There is also a strong Iron-sulphur cold spring

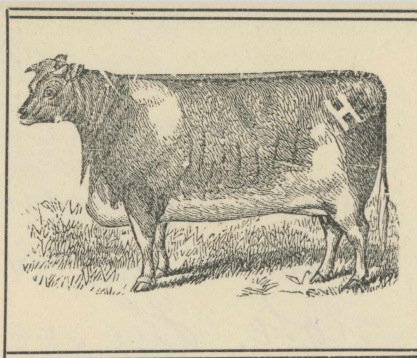

Dear Wife: Yours, not dated, to hand. It found us all well excepting Uncle Billy. He was for three days & nights very sick with pains in breast and shoulders and could not eat anything. I wanted to send for a doctor but he would not have it that way. He preferred going to Buena. So I wrote and telegraphed to Jim Quiggles to get a doctor and take care of him and Billy went on Monday. Have not heard from him since. I think he had a touch of pneumonia. Boyer has been knocked out with a bad cold and erysipilis in the nose. Mrs Hunt is complaining they have no help at the hotel. Kate & Lucy are getting along nicely. Walt & Jim are up at Trout Creek to day. Dagley will finish baling at Chalmers to day and move to the Brophy place and bale what hay is there. A rate war at Cripple Creek has demoralized the haymarket and no hay has been shipped for a month. Have shipped none of Pete's hay since you left. I wrote a few days ago to Myrtle,

In regard to letting Mr Wilson have some more money. I think letting him have \$300⁰⁰ will be quite safe. He and his wife both signing the note. The weather has been delightful. We have had no snow but need it badly. I have lost a few calves with the black leg. Yesterday I moved the beef cattle from the old meadow up to the beef pasture. The boys are milking 6 cows. The mad dog scare at Balfour developed nothing serious. Judge Morse is carrying the mail as Uncle Sam is down at Harringtons. If I am not called to Buena I am going over to Mr Mahanys the last of the week. Thos James is not back from Missouri yet. Sam Cohen is putting in a mill at Garo to cut the timber back of the Railey place. No news from Hettie.
