postage Stamp of two cents each number.

This rate will be applicable to all classes of Canadian Periodicals posted as above for the United Kingdom, the exemptions to which certain classes of Canadian Periodicals are entitled, extending to such numbers only, as are addressed from the Office of publication to places within the Province.

POSTAGE RATES ON MISCELLANEOUS MATTER.

Patterns or samples of merchandise and goods for sale may be posted in Canada to be forwarded to any place within the Province, on prepayment by postage stamp of a rate of one cent. per ounce, under the following regulations:

Patterns or samples must be sent in covers open at the ends, so as to be easy of examination. Samples however of seeds, drugs, and so forth, which cannot be sent in open covers, may be enclosed in bags of linen or other material, fastened in such a manner that they may be readily opened; or in bags entirely closed, provided that they be transparent, so that the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents.

The Packet may bear on the outside the address of the sender, in addition to the address of the person for whom it may be intended; also a trade mark and numbers, and the price of the article enclosed; inside, there must be no enclosure but the samples or patterns themselves; the particulars however of the trademarks, numbers and price, may be marked on the articles themselves, instead of on the outside of the Packet, at the option of the sender.

Any sample or pattern Packet containing a letter, or otherwise violating the conditions of the preceding rules, will be rated and treated as a letter.

The rate of one cent. per ounce is to be pre-paid by postage stamp, and, if such rate be not fully pre-paid by the stamps affixed, the Packet is to be rated with the deficient postage and a fine of five cents in addition.

Packets of samples and patterns may be registered on pre-payment by postage stamp of a registration fee of 5 cents in addition to the postage rate, and provided such Packets be duly handed in to the post office for registration.

No Packet of samples or patterns must exceed one pound, in weight.

These regulations apply only to the transmission of Packets of samples and patterns within the Province of Canada, and will not in any manner interfere with the regulations governing the exchange of samples and patterns with the United Kingdom, or with the foreign countries to which the same advantage extends, namely, France, Belgium, Italy, German States, and Denmark.

No provision as yet exists for the exchange of such matter with the other British Provinces or Colonies, with the United States or with other foreign countries than those above named.

Book manuscript, and printers' proofsheets (whether corrected or not), maps, prints, drawings, engravings, photographs when not on glass or in cases containing glass, and sheet music (whether printed or written), may pass in covers open at the ends or sides, and provided that no letter, or other communication intended to serve the purpose of a letter, be enclosed therein, on pre-payment, when posted in Canada, by postage stamp of the ordinary printed matter rate of one cent. per ounce; or upon payment of that rate on delivery of such matter when received in the mails from the United States.

POSTAGE OF BOOKS, PATTERNS AND SAMPLES.

Patterns of merchandise, and samples, may be forwarded between Canada and the United Kingdom, France, Italy, and the German States, by the Canadian Packet mails, at book post rates, and subject to the following conditions:

There must be no writing or printing other than the address of the person for whom the packet is intended, the manufacturer's or trade mark and number, and price of the article.

Any infringement of the above regulations will render the packet liable to be treated and charged as a letter.

Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles intended for delivery within the United Kingdom, are now allowed to be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent, so that "the officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as of the contents."

The rule which prohibited the transmission through the Post, as patterns, of articles of cutlery, &c., has been rescinded; and scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, are now allowed to be forwarded by the Post as samples, provided they be packed and guarded in so secure a manner as to afford complete protection to the contents of the mail bags, and to the persons of the officers of the Post Office. Such articles, however, must be so packed that they may be easily examined; and it is made a rule that any packet containing such articles, which may be found to be insufficiently guarded, shall not be forwarded through the Post.

None of the articles named in the next preceding paragraph may be sent as patterns or samples to any place abroad, except Germany, Belgium, and the British Colonies, and not to the places when addressed *via* France.

A packet of patterns or samples sent to France, must not exceed 18 inches in length, width or depth; a packet to any other place abroad must not exceed 24 inches in length or 12 inches in breadth or depth.

A packet of patterns or samples sent to Germany or Belgium must not exceed 8 oz. in weight.

No packet of patterns or samples must exceed 24 oz. in weight.

Bags entirely closed, even though they may be transparent, must not be used for the transmission of seeds to foreign parts.

No prints or printed matter will be allowed to pass by book post between the United Kingdom and Canada, unless printed on paper, parchment or vellum.

MONEY ORDERS ON CANADA.

All the Money Order Post Offices in Canada are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100; and for as many Orders of \$100 each as the Applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz.:—

On Orders up to	\$10	- - - - -	5 cents.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE UNITED KINGDOM.

The Canadian Money Order Offices also draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland and Scotland, and the Channel Islands, for any sum up to £10 sterling, and grant as many Orders for £10 sterling each as may be needed to make up the amount to be remitted. The terms are as under:—

On Orders up to £2	- - - - -	25 cents.	
" over £2 and up to £5	- - - - -	50 cents.	
" over £5 "	£7	- - - - -	90 cents.
" over £7 "	£10	- - - - -	100 cents.

MONEY ORDERS ON THE LOWER PROVINCES.

The Canadian Money Order Offices draw also upon all Money Order Offices in Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. The Orders, like those of the United Kingdom, are made payable in sterling money, and for sums up to £10 sterling. The terms are:—

For Orders up to £5	- - - - -	25 cents.
" over £5, and up to £10	- - - - -	50 cents.

The Money Order Post Offices are furnished with Lists of all the Money Order Offices in Canada, the United Kingdom, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland; and the Postmasters are instructed to afford every

information in their power, in respect of the places upon which they draw, together with any other information relating to such issues as the intending Remitters may desire.

POSTAGE STAMPS.

Postage Stamps are provided for sale of the respective values of 1 cent for Newspapers; 2 cents for Prices Current and Periodicals for the United Kingdom; 5 cents for ordinary Provincial Letters; 10 cents for United States rates; 12½ cents for Canadian Packet; and 17 cents for Cunard Packet.

Letter Envelopes are provided, impressed with medallion stamps, and equivalent to the prepayment of postage to the amount of 5 cents and 10 cents respectively.

The 5 cent envelopes will be sold to the public at the rate of \$5.50 per hundred, or 66 cents per dozen. The price of a single envelope is 6 cents.

The 10 cent envelopes will be sold at the rate of \$10.50 per hundred, or \$1.25 per dozen. Single envelopes 11 cts.

PENAL CLAUSES.

The Post Office Act contains the following penal clauses:

1. If any person uses or attempts to use in pre-payment of postage on any letter or mailable thing posted in this Province, any postage stamp which has been before used for a like purpose, such person shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars for every such offence, and the letter or other mailable thing on which such stamp has been so improperly used may be detained, or, in the discretion of the Postmaster General, forwarded to its destination, charged with double the postage to which it would have been liable if posted unpaid.

2. To enclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a parcel posted for the Parcel Post, or in a packet or samples or patterns posted to pass at the rate of postage applicable to samples and patterns, or to inclose a letter or any writing to serve the purpose of a letter, or to inclose any other thing, in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers (except in the case of the accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers) shall in each case be an offence punishable by a penalty of not less than ten and not exceeding forty dollars in each case.

3. The Postmaster General may grant licenses, revocable at pleasure, to Agents, other than Postmasters, for the sale to the public, of postage stamps and stamped envelopes, and may allow to such agents a commission of not exceeding five per cent, on the amount of their sales; and it shall not be lawful for any person to exercise the business of selling postage stamps or stamped envelopes to the public, unless duly licensed so to do by the Postmaster General, and under such conditions as he may prescribe; and any person who shall violate this provision by selling postage stamps or stamped envelopes to the public without a license from the Postmaster General, shall on conviction before a Justice of the Peace, incur a penalty of not exceeding forty dollars for each offence.

4. The penalties imposed by this Act shall be recoverable by the Postmaster General, before any one Justice of the Peace, in a summary manner, and if not paid may be levied by distress under warrant of such Justice, and the proceedings for the recovery of any such penalty shall be subject, as to evidence and proof of the offence, to the provisions contained in the sixty-second section of the Post Office Act.

6. If any person wilfully or maliciously injures or destroys any Street Letter Box, Pillar Box, or other receptacle established by authority of the Postmaster General for the deposit of letters or other mailable matter, such person shall on conviction be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour punishable by fine or imprisonment or both, in the discretion of the Court before which the offender is convicted, and every person who aids, abets, counsels or procures the commission of this offence, shall be guilty of a misdemeanour and be indictable and punishable as a principal offender.

9. Wilfully and maliciously to destroy, damage, detain, or delay any packet or package of patterns and samples of merchandise and goods, or of seeds, cuttings, bulbs, roots and scions or grafts, sent by mail, shall be a misdemeanour, and punishable in like manner as other offences declared to be misdemeanours by the Post Office Act.

COURT OF QUEEN'S BENCH.—The jurisdiction of this Court extends to all manner of actions, causes and suits, criminal and civil, real, personal and mixed, within Upper Canada, and it may proceed in such, by such process and course as are provided by law, and as shall tend with justice and despatch to determine the same; and may hear and determine all issues of law, and also with the inquest of twelve good and lawfule men (except in cases otherwise provided for) all issues of fact, and give judgment, and award execution, thereon, and also in matters which relate to the Queen's Revenue (including the condemnation of contraband or smuggled goods) as may be done by Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Law in England. Chief Justice—Hon. William Henry Draper, C.B. Puisne Judges—Hon. John Hawkins Hagarty, D.C.L., and Hon. Joseph Curran Morrison. Clerk of the Crown and Pleas—Lawrence Heydon. Reporter—Chris Robinson, Q.C. Senior Clerk—John Smith. Junior or Docketing Clerk—S. B. Clark. Crier and Usher—Andrew Fleming.

COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.—This Court has the same powers and jurisdiction as a Court of Record, as the Court of Queen's Bench. Writs of summonses and capias issue alternately from either court. Chief Justice—Hon. William Buell Richards. Puisne Judges—Hon. Adam Wilson and Hon. John Wilson. Clerk of the Crown and Pleas—W. B. Jackson. Reporter—S. J. VanKoughnet, M.A. Senior Clerk and Taxing Officer—Augustus B. Sullivan. Junior or Docketing Clerk—Wm. Lyons. Crier and Usher —.

COURT OF CHANCERY.—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, account, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics and their estates, waste, specific performance, discovery, and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, reparation or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law. PRACTICE COURT AND CHAMBERS.—One of the Common Law Judges holds a Court during each Term, called the "Practice Court," for hearing matters relating to the settling or justifying bail, discharging insolvent debtors, administering oaths, hearing and determining matters on motion, and making rules and orders in causes and business depending, either of said law courts. Chambers are held each day in Common Law and Chancery by one of the judges of the said courts, for such business relating to suits therein as may be transacted by a single judge out of court. Routine business in Chancery Chambers, by a recent order, is also taken before T. W. Taylor, the Judges' Secretary. Clerk, Common Law—William B. Heward. Reporter Common Law Chambers—Henry O'Brien.

HEIR AND DEVISE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be

appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their offices are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favour of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assigns. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year. Clerk of Commissioners—W. B. Heward.

COUNTRY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each county. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, crime, or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to Chancery.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also judges of the Surrogate Courts. Surrogate Clerk—Sir J. L. Robinson, Bart.

Board of Judges for regulating procedure and duties of Officers in the Surrogate Courts.—J. G. Sprague, Vice-Chancellor, Common Law Judge; J. R. Gowen, County Judge.

COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year for trials by jury in cases of felony and misdemeanor, but treason and capital felonies are exempted from their jurisdiction.

RECORDERS' COURTS.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston, and Ottawa, the Recorders' Court takes the place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the case of which is confined to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held first Monday in March, June and September, and third Monday in December. Recorders—George Duggan, Toronto; James O'Reilly, Kingston; John E. Start, Hamilton; William Horton, London; J. B. Lewis, Ottawa.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—By the "Insolvent Acts of 1864 and 1865," 27 & 28 Victoria, cap. 57, and 29 Vic. cap. 18, provision is made "for the settlement of the estates of insolvent debtors, for giving effect to arrangements between them and their creditors, and for the punishment of fraud." In Lower Canada, this enactment applies to traders only. In Upper Canada, to all persons whether traders or non-traders. In these courts, the county court judge in each county presides—the only appointments made in pursuance of this statute being those of "official assignees," who are to be nominated by the Board of Trade at any place, or the council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade." This important statute is proving a great boon to the community, in enabling parties who from unavoidable circumstance find themselves paralyzed by hopeless liability to obtain relief, and recompence business.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; and personal actions to that amount, if not excepted from their jurisdiction; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejectment, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crime, or seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office. If he objects to it. Each judicial district is divided into court divisions, and courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

DEPUTY CLERKS OF THE CROWN.—The Clerks of the County Courts will be ex-officio Deputy Clerks of the Crown and Clerks of their several counties as the present incumbents decease by death or otherwise.

DEPUTY REGISTRARS AND MASTERS IN CHANCERY.—These officers are appointed by the Court, for each County, as occasion requires.—(See title Master's office in Chancery.)

CLERK OF THE PROCESS.—For sealing and issuing Writs of Summons and other Writs in the Queen's Bench and Common Pleas (alternately)—Alan Cameron, *Assist. Clerk*.—A. H. B. Wadsworth. The Deputy Clerks of the Crown in the several Counties are supplied with writs from Toronto and re-issue the same in their respective counties.

Terms of the Courts.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the second Thursday next after Hilary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins 3rd Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the second week thereafter. By the act 24 & 30 Vic. c. 40. Trinity Term, hitherto commencing on the Monday after the 21st August, is abolished; but the same statute gives power to the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas, at their discretion, to hold sittings in banc in time of vacation (except long vacation), by virtue of a rule or order of the court, respectively to be made in or out of term, for the hearing of such special cases or rules for new trials as shall be named in the list to be attached to any such rule or order, and for giving of judgments in cases previously argued, and for disposing of such other business as the court in its discretion shall see fit. Notice of such rules to be given in form and manner prescribed by the act, six clear days before the day appointed. Long vacation extends from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year, for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long vacation from the 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in Jan., April, July and Oct., and end the following Saturday.

Circuits of the Courts.

LAW CIRCUITS.—Courts of Assize and nisi prius and of Oyer and Terminer and General Gaol Delivery shall be held twice a year in each County or union of Counties, in the vacation between Hilary and Easter Terms,

and between that period of the vacation after the 21st of August and Michaelmas Term, except in the County of the City of Toronto and the County of York, in each of which counties there shall be a third such Court in every year, in the vacation between Michaelmas and Hilary Terms. There are six Circuits, as follows, viz.:—The *Eastern*: Perth, Cornwall, Ottawa, L'Original, Brockville, Kingston. *Home*: St. Catharines, Hamilton, Brampton, Barrie, Owen Sound, Milton, Welland. *Western*: St. Thomas, Sandwich, Sarnia, Chatham, London, Goderich. *Midland*: Whitby, Peterboro', Cobourg, Belleville, Picton, Lindsay. *Oxford*: Simcoe, Brantford, Guelph, Berlin, Stratford, Woodstock, Cayuga. *Toronto & York*: Toronto. The Courts in each Circuit shall be presided over by one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts, or, in their absence, by some one Judge of a County Court, or some one of her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, requested by any one of the Chief Justices or Judges of the Superior Courts to act in that behalf.

CHANCERY CIRCUITS.—For the Examination of Witnesses and Hearing Causes are held in the Spring and Fall of each year as follows:—*Toronto*: Toronto, *Home*: Whitby, Barrie, Hamilton, St. Catharines, Brantford, Guelph. *Western*: Simcoe, London, Chatham, Sandwich, Sarnia, Goderich, Woodstock. *Eastern*: Ottawa, Cornwall, Brockville, Kingston, Belleville, Cobourg, Lindsay. The Courts in each Circuit are presided over by the Chancellor or one of the Vice Chancellors, or by any one of Her Majesty's Counsel learned in the law, requested by the Chancellor or one of the Vice Chancellors to act in that behalf.

The Autumn Term begins Sept. 1; Winter term, Nov. 10; Spring term, Feb. 5; Summer term, April 1. Reports of the progress and conduct of the pupils are sent to parents twice each Term, or oftener if desired. Deducting the Vacations, the Terms are ten weeks each. The Tuition Fee is \$10 for one Pupil, \$9 for two (Brothers), \$8 for three (Brothers); and the Fee for Boarders, inclusive of Tuition, is \$45 per Term, and includes washing, seat in Church, and ordinary medical attendance. The many improvements made in the arrangement of the College Boarding House have been found to add very materially to the comfort of the boarders. A large paved Hall Court and a Gymnasium, fitted up with the most approved modern appliances, and a spacious playground and cricket ground afford ample facilities for out-door exercise and amusement within the College bounds. The Boarding House is conducted strictly as an integral part of the Institution, its disbursements paid out of, and its returns paid into the general funds. Prizes of books and certificates of honor are given every year to those who distinguish themselves in any of the subjects taught in the College. His Excellency the Governor General offers annually a valuable Prize of Books for the best examinations in the higher departments of the College Curriculum. At the Annual Public Examination in July Exhibitions are competed for, varying in value from \$120 to \$40 per annum. Competition for them is open to the Grammar Schools of the whole Province. More than 2,500 of the youth of the Province have received their education, in whole or in part, in Upper Canada College. The First Classical and the Mathematical Masters, were pupils of the Institution; as were likewise the greater portion of the Modest-men, Scholars and Honor-men of our Universities.

GRAMMAR SCHOOLS.—Each of these Schools (which form the intermediate link between the Common Schools and the Universities) is managed by a Board of Trustees appointed jointly by the County and Town Councils. In either the Trustees are all appointed by the City Council, except where there is only one School in the county. The head master must be a graduate of a British or Colonial University, unless certified and appointed before 1st September, 1855. Besides fees, local rates or contributions to the extent of half the government grant must be raised for the master's salary. The grant is payable to those schools only which attain a certain standard, and is based on the average attendance of pupils in the prescribed studies. An extra grant is provided for masters taking certain Meteorological observations and giving military instruction. Pupils attending these Schools are required for matriculation in the Universities. There were 101 Grammar Schools, with 5,754 pupils, in Upper Canada in 1855.

COMMON SCHOOLS.—Each Township is divided into School Sections of a suitable extent for one School; and in each of these Sections three trustees are elected to manage its school affairs. In cities, towns, and villages, the schools are managed by a Board of School Trustees, elected for the Municipality. There were 4,363 Common Schools, with 383,052 pupils, in Upper Canada, in 1865.

PUBLIC SCHOOL LIBRARIES.—Each School and Municipal Corporation, desirous of establishing Free Public Libraries, is aided by the Educational Department granting 100 per cent. on local appropriations, and supplying books from the Depository in connexion with the Department. Up to the end of Dec., 1865, about 920 Libraries had been thus established, with 212,365 volumes.

EDUCATIONAL MUSEUM.—Connected with the Educational Department is a Museum, containing specimens of School apparatus and furniture; a valuable collection of Italian, Dutch and Flemish Oil Paintings and Statuary casts and busts. The Museum is freely open to the public.

THE TOTAL NUMBER OF EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS of all kinds, as reported by the Educational Department as in operation in Upper Canada during 1865, was 4,684, attended by 307,932 pupils, and expending \$1,912,561 in their support.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, for \$25 and under, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 3 cents.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 3 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction of a \$100, 3 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange, executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange, executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duty to be paid by stamps affixed at the time of making, upon which the signature is the integral portion of the instrument, shall be written on the stamp to be affixed by the maker or drawer of the instrument, or if drawn out of the province by the acceptor or last inforer in the province. Penalty for neglect to affix stamp, \$100. Stamps in all cases to be delivered at the time of affixing the same, by writing or stamping the date thereon, and such stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and if no date be so stamped or written thereon such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.
